

When Mrs. Shepard put the house on the market at the end of the last century, William Rockefeller, the older brother of John D. Rock-efeller bought 400 acres of the surrounding land, leaving 98 acres to go with the sale of the house. This reduced acreage and the Shepard properties were then bought at the sensational bargain price of \$600,-000 which was probably a sixth of the replacement cost.


