Soviet Boss Cites Missiles, Peace Aim in Interview

. By HENRY SHAPIRO United Press Writer

Moscow - Nikita Khrushchev today claimed that the Soviet Union has won absolute world rocket and missile superiority but he said the Sovets "will never start a war."

In the event of another war, he said it would be "fought on the American continent," but "we too would suffer

In an exclusive two and one half hour interview, the Soviet party chief expounded freely on world problems as he saw them and made these major points:

Prospects for preserving world peace "aren't bad" but the possibility cannot be excluded that World War 3 might be started by "some lunatics."

There probably won't be any summit meeting with the West in the nearest future, though he still wants one as "the only way out" of the East-West impasse.

Some of the top hoods of America's underworldwho told investigators they were in Apalachin to inquire about the health of a friend, Joseph Barbaradashed out of the Triple Cities early this morning after state police and federal agents broke up what they called a "gangland convention.".

They were among 65 men who were rounded up at Barbara's imposing stone mansion that sits on a hilltop 15 miles west of Binghamton.

The prize catch of the roundup was Vito Genovese,

once called "King of the Rackets" by former Gov. Thomas E. Dewey. Genovese's name was

mentioned a few weeks ago in connection with the gangland assassination of Albert Anastasia, high executioner of Murder, Inc.
