Although the information remains unchanged the data has been sorted according to the date of establishment and the geographic region: the Cape Colony, Natal, the Orange Free State and the Transvaal. The Early towns in the Cape were established by the Dutch, in 1806 the British took over. Towns in Natal were of both Dutch and British origin until the British assumed control. The towns in the Transvaal and the Orange Free State were established by the *Voortrekkers* (Dutch farmers who left the Cape Colony *en masse* in 1838)
