Methodology

Fieldwork Dates

22nd – 26th January 2015

Data Collection Method

The survey was conducted via telephone. A systematic random sample of telephone numbers in postcodes corresponding to the constituency, balanced to age, sex & ward targets, were called.

Population Sampled

All residents aged 18+ in the Sheffield Hallam constituency.

Sample Size

1,011

Data Weighting

Data were weighted to the profile of all adults in the Sheffield Hallam constituency aged 18+. Data were weighted by age, sex, ward and likelihood to vote. Targets for the weighted data were derived from Office of National Statistics 2011 Census data.

Margin of Error

Because only a sample of the full population was interviewed, all results are subject to margin of error, meaning that not all differences are statistically significant. For example, in a question where 50% (the worst case scenario as far as margin of error is concerned) gave a particular answer, with a sample of 1,011 it is 95% certain that the 'true' value will fall within the range of 3.1% from the sample result. Subsamples from the cross-breaks will be subject to higher margin of error, conclusions drawn from crossbreaks with very small sub-samples should be treated with caution.

Voting Intention

In order to assess voting intention, we first asked respondents how likely they would be to vote in the next election on a scale of 0-10. This likelihood to vote for was then used to weight voters' responses, such that respondents replying "10" were weighted by a factor of 1.0, whilst those responding "9" were weighted by a factor of 0.9, and so on down to responses of "0" being excluded altogether.

Respondents were then asked who they would be most likely to vote for if that election were tomorrow, with the responses "Labour", "Conservative", "Liberal Democrat" and "UKIP" prompted in a randomising order, with "Another Party" being prompted last. If respondents selected "Another Party", they were then encouraged to give an unprompted response.

Question presentation

All data tables shown in full below, in order and wording put to respondents, including but not limited to all tables relating to published data and all relevant tables preceding them. Tables for demographic questions might not be included but these should be clear from the cross-breaks on published tables. In all questions where the responses are a list of parties, names or statements, these will typically have been displayed to respondents in a randomising order. The only questions which would not have had randomising responses would be those in which there was a natural order to maintain – e.g. a scale from “strongly agree” to “strongly disagree”, a list of numbers from 0 to 10 or questions which had factual rather than opinion-related answers such as demographic information. “Other”, “Don’t know” and “Refused” responses are not randomised.

Not all questions will have necessarily been asked to all respondents – this is because they may be follow-on questions from previous questions or only appropriate to certain demographic groups. Lower response counts should make clear where this has occurred.

Before Q7, respondents were read the following statement regarding the Trans-Atlantic Trade and Investment Partnership (TTIP):

Representatives from the European Union and the US government are presently negotiating a new trade agreement called TTIP (Trans-Atlantic Trade and Investment Partnership), aimed at making it easier to trade between Europe and the USA, which they estimate could bring an extra £4 billion a year to the UK economy.

As it currently stands this new agreement covers the NHS and health sector in the UK. The UK government recently confirmed that health is in the scope of the agreement. If the NHS is included as part of this trade agreement, TTIP would provide a mechanism to allow American multinationals, or any firm with American investors, new powers to sue the government if it ever attempted to take privatised health services back into public ownership.

Data were analysed and weighted by Survation and presented by Patrick Brióne and Damian Lyons Lowe.
