#### The Mace

The mace, originally a weapon of defense, has in modern times become a symbol of authority, dignity, and privilege. English universities have used maces in academic processions for many centuries. The University of Rochester's present mace was first used at the induction of Alan Valentine as president in 1935, and has been used in academic processions since that time.

Philip Merz, designer of many of the architectural features of the early River Campus buildings, designed the University of Rochester's mace. It is approximately four feet in length, and is made of mahogany and hand-wrought silver. On the head is the seal of the University, and below that a silver band on which are engraved the names of the presidents of the University since its founding in 1850. The dandelion, floral symbol of the University, is used as the decorative motif of the silver work. The mace is carried by the University marshal as a symbol of authority. The baton, carrried by the associate marshal, is slightly less than two feet in length, and is made of mahogany studded with silver dandelions and stars.

#### Academic Attire

The distinctive attire of those participating in the academic procession represents a tradition that reaches at least as far back as the fourteenth century when gowns similar to today's became the required dress at many European universities. Gowns were then a common form of apparel for both the clergy and the laity but today they survive chiefly in ecclesiastical or academic ceremonies such as those we shall witness today. The symbolism of the American style of regalia is described below. Variations may be observed in the attire of the graduates of foreign universities and of the several American institutions which have departed from tradition.

The gowns for the three levels of degrees differ primarily in the sleeve. The bachelor's gown has long pointed sleeves and is worn closed. The master's gown is usually worn open and has long square-cut sleeves with slits through which the forearms protrude. The doctor's gown has large bell-shaped sleeves with three velvet crossbars on the upper portion of the arm and velvet trimming down the front of the gown. The mortarboard derives from the Oxford cap and is generally black with a black tassel, although color is sometimes used to indicate the field in which the degree was awarded. Gold tassels denote the holders of doctorates.

The most colorful portion of the academic costume is the hood which varies in length from three feet for bachelor's degrees to four feet for doctorates. The color of the lining indicates the institution which granted the degree. The University's color is yellow. For the nine colonial colleges the colors are: Harvard, crimson; William and Mary, green, gold, and silver; Yale, blue; Pennsylvania, red and blue; Princeton, orange and black; Columbia, light blue and white; Brown, brown; Rutgers, scarlet; and Dartmouth, green and white. Space does not permit listing the colors of all the colleges represented in the procession. The color of the edging of the hood indicates the discipline to which the degree pertains, for example: Arts, Letters, and Humanities, white; Commerce, Accounting, and Business, drab; Dentistry, lilac; Education, light blue; Engineering, orange; Law, purple; Medicine, green; Music, pink; Nursing, apricot; Philosophy, dark blue; Science, golden yellow; and Theology, scarlet.

#### Alumni Citations

#### DOROTHY DENE AESCHLIMAN

Daughter of missionary parents, Dorothy Dene Aeschliman was born in China and lived there for thirteen years. Upon receiving her Bachelor of Science degree in nursing from the University of Rochester in 1949, she served as staff nurse and later as head nurse of the Emergency Department of Strong Memorial Hospital. After further experience at the University of North Carolina and the San Francisco Medical Center of the University of California, she joined Project HOPE in 1960, participating in the training of nurses in Indonesia, Peru, Ecuador, and Guinea. Voyages to Colombia and Ceylon followed a year of graduate study and the degree Master of Arts from the University of Washington. She became director of nursing for Project HOPE in 1968, and since has held the heavy responsibility for nursing programs in Peru, Tunisia, the West Indies, Brazil, the Navajo reservation at Garrado, Arizona, and the Mexican-American community of Laredo, Texas. She exemplifies the best tradition of nursing at this University, combining service to the sick with fundamental research and the education of local nurses, wherever Project HOPE is needed.

#### ALLAN EDWARD KAPPELMAN

This community and this University have been strengthened and elevated by the hand and heart of Allan Edward Kappelman. An able and active student in the Class of 1933, he has worked for four decades to make that class outstanding, worked on reunions, fund drives, and all the unglamorous tasks that keep an alumni program vigorous. As President of the College of Arts and Science Alumni Association he drafted the plan for reorganizing the alumni body that was adopted in 1967, and then held the chairmanship of the new University Alumni Council during its first formative years. The same qualities of leadership and drive that have made him an exemplary alumnus have led him to excel in a host of community endeavors. Dedicated to service, he has given himself unsparingly to the improvement of the University he loves.

#### GARSON MEYER

That each person, young or old, should have adequate housing and medical care, and should be able to live in dignity and at peace with his neighbors, has long been the ideal of Garson Meyer. When he retired in 1962 from a successful career as a chemist it was only to increase the intensity of his concern and the scope of his activity. In his own community and state he has led and served innumerable groups for planning and administering social programs. Seven times elected President of the National Council on the Aging, he has been summoned to national service by five Presidents, recommending policies to "identify society's commitment to older Americans." A crusader with realism, he has worked courageously and effectively for a better life for all Americans.

## The Edward Peck Curtis Award for Excellence In Undergraduate Teaching

#### HAROLD SEARL DUNN

Harold Searl Dunn completes a decade of service at the University of Rochester this year. A graduate of Princeton University with the degrees of Bachelor and Master of Science in Engineering, he obtained the Ph.D. from Brown University in Electrical Engineering in 1962, and joined the University of Rochester as assistant professor of mechanical engineering in 1963. As his professional stature grew, so also did his dedication to effective teaching, the latter marked by warm relations with students, thoughtful choice of teaching material and method, and a firm determination to relate the classroom to the world outside. The superb quality of his teaching was formally recognized by his colleagues at the time of his promotion to associate professor in 1967. As teacher, adviser, and friend he has added immeasurably to the educational experience of his students, and their enthusiastic comments attest the stimulation and inspiration he provides.

### Honorary Degrees

#### ROBERT SWAIN MORISON

Exciting advances in biological research have changed our views of the human being, human behavior, and society. Robert Swain Morison not only has been a leader in this research, but also has been unexcelled in stimulating the efforts of others as a foundation officer and in interpreting the findings of science to his peers, his students, and the public.

A native of Milwaukee, Robert Swain Morison was graduated from Harvard University in 1930 and received his medical degree there in 1935. After eight years on the faculty of the Harvard Medical School, he served for two decades at the Rockefeller Foundation, attaining the position of Director of Medical and Natural Sciences. He returned to the classroom in 1964 as professor of biology and director of biological sciences at Cornell University, where he is now Richard J. Schwartz Professor of Science and Society. A prolific contributor to professional literature, he has also appeared in the pages of the Encyclopaedia Britannica, Daedalus, and Science. Through a long and creative career he has furthered knowledge and helped our understanding of mankind and man.

#### LEO CALVIN ROSTEN

Had he written nothing more, Leo Calvin Rosten's creation of that masterpiece of humor, pathos, pedagogy, and psychology, *The Education of Hyman Kaplan*, would have insured him a permanent place in our hearts and libraries. Luckily for us, he has written much more: from pioneering studies of Hollywood and the Washington correspondents, and his insightful and humane *Captain Newman*, *M. D.* on the emotional consequences of combat, to *The Joys of Yiddish*, his taut melodrama, *A Most Private Intrigue*, and a full shelf of other works of lasting value and importance. A contributor to *The New Yorker*, *Harpers*, and *Look*, as well as academic journals, Leo Rosten has also been a lecturer and visiting professor at leading universities.

His wit tempered by compassion, his judgments as a social scientist enriched by an artist's vision, he has made a unique contribution to our understanding and enjoyment of human relations. The University of Rochester takes pride in recognizing an author of extraordinary scope and merit.

#### GEORGE PRATT SHULTZ

The lives and fortunes of American citizens and countless others throughout the world are benefitting from the influence of George Pratt Shultz. Serving successively as Secretary of Labor, Director of the Office of Management and Budgets, and Secretary of the Treasury, and constantly as trusted counselor to the President, he has worked tirelessly and effectively for the Nation's economic health and growth in a time of exceptional challenge. Everything he brought to the Cabinet pointed to the success he has enjoyed: his brilliant academic record at Massachusetts Institute of Technology and the University of Chicago, his solid administrative achievement as dean of Chicago's notable Graduate School of Business, and his quiet warmth, stead-fastness, and humane concern.

A staunch advocate of freedom, he is equally dedicated to the ideal of equal opportunity.

The University of Rochester salutes an academician in the front rank of national life, a shaper of the plans and policies for America's future, who represents the finest in both scholarship and statesmanship.

#### ALVIN MARTIN WEINBERG

Scientific leader and director of Oak Ridge National Laboratory, Alvin Martin Weinberg is secure in his high place among American scientists. He attended the University of Chicago in his native city, receiving the degrees of Bachelor of Arts in 1935, Master of Arts in 1936, and Doctor of Philosophy in 1939, and remained at the University as research associate in Mathematical Biophysics and the Metallurgical Laboratory until 1945. His career since the Second World War has centered on Oak Ridge National Laboratory, an organization of remarkable range and depth, which he has directed with spirit and imagination since 1955. More than any other individual he has worked to make nuclear energy safe, cheap, and abundant, and to harvest medical and other life-saving by-products of the nuclear reactor. His leadership through the President's Science Advisory Committee brought about new and successful approaches to making scientific information useful. His books and articles have done much to guide national policy in the support and critical review of scientific research. Recipient in 1960 of the Atoms for Peace Award and the E. O. Lawrence Award, he has advanced man's knowledge and welfare.

#### ALEC WILDER

A native of Rochester and a student at the Eastman School of Music, Alec Wilder began writing songs in the 1930's. His noted Octets followed, synthesizing jazz influences and serious music. His witty and felicitous combination of these elements has continued to characterize the many works he has produced, including two operas, a ballet, and a musical comedy. An arranger for many orchestras and singers, he has also composed for the theater, records, and films. Many of his best compositions have been written as presents for friends. His book, American Popular Song: The Great Innovators, was a National Book Award nominee in 1973.

A self-directed and independent artist who has neither sought nor avoided popularity, Alec Wilder is secure in the esteem of professional musicians and holds a high place in the ranks of contemporary composers.
