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PREFACE

THERE are a few remarks, some of which will be of interest to almost every reader, that the editor desires to make regarding the scope and make-up of this genealogy. The genealogy proper consists of a record of the descendants of Thomas Talmadge or Talmage, who is said to have come to America in the fleet with Governor Winthrop and three of whose sons—William, Thomas and Robert executed legal papers in Boston in 1640. In the appendix are the genealogies of a number of families living in the United States, some of which are probably descendants of the same ancestor common to all mentioned in the main book; the others, who trace their ancestries to neighboring parts of England may be descended from a collateral relative of our common ancestor above referred to.

In the first part of the book is given the general result of numerous researches by interested members of the family concerning the family in England. It is shown that families bearing our name holding positions of influence have resided in Suffolk County from the earliest Saxon times to the present day; that as early as 1500 A. D. the name appears in Hampshire records and that these people are supposed to be a branch of the Suffolk family; and that prosperous members of the Hampshire family lived almost from their first appearance in the County at Newton Stacey, where John Talmadge, the brother of our ancestor Thomas, lived, previous to his death in 1640. Thus our early English ancestry is clearly indicated though no attempt is made to give the unbroken line of descent even back through the Hampshire to the Suffolk family as there are links where the evidence is doubtful.

However, it will be of interest to most members of the family to know that it is merely a question of expense of successful research to discover the correct line, for a professional genealogist writes that he already possesses the exact line of ancestry of our ancestor Thomas, based on satisfactory evidence such as wills, public records, etc., and he is willing to sell a copy of the

same, including a history of the family in America, for three hundred and eighty dollars. Unfortunately he reserves the right to reprint, so that the same could not be included in this book.

As regards the material for this book the "Sources of Information" indicate very clearly that the early generations are based largely on the result of searches by the editor, while the rest is mostly the records of a limited number of persons who have taken a general interest in the subject. These records, and notably those of the late Lewis Cass Tallmadge, Esq., are based on innumerable letters from people who write generally concerning their own family only.

This book is, therefore, the result of the coöperation of many people and the editor wishes to express his thanks to all those who took an interest or assisted in the production of this book and especially to Mr. Robert Swartout Talmage, of New York city; Mrs. John A. Vanderpoel, of New York city; Mr. Henry Pearl Talmadge, of Netherwood, N. J.; Mr. Thomas E. Tallmadge, of Chicago; Mr. Charles T. Conover, of Seattle, Wash.; and Mrs. Mary T. Root, of Providence, R. I. He also wishes to thank Mrs. John L. Buell, of "East Meadows," Litchfield, Conn., for the use of the three plates pertaining to Col. Benj. Tallmadge, which are from her article on the Mary Floyd Tallmadge Chapter in Chapter Sketches of the Daughters of the American Revolution; and Mrs. James Tallmadge Van Rensselaer for the picture of General James Tallmadge. The illustration of Helmingham Hall is from *Odd and Old Memories*, by Lionell A. Tollemache; that of Ham House is from *Ham House, Its History and Art Treasures*, by Mrs. Roundell; and the map of Easthampton is from *The Talmage Record*, by S. C. N. Talmage and by William Pelletreau; and the map of New Haven is from a reprint of the original furnished by John E. Bassett & Co., of New Haven, Conn.

The records of the late Lewis Cass Tallmadge call for special notice. They comprise about half this genealogy and corroborate much more. Mr. Lewis Cass Tallmadge evidently took the most general interest in this subject of all the family, and showed the most persistent efforts in tracing widely scattered collateral lines. A picture of him is included in the genealogy. His records, which were obtained through the kindness of his son, Mr. Thomas E. Tallmadge, were written about thirty

years ago in a fine hand, and as the paper is losing its surface from age, particularly in the folds, it was impossible even with a magnifying glass to be sure of a few of the spellings of proper names.

The late Mr. S. C. M. Talmage, who wrote the *Talmage Record*, deserves the especial thanks of all who are descended in the male line from Captain Thomas Talmage, one of the founders and first Recorder of Easthampton, Long Island, for he discovered the will of Nathaniel Talmage, which was filed but through some error not recorded at the office of the surrogate of New York County. Nathaniel was the only son of Captain Thomas survived by male heirs and his will is the only conclusive proof known as to who were his sons. Previous to the discovery of this will the line of descent had frequently been published incorrectly in genealogical magazines, etc., all based on what seemed most probable with the evidence at hand.

The Talmadge, Tallmadge and Talmage Genealogy

THE FAMILY IN ENGLAND

The name of this family in the United States is at present spelled in three ways, "Talmadge," "Tallmadge," and "Talmage." The first is the spelling used by the earliest members of the family to whom any of the American family can trace without a break in the descent, *i. e.*, John Talmadge of Newton Stacey, Hants, and Simon Talmadge of Wherwell, Hants, and is now used by various scattered branches of the American family. Generally speaking the spelling "Tallmadge" is used by descendants of Robert Talmage who settled at New Haven, Conn., in 1644, and the spelling "Talmage" is generally used by descendants of Thomas Talmage of Easthampton, L. I., the older brother of the Robert above referred to. The spelling "Talmage" is also used by the descendants of Roger Talmage, some of whose descendants emigrated from England to America within fifty years. The genealogy of this family is included in the appendix, and though doubtless of common origin, coming from a neighboring part of England, there is yet no definite connection known.

There is one more family in the United States using the spelling "Talmage." They are the descendants of Thomas Tammadge of Portsmouth, England, and their genealogy, which is interesting for the recent change of spelling, is included in the appendix.

I do not know of any signatures spelled in any but one of the three above ways in the United States, but in many cases signatures are not easily available and church and town records are not to be relied on. A striking example is the records of the first church of New Haven, where the following spellings occurred during the ministry of Mr. Joseph Noyes: "Tal-

maig," "Talmag," "Talmadge," "Talmig," "Talmage," and "Thammage." Other unusual spellings that occur in American records are "Talmidge," "Tallmage," and "Toelmag."

In England the name has undergone a great variety of changes and the best known branch of the family, the one that now spells the name Tollemache, and inherited the earldom of Dysart, is a striking illustration, as is shown in the preface of "Ham House, Its History and Art Treasures," by Mrs. Charles Roundell. This lady is a granddaughter of the late Admiral Halliday and Lady Jane Tollemache, sister of the fifth earl of Dysart.

This preface reads: "The spelling of the family surname has undergone several changes; at one time it was spelt Talmasche, later it became Tallmash, then Talmash, and finally the name settled into Tollemache. In the United States the name exists as Talmage." As will appear later there is evidence to believe these Tollemaches are descended from people who used the American spelling of Talmage.

The name is of Saxon origin and has been widely published as coming from the Saxon word Tollmack, meaning the ringing of the bell, but the late Mr. J. M. B. Dwight, of New Haven, Conn., who was connected by marriage with the Tallmudge family of New Haven, made a careful search extending over a long period, of the early ancestry of our family, and he wrote that the English Tollemaches told him that the name was that of the Saxon Viking, Toadmag, meaning Mankiller. This spelling is said to occur in Doomesday Book, though other reports say the spelling there is Toelmag and that King Stephen of England was descended from this Toelmag of Doomesday Book. However this may be, King Stephen was a son of the famous Count of Blois and a son-in-law of William the Conqueror, and if he is reckoned a member of this family his distinguished sister the Queen of France, and many other notable persons might doubtless be included.

As King Stephen was a Norman it is interesting to note that there is at present a family of very ancient lineage settled in France by the name of Tollemache, and it is of course possible that some of Stephen's Saxon cousins may have been induced to try their fortune in Normandy, where they would have the advantage of great and friendly power, and that the French tongue transformed their harsh Saxon surname just as its in-

fluence through the Norman conquest softened the name in England.

Suffolk County, England, seems to be the birthplace of the family, for long before we find records of the family in Hampshire or other places where they located, Suffolk County seems to have possessed Talmadges, Talmages, Talmachs, etc., who were people of position. Burke's Peerage in speaking of the ancestry of the Earls of Dysart, says: "The Tollemaches have flourished with the greatest honour in the County of Suffolk since the arrival of the Saxons in England, a period of more than thirteen centuries." Tollemache, Lord of Bentley in Suffolk County, and Stoke-Tollemache in Oxfordshire, lived in the sixth century. There is a much and variously quoted inscription on the old manor house at Bentley to the effect that "when the Normans into England came, Bentley was my home and Talmach was my name."

Hugh de Tollemache subscribed the charter sans date (about the time of King Stephen), made by John de St. John to Eve, the first Abbess of Godstow in Oxfordshire. This Hugh in his old age assumed the cowl at Gloucester and bestowed upon that monastery a moiety of the town of Hampton, which his son, Peter, confirmed in the time of the Abbott Hamblin.

A descendant of Peter was Sir Hugh de Tollemache, who held of the crown in the twenty-fifth year of Edward I. the manor of Bentley and a fourth part of the village of Aketon by knight's service.

In the twenty-ninth year of Edward I. William and John Tollemache were among those summoned to attend the King at Berwick-upon-Tweed before his expedition into Scotland. This John took the black cross and his arms are now remaining at the minister of York.

The foregoing is an indication of the early prominence of the family in Suffolk, though little faith can be put in the spelling, as the names are copied from Burke's Peerage, where all the names are made to conform in spelling to that used by the more recent Earls of Dysart. Mr. Dwight wrote that Stoke-Talmage in Oxfordshire belonged to the Talmage or Tollemache family of Bentley, and a reference to the General Search of the College of Heraldry included in the appendix will show the variety of spellings used by members of the Bentley Talmages or Tollemaches.

Unfortunately the slowness with which information is obtainable from the College of Heraldry prevents me from including reference 51 of the "General Search, etc." (see Appendix). This record takes the Talmach family of Bentley, Suffolk, from 1620 backward for fourteen generations or to about 1200—a remarkably early date from which to be able to trace a line of ancestry without a break, especially as they seem to have been people of wealth and position with their permanent residence at Bentley all these centuries.

"The History of Suffolk County Thingoe Hundred," by John Gage, Esq., F. R. S., London, 1838, has some references to the family that are interesting as showing the spellings used at a very early date and the position of the family in that locality. Thus:

Simon Abbot, of St. Edmunds, who governed the monastery from 1237 to 1279, had the wardship of the heir of Sir Robert de Halsted; after whose decease the fee became the property of Sir William Talmach and Cecily his wife, probably the heir of the Halsted family.

Cecily, widow of Sir William Talmach, died at Hawsted in the ninth year of Edward I. (1281), leaving William, her son, and Gilbert de Melton, her chaplain, executors of her will; and from account rendered by Gilbert, we have the following funeral and other charges:

Item: For a mass for the soul of the lady and for ringing for her soul in Hawsted, *iiij^d*.

Item: For ringing for the soul of the lady in St. Edmunds, *iiij^d*.

Item: For 1 pair of shoes for the clerk assisting Gilbert the chaplain, celebrating for the soul of the lady, *ij^d*.

Monies paid for divers things bought for the funeral of the lady. Paid Henry de Belcham of St. Edmunds for fish and herrings, *ix^s* in part.

Item: Paid Allen Fouke for pike and eels, *xxvi^s*.

Item: Paid to Thomas de Batesford for cloth for black coats bought, *xxx^s* in part.

Item: Paid to the chandler of St. Edmund's *ix^s ij^d* in part.

Item: Paid to a man for cups and dishes bought *xiiij^s viij^d* ob.

Item: Paid to Thomas, son of T. de Heyham, for rabbits ag^t. the funeral of the lady xijj.

Item: Paid to Thomas Fulborn of St. Edmund's, for white cloth for the poor, xv^s in part.

Item: Paid Ralphle Smeremonger for meat ag^t. the funeral of the lady, xx^s.

Item: Paid to Adam le Soper, the cook, for fowls, iij^s in part.

Item: Paid John Campe of St. Edmund's, the skinner, for furs for the black coats, viij^s ij^d.

Item: To the bailiff of Alexander de Walsham for xvj geese against the funeral of the lady, iiiij^s viij^d.

Item: Paid John Seinale of St. Edmund's, for wax and divers spices bought against the funeral of the lady, iiiijⁱⁱ iiiij^s ij^d.

Item: Paid John de Stowe for wine, xxx^s vi^d.

Item: Paid John de Northfoleh for mending the clothes of the poor people, iiiij^s.

Item: Paid to Helye Poyke of St. Edmund's, by the hands of John de Bentelye, for the hangings for the hall, x^s in part.

Item: Paid to Margery for ale ag^t. the funeral of the lady, xix^s xj^d.

Item: Paid to Alexander de Westlee of St. Edmund's, for fine linen and silk, and other windings, bought for the body of the lady and in discharge of debt due from the lady, xi^l vij^s, of which xv^s was her debt.

Item: Paid Helye Poyke more for the hangings for the halle, iiiij^s iiiij^d.

Item: To a baker, of St. Edmund's, for waste bread bought for the lady's funeral to make mortrells, ij^j^d. Sm. xviiⁱⁱ xv^s vi^d. From the grange after the death of the lady—Item of wheat delivered to the bakers of St. Edmund's for bread to be baked and distributed to the poor, ij^{sr} ij^{bg}.

Gilbert de Melton gives himself credit in the account for a legacy from the lady, iiiij^s iiiij^d and for x^s for wages for looking after the Grange and xxxij^s iii^d salary for celebrating for the soul of the lady from the feast of Easter to Michaelmas; for wine for the chapel, j^d; for wax bought on the feast of the purification of the Blessed Virgin for the executors and household, vj; in offerings and dinners for a carter and for one day laborer (unum daye) at Hawsted, and another at Brockley, on Easter day, iiiij^d ob, that is to say, a half penny for each offer-

ing, and j^d for each meal; and the executor debits himself with sums of money paid by William Talmach and John Talmach on account of stock and effects purchased by them.

Sir William Talmach, the son, in the fourteenth year of Edward I. (1286), held here a messuage and two hundred and four score acres of land. He died prior to the seventh year of Edward II. (1314), when a fine was levied between Cecily, his widow, and Thomas, the Parson of Somerton, and Roger, Parson of Hawsted, of two messuages and six carucates of land in Hawsted, Brockley, etc.—“to Cecily, intail, remainder to John, son of Sir William Talmach, intail; remainder successively to his brothers, William, Edmund and Thomas Talmach, intail; remainder to her right heirs.”

Among the principal tenants of Hawsted Manor who held of the Abbot of St. Edmund'sbury in 1286 was Sir William Talmach.

“It appears, however, he had disposed of half the fee to William Talmadge, prior to the twenty-eighth year of Edward I. (1300), whence came the name of Talmadge's Manor in Brockley.”

“Subsequently to the thirteenth year of Henry VIII. (1522), Sir William Drury of Hawsted, became the purchaser of the Manor of Brockley; and in him was also vested the Manor of Talmages, with Wifolds in Brockley. As to the manor of Talmages we have seen that it constituted the half of the fee of Henry de Brockley, which took the name of Sir William Talmach after the annexation of it by him to his family possessions in Hawsted.

In the twentieth year of Edward III. (1347), it was vested, probably in trust for the family of Talmach.

John Talmach, son and heir of Sir William, after the annexation by him, in the ninth year of Richard II. (1386), released to William Clopton all his rights in his father's lands at Brockley.

“In the twenty-sixth year of Henry VI. (1448), sold the version expectant, and in the third year of Edward IV. (1464), his feoffee William Coleman, chaplain, conveyed the Manor of Bokenhams, otherwise Talmadges, to Roger Drury, Esq.”

On page 427 Mr. Gage gives the “Pedigree of Talmach of Hawsted,” showing how the Manor of Talmadges or Talmages

went out of the Talmach family, through the marriage of a daughter who had inherited it.

I. Willielmus Talmach de Hawsted, miles temp Henry III., married Cecelia, filia et haeres Roberti de Halsted, militis, filia Ricardi de Halsted; ob. 9 Edw. I. (1281).

II. They had Willielmus Talmach de Hawsted, miles, fileus & haeres, 14 Edw. I. (1286), who married Cecelia, vidua 7 Edw. II. (1314).

III. They had Johannes Talmach de Hawsted, fileus & haeres; vivens 6 Rich. II. (1383); Willielmus Talmach, miles; Edmund Talmach, Thomas Talmach.

IV. Willielmus Talmach married and had a daughter, Alicia Talmach de Hawsted, filia & haeres, 16 Rich. II. (1393). She married Willielmus Bokenhan de Hawsted, vivens 6 Henry IV. (1405), and they had,

V. John Bokenham, Jr., who married Alicia. John Bokenham, 5 Henry VI. (1427).

Following shortly after the above pedigree in point of time come the charts and coat-of-arms in the Harleian MSS.:

Robert Harley, Earl of Oxford and Mortimer, who died 1724, made a collection of books and MSS. containing a great amount of genealogical material and this collection is preserved in the British Museum. The five charts referred to here are Harl. MS., 1560, p. 48; Harl. MS., 1177, p. 37; Harl. MS., 155, p. 7; Harl. MS., 1449, p. 43; and Harl. MS., 1103, p. 41. They all have the same coat-of-arms with quarterings and refer to the same family, the chief difference being that some give one or two more generations and more detailed information than others. While the spelling of the surname is generally Talmache, in the first it is Talmage throughout, also this one gives the greatest number of generations and is the evidence referred to, that the ancestors of the present Tollemaches, the Earl of Dysart, etc., spelled their name Talmage, for they claim this pedigree as their own. The coat-of-arms is reproduced here from a pen and ink drawing, and the Talmage chart with whatever additional information occurs in the others, is as follows:

I. Lyonell Talmage of Benley in Suff. King H. 3 as appeareth by evidence in the hands of Sir Lionell, married dau. and Co-heir of John Curson of Brigewell in Suff. They had

II. Lyonell Talmage of Beneley, who married Ann, dau. and heire of Helmingam. They had

III. John Talmage of Helmingham, in Suff., who married dau. and heire of Roger Louth of Sawtry or Snotry in Com. Huntingdon, Gent. They had

Lyonell Talmage of Helmingham, first son and heir, also Hugh, Robert, Oliver, and William, and Katharine, Joane, Ann, and Jone.

IV. Lionell Talmage of Helmingham married Edith, dau. & heire of Joyce of Helmingham, or John Helmygam. They had

William, John, James, which three died without issue, Lyonell, son and heir and Robert, fifth son, also Ann and Elizabeth.

Hugh Talmage IV. of St. Leonard's Hall in Suff. married Marg. dau. of Allen, Baron of the Exchequer. They had Richard and Francis, who died without issue, and Ann, who married Humfre Brown. Ann and Humfre had Peregrene and John Browne and John Browne had Peregrene Browne.

Katharine IV. married Trewtayle of Com. Lincon.

Joan IV. married Edmund Bokinge of Boking Ashe, in Suff. Gent.

Anne IV. married Sir Thomas Pargiter, Maior of London.

Jone IV. a nounge at St. Hellen's in London.

V. Lyonell Talmage of Helmingham, married Dorothe, d. of Sir Rich. Wentworth of Nettleded in Com. Suff. Kt., and they had

Humfre and Thomas, who died without issue, Lyonell, third son and heir, and Edith, Mary and Cecile.

Ann V. married Robert Knevett or Keevett of Bucknam in Norff. Gent.

Elizabeth V. married first, Edmond Parye, and second, John Crackenell.

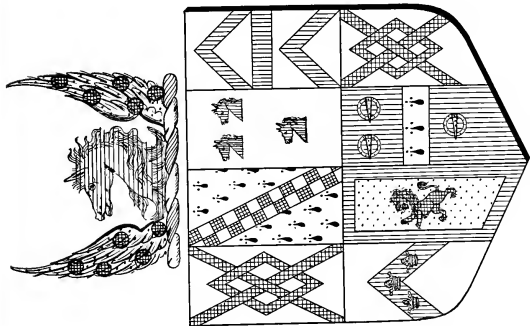
VI. Lyonell Talmage of Helmingham, married Susan, dau. of Sir Ambrose Jermyn of Rushbrook, in Suff. Kt., and they had

Lyonell, son and heir.

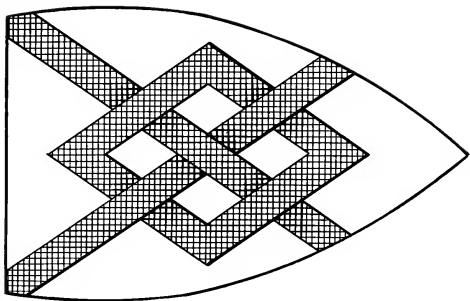
Edith VI. married Edward Clarke of Hadley.

Baronet, married Katharine, dau. of Gregory or Geffery, Lord Cromwell, and they had

VIII. Lionel Talmage of Helmingham, Kt., and Baronet, married Elizabeth, dau. of John, Lord Stanhope of Harrington. For their descendants see any English peerage, under "Dysart."

Also Edward Talmage, Robert Talmage, Susan Talmage married Henry Doyler of Scottisham, Mary Talmage married Roger Castle of Helmingham, Katherine Talmage married William Plater of Fordley, and Anne Talmage married Robt. Goswold of Otley in Suff.

To return to the Talmach family of Hawsted, from the quotations included there it seems as though Mr. Gage could have made a more complete pedigree and also that Johanness Talmach of the third generation was not the one "viveus 6 Rich. II.," but more probably the grandfather or an uncle. It should have been noted that Talmadge Manor was in Southwood, Suffolk County, and is mentioned again by Mr. Gage as being sold in 1538 by the Duke of Suffolk to Lord Thos. Audley, Lord Chancellor of England.

The Talmage, Talmach, etc., coat-of-arms, as recorded in the College of Heraldry is: Arg; a fret sable; with quarterings; and is shown in figure 2 without quartering and in figure 1 with the quarterings and crest as copied from the Harleian MSS. In figure 1 the quartering to the right of the Talmage arms represents the Curson arms and is: Ermine a bar chequy argent and sable; and the quartering furthest to the right in the lower line is: Gules a fesse ermine between three round buckles or,—this represents the arms of Soterley or Sotelly. Mr. Geo. B. Howell identified the above quarterings in Berry's work on heraldry, but was unable to identify the others, though notes there was at that time (1875), no complete work on this subject.

All the Talmages whose arms are recorded in the College of Heraldry bore the arms as shown in Figure 2, and all came from Suffolk County, mostly from Bentley, Helmingham and Fakenham. (See "Result of General Search, etc." in appendix.)

The American Talmadges, Tallmadges and Talmages believe they are descended from the Suffolk family, and the Tolle-maches have accepted this belief as shown in the quotation from

the preface of "Ham House, Its History and Art Treasures." However, beyond an inherited tradition that dates back to the time of the Revolution, there seems to be no proof and we do know that the early settlers of our name in Colonial Massachusetts had relatives in Hampshire.

The Talmach or Talmadge family appear in Hampshire shortly after 1500 A. D. according to present information, and about a century later we find them in Wilts and Berks. With my present information the chart of this family, as I assume it, is so doubtful in spots that I will simply indicate the probable generations and add in the appendix extracts from the wills I possess, for the benefit of any who may wish to investigate the subject further.

First Generation. In subsidy Rolls of Hampshire, 1523, are Robert, John, William and Nicholas, brothers. Agnes, see her will dated 1537; Robert of Barton Stacie, see will dated 1538, had William, Margery and Ann; John, will probated in Bishop's Court, 1546, of Barton Stacey. Surname Talmach or Talmage.

Second Generation. In subsidy Rolls of Hampshire, William Talmach, 1548, will 1555, had William, John, Isabel and Edith, and wife Joan; Edward of Apleshaw, will in Bishop's Court, 1545; another William, Robert and Hugh. Talmage or Talmach spelling of surname.

Third Generation. John of Newton Stacey, see will 1558, had brother William, who may be William of Newton Stacey, see his will dated 1581; he had John and Edmund, see their wills about 1595 and 1596. Possibly the same William as in subsidy rolls in 1570. Others probably of this generation were, William, John, and Thomas, the last of Appleshaw, see his will dated 1578. Surname spelled Talmach or Talmage.

Fourth Generation. In subsidy rolls of 1596, are William, Sr., and Jr. Others probably of this generation are Robert of Broughton, see will 1587; Richard of Somborne, see will 1587; also will of John, 1619, probably his son, and will of William, 1618, also possibly his son. These three, John of Middleton, will, 1605; Robert of Faccomb, will, 1616, and Peter of Upton, will, 1629, may be sons of Thomas of last generation. Spelling of surname Talmage, Talmadge, Talmaige, Tallmage and Talmydge.

Fifth Generation. Subsidy rolls, 1620, Thomas and John

Talmadge; 1627, Thomas Talmadge or Talmage; others are Robert of Fifield, see will 1638, and William of Faccomb, see will, 1642; the two latter supposed to be sons of William, whose will is dated 1618. The Thomas of this generation is supposed to be the progenitor of the large American family who came to Massachusetts about 1630 with his three sons, William, Thomas and Robert, and died at Easthampton, Long Island, 1653-4. The John Talmadge of this generation is doubtless his brother, who died at Newton Stacey, 1640.

Thomas brought his coat-of-arms on parchment with him to the Colonies, and it was still at Easthampton in 1906—more than two hundred and fifty years after his death at that place—and in the possession of his descendant, Jonathan Gould. As the families that have scattered to the different parts of the country have mostly lost knowledge of this old parchment and accepted as theirs, the arms of some member of the Suffolk Talmage or Tollmache family, and as this old parchment has no similarity to the arms of the Suffolk Talmages and is not recorded in the College of Heraldry, I will tell here why I believe it is genuine and therefore the arms to which the descendants of Thomas the progenitor have the best title.

Thomas' last known residence was Easthampton and according to the town records he died 1653-4. Thos., Jr., seems to have inherited his home from the fact that his will refers to two "home lots" and as oldest son present it is presumable that he inherited the coat-of-arms.

The will of Thomas, Jr., left his household goods to his two sons, Shubaell and Onesimus. The first died a bachelor and the other was survived by daughters only. Phebe, the wife of Severus Gold or Gould, was the only one married, and apparently inherited the whole estate. This explains how the old parchment came into the Gould family and under Phebe Talmage 38, in the genealogy, will be found the line of descent of Jonathan Gould from his ancestor, Phebe Talmage Gould.

The design by its simplicity indicates it is of early origin, when Heraldry was at its best and the use of choughs—a bird now nearly extinct that was found with few exceptions only in Cornwall—indicates that the original bearer of these arms came from that part of England. The Encyclopædia Britannica, under Heraldry, mentions the chough as in repute in Cornish heraldry.

While it would have been a satisfaction to find this coat-of-arms in the College of Heraldry yet the College of Heraldry was not inaugurated until the fifteenth century, and then while in law it controlled heraldry in practise it has never controlled it entirely and so many people of power and influence simply assumed arms without the formality of having them granted that at one time in an effort to regain its prestige, the College of Heraldry offered as a compromise to recognize as genuine anybody's arms whose ancestors had used the arms for two hundred years.

One of the best known rules of heraldry is that color must not be placed on color, yet our arms seem to have a blue chevron on a red field and as this irregularity is not uncommon in early heraldry it seems to me a strong evidence of the genuineness of the old parchment. If it were the product of the last two hundred years anyone knowing that such a rare bird as a chough was in good repute in heraldry would certainly know that color must not be placed on color, and in keeping with the existing fashion would have designed an elaborate coat-of-arms.

As regards quarterings in very early times when heraldry was in use to distinguish knights on the battle field, there were no quarterings, and in latter times only the arms of heiresses are used in quarterings, *i. e.*, heiresses under the English law, as the eldest daughter of the house, there being no sons—not heiresses under the loose meaning of any daughter of wealthy parents.

In closing I will quote from a letter dated Albany, N. Y., July 31, 1875, to Mr. L. C. Tallmudge from Geo. B. Howell on this subject: "But I think there is no doubt whatever but the Talmage who colonized here in 1640 or thereabouts bore the arms on that old parchment—that is, I believe he did, and rightfully. He may be a collateral branch of the Helminghams, who were the 'head' of the family in England and so changed the arms as it was customary at that time."

The coat-of-arms of the Earl of Dysart as given in Burke's Peerage is, Arms: quarterly 1st and 4th arg., a fret sa., for Tollemache; 2nd and 3rd Az; an imperial crown or, between three mullets, arg., within a double tressure, flory-counter-flory, of the second, for Murray.

Crest; a horse's head, erased, arg., with wings expanded, or, pelletee.

Supporters; two antelopes, ppr., attired and unguled, or.

Motto; Confido, Conquiesco.

As the family this book traces left England before there was an Earldom of Dysart and are not descended from William Murray 1st earl, we do not claim the Murray quarterings, but the crest and Tollemache quarterings are those of the Suffolk Talmages or Talmaches and are the same as sketched in Figure No. I.

Thus all the American families are probably descended from the original bearer of the arms as given in Figure No. 2, and may be entitled to all or some of the quarterings included in Figure No. 1, but all (except those included in the appendix) have a much clearer title to the arms of their ancestor Thomas, to whom they trace without a doubt.



GENERATION ONE

Extract from Will of John Talmadge, Vicessimo Tertio, Jan., 1638:

John Talmadge, Newton Stacey, parrish of Barton Stacey, yeoman. Legatees the poor, the church, William Talmadge cousin, Thomas Talmadge cousin, Robert Talmadge cousin, Christian Wormlum, Jane Talmadge; children of John Herring, senior, William by wome John Herring the younger, Robert Herring, Edward, Dorrithie, Alice, Margorie Herring, Richard Canyinges the younger, Margorie Canyinges, Ann Lacey, children of Richard Pitman, sister Alice Leaps (?) every one of my godechildren (not named).

Overseers Richard Pittman, Richard Cannings, and William Dowling of Wherwell.

Residue to Symon Talmadge my godson, sole executor, if not alive, then William and Thomas Talmadge, who are the brothers of Symon Talmadge.

Witnesses; William Dowling, Joanni Herring, Ricci Cannings.

There is an inventory of the property.

1 THOMAS TALMADGE. He was an Englishman and brother of John Talmadge of Newton Stacey, Hants, as described by several of his children in the letter of attorney below. Compare this with Will of John Talmadge above.

Thomas Talmadge came to America, 1631, in the ship *Plough*, which carried ten passengers. Another report says he came in the fleet with Governor Winthrop in 1630, see Savage, iv or ix, 252. He landed at Charlestown, moved to Boston and then Lynne. May 14, 1634, the "Genall Court" made "Thomas Talmage" a freeman. In 1637 a committee composed of Daniel Howe, Richard Walker and Henry Collins, was appointed to lay out farms, and in 1638 they allotted one of two hundred acres to "Thomas Talmage" and one of twenty acres for "Thomas Talmage his son." On September

3, 1640, a letter of attorney by the emigrants seems to have been executed at Boston.

Mr. S. C. N. Talmage in his *Talmage Genealogy*, 1901, writes that Thomas Lechford was an English lawyer who came to Boston, 1638, and returned to England, 1641. He was the first practising lawyer in Massachusetts and kept a notebook of legal memoranda which has been published and contains these entries, page 294, old 167:

“William Talmage, of Boston, in New England, Thomas Talmage, Robert Talmage and Richard Walker, husband of Jane Talmage, deceased, sonnes and daughter of Thomas Talmage, brother of John Talmage of Newton Stacey, in the county of Southampton, deceased, make a letter of attorney to Richard Conying and William Dowlying, overseers of the will of the said John Talmage, deceased, to receive of the executor and administrator of the last will and testament of Symon Talmage, our brother, and of John Talmage aforesaid, the summes of money due unto us by the will of the said John Talmage (and a certificate under the public seal. (L. S.).

Page 311 new, old 175: A letter of Attorney by William Talmage, Thomas Talmage and Robert Talmage aforesaid, and Richard Walker, to Mr. Ralph King to receive the money of the said overseer, dated Sept. 3, 1640. (A certificate made under the public seal. (L. S.).

From vol. 31 of the *New York Genealogical and Biographical Record*, I took the following notes:

A letter of attorney was made by William, Thomas, and Robert Talmage and Richard Walker, husband of Jane Talmage, deceased, all of Boston in New England, and sons and daughter of Thomas Talmage (brother of John Talmage of Newton Stacey, South^t, husbandman (deceased), to Mr. Ralph Kinge to receive certain sums of money from Richard Carrying and William Dowlying overseers of the Will of John Talmage, deceased, and from the executor of the will of Symon Talmage (their brother), due to them. This letter dated Sept. 3, 1640. Ralph King was a draper of Watford, England.

We next hear of Thomas, Sr., at Southampton, Long Island. This town was founded 1640, and most of the people came from Lynn, Mass. Thomas arrived shortly after the town was settled and in 1642 Thomas Talmage, Sr., was granted a home lot.

By order of the court on March 7, 1644, the town was divided into four wards and Thomas, Sr., lived in the first, while Thomas, Jr., and Robert lived in the second ward. Among the freemen March 8, 1649, is Thomas Talmage, and on May 10, 1649, he was number 13 in the list of Townsmen. He is not in the list of inhabitants 1657, and he must have left about 1650, going to Easthampton, of which his son, Thomas, Jr., was one of the founders in 1649. On May 24, 1651, Thomas Talmage, Sr., was fined for absence from Town Meeting at Easthampton. He probably died 1653, for on December 9, 1653, the town records show it was "ordered that the share of whale in controversy between Widowe Talmage shall be divided even as the lott is," and in February, 1654, Thomas Talmage (no Sr. or Jr. attached to name), was given five acres of land. Also it is recorded " . . . possessor of the land formerly granted to Thomas Talmage, senior, deceased," and on same page Thomas Talmage (no Sr. or Jr. attached to his name), is mentioned at living. There is no date on this page, but the following contains records dated May 24, 1655.

GENERATION TWO

2 SIMON TALMADGE. He lived and died in England. He was the principal heir of his uncle John Talmadge of Newton Stacey, Hants, who made his will 1638, and died before September, 1640. "Simon" as he spelled his name, made his will 1639, leaving most of his property to his wife and her family. He apparently had no children, and died 1640. His wife was Katharine Hay, daughter of Bartholomew Hay.

Simon Talmadge lived at Wherwell and signed his name in his will as it is here spelled.

Extract from will of Simon Talmadge, Decimo Septimo, March, 1639.

Symon Talmadge, Wherwell, yeoman, burried at Wherwell. Legatees Katharine Talmadge (wife), Bartholomew Hay, his father-in-law, mother-in-law, and to sister-in-law Elizabeth Hay, a bible which is at Salisbury. Mr. Binner (minister), and godchild John Canning. Katherine his wife, executrix.

Witnesses, Casper Binner (curate. temp of Wherwell, Bullington and Tuffton), Bartholomew Hay and John Canning.

Proved, March 27, 1640. Signature "Simon Talmadge."

3 WILLIAM TALMIDGE, TALMADGE or TALMAGE. He is supposed to have come from England in the fleet with Governor Winthrop in 1630, or in 1631 with his father Thomas, in the ship *Plough*, and landed at Charlestown. May 14, 1634, the "Genall Court" at Lynn, made "William Talmidge" a freeman.

"12th of the 6th August, 1636, at a meeting of the richer inhabitants subscriptions for a free school-master was taken." Governor Vane heads the list and William Talmadge was one of the 44 subscribers. He was a member of Rev. Elliot's church at Roxbury, who speaks highly of his wife in his church records. Elizabeth, wife of William Talmage, died December 20, 1660, at Lynn. He then married Elizabeth, daughter of John and Elizabeth Peirce, who was born at Boston, July 16, 1643. They had:

9 Elizabeth, born Sept. 22, 1666.

10 Mary, born Jan. 13, 1668.

These children seem to have died without issue, as Ann Flack, niece of William, eventually became his sole heir.

William Talmage's second wife died about 1669, for after that her name does not appear in the legal documents signed by her husband. June 2, 1670, William Talmage made an extraordinary agreement in which his father-in-law agreed to support him for life and his two daughters for sixteen years or until they married, and in return he deeded to his father-in-law for sixteen years his house, garden, orchard, cattle, certain of his lands, etc. William Talmage probably died before Jan. 9, 1672, when two witnesses testified that he had signed the above agreement. His name appears many times in the records from 1634 to 1672, after which he is referred to as deceased and his name is spelled at different times in the three ways given above. In deeds he described himself as a house carpenter and he seems to have been very prosperous.

4 CHRISTIAN TALMADGE or TALMAGE. She was born in England and married there, for in the will of John Talmadge of Newton Stacey, she is mentioned as Christian Wormlum. She probably came to America after 1640, for she was not one of the heirs of John Talmadge, who executed a joint letter of attorney at Boston, Sept. 3, 1640, in order to have their share of the inheritance sent them. However, she came to Boston, Mass., and married a man named Belcher—possibly Edward Belcher, who lived next her brother William at Boston. She had a daughter.

11 Ann, who was the sole heir of her uncle William Talmage, and in 1702 was the widow of Samuel Flack.

July 29, 1704, it was testified by several people that Christian Belcher and William Talmage, both of Boston, and at that time deceased, were brother and sister; she was supposed to be his only sister and Ann Flack, widow of Samuel, was her daughter and the only surviving next of kin.

5 JANE TALMADGE or TALMAGE. She was born in England and married Richard Walker about 1638, and died before Sept. 3, 1640. She is mentioned in the will of John

Talmadge of Newton Stacey, as Jane Talmadge, so if she married before he drew his will in 1838, the news presumably had not reached him in England. The letter of attorney signed by her brothers and husband in 1640, states she was deceased.

There were two Richard Walkers, presumably father and son. The elder was made freeman at Lynn in 1634; the younger and more probable husband of Jane Talmadge, was born 1611, came to America 1635 and went to Reading, where he became a representative.

6 CAPTAIN THOMAS TALMAGE. He was born in England and came to America with his father when a boy.

In 1637 a town meeting at Lynn appointed a committee to lay out farms; they were Daniel Howe, Richard Walker and Henry Collins. In 1638 they laid out a farm of twenty acres for Thomas Talmage, son of Thomas Talmage.

Thomas, Jr., went to Southampton shortly after that town was founded in 1640, and was granted land there in 1642.

On March 7, 1644, by order of the court Southampton was divided into four wards. In the first ward lived Thomas, Sr., and in the second ward lived Thomas, Jr., and Robert Talmage.

In 1649 Thomas, Jr., left Southampton with seven other men and founded the Town of Easthampton, where he lived the rest of his life. The new settlement seems to have prospered at once, for the next year there were thirty-six land holders. Thomas, Jr., was elected the first recorder or secretary, which position he held many years, alternating the exercise of the office with Benj. Price. In 1691 when he died he was the recorder.

In the Chronicles of Easthampton, by David Gardiner, it reads: Thomas Tallmadge, Jun., was the first recorder or secretary. Judging from his handwriting and orthography he must have had a good education for that period, when in the Mother Country the teaching of grammar was held by agrarians of that day "a corrupting of the youth of the realm." Taking the same extent of learning as a criterion, he had a much better education than some who have held higher stations in our own country in this enlightened age.

This little colony organized a force of fighting men to protect themselves in case of emergency and Thomas Talmage the recorder was chosen leader, and in 1660, Feb. 5th, the Court of Election confirmed his election as Lieutenant. Later his position was raised to that of Captain.

He acted for the town on most occasions and the New Netherlands Register notes that Thomas Talmage in 1673 was Town Clerk. In 1674 Thomas Talmage and others, in the name of the town of Easthampton petitioned the King to allow them to remain under the government of Connecticut, and in 1682 a unanimous vote agreed that the Constable, the Overseers, the clergyman and Thomas Talmage, should sign a petition and transmit it to the Governor. In 1686 Governor Thomas Dongan granted a patent for the town of Easthampton to Captain Thomas Tolmage and others.

Judge Hedges writes that the records show that at his death in 1691, Captain Thomas Talmage was the richest man in East Hampton. When he made his will, 1687, his wife Elizabeth, was living and it is probably she to whom Rev. Nathaniel Hunting refers when he records the death of Mrs. Talmage, May 20, 1704.

The children of Captain Thomas were:

- 16 Hanna, probably married Edward Jones, Jr. See will of Onesimus, also remarks under Thomas Talmage, No. 86.

Captain Thomas Talmage died between April and September, 1691, for his will, dated 1687, was proved 1691, Sept. 29, and on April 7, 1691, Thomas Talmage was re-elected Recorder.

In the earliest tax list we have, 1675, Captain Thomas Talmage is one of the four richest men and in the next list 1683 he is the richest inhabitant.

In 1663 Thos. Talmage was the first of the "Committee" of three, elected, who governed the town. In 1673 Lieut.

Thos. Talmage was one of the four magistrates elected that year. When Governor Dongan granted Easthampton a patent he appointed Captain Thomas Talmage one of the trustees of the freeholders until an election could be held the next year.

The Will of Captain Thomas Talmage.

I, having through the mercy of God, at present my reason and understanding, I do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following:

First, I give unto my well-beloved wife, Elizabeth Talmage, after my decease, my dwelling house and two cows and fodder for them for the winter, and pasturing for them for the summer, and also that she be provided for with corn, fire-wood, wool, flax and such necessary provision needful for her comfortable subsistence during the time of her life, and that by my sons that do succeed me, if she continue in a single state and abide in this place.

2ly, I do give to my son Nathaniel Talmage, my house lot and addition, which is about eleven acres of land, he no ways to infringe my wife's peaceable living upon the same as is above mentioned; also I do give to this my son Nathaniel on piece of land at Georgia, which is about ten acres; also I do give unto him twelve acres more as being part of a parcel of land that I have upon the North west Woodland Plain, and one piece of land more on the Great Plain about two acres and a half, and one acre more known by the name of Little Lots as also I do give unto him one-half of a piece of land that I have on the Eastern Plain, the whole is six acres. The parcels of land above mentioned I do give unto my son Nathaniel Talmage, after my decease, and to his heirs and assigns forever; also I do give unto him one-quarter part of my living cattle of what kind so ever.

3ly, I do give unto my son, Shubaell Talmage, my second home lot containing about six acres, and also one piece of land more joining to this home lot on the northward part of it containing about eight acres, and one piece of land more lying northward of this land last mentioned above, only a highway parting it, and it containeth about seventeen acres and a half, and I do give unto this my son Shubeall, the other half of

that piece of land that I have upon the Eastern Plain; it is about six acres in the whole, the one-half I have given to my son Nathaniel and the other half to my son Shubeall, and I do give unto my son Shubaell one piece of land more on the Eastern Plain, eastward of a place called by the name of the two Mile Hollow, and it containeth about two acres and a half, all this land above mentioned I do give unto my son Shubeall after my decease, and to his heirs and assigns forever.

4ly, I do give unto my son Onesimus Talmage, my close that lyeth something westward of this Town of East Hampton and it containeth about fifteen acres, as also I do give unto him four acres more on the Little Plains, as also part of one piece of land more that I have upon the Northwest Wood land Plain, the remaining part is about fifteen acres more or less: these parcels of land last mentioned above after my decease, I do give unto my son Onesimus Talmage and his heirs and assigns forever and also I do give unto these my two sons, Shubaell and Onesimus, three-quarters of what living cattle I have of whatsoever kind, and also what household goods I have I do give unto these my two sons Shubeall and Onesimus; only if God should take away either of my two younger sons while they abide in a single state, then the land to belong to those other two that do survive, and also I do grant that my two youngest sons shall have an equal part of the hay that cometh off from my home lot and addition with my son Nathaniel, and that for the space of three years after my decease, they doing equally alike for the getting of it, and also I do give unto my grandchild, Thomas Talmage, the son of Nathaniel Talmage, one little piece of land of mine that lyeth on the northeast end of the town, which for some time was made use of by Thomas Bee, by my consent, and it containeth something more than three acres as by the Town Records may appear, which said land I do give to this my aforesaid grandchild forever.

Also I having given formerly unto my daughter Naomi, what I could, I do now give unto her five shillings in common pay upon demand here three months after my decease. Also I do give to my daughter Mary Hand, forty shillings in common pay one year after my decease. Also I do give unto my daughter, Hanna Talmage, three pounds out of my estate in

common pay one year after my decease, and I do give unto my daughter, Sarah Bee, three pounds in common pay one year after my decease. All the rest of my lands and goods whatsoever that is not afore mentioned, with all the privileges that do or of right belong to me wherever it is, my debts and legacies being first paid, I do give unto these my three sons, Nathaniel, Shubaell and Onesimus Talmage, and do make them executors of this my last Will and Testament. To all and every of the above written premises I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty-third of April, 1687.

7 ROBERT TALMAGE. He was born in England and came to America as a young man. In 1638 his uncle, John Talmadge, of Newton Stacey, Hants, England, drew his will leaving Robert a legacy. On September 3, 1640, at Boston, Robert, with his brothers and brother-in-law signed a letter of attorney to Ralph King, of Watford, to get the money for them from the Overseers.

On March 7, 1644, Robert was at Southampton, Long Island, living in the second ward where Thomas, Jr., also lived; Thomas, Sr., living in the first ward.

Robert next appears at New Haven, where Robert Talmadge took the freeman's oath, July 1, 1644. In 1649 he was a married man. It is supposed that he married in 1648, though no record of this has yet been found. His wife was Sarah Nash, who was born in England and was probably the third child of Thomas Nash and Margery Baker. She was living in 1687 when Major John Nash left her, "the widow Talmage," a legacy. See the Nash Family of New Haven, Conn.

It is said that Robert Talmage was among the original purchasers of New Haven Colony in 1639, and that his brother or father Thomas, was also located there for a while at least. In 1662 the administrators filed in inventory of the estate of Robert Talmage.

8 DAVIS TALMAGE. The town records of Easthampton state, "Davis and Thomas Talmage shall have the land granted unto them," May 24, 1655. David or Davis, who died May, 1708, aged 78, and was therefore born 1630, must have been the youngest brother of Thomas, Recorder of Easthampton.

As the children of Thomas, his brother, are accounted in his will, and as Davis is the only known person who could have been their father, the following are recorded as his children:

GENERATION THREE

12 NATHANIEL TALMAGE. He was the oldest living son of Thomas, the first recorder of Easthampton, when that man made his will in 1687. He was born at Southampton, Long Island, 1643, removed when a boy with his father, who was one of the founders, to Easthampton, where he spent the rest of his life. In the early town records, the only records now extant, as the church records were lost by fire, Nathaniel T. Tallmage is a recorded witness 1668, September 27, Nathaniel Talmage sold a house 1676, June 28, and owned land south of Ben Conkling at Wainscott about 1678.

In 1687 Nathaniel was elected one of the two Constables—in those days officers of considerable importance. He was also a trustee of the town in 1689, 1692, 1701, 1703, and 1705.

About 1677 Nathaniel married Rebecca ———, who was born 1658, and died April 15, 1743, aged eighty-four or five, according to the church record. He died August 3, 1716. The church record is 1715, but it must be an error as his will in the New York County Surrogate Office is dated July 24, 1716. Their children as mentioned in his will, were:

28 Thomas, born 1676-1677.

29 John, born 1678.

30 Elizabeth Joan, born about 1685; unmarried in 1716.

Will of Nathaniel Talmage:

“In the name of God, Amen. I, Nathaniel Talmage, of Easthampton, In the County of Suffolk, within the collyen of

New York, Yeoman, being in my right mind and perfect understanding, doe make this my last will and Testament, I bequeath my soule to God that gave it, my body to the dust from whence it came, and my estate which God is pleased to bless me with as followeth, viz.:

First. I do give unto my son, John Talmage, all that my piece of land in the Parish of Bridghampton which I bought of Capt. Sayrs, and all that my parcell of Meadow ground lying on each side of Little norweser creek. Also one-half of all my commonage about this town and at Mahasset. All which parcle of Land Meadow and Commonage I doe give unto this my son John to him and his Hairs forever.

2ly. I doe give unto my son Thomas Talmage, my Home Lott bounded by the street East and the highway or common west, with the fences and building thaire as Erected: Except the house I now live in, which is for my wife's use dureing her widdowhood afterwards, to be his. Also all that my lott of land In Georgika ad the neck Lying between Thomas Mulford and Thomas Bakers Land, Also I do give ——— him twelve acres of land on the norwest plains and that if hee pleaseth to take it next to Thomas Chatfield's land the whole length of that division, it is my will it should be soo, and also all that my piece of land lying near south end of the calf pasture, being seven acres more or less, bounded by Thomas Mulford's Land Westerly the highway northerly and Easterly the beach South, also all that my piece of land Meadow and Lowe ground, lying and being on the West side of Great Norwest creek Joseph Osborn's meadow northerly Stephen Hedges Southerly, also I give to my son Thomas that division of land lying on this side of the road of the three mile harbor as it was laid out to my father, be it more or less, Also I give this my son Thomas one halfe of all my commonag: booth about this towne and at Manhasset throughout, all which parcels of land meadow and commonag I doe give unto this my son Thomas Talmage to him and his Hairs forever.

3ly. I do give unto my son Daniel Talmage all that my piece of land lying and being on the west side of Georgika containing twenty acres and a halfe bee it more or less all which piece and parcel of land I doe give unto this my son Daniell to him his Hairs and Assigns forever.

4ly. I doe give unto my son Enos Talmag three acres of

land near the Walnuts in the eastern plains and all that my foure acres and a halfe of land lying in the ould Eastern plains which I bought of Samuell Brook; and also all that my piece of land lying in Amoganset Woods Mr. John Gardner's land southerly and Capt. Samuel Mulford's land northerly: also my will is that my son Thomas Talmage doe lett my son Enos lands, and make it sure to him and his Hairs: under his hand and seales that piece of land at the North end of the Town joining to William Hodges home lot, containing upwards of three acres; But if my son Thomas Talmage shall neglect or refuse to let him to have it and secure the same to him as above said, then my will is, That my son Thomas pay unto my son Enos Talmage the sum of Twenty-five Pounds current money of New York. All which three parcels of land I doe give unto this my son Enos to him his Hairs and Assigns forever.

5ly. My will is that my son John shall have one chaine: my son Thomas shall have the cart, plows, and teame tackling; all of it except that chain: and the other utensils for husbandry work my will that they shall be equally divided between my son John and my son Thomas; and my son Thomas shall have the use and work of twoe oxen and twoe horse kind: if he hath occasion for them for the space and term of two years after my decease then to return them, to my wife disposing as she pleaseth and where as their was not yet a division of the meadow which was willed by my father to me and my brothers namely, Shubal and Onzimus Talmage. My will is that my two sons John and Thomas Talmage doe get all the Meadows Measured; that they formy part, and Shubal and Onzimus for their part may have an equall proportion of the same according to my Father's will in that case, And where as my father gave by his will several parcels of land and meadow unto my brother Shuball Talmage; and if it should happen my brother should dye without ishew, soo that his land or part thairof should fall to me or my sons then my will is that it be equally divided between my two sons John and Thomas Talmage: and also all lands, meadows, commonage and priveleges whatsoever not above mentioned to be equally divided between them that shall come by lands the aprentice Abell Barnes: my will is that my son Thomas shall hand him the time of his service and fulfill his endentures.

gly. I doe give unto my four daughters namely Elizabeth Joan Martha Russell Rebecka Talmag and Naomi Talmage to each of them a cow or the value thereof out of my moveable estate, and after my debts are paid the probat of my will and letters of Administration paid out of my moveable estate, I do give unto my beloved wife Rebecka all my house I now live in during her widdowhood and all my household goods and moveable estate not above mentioned to be at her disposal as she pleaseth, Only my desire is that my daughter Naomy shall have a double portion, I do hereby constitute and appoynt my twoe sons John and Thomas joyntly to be my Executors of this my last will and testament: This I do declare to be my last Will and Testament.

Given under my hand and seale at Easthampton this twenty-fourth day of July One thousand seven hundred and sixteen. In the second year of the Reigne of King George.

“ May ye 21, 1670.

“The Testimony of Japhett being present spectator at the drowning of John Taylmag hee declares as followeth. I see nor perceive no difference betwixt them that was washing of sheep & John talmag neither in word or action after they had don washing the sheep Arthur Crease went into the boat to goe into the pond to swimming and John taylmage, Ralph Dayton, and Jeremy Millor waded to the boat to goe out along with him and after they was gone out into the pond they put off their Cloaths three of them to wash them selves Ralph Dayton going out of the boate first to swimming and Arthur Crease second and John Taylmage last I could not perceive

but John Taylmage did swime as well as the other two after awhile I perceive Arthur swimming to the boate and calling to Jeremy Miller to bring the boat and then I see John Taylmage spring out of the water a little way and presently he sunk down and I see him no more alive two Children more can testife to the same effect Jeremy Miller and Mary Conklin."

15 MARY TALMAGE. Mentioned in her father's will 1687, as the wife of Hand. This was probably Thomas Hand, son of John, the first of that name in the colonies, and one of the first eight settlers of Easthampton.

Thomas Hand removed to Cape May, New Jersey, and their descendants are said to still live in that region.

17 SARAH TALMAGE. Mentioned in her father's will 1687, as the wife of Bee, probably Thomas Bee, who he says used some of his land by his consent.

18 SHUEBALL TALMAGE. He was the second son of Thomas, living when this man drew his will in 1687. He was born about 1656, and died October 1, 1742, aged eighty-five or six according to the church record. He remained single, and lived at Easthampton all his life as far as is known. He was witness to the will of Thomas James, who was the first minister of Easthampton, officiating there about fifty years, and also Trustee of the town in 1704.

19 CAPTAIN ONESSIMUS TALMAGE. He was the third living son of Thomas Talmage, when he drew his will, 1687, and at that time was unmarried. He was born 1662 and died 1723, Februray 1st, at about sixty-one years of age. He married Rebecca Wheeler, who is probably the aged Widow Talmage who died January 4, 1751. He was probably captain of the local militia, as he is repeatedly referred to in records of the time as "Captain," and he was trustee of the town in 1699, 1700, 1703, and 1706. Their children were:

In the name of God, Amen, the thirty first Day of January in the year of our Lord God 1722/23 in the ninth year of the Reign of King George over Great Britain, I Onissimus Talmage of East Hampton in the County of Suffolk being very sick and weak of body but of perfect Sound mind and memory and calling to mind that it is appointed of all men to die I therefore make and ordain this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form following: to say first and principally I Give and Recommend my Soul to God that gave it and my Body to be buried in the Earth at the discreation of my Executors hereafter to be named not doubting but at the Day of the General Resurrection I shall receive the same by the mighty power of God and as Touching all such Worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to Bestow upon me I give and dispose thereof in manner and form following—

First that my Just Debts and Funeral charges be all paid or ordained to be paid in some convenient time after my decease.

Secondly I give & Bequeath unto my Beloved Wife Rebeckah the west end of my now dwelling House from the Botom unto the top for the Term of her Natural life in like manner one end of my Barn that end thereof next my said House and I give unto my said Wife my Teem and Wainage with one third part of the rest of my personal Estate except my Tools and Instruments of Husbandry.

Thirdly I Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Phebe Gold the other part of my Dwelling House and Barn that I have not above given to my Wife and Two Thirds parts of my Home Lott and Two Thirds parts of Six Acres of Land adjoining to the Land of John Hedges and Two Thirds parts of my Meadow lying at little Norwest and one third part of all my

Right at Meantauck and in the Town Commons Reserving of that part that I have given my Daughter Phebee—

Fourthly—I give unto my Daughter Phebee after the Decease of my Wife all that part of my Home Lott House and Barn and Six Acres of Land adjoining to John Hedges Land and Right at Meantauck and in the Commons that I have given my Wife for her Natural life to be and Remain unto my said Daughter Phebee and to the heirs of her own Body with the other Land and privileges that have given her and for want of such heirs to Return to my other Two Daughters Namely Sarah & Mary all my Lands, Meadows Right at Meantauck and Commons not above Disposed of I Give to be equally Divided among my three Daughters and my Will is that my Daughters Mary and Sarah shall have the liberty to live in that part of my House that I have given my Wife after her Decease untill they marry. Finally I appoint Edward Jones, Jr.—my Brother-in-Law John Wheeler to be Executors of this my last Will and Testament.

Signed sealed published pronounced and Declared by Onissimus the above Instruments to be his Last Will and Testament the Day and year above written in the presence of us the subscribers.”

21 LT. THOMAS TALMAGE, TALMADGE or TALLMADGE. He was born at New Haven, Conn., October 17, 1650. He was one of the “proprietors” of New Haven, 1685, and was elected four times to the Town Legislature. He was a sergeant, later lieutenant, and distinguished himself in the burning of Schenectady, New York, where his brother Lieutenant Enos, was killed. He is supposed to have died 1730. Elizabeth, wife of Lt. Thomas Tallmadge, died October 12, 1719. She was said to be the daughter of Joseph Alsop.

He is in Bradley's list of New Haven proprietors, 1685. He died April, 1690. She was born October 30, 1658, and baptised January 22, 1659.

Abigail Bishop was the granddaughter of Captain George Lamberton of the famous phantom ship. James Bishop, her father, was a distinguished public man, holding many offices, as Magistrate, Commissioner on the Union of the New Haven and Connecticut Colonies, Deputy Governor of New Haven, 1662-3, and of Connecticut, 1683-7, etc.

24 LIEUTENANT ENOS TALMAGE. He was born at New Haven, Conn., October 4, 1656, and married Hannah Yale, daughter of Thomas Yale, May 9, 1682. He is in Bradley's list of proprietors of New Haven, 1685, and went to the defense of Schenectady in command of the assistance sent by Connecticut, and was killed in the burning of the town, February 9, 1690, by the Indians.

Hannah Yale was the daughter of Thomas Yale and Mary Turner, and granddaughter of Captain Nathaniel Turner. November 14, 1695, she married Samuel Bishop.

26 ENOS TALMAGE. He was born at Easthampton, 1660, was a very tall man, according to Major Thomas Talmage, who visited Easthampton in 1752, and lived to a great age. Major Thomas also mentions that the wife of Enos, also very aged and exceeding short as her husband was tall, was alive at this time. Major Thomas says that Enos was his grandfather, and that he had the following children:

57 John.

58 Daniel, the youngest child, born, 1693; died 1725 at Elizabethtown, N. J.

This Major Thomas married Elizabeth Wick, a granddaughter of one of his aunts, the daughter of Enos. He also states his three uncles were alive in 1752 when he visited Easthampton.

Enos Talmage, born 1660; died 1753, at Easthampton, and Mrs. Catherine, relict of Mr. Eanos Talmage, who died May 12, 1752, aged sixty-six, may refer to this family. See No. 33.

I have already credited Daniel, son of Nathaniel, of Easthampton, as born 1693, died 1725, at Elizabethtown, N. J., so if it was Daniel, son of this Enos, who died there his descendants trace through this line.

Thomas, the son of the above Major Thomas Talmage, recorded the above genealogical record apparently from memory thirty-nine years after his father's death, and seventy-seven years after his father's only known visit to his relatives at Easthampton, so that some confusion seems quite possible. From the known records, wills, etc., Enos does not appear to have had any children, and those here credited to him and described by Major Thomas, coincide exactly with what we know of the children of Nathaniel Talmage, the cousin of Enos.

GENERATION FOUR

28 THOMAS TALMAGE. He was the oldest son of Nathaniel, and was born about 1677, though possibly 1676. As the church records of this time were all destroyed by fire, the date of his marriage as well as birth is missing, yet other dates of events show that he was very probably born in 1676 or 1677, for his younger brother John seems to have been born 1678 and their mother Rebecca was born 1658. As one of his daughters died aged about fifteen in 1713, according to the church record, he must have married about 1697, when twenty years old.

The earliest reference to him is in his grandfather's will dated 1687. He inherited the original Talmage home at Easthampton and lived there where he died, 1764, October 24.

In 1709 Thomas Talmage was elected Constable of Easthampton, which office had also been held by his father, and he was trustee of the town in 1730, 1732, 1742 and 1745.

29 JOHN TALMAGE. He was born at Easthampton, Long Island, New York State, 1678.

On December 25, 1702, John Talmage and Experience Mil-

ler were married by Rev. Nathaniel Hunting, second minister of Easthampton, who notes that they were the twentieth couple he had married. Experience died August 30, 1723, and was born 1685, for Rev. Hunting notes she was thirty-eight years old. She was no doubt the daughter of Lieutenant Jeremy Miller of Easthampton, who was born 1655 and died January 2, 1723. For further information of the Miller family, see Hedges, Easthampton, pages 305-311.

John married again about 1725, and was survived many years by his widow Ann. He died November 2, 1764, "aged 86," according to his tombstone, and his widow Ann died February 24, 1788, aged ninety-eight years. In 1716 John and his brother Thomas inherited the greater part of their father's estate; John's share lying largely in the Parish of "Brighampton." He resided at Wamscott about six miles west of Easthampton.

Hunting, and again in 1764 Rev. Buell, the third minister of the town of Easthampton, restored John Talmage to communion.

He was trustee of the town in 1732 and his name appears as a member of the Suffolk Regiment about 1715, among the soldiers from Easthampton.

Except for the two daughters who died young and Joseph, who went to Branford, Conn., to live, all of John's children are mentioned in his will dated 1760, and he left most of his property to John, Jr. and Enos, the two oldest sons of his two wives.

The Reverend Nathaniel Hunting, who married John and Experience in 1702, was a graduate of Harvard College, class of 1693, and went to Easthampton, L. I., where he was the minister for fifty years, officiating at the baptisms, marriages and deaths of a large number of the Talmadge family spreading over five generations.

He is said to have gone about 1719 to Elizabethtown, New Jersey, where he married. He died at Elizabethtown, N. J., 1725.

This may be so but so far I have not been able to verify it. We have at present nothing but the gravestone of Enos to verify his existence and there are no records (town or church), that refer to Talmages whose ancestry does not seem very clear and who might be the children of Enos. Nor is there the record of a marriage of a Jones or Wick to a girl who might be the daughter of this Enos Talmage. However, it is possible that the marriage took place before 1696, the records of which period are lost and that the other children removed from Easthampton or associated themselves with Bridgehampton.

154 JOSIAH TALMAGE. Born at Branford, Conn., November 25, 1736; he was baptised by the Rev. Hunting of Easthampton, Long Island, May 1, 1737. On March 15, 1759, he married Sybil Todd, daughter of Stephen Todd, Warham Williams, the Town Clerk of Branford, officiating. They resided at Branford for a while, but later went to Cheshire, where Sybil died at the age of thirty-six, on April 23, 1778, and Josiah six years later in 1784.

Public records of New York and Connecticut States prove that several of Josiah's younger brothers took part in the Revolution. Of Josiah we have simply the one incident related by his sister Sally, to Henry Talmadge on August 12, 1846, which Mr. Talmadge recorded at the time.

"When the news came to Branford that the British had landed at New Haven Josiah Talmage, my great grandfather, immediately mounted his horse, took his gun and powder and ball and provisions, and started for New Haven, and met them in Mark Lane. He fought till they got his horse from him and then he fought till he recovered his horse and the British retreated to their ships. He fired at them from behind a post or stump and the post stood for several years with the bullet holes in it that were shot at him. He returned home in safety after being absent three or four days." A reference to any history of the taking of New Haven by the British, will show that this was a typical instance of the fight. The country rose up to resist the British, every man acting independently, as his own general.

Josiah was probably deterred from taking a more active

part in the war as he had three or four children all under six years, and most Revolutionary soldiers were much younger men than he. His oldest son Samuel, was also a soldier of the Revolution.

He was found dead with a piece of old shoe in his mouth.

Another record states he was captured by the British in 1782, so the date of his death is doubtful, though the first account is I believe the more authentic.

247 COL. BENJAMIN TALLMADGE. He was born at Brookhaven, February 25, 1754; he graduated from Yale College in 1773, after which he taught school. It is said that President Dagget of Yale College, examined him when he was only twelve years old and found him sufficiently advanced in his learning to enter Yale College, but he did not do so for several years.

During the greater part of the Revolution he was an officer on the staff of General George Washington, the Commander-in-Chief. His ability and boldness as a soldier are recognized by the leading histories of the War. One of his most notable achievements being his attack on Fort George, Long Island, November, 1780, which he captured including the ships under its guns, and his return to Connecticut without the loss of a man. As a result, Congress passed a resolution of thanks to Major Tallmadge and his men, and General Washington sent him a letter of congratulation. His many achievements are too numerous to consider here, but many may be noted in his official correspondence with General Washington, and his autobiography probably gives many interesting details.

In passing it must be noticed that Major André was captured by men in his command and was in his custody until his death. Even this unfortunate gentleman gave his testimony to the kind and thoughtful conduct and gentlemanly bearing of Major Tallmadge.

After the war, Col. Benjamin Tallmadge made his home in

Litchfield, Conn., where he became a successful merchant and bank president; for many years he was a representative in the United States Congress, from 1801 to 1817, after which he refused a re-election.

On March 18, 1784, he married Mary, daughter of General William Floyd, a New York representative in the Continental Congress, a signer of the Declaration of Independence, and later a Governor of New York. She died June 3, 1805, in her forty-second year; and Col. Benjamin married, second, Maria Hallet, daughter of his old friend, Joseph Hallet, of New York, on May 3, 1808. One of Col. Benjamin Tallmadge's most highly prized souvenirs of the Revolution was a portrait of General George Washington, with which his chief presented him shortly before his death. An interesting incident showing the intimacy between Col. Tallmadge and General Washington, is the fact that Col. Tallmadge posed for the lower part of the famous portrait of Washington by Trumbull. General Washington's time was so taken up with public affairs that at his request, Col. Tallmadge posed for the legs, Trumbull having pronounced Col. Tallmadge's legs an exact pattern of General Washington's.

"Col. William Smith Livingston possessed great physical strength, and with Col. Benjamin Tallmadge, had the reputation of being the handsomest man in the Revolutionary Army." They were second cousins.

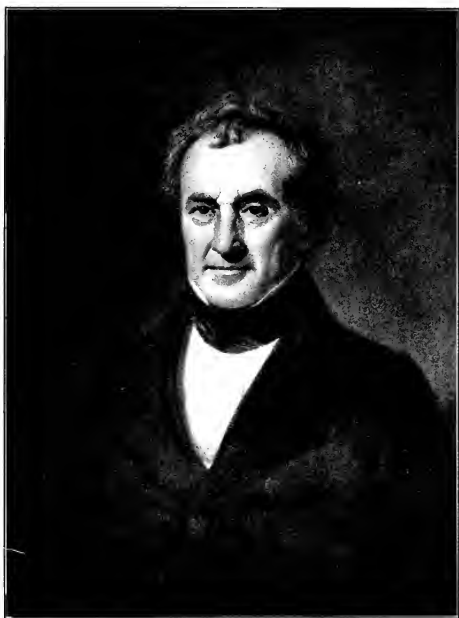

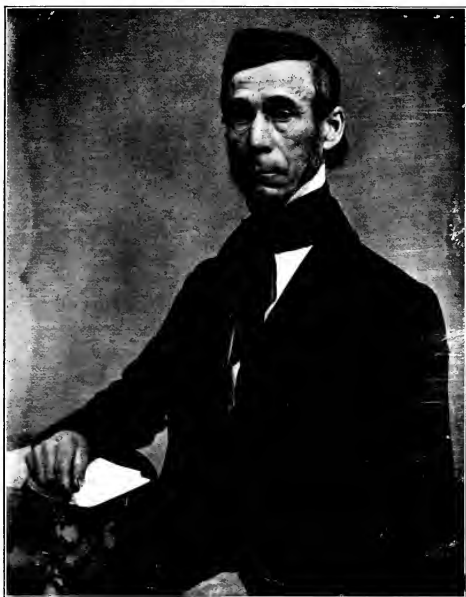

Brooklyn is much indebted to his enterprise in developing the Eighth Ward. Third and Fifth avenues were opened by him, running through the Van Brunt and Talmage farms. 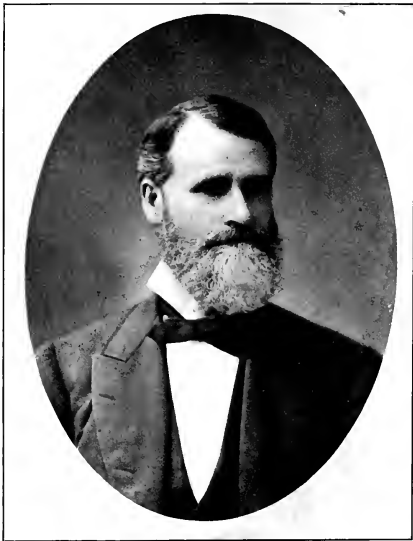
At the age of sixteen Henry graduated from the Westfield Academy, and got a position in a Hartford bank; later he went into business in Troy, N. 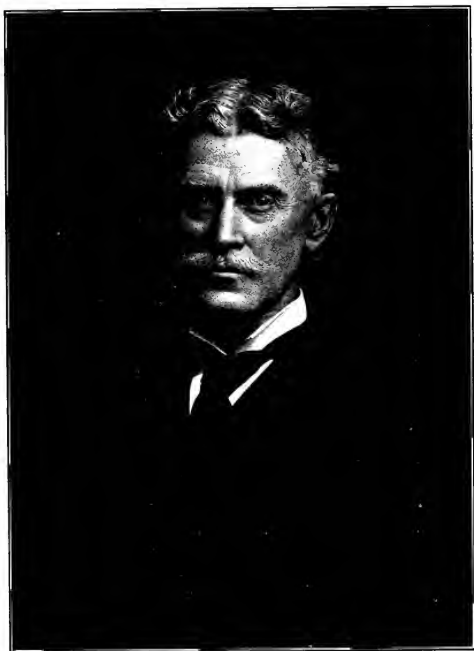

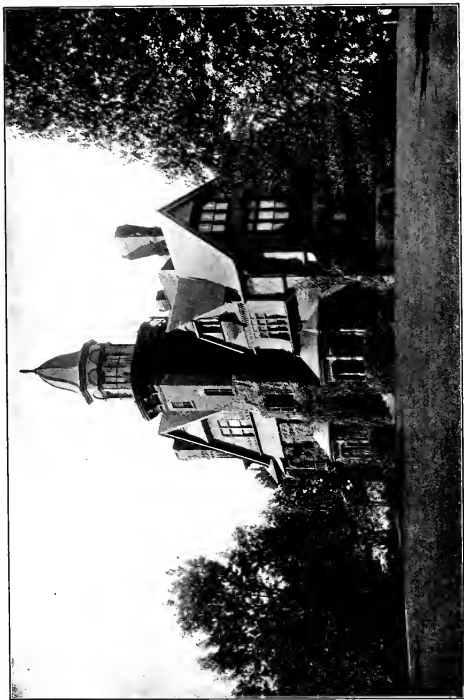

Overseers: John Grace son-in-law of Penton and Thomas Buckley of Longparish. Signed by mark. Witnesses: Hugh Whistler, John Commin. Codicil mentions Edward Talmage eldest son about to marry Joane Evred. Witnesses: Hugh Whistler, Richard Goodall and R. Willis.

The records at Winchester contain no baptisms at Newton Stacey or Barton Stacey prior to 1713. Those for Wherwell date from 1624. The marriages recorded at Winchester prior to 1650 are: William Talmadge and Alice Blake, October 3, 1595; Robert Talmadg and Alice Hunt W. of East Woodhay, October 11, 1602; John Brodowe and Joan Talmage, January 30, 1602; John Clarke of Shawbourne and Annis Talmage, July 16, 1604; John Pearse and Mary Talmayge, October 24, 1625; Thomas Buckland and Alice Talmage, February 18, 1632. These marriages all occurred at Faccomb. There were apparently no marriages of this family in the other parts of the county on record.

A letter dated December, 1906, from Rev. U. Z. Rule, Vicar of Barton Stacey, says the early records were presumably lost or destroyed, for the parish records are now in his keeping and they do not go back further than 1715. Also there is at present no one of the name in the parish.

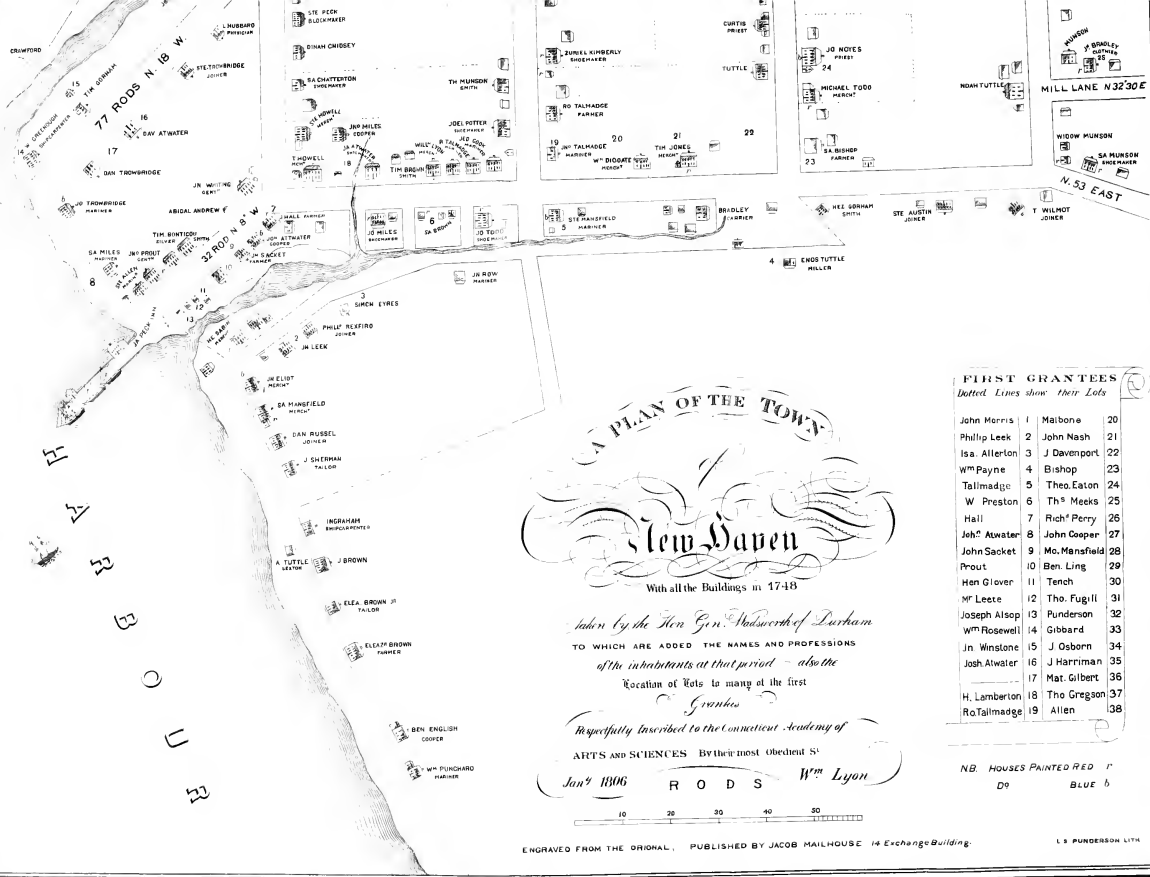

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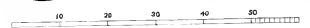


A PLAN OF THE TOWN

progenitors in North America, about two hundred years since, to the year of our Lord 1829.

By me, Thomas Talmage the 3rd of the 4th generation—so far as has come to my knowledge; which was obtained by oral conversation—1st partly from my immediate father Thomas Talmage the 2nd of the 3rd generation. 2ndly, partly from a Major Potter, an intelligent gentleman, immediately from Great Britain, who had a personal acquaintance with the origin of the family—and which was of Welch extraction. and 3rdly from a written correspondence, kept up for some time, by me, with Col. Benjamin Tallmadge, (late member of Congress) county of Litchfield, state of Connecticut. All substantially agreeing in the same account, has induced me, Thomas Talmage the 3rd, of the 4th generation, to make a record thereof, this 30th day of Jan. 1829., (there being no written family record as known of by me) for the use of future generations.

A member of the family original, having performed some great achievement for the benefit of his government—a Royal Grant was made to him (and his successors, of the male kind) of Nobility, with a large estate annexed to it, to go down by legitimate descent to the oldest son, through succeeding generations, well understood by the honorable title of Lord Dorsett. (Dysart).

In the year 1779—happening to have a conversation with the aforesaid Maj. Potter, who was then in America, he informed me that Lord Tellemach, then Lord Tallmadge, or Earl of Dorsett, was yet living, and about 80 years of age, but having no issue or descendant in Great Britain to inherit after him, it was generally believed that both his title and large estate would revert to the Crown royal, after his decease, which things, tis presumed, have long since taken place.

(The name Tellemach was of Welch spelling and pronunciation, but was changed to suit the idiom of the English Tongue to Tallmadge, which is still kept up to this day with the Connecticut family, and pretty generally by the remaining family at East Hampton, and only altered as I presume, by my father, in order to make the name shorter in writing, as his own brother Daniel kept up the original spelling till his death. A legitimate heir to the Peership might have doubtless been found, either in the family in Connecticut, or in the one at East Hampton, but as no family Registry, regularly kept, could be found, so as

to produce sufficient evidence of the proper facts, and as the inheritance according to the Royal Grant, could not be possessed without returning to Great Britain again, the idea of obtaining it was given up.)

In the time of severe religious persecution, it is said, that two of the brothers of the then Lord Dorsett, came over to America (somewhere 'tis presumed, in the year 1600), which was then parcelled out into British Colonies. The one, settled somewhere in Connecticut, name not now recollected by me. The other, Enos Tallmadge and his wife (who were my great grand parents), settled on Long Island, East Hampton, Colony of New York.

Their progeny were 4 sons, Enos, Thomas, John and Daniel; and two daughters, names not known.

The *three* first sons, and, 'tis presumed, the two daughters lived and died somewhere near the place where their progenitors first settled.

Daniel, as my father informed me, was the youngest of the brothers; and pretty early in life he came to Elizabeth Town, N. J. There he married and settled. Dying young he had but two sons, Daniel and Thomas (the last was my immediate father), and a daughter named Hannah. My father being then about three years old (as he has often told me), was taken by my Mother's sister Eunice, then married to Thomas Riggs, and settled at Baskingridge, Somerset Co., New Jersey. There he was brought up, till about 15 years of age, when he returned to his sister Hannah, then married to John Ross, Esquire, of Elizabeth Town, and with whom he learned the trade of a House Carpenter.

After serving his apprenticeship out, and when he had arrived to 24 years he married Hannah Norris, of respectable family; by whom he had *three* sons—Daniel, John and Enos. About this time my father removed his family to, and settled at Baskingridge, aforesaid. Pretty soon after this his first wife died, and was buried in the churchyard in that place. My father, being now a widower, took it in his head to visit his predecessors at East Hampton. There he had the pleasure of seeing his grandfather, Enos Tallmadge, his grandmother, and three of his uncles, then all living. His grandparents were both very aged, the husband about six feet, three inches high, the wife rather of smaller stature than the ordinary. At

She was granddaughter of one of his aunts, and great granddaughter to his grandfather, and, of course, they were 2nd cousins. They were shortly afterwards married by Rev. Samuel Buel, and then departed together for Baskingridge.

I now proceed to give a history of my fathers family, respecting their births—places of their nativity—times of their decease, and where buried, *all which I am well acquainted with, either personally or by information from my parents, etc.*

Weekly Register, New Haven, Connecticut, Saturday, December 6, 1873. History of a Connecticut Family. Genealogy of one of New Haven's First Settlers.

Among the names of the original grantees or purchasers of town lots at the settlement of New Haven in 1639 as published in a late number of the *Weekly Register*, were those of Robert and James Tallmadge. The history of the latter is unknown, but several of the descendants of Robert have resided in New Haven in unbroken succession from that time to the present—a period of 234 years; while many have removed to various portions of the Union and filled places of honor and trust in the civil and military service of the country. A brief history of this old Connecticut family may not be uninteresting to your readers; and I have taken the trouble of collecting a few facts and dates regarding the same. . . .

The present family is said to have descended from Lionel Tallmasche, a gentleman in great favor with King James I. of England, who made his eldest son a Scottish peer as Lord Huntingtower. Two of the brothers of this family, James and Robert, became Puritans and were obliged to flee from England taking refuge in Holland, whence they came to America and settled in Boston, in 1630. Here they remained until 1639, when they joined the original party of pioneers which penetrated the wilds of southwestern Connecticut and laid the foundations of the present beautiful city of New Haven.

Robert established himself as a planter and became identified with all the various projects for the improvement and protection of the new colony. We have no record of any particular military exploit performed by him during the Indian hostilities which followed the settlement, but it requires no stretch of imagination to picture the pious wrath that filled his Puritan

soul at the murders and robberies of the savages, or the aptness with which he quoted an appropriate passage of Old Testament Scripture as he pulled the trigger which sent a red-skin to the happy hunting ground. He evidently trusted in the Lord and lived temperately, for after performing his duties faithfully to the church and state for a period of nearly half a century he died about 1680 at the ripe age of eighty years. His children are:

Thomas, born Oct. 17, 1650.

Sarah, born Sept. 19, 1652.

John, born Sept. 11, 1654.

Enos, born Oct. 4, 1656.

Marah, born Sept. 2, 1659.

Thomas Tallmadge, the eldest son of Robert, also settled in his native place and became a prominent citizen. He was a Lieutenant in Captain Bull's company of Colonial troops, and was present and distinguished himself at the burning of Schenectady by the French and Indians in 1690. He was a person of great physical strength as well as personal courage and took a prominent part in all the military operations of those perilous times. The Indians specially disliked to encounter him in battle and gave him the soubriquet of "Powder Tom." It is said that whenever they discovered an expedition against them was headed by "Powder Tom" they concluded it was best to either submit at once or to leave the neighborhood very suddenly. He was not in the habit of sending a peace commission to civilize them before punishing the offenders, but he first conquered them in battle and then civilized the survivors, what few there were remaining, etc.

The facts as we now know them do not entirely verify either the record in the family Bible or the article in the *Weekly Register*, though they are corroborated by such evidence as an old silver snuff-box with the Dorset or Dysart arms engraved on the lid which has been at least a number of generations in one branch of the family, while another family has some very old silverware that was made in Holland and is believed to have been brought from there by their ancestor Robert, one of the founders of New Haven.

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
