

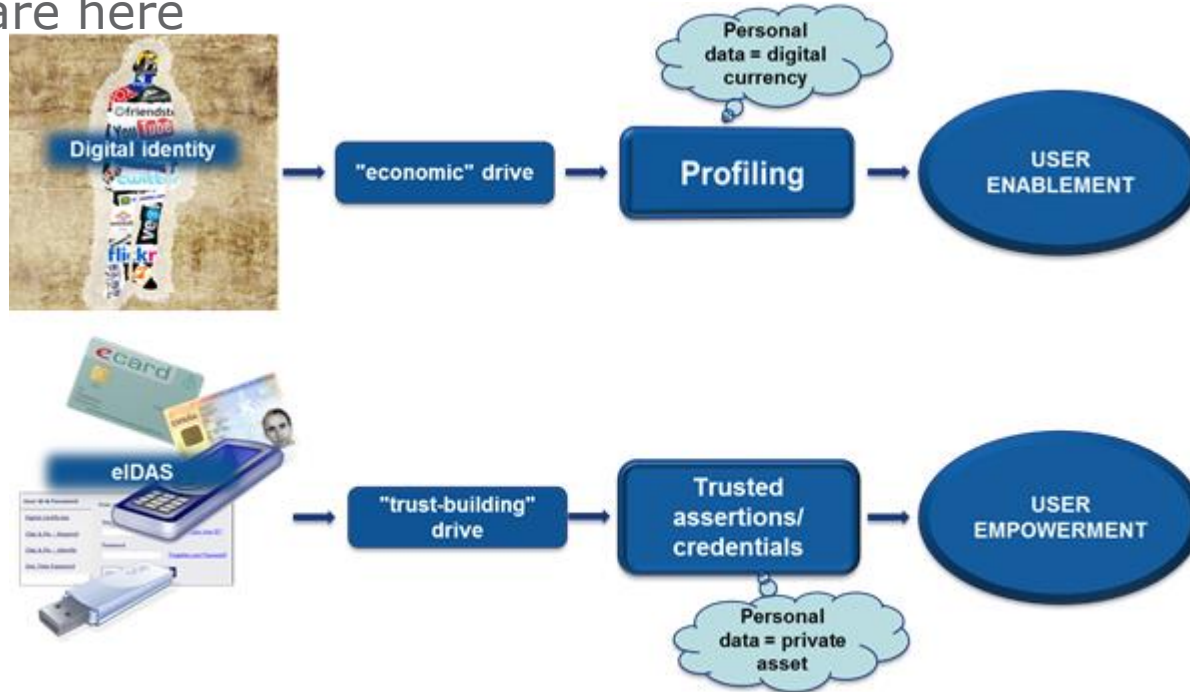

Commission Communication on Online Platforms and the Digital Single Market (COM(2016)288)

*"The Commission will further promote interoperability actions, including through issuing principles and guidance on eID interoperability at the latest by 2017. The aim will be to **encourage online platforms to recognise other eID means** — in particular those notified under the eIDAS Regulation (EC) 910/2014 — **that offer the same reassurance as their own**".*

"We call upon the Commission to take steps to increase the recognition of eIDAS compliant solutions by global market players, in particular, for notified electronic identification means and qualified website authentication certificates, and to provide support to accelerate the uptake of those services for cross-border activities"

What has changed in the updated version

- 3 principles updated – out of 9
- Clearer language, e.g. "identification" vs "authentication"
- Clearer link with data protection rules
- Guidance updated to make language more consistent
- Clearer indication of who is responsible for what
- No unnecessary authentication-related data should be stored – fulfilment of online platforms' legal requirements always
