

Section 24-33.5-216.5 (4), C.R.S., requires the Executive Committee to establish a process by which a member of the General Assembly may request protection from the Colorado State Patrol.


If there is an urgent threat to a member of the General Assembly, the member must first notify the Colorado State Patrol via the 24-hour dispatch number (303.866.3660). They shall then notify the leader of their respective chamber (Senate President or Speaker of the House) to request additional protection, who will then consult with Colorado State Patrol (CSP) and the Department of Public Safety (DPS) to determine if and what level of additional protection is needed.

If the request for additional protection is not related to an immediate threat, the member may bring this to the President of the Senate, Minority Leader of the Senate, the Speaker of the House, or the Minority Leader of the House, with as much notice as possible, who will consult with CSP and DPS to determine if and what level of additional protection is needed. This can then be raised with the Executive Committee for approval.
