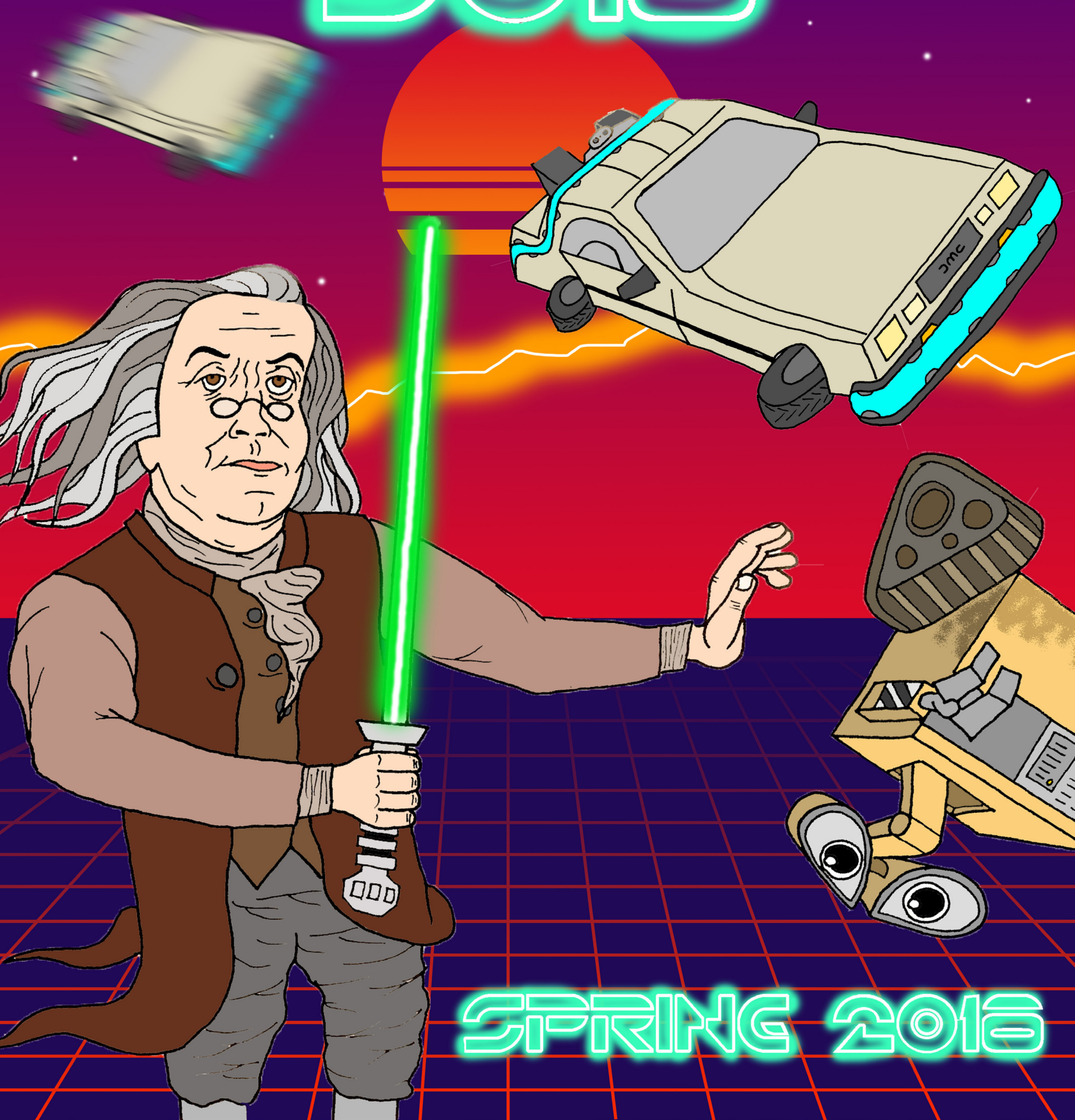
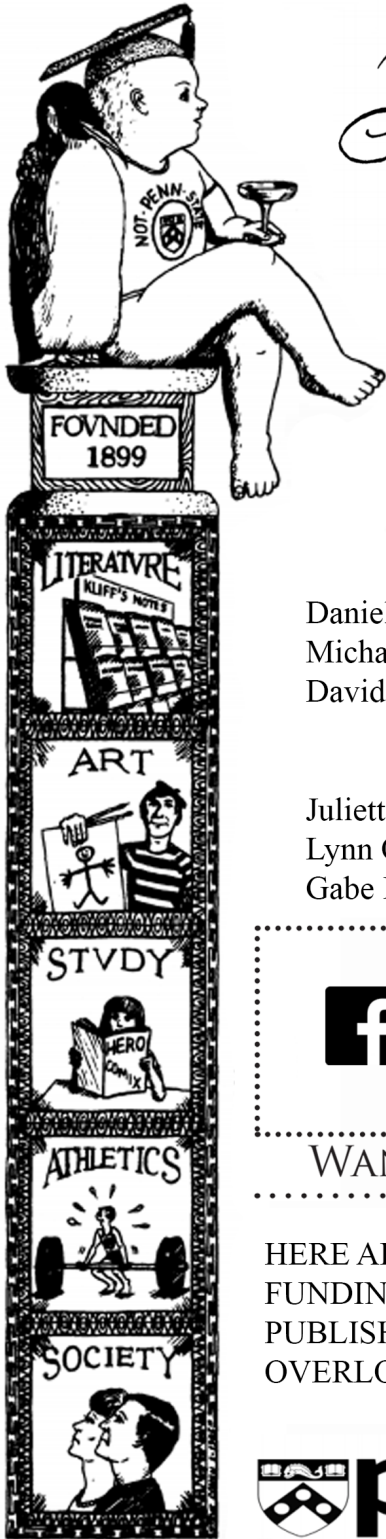

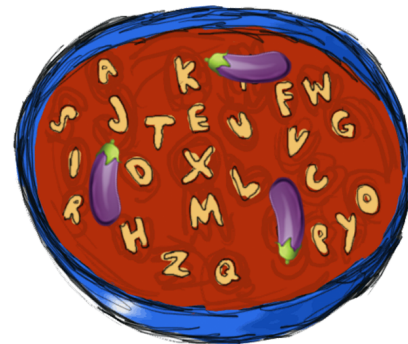

## Global Warming Proven Wrong as Temperature Dips Below 115

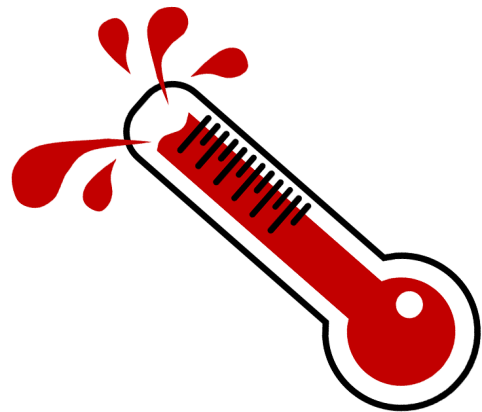

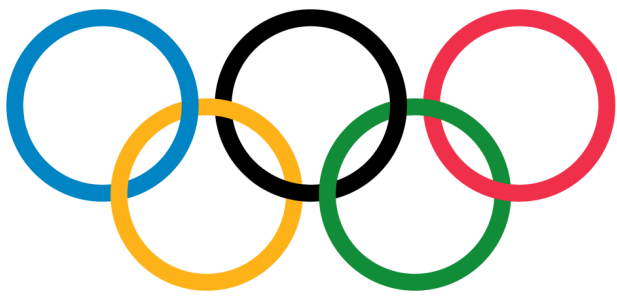

## Alpine Skiing

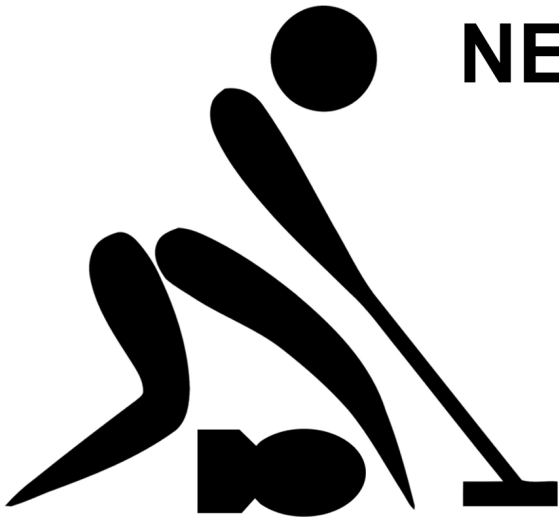

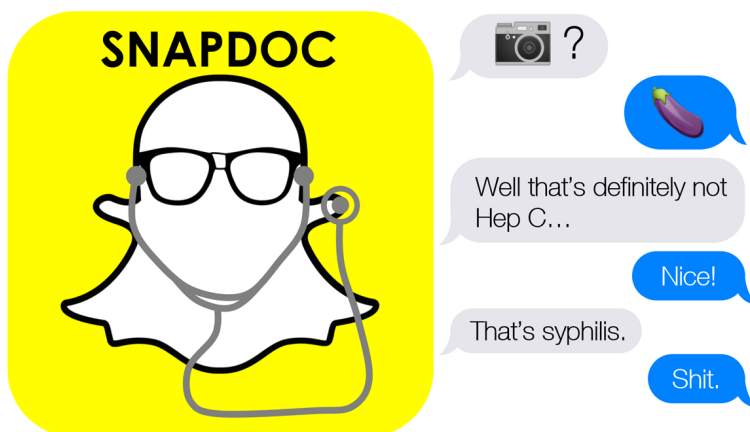
## 2. Plants Have Feelings, Too
