ADDITIONAL GRANT WANTED.

A deputation consisting of Messes, Cox, W. J. Wiseman, S. Brown, T. Cook, J. A. Mayo, and Dr. Kerr, introduced by Mr. J. B. Nicholson, M.J.A. weited upon the Chief Secretary (Mr. J. Hogue) on Tuesday, to ask for a grant of £1000, so that operating and isolation blooks and a hot water installation should be added to the Wollowsong Albert Memorial Hospital, which is now being erected. These additions, it was explained, would run, into something like £1200 and even if the Chief Secretary acceded to the deputation's request, there would still be a deficiency of over £1000, which the committee undertook to see was wiped off. The present operating moon, it was stated, was not up to the requirement of such an important district, and the necessity of an isolation block was emphasised by a condition attached to the original grant, and which compelled the hospital to accept infectious cases,

Mr. Hogue said that when he laid the foundation stone of their hospital has was pleased to find that the people of Wollongong were willing to help themselves. He thought the Government had done very well in handing £2000 over to them, and he could not promise them any more.
