REVIEW OF EVENTS
JANUARY 1967

GENERAL

During January, U.S. strength in-country increased from nearly 391,000 to about 404,000. Breakdown of U.S. strength by service at 26 January was: Army 253,000; Marine Corps 73,000; Air Force 53,000; Navy 24,000; and Coast Guard 400(+). Other Free World strength remained at about 53,000. The three Free World countries most heavily represented were: Republic of Korea, Australia and the Republic of the Philippines. Estimated enemy strength in-country increased from 280,000 to 284,000.

Known enemy personnel losses (based on partial returns) were over 4,900 killed, an increase over December's 4,059 killed. Total Chieu Hoi Returnees during January numbered over 2,300, down slightly from December but still maintaining the high peak entered in October - November. Enemy weapons losses during the first 21 days of the month were 1,525 individual weapons and 69 crew-served weapons, well above preceding month's figures of 1,306 individual weapons and 83 crew-served weapons.

The New Year's stand-down was in effect from 0700H on 31 December until 0700H on 2 January. During the stand-down period, USMACV recorded 111 incidents and reported 24 to the press as significant.

The 2d Brigade, 9th Infantry Division arrived in the Republic on 30 January.

Air activity over North Vietnam continued to be curtailed by bad weather. Strike pilots took advantage of short breaks in the bad weather to strike at targets near Thai Nguyen and major lines of communication between Phu Ly and Thanh Hoa.

In the Republic, USAF and USMC pilots continued to support ground operations. Operation Cedar Falls and Prairie received the majority of the support.

ENEMY ACTIVITY

Enemy units initiated a number of significant small-unit attacks against U.S. units during the month.

The first of these attacks occurred in Pleiku Province early on 7 January when an enemy force attacked Camp Holloway Airfield employing a ground assault supported by mortars. Enemy secondary attacks were launched against Pleiku Air Base and Lac Trung Sub Sector at the same time. The enemy mortars delivered 207 rounds of 81mm mortar fire from 10 mortar positions within a 20 minute period. Elements of the ground assault penetrated to the center of Camp Holloway where they employed satchel charges and grenades. Artillery, armed helicopters and flareships supported the defense. Friendly casualties were light; equipment and aircraft damage were light. One enemy mortar was destroyed. Enemy casualties are unknown.

The next day enemy attacked the camp again, employing small arms fire, mortar fire and rifle grenades, causing light friendly casualties but no equipment or structural damage.

Early on 9 January, VC detonated mines against the large RMK-BRJ floating dredge near Dong Tam in Dinh Tuong Province, sinking the dredge in 20 feet of water, killing 3 U.S. and wounding 1 U.S. Also on 9 January an enemy force fired on the UK tanker ship HAUSTRUM with 57mm recoilless rifle fire causing one killed and one wounded in the crew and light damage to the ship.

On 11 January the enemy fired 27 rounds of 82mm mortar fire on the 3d Brigade 4th Infantry Division base camp at Tri Tam Airfield in Binh Duong Province causing light friendly casualties. On 12 January an enemy unit attacked Binh Tuy Airfield with 50 rounds of mortar and recoilless rifle fire causing light damage to the airfield, buildings and aircraft.

On 13 January an estimated 300 enemy attacked a USMC artillery position 10 kilometers W of Chu Lai with mortars and ground assault. The assault was repulsed. Marine casualties were light.

On 15 January, an estimated 100 enemy massed to attack a USMC company (reinforced) perimeter 10 kilometers S of Da Nang. A Marine security patrol engaged the enemy force before it was ready to attack, causing a prematurely launched assault on the perimeter. The enemy assault was repulsed with 60 enemy killed.

On 16 January a group of 20 enemy being pursued by a U.S. Infantry unit in Binh Duong Province used riot control gas in an attempt to break contact.

On 17 January an enemy unit delivered 100-150 rounds of mortar fire on a 4th Marines company in the Operation PRAIRIE area, causing light Marine casualties.

On 19 January an enemy unit fired 30-35 rounds of 82mm mortar at the USMC installation at Phu Bai in Thua Thien Province.

On 22 January an enemy unit mortared Vinh Long airfield in Vinh Long Province causing no casualties and light aircraft damage.

On 24 January an enemy unit attacked a 1st Bde 9th Infantry Division unit in Long Khanh Province employing SA, AW and mortar fire. Friendly casualties were light.

GROUND OPERATIONS

GENERAL

SONG THAN/DECKHOUSE V, a coordinated VMMC and USMC amphibious surface and helicopter assault in Kien Hoa Province of the GVN IV CTZ, was initiated 6 January. Participating elements were the U.S. 7th Fleet Amphibious Ready Group, U.S. Marines of the Special Landing Force (BLT 1/9 and HMM 362), the VN Marine Brigade Force Bravo, supporting ships or units from NAVFORV, and VNN River Assault Group units. Only scattered light contact was encountered in the operation. The operation terminated 15 January. Enemy losses were 21 killed, 71 detainees, 37 individual weapons, 4 crew-served weapons, 34 tons of rice, 134 grenades and 31 sampans. The operation was supported by 200 naval gunfire missions and 94 tactical air sorties. This was the first major operation conducted by U.S. forces in the Delta and was also the first coordinated amphibious operation involving U.S. and GVN forces. It showed conclusively that major forces can be employed in the marshes, mangrove swamps, inland waterways and canals which typify Delta terrain.

III MAF.

PRAIRIE continued during January terminating 31 January. PRAIRIE was initiated 3 August upon termination of HASTINGS, in the same area and with the same purpose. These operations countered the efforts of the enemy to infiltrate through the DMZ and concentrate in force in Quang Tri Province. HASTINGS had accounted for 882 enemy killed; and PRAIRIE, by the end of 1966, 1,318. Final results for PRAIRIE at termination were 1,397 enemy killed; 126 detained; 248 individual weapons; 15 crew-served weapons; and 13 tons of rice. The operation was supported by 5,183 tactical air sorties (a high for the war) and 223 naval gunfire support missions. Cumulative friendly casualties in the operation were moderate.

CHINOOK was initiated in Thua Thien Province 20 December by the 4th Marines and by the end of December had accounted for 159 enemy killed. The operation was continued through January and by the end of January had cumulative results of 218 enemy killed. The operation is continuing.

On 14 January a 1st Marines company conducted a helicopter-borne raid on an enemy hamlet meeting place in Quang Nam Province killing 61 enemy and taking 1 detainee.

In Operation TUSCALOOSA in Quang Nam Province on 26 January, USMC units contacted and partially contained an estimated enemy battalion, killing 72 of the enemy. TUSCALOOSA was conducted by the 5th Marines 24-28 January about 24 kilometers SSW of Da Nang.

Scattered TAOR actions by 2d ROK Marine Brigade units in Quang Ngai Province resulted in 131 enemy killed during the second week of the month. Contact the remainder of the month was generally light.

I FORCE

PAUL REVERE V was initiated 1 January in Pleiku Province. The name of the operation was changed however, retroactive to 1 January, to SAM HOUSTON. SAM HOUSTON continued the PAUL REVERE series of operations in Pleiku Province which commenced with PAUL REVERE I (10 May - 31 July) (546 enemy killed) and progressed through PAUL REVERE II (1-25 August) (703 enemy killed), PAUL REVERE III (26 August - 18 October) (36 enemy killed), PAUL REVERE IV (18 October - 31 December) (978 enemy killed). These operations maintained surveillance over the western portion of Pleiku Province and SW Kontum Province and countered enemy efforts to move forces into and through that area. SAM HOUSTON was continued throughout January by the 4th Infantry Division, but produced no significant contacts during the month.

THAYER II is a multi-brigade search and destroy by the 1st Cav Div (Airmobile) in Binh Dinh Province, continuing a series of highly successful operations in that province that commenced with combined US/ARVN operation DAVY CROCKETT (1-16 May) (374 enemy killed) and extending through US/ARVN-ROK operation CRAZY HORSE (16 May - 5 June) (478 enemy killed) and U.S. Operation THAYER I (13 September - 1 October) (230 enemy killed). THAYER II, initiated 25 October, had accounted for an additional 980 enemy killed at the end of December and continued into January. On 3 January the 3d Bde

25th Infantry Division changed operational control to the 1st Cav Div (Airmobile) and joined the operation. The operation continued to produce numerous significant contacts during the month and by the end of January had cumulative results of over 1500 enemy killed.

Other elements of the 1st Cav Div (Airmobile) continued Operation BYRD in the Phan Thiet area of Binh Thuan Province, accounting for over 60 enemy killed during the month.

MAENG HO 8 was initiated 3 January in Binh Dinh Province by the 26th Regt Cap ROK Inf Div to accomplish search and clear with helicopter assaults and clearing operations astride Highway 1 North of Song Cau in Phu Yen Province. The operation continued throughout the month and by 31 January had resulted in over 150 enemy killed and over 110 enemy weapons captured.

BAEK MA I (WHITE HORSE I) was initiated 29 January in Khanh Hoa Province by elements of 29th and 30th Regiments, 9th ROK Inf Div. In the first two days of the operation, the ROK troops killed 71 enemy and seized 129 weapons, suffering no casualties themselves.

II FORCE

II Field Force initiated Operation CEDAR FALLS 7 January against the Iron Triangle (An Son Base) and Than Dien Forest Reserve area. Major elements participating in the multi-division operation were units of the 2d and 3d Bdes, 1st Inf Div; 173d Abn Bde; 2d Bde, 25th Inf Div; 196th Lt Inf Bde; 11th Armd Cav Regt; plus ARVN abn and Ranger battalions. The principal aspects of the operation were the sealing off of the 50-60 square kilometer area of the Iron Triangle and the Thanh Dien Forest Reserve, helicopter assault of the Ben Suc area, evacuation of the more than 5,000 persons in the area along with their livestock and possessions, and the subsequent thorough reduction of the Iron Triangle enemy base and headquarters areas. Final results were: 720 enemy killed; 725 persons detained; 555 individual weapons; 23 crew-served weapons; 3,709 tons of rice; 1,500 gallons of fish sauce; 1,960 grenades; 60,300 rounds of small arms ammunition; 1,520 gallons of gasoline; 1,040 gallons of other POL products; 121 CHICOM gas masks; 285 pounds of documents; 394 batteries; 345 sampans; and large quantities of other munitions and materiel. Over 1,100 bunkers and 420 tunnels were uncovered. It was the first multi-division offensive designed to neutralize a known major enemy base area. It also had as one of its primary objectives the removal and relocation of the civilian inhabitants of the area. The operation was highly successful in all its aspects.

On 10 January USMACV announced deployment of U.S. engineer, signal and security units into the GVN IV Corps Tactical Zone. The units deployed to Dong Tam 8 kilometers WSW of My Tho in Dinh Tuong Province to prepare a U.S. operating base there.

LAM SON II, a multi-battalion combined US/ARVN operation, was continued in support of revolutionary development in Binh Duong Province. The operation is the longest on record for this conflict, having been initiated 23 May. The operation accounted for 72 enemy killed during January, bringing the cumulative totals for the operation to 245 at the end of January.

AIR OPERATIONS

NORTH VIETNAM

The northeast monsoon weather pattern continued over NVN. U.S. strike pilots took advantage of two short breaks in the weather to strike at targets in the Red River and Hanoi area. U.S. pilots used radar to continue their interdiction of LOC's in the panhandle despite the weather.

On 2 January, USAF F-4C pilots shot down seven MIG-21s with air-to-air missiles in fighter sweeps over the Red River Valley. On 5 January, USAF F-4s downed two more MIG-21s 100 miles W of Hanoi.

On 28 January, USAF pilots destroyed 47 enemy cargo barges and damaged 16 others in strikes on the Song Ca River 60 and 80 miles WNW of Vinh.

Navy strikes were flown from the carriers Kittyhawk, Enterprise, Coral Sea, Ticonderoga and Franklin D. Roosevelt.

On 29 January USN aircraft struck the Thanh Hoa transshipment complex with a three-carrier strike, destroying or damaging numerous boxcars, 7 AAA sites, two radar sites, and rail/bridge approaches.

REPUBLIC OF VIET NAM

On 11 January a tactical airstrike in the Forest reserve area of the Iron Triangle in support of CEDAR FALLS resulted in 18 secondary explosions.

On 11 January a USMC UH-34D crashed off the coast of Chu Lai due to engine failure, resulting in 9 U.S. killed, 1 U.S. missing. On 15 January a USA CH-47 with 9 persons aboard was downed by suspected enemy ground fire in Phong Dinh Province resulting in 8 U.S. killed and 1 U.S. missing. On 17 January a USA UH-1D exploded in flight over Hau Nghia Province resulting in 8 killed. On 20 January a USA O1-E was downed by enemy ground fire in Kontum Province. 1 U.S. was killed; 1 U.S. rescued.

On 27 January, Firefly operations in Long An Province resulted in 44 enemy killed and 33 enemy sampans destroyed. Also on 27 January, USMC strike aircraft pilots killed 55 enemy and set-off two secondary explosions.

On 18 and 28 January, B-52s conducted an incendiary raid against jungle areas in War Zones "D" and "C" respectively.

On 31 January, USAF pilots killed 19 enemy, destroyed or damaged 66 fortified positions and 40 enemy sampans, and triggered six secondary explosions.

NAVAL SURFACE OPERATIONS

On 9 January, 48 Chinese fishermen from Hainan who had been rescued by U.S. Navy units when in distress at sea early in December 1966, were flown to Hong Kong by USAF C-130 for repatriation.

MARKET TIME

USN Swift Boats and two USCG cutters supported by a USAF AC-47, sank a 70-foot steel-hulled enemy trawler attempting to infiltrate into An Xuyen Province on the night of 1 January. The investigating Swift boat received heavy AW fire from the trawler. Friendly casualties were light during the engagement. Moderate damage to the first PBR.

A USCG cutter destroyed an enemy junk that was attempting to evade capture on 10 January, 165 miles SW Saigon.

GAME WARDEN

Enemy units initiated a number of attacks against GAME WARDEN units during the month, attesting to the effectiveness of these units curtailing enemy use of the inland waterways.

On 1 January, PBRs foiled an enemy river crossing attempt on the Bassac River, destroying one enemy junk. On 3 January, two PBRs contacted an enemy force on the My Tho River and killed six enemy. On 4 January, PBRs challenged an enemy sampan, received fire, and killed three enemy. On 11 January, a USN MSB discovered and disarmed a large enemy water mine on the Long Tau River. On 12 January a PBR patrol on the Bassac River received heavy AW fire from bank, returned fire, requested artillery, and obtained secondary explosion.

On 14 January a USN MBS was rammed and sunk by the merchant ship MUI FINN on the Long Tau River 44 km SE of Saigon, resulting in 2 U.S. killed, 2 U.S. injured and 1 U.S. missing out of the MSB crew of 7.

On 21 January, two PBRs on the Bassac River challenged 9 men aboard a sampan. The men attempted to escape. The PBRs killed 2 and detained 7. On 23 January a USN MSB received heavy AW fire during sweeps of the Long Tau River. Two U.S. were killed. In the ensuing action a USA UH-1B was downed by enemy ground fire resulting in 4 U.S. killed. On 26 January enemy attacked USN PBRs with SA and AW fire in Ba Xuyen Province. In the latter action, 1 U.S. was wounded and the PBRs suffered light damage.

On 27 January enemy attacked USN PBR patrol SSW of My Tho employing AW fire. No casualties or damage. The PBR returned fire and received artillery support from Dong Tam. That evening enemy attacked a USN PBR patrol on the Long Tau River. No PBR casualties or serious damage. That same evening, an estimated two enemy companies attacked VNN Coastal Group 36 and USN PBRs 60 km SE of Can Tho. PBRs returned fire and were supported by armed helicopters and AC-47s. Two U.S. were wounded and 1 PBR damaged.

On 30 January enemy attacked a Vietnamese civilian boat in the Rung Sat Special Zone, employing rifle grenade fire. USN armed helicopters and VNAF tactical air strikes supported the civilian boat. The enemy attack killed 4 Vietnamese civilians and wounded two. A USN helicopter drew heavy enemy ground fire during the action was forced to land. The crew and helicopter were safely extracted. Also on 30 January, two USN and one VNN minesweepers were attacked with heavy automatic weapons and recoilless rifle fire in the Rung Sat Special Zone. There were no friendly casualties.

NAVAL GUNFIRE REPUBLIC OF VIET NAM

U.S. naval ships continued to provide naval gunfire support for allied forces throughout the coastal areas of the Republic.

Naval gunfire ships were credited with at least 51 enemy killed during the third week of the month.

On 22 January the 7th Fleet cruiser USS CANBERRA (CAG) destroyed 9 enemy structures and a tunnel complex while firing 8-inch guns in support of THAYER II.

On 23 January the USS CARRONADE (IPS) firing 5-inch SSR at enemy fortified emplacements in support of Operation BYRD killed 22 enemy and destroyed or damaged 200 meters of trench works, 38 structures and 52 bunkers.

On 27 January, USS ST. FRANCIS RIVER (LSMR) killed 8 enemy, destroyed or damaged 130 enemy structures, 20 sampans, 3 bunkers, and 3 ammunition caches in Quang Ngai Province.

NAVAL GUNFIRE NORTH VIETNAM

On 19 January, two USN destroyers damaged or destroyed an enemy radar site on Hoi Thong Peninsula S of Vinh, and fired on another radar site on Hon Matt Island; silenced a 57mm gun battery on Hon Matt Island (two secondary explosions observed); destroyed 3 watercraft and damaged 4; and destroyed two guns of a shore battery at the mouth of the Can Sat River. No casualties or damage aboard the destroyers.

On 20 January two USN destroyer damaged or destroyed 5 watercraft and on two occasions neutralized or silenced NVN coastal guns SE of Vinh. No casualties or damage aboard the destroyers.

On 21 January a USN destroyer destroyed or damaged 4 enemy watercraft; destroyed 1 enemy watercraft and 2 trucks; damaged 1 truck, and obtained secondary explosions ashore 31 km NNW of Dong Hoi. Another USN destroyer damaged a 40-foot watercraft 24 km NNW of Dong Hoi.

On 25 January, USN destroyers and supporting A-1s damaged or destroyed 20 enemy watercraft. On 27 and 28 January three USN destroyers destroyed 7 enemy watercraft along the coast of NVN, and an 85mm shore battery on Tiger Island.

On 30 January a USN destroyer destroyed 5 enemy watercraft and damaged 17.

CIVIC ACTION

Civic action projects included construction and/or repair of houses, wells, schools, places of worship, irrigation facilities and electrical power sources, and the distribution of food and clothing. The Medical Civic Action Program (MEDCAP) continued to be highly successful with a high degree of acceptance by the people.

REVOLUTIONARY DEVELOPMENT (RD)

The RD program was established by GVN as an extension of the Rural Pacification Program. It is a GVN program with U.S. and other Free World Forces providing supporting actions. Historically, the older programs seemed to have had only nebulous meaning to the masses of population, but the RD program was redefined and pointed directly toward providing security for the people and enhancing their economic and social position. The program is headed by a Commissioner General for Revolutionary Development.

Factors that have been addressed of late include the status of hamlets and the amount of population living in secured areas. Many adjustments were made throughout 1966 in hamlet status and census figures. Criteria for measuring the status of hamlets was upgraded, and the total numbers planned in different sections of the country were changed.

The allied military forces have, and can continue, to provide a protective shield for the extension of the RD program. A solid foundation for RD has been established.
