PURPOSE: The Nebraska Environmental Trust was created by statute in 1992, and following the authorization of the state lottery by the voters of Nebraska, affirmed by passage of an identical statute in 1993.

Periodically since 2002, the Legislature has appropriated funds from the trust for other purposes. This study shall include, but not be limited to, examination of the following:

- (1) The interests and desires of the public on this issue, including the history of enactment of the State Lottery Act;
- (2) Allocation of state lottery and other revenue for natural resources conservation and reclamation in other states; and
- (3) Any other matters necessary or appropriate for a complete examination of this issue.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MEMBERS OF THE NINETY-NINTH LEGISLATURE OF NEBRASKA, SECOND SESSION:

- 1. That the Natural Resources Committee of the Legislature shall be designated to conduct an interim study to carry out the purposes of this resolution.
- 2. That the committee shall upon the conclusion of its study make a report of its findings, together with its recommendations, to the Legislative Council or Legislature.

In part, the appropriation presented in LB 872A duplicates agency costs that have been accounted for in LB 968A, which has already been enacted. The agency's costs for updating the individual income tax form is an example of such duplication; therefore, I have reduced LB 872A by \$41,635 in FY2006-07, and \$1,653 in FY2007-08. With this letter, I am returning LB 746A with certain line-item reductions.

I have vetoed \$145,000 of General Funds in FY2006-07 and \$200,000 of General Funds in FY2007-08 which are proposed for the creation and funding of a new Civil Legal Services Fund within the Supreme Court.

After my vetoes, LB 746A will provide total new funding for civil legal services of \$200,000 in FY2006-07 and \$290,000 in FY2007-08.

Currently, a civil legal services grant program exists within the Commission on Public Advocacy. This legal aid program, funded by a \$5 court fee, already has an annual appropriation of \$1,900,000. My reductions are made, therefore, because LB 746A creates a duplicative second state grant program to finance the provision of civil legal services to eligible, low-income individuals. In addition, we have historically financed these services from dedicated court fees. I believe it is unwise to begin the practice of supplementing this financing with state General Funds.

I have left \$55,000 of General Funds in FY2006-07 in the program only because the new \$1 court fee that will fund these services does not begin to phase-in until January 1, 2007.

For these reasons, I urge you to sustain my line-item reductions to LB 746A.
