Training/education

1966: Graduates from Leningrad Polytechnic Institute as electrical engineer.

Professional experience

March 2006: Says that those who read his book for schoolchildren, the *Ruhnama*, three times will find spiritual richness, become more intelligent, recognise God and go straight to Heaven. The book tells the country's history in a way to confirm him as its spiritual guide.

December 2005: Has Khudaiberdy Kurbandurdyev, editor of weekly *Adalat* (*Justice*), sentenced to eight years in prison for "professional negligence" and "treason."

August 2004: Personally dismisses interior minister in live TV broadcast for alleged incompetence after leaflet campaign calling for Nyazov's overthrow and trial. Orders building of an ice palace in Ashgabat.

2004: Orders all rural libraries to be shut down, saying Turkmen villagers do not read.

2003-05: Cracks down hard on only non-government Turkmen-language media available in the country, the US-funded *Radio Free Europe / Radio Liberty*, with harassment, arrests, beatings and imprisonment.

25 November 2002: Orders arrest of large number of supposed plotters after alleged assassination attempt.

29 December 1999: Proclaimed president-for-life by rubber-stamp parliament.

22 October 1993: Proclaims himself "The Turkmenbashi" (Father of All Turkmens).

21 June 1991: Elected president, and also becomes prime minister.

27 October 1990: Elected first president of Soviet Turkmenistan.

1985: Becomes head of Turkmen Communist Party and renames it Turkmenistan Democratic Party.

1962: Joins Soviet Communist Party.
