Background to the organisation

Fauna & Flora International (FFI) is one of the world's leading international conservation organisations, dedicated to conserving threatened species and eco-systems around the globe. Founded in 1903, the organisation has a proud history of achievement. It has been a driving force in establishing much of today's global conservation infrastructure - including The World Conservation Union (IUCN), the Red Data Books, TRAFFIC and CITES - and was instrumental in focusing world-wide attention on the plight of endangered species. In 2003 FFI celebrated its hundredth anniversary and launched an appeal to raise the funds required to increase conservation work on the ground.

FFI has an unparalleled reputation for delivering sustainable solutions that reconcile the needs of both wildlife and local communities. The development of local partnerships is central to its approach. With success in the field generating increased demand for FFI's services, the organisation has recently undergone a period of rapid growth. The current portfolio comprises of several hundred projects, encompassing more than 60 countries world-wide.

FFI's headquarters are in Cambridge, and it also has offices in Spain and San Francisco, USA and regional offices at key locations to support local programmes. In addition to its core team based in the UK, the organisation has a growing number of in-country field staff, combined with a network of associated consultants.

FFI is a registered UK charity. The US branch of FFI was established in 1984 and registered as a Not for Profit Organisation with 501 (c) 3 status, which allows charitable giving with tax incentives. Both FFI and FFI-US are governed by Boards of Trustees.

Background to role

Bridging business & biodiversity

Fauna & Flora International works with the private sector to try to ensure that business activities are not undertaken at the expense of biodiversity. Such partnerships, be they with local business initiatives or multinational companies, offer tremendous scope to influence corporate behaviour and increase environmental responsibility. By harnessing the potential of the private sector, Fauna & Flora International encourages sustainable development among companies for whom natural resources are a key component of their business.

We operate at three levels with businesses: with the influencers of business such as governments, the finance sector and intergovernmental organizations to ensure they adequately address biodiversity issues and thus promote change through the private sector; directly with businesses whose operations can significantly impact on wildlife areas and species; and with small and medium sized enterprises to help them minimize their impacts on biodiversity.

We are seeking an individual with a strong conservation background with the ability to think laterally and creatively and adapt this knowledge to work in partnership with companies to help them avoid and minimise impacts on biodiversity. The role will provide technical support to our existing and developing corporate partnerships.

- 6. Other support roles to the corporate team and other parts of FFI as appropriate
