

Amtrak Fact Sheet, Fiscal Year 2006 State of Montana

Amtrak Service & Ridership

Amtrak operates one daily long-distance train through Montana, the *Empire Builder* (Chicago-Minneapolis/St. Paul-Seattle/Portland service via northern Montana).

During FY06 Amtrak served the following Montana locations:

Amtrak is upgrading equipment and amenities on selected long-distance trains, and the first train to be relaunched with these upgrades was the *Empire Builder*, in August 2005.

Procurement/Contracts

Amtrak expended \$93,980 for goods and services in Montana in FY06.

Employment

During fiscal year 2006, Amtrak employed 57 Montana residents. Total wages of Amtrak employees living in Montana were \$3,458,925 during this period.

Selected Highlights

In FY06, ridership on the Empire Builder increased by 4.3%, making it the most popular Amtrak long-distance train for the third consecutive year.

A recent study by R.L. Banks & Associates commissioned by the state of Montana concluded that the *Empire Builder* contributes nearly \$14 million annually in economic benefits to Montana.
