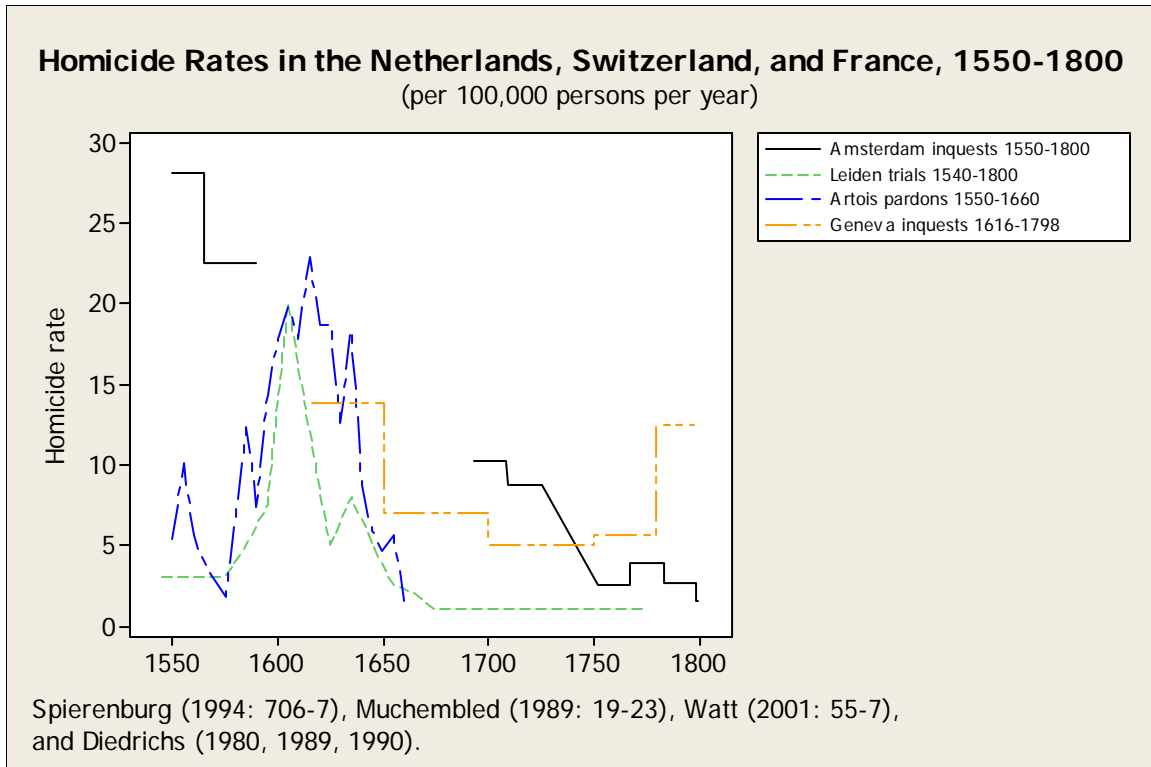

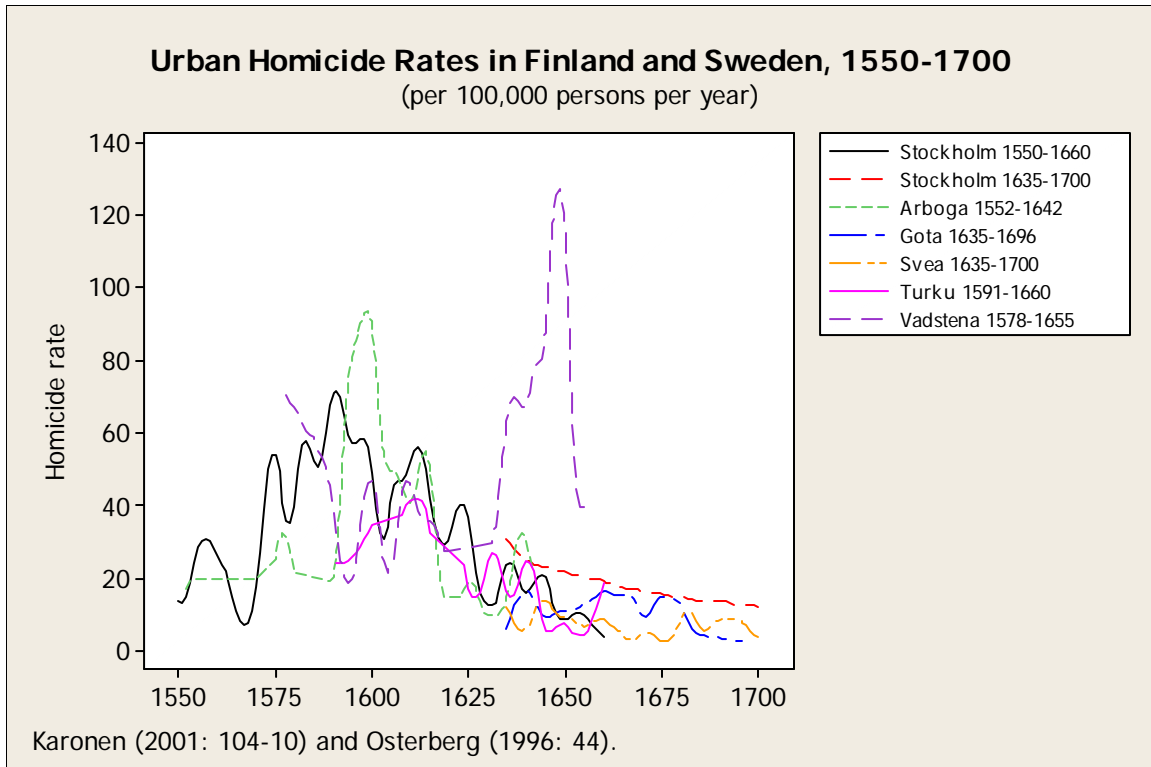

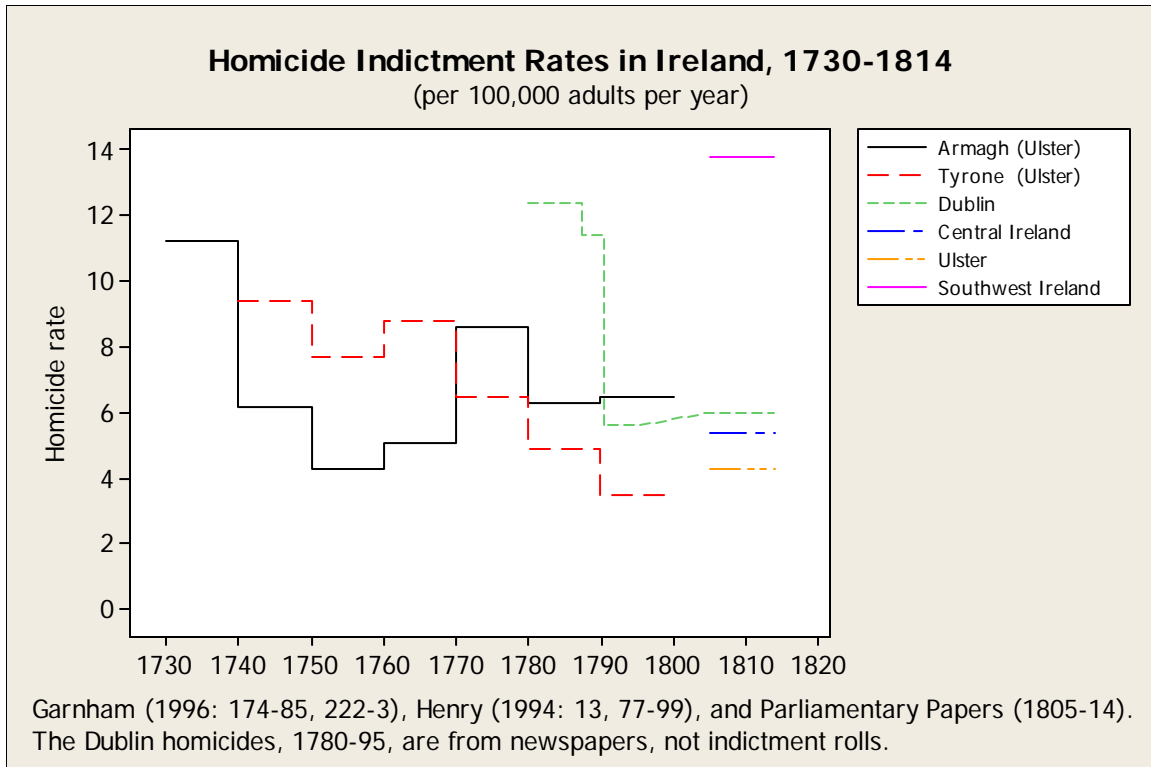

### Homicide Rate in France, 1825-1914 (per 100,000 persons per year)

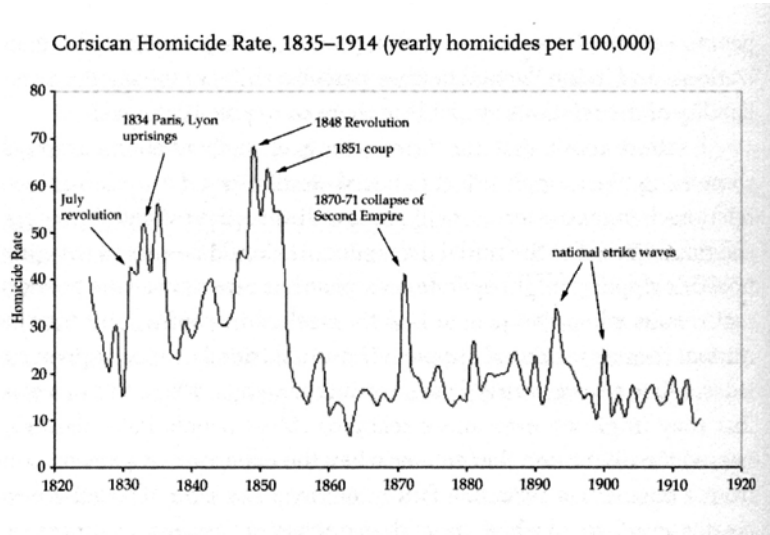

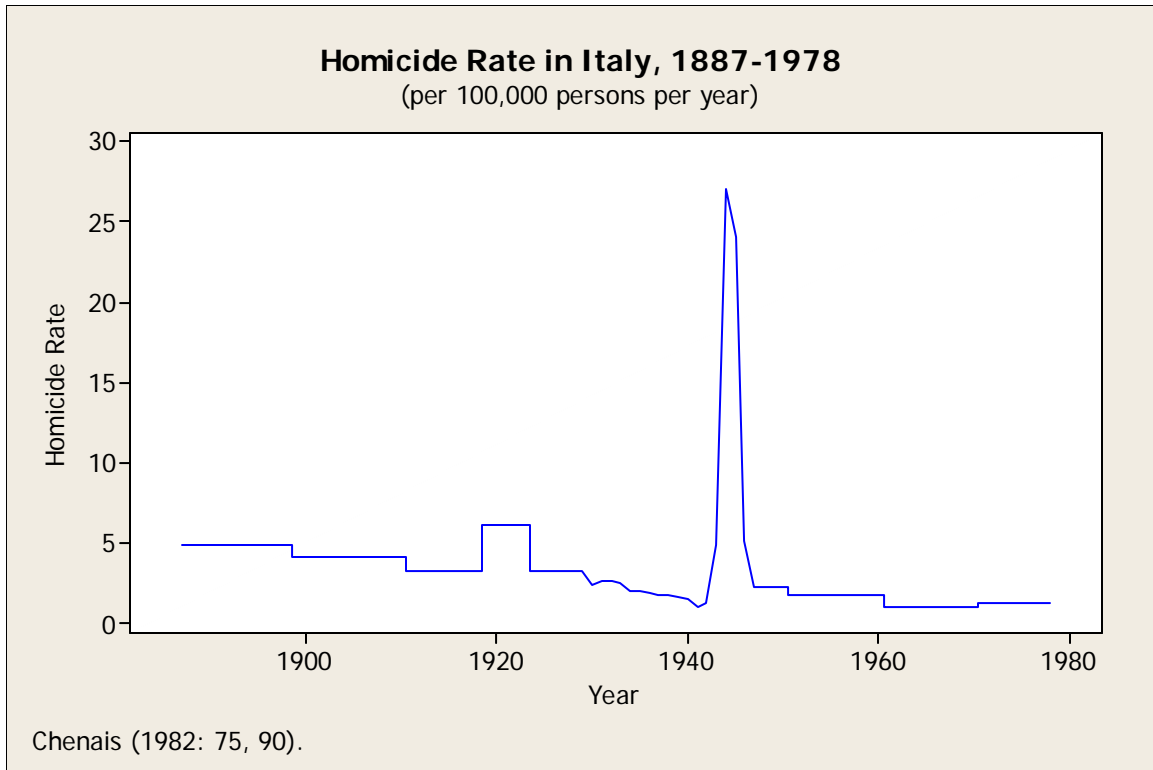

### Homicide Rates in Corsica, 1835-1914

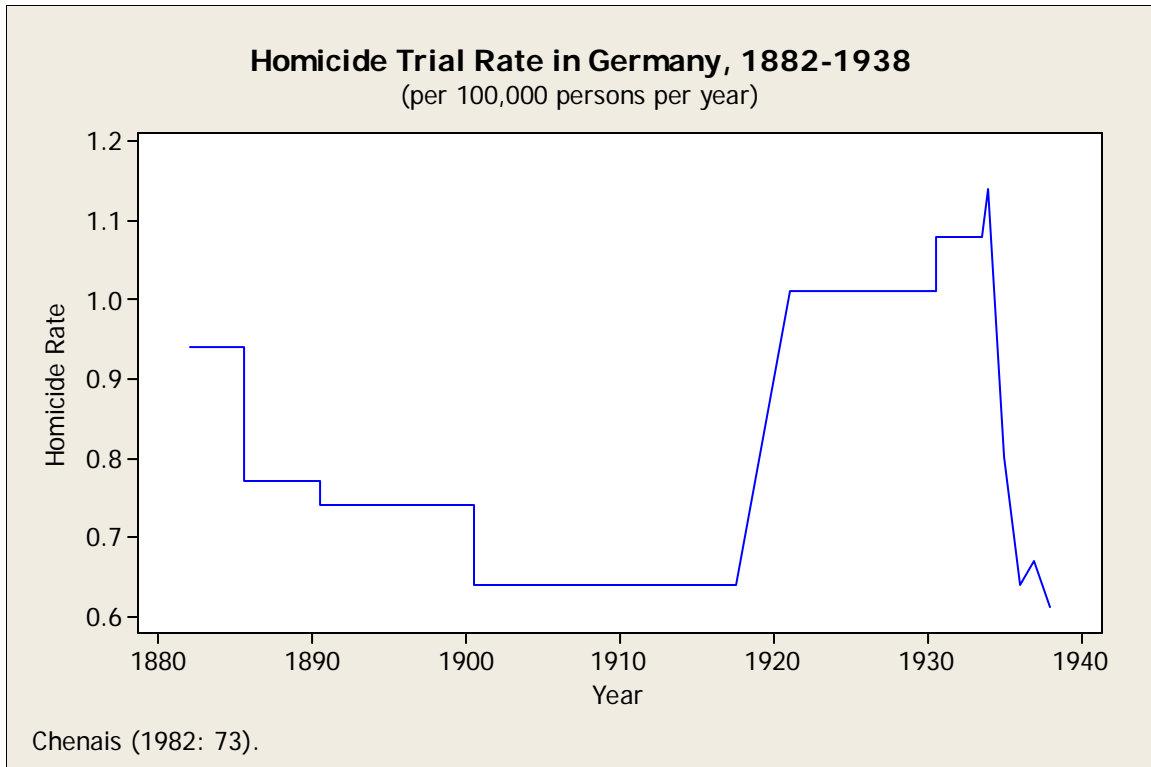

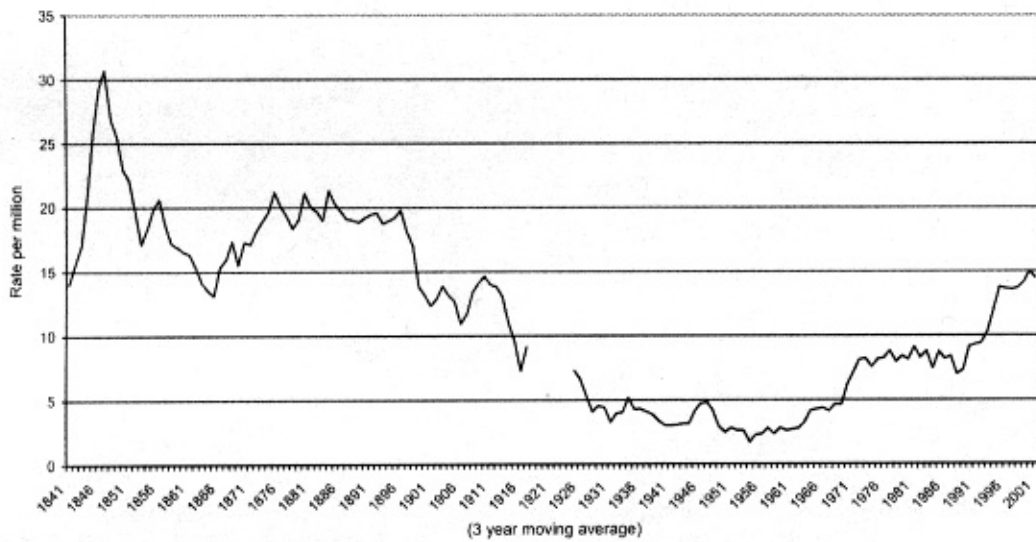
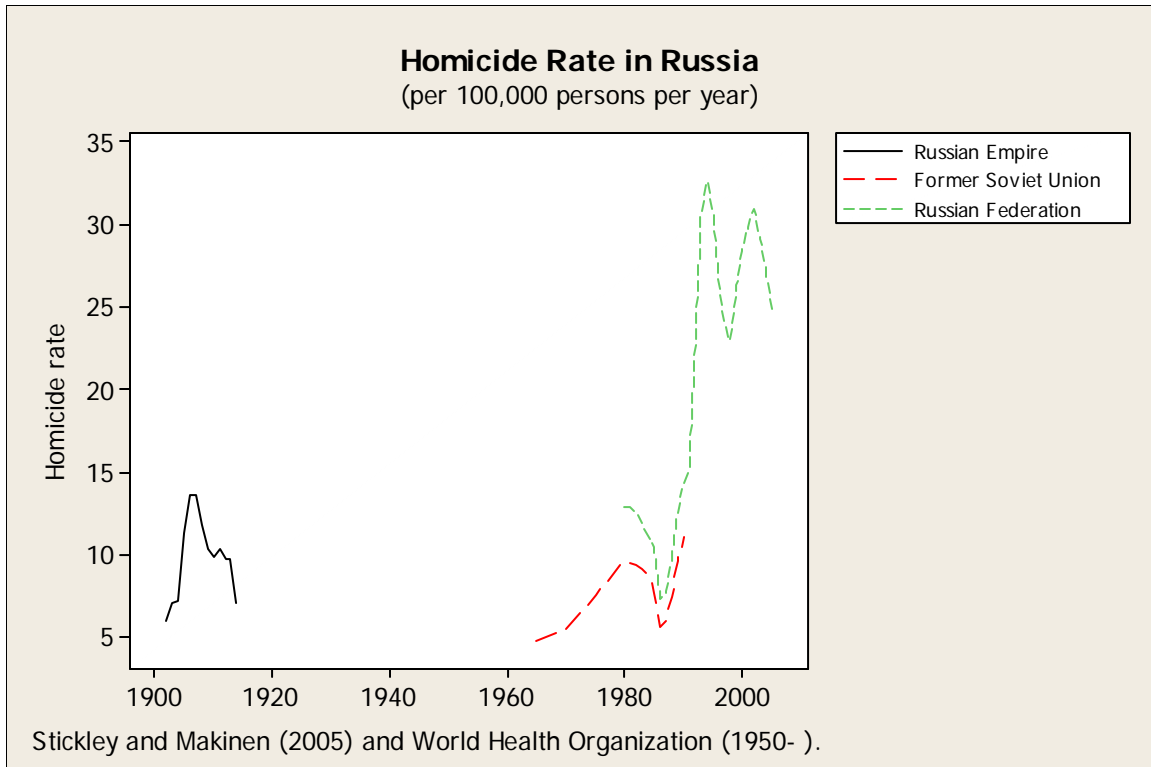


FIG. 2 Killing of persons aged over one year, 1841–2003

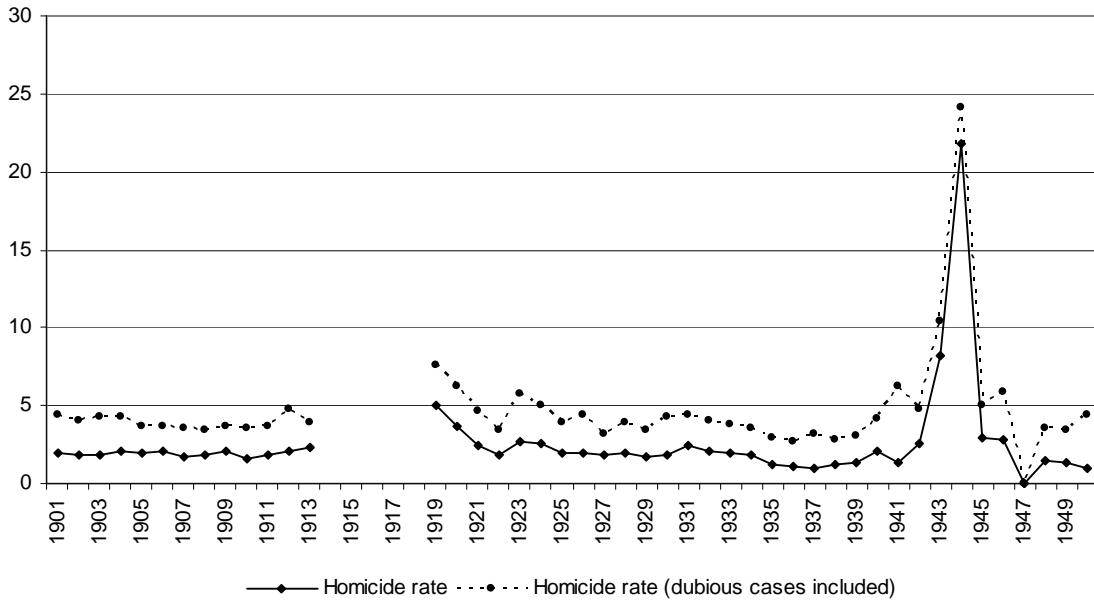

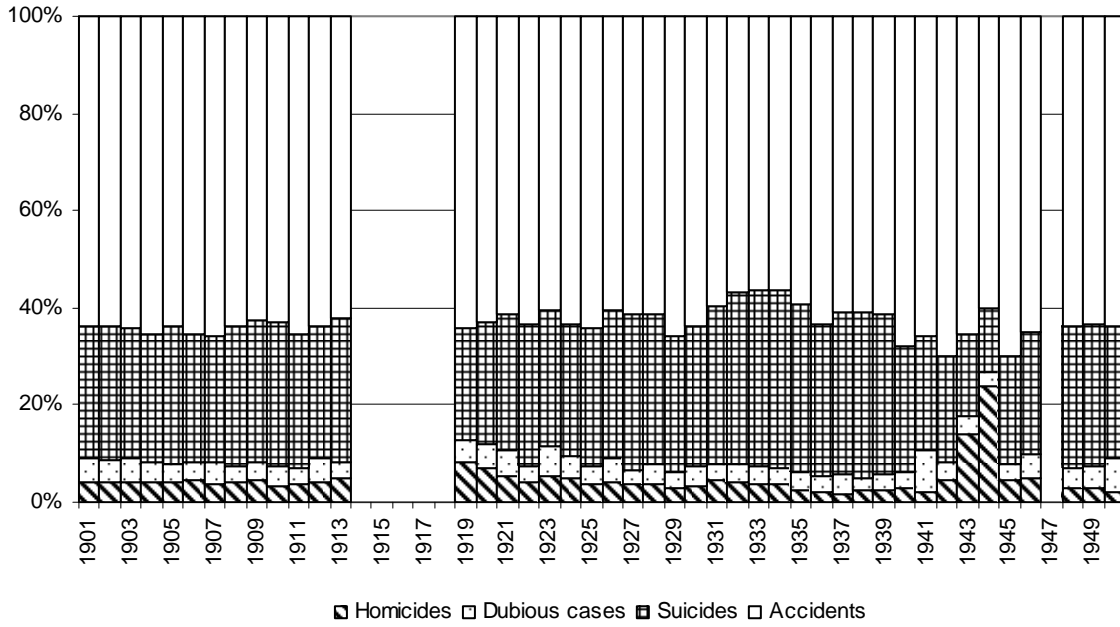
**Homicide Rate in Belgium**  
(per 100,000 persons per year)



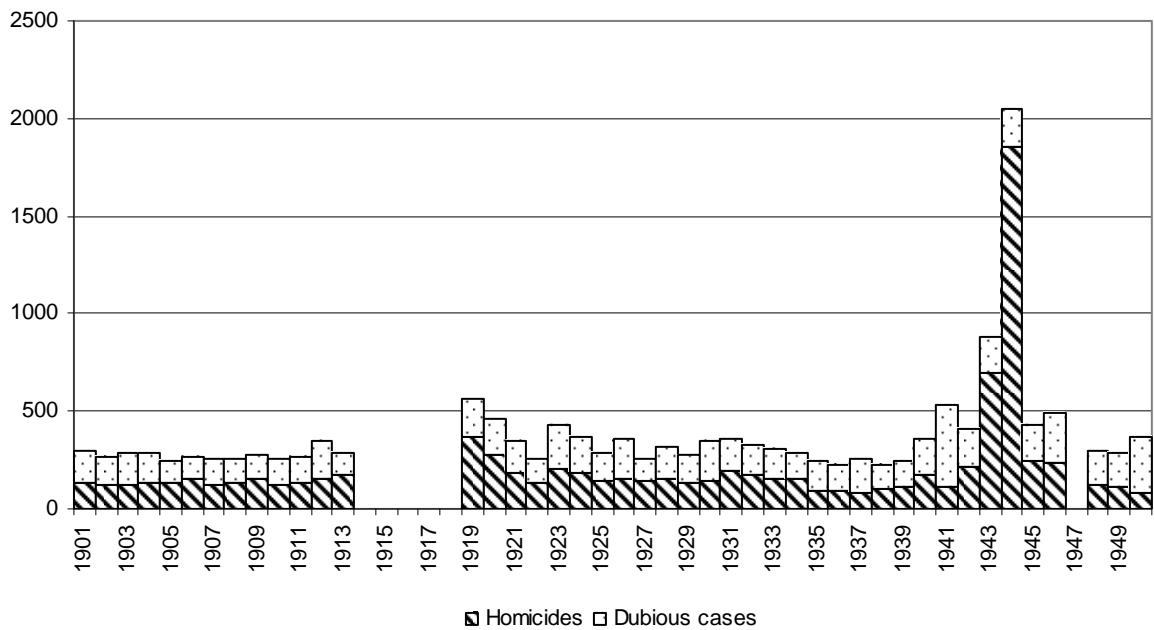

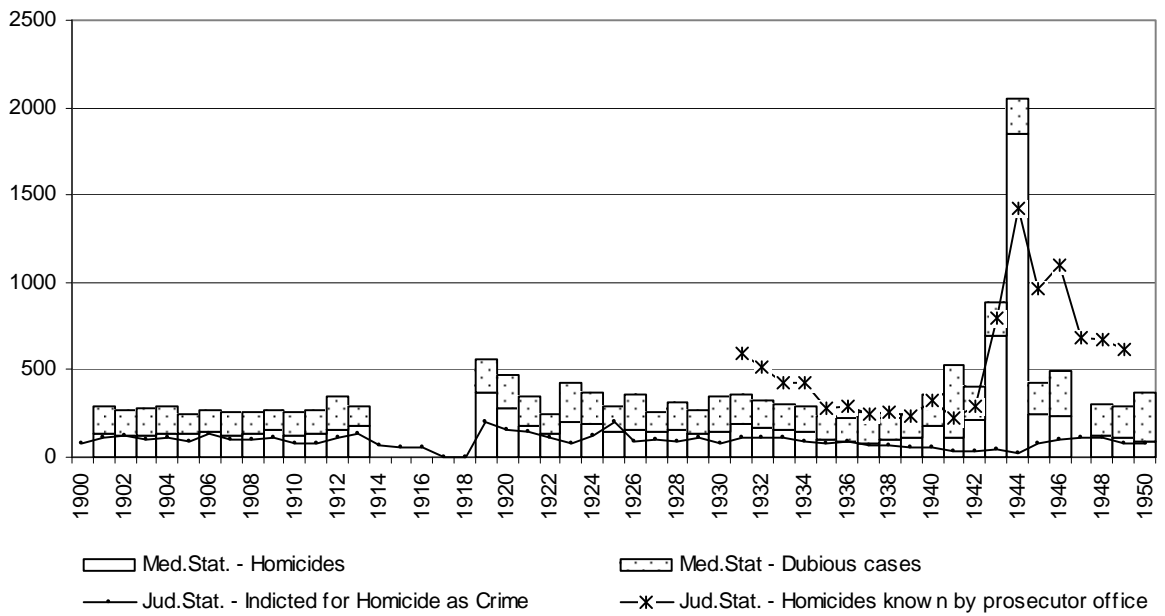
**Homicide, suicide, and accident counts from medical statistics in Belgium**
