

The orders, decorations and medals of Sir Edmund Hillary, KG, ONZ, KBE (1919-2008)

The Reserve Bank and Sir Edmund Hillary have enjoyed a special relationship. Since 1992 his portrait has appeared on the Bank's Five Dollar note.

Following Sir Edmund's appointment as a Knight of the Order of the Garter in 1995 the Bank, as a tribute, gifted to him the fee for a personal Grant of Armorial Bearings (Coat of Arms). The Letters Patent granting the Arms are on display together with the Warrant of Appointment as a KG.

Hillary's ascent of Mt Everest with Tenzing Norgay on 29 May 1953 is one of the great feats of the twentieth century. It also was the beginning of many honours and awards that would be given to him during his life. On his descent Hillary heard that The Queen had made him a **Knight Commander of the Order of the British Empire (KBE)**. Shortly afterwards the King of Nepal conferred the **Order of the Gurkha Right Arm** and the Government of India, the **Everest Medal** in gold.

Awards from leading institutions followed and on display are the David Livingstone Medal of the Scottish Geographical Society, the American Geographical Society of New York Medal, the Belgium Le Soir Medal, the Geographical Society of Chicago Medal, the highly prized Hubbard Medal of the National Geographical Society, Washington, D.C., (presented by President Dwight Eisenhower, at the White House, on 11 February 1954), the Cullum Geographical Medal of the American Geographical Society, the John Lewis Gold Medal of the South Australian Branch of the Royal Geographical Society of Australasia, the French Geographical Society Medal, and the Distinguished Services to Geography Medal of the Geographical Society of Philadelphia.

Between 1955-58 Sir Edmund was leader of the New Zealand Party of the Commonwealth Trans-Antarctic Expedition for which he was awarded **The Polar Medal** and the **Fuchs Medal** of the Royal Geographical Society, London. In 1958 for his Antarctic and Himalayan expeditions he received the **Patron's Medal** of the Royal Geographical Society, London. On 6 February 1987 Sir Edmund was appointed a foundation member of the exclusive Order of New Zealand (ONZ).

Hillary's ongoing exploration, work in the field of conservation, support of mountaineering and sporting groups, and benefactions, especially in Nepal, brought him further distinctions. From France the Order of Sports Merit, the Order of the Golden Ark of the Netherlands, and the Order of Merit of the Republic of Poland. In 2008 the President of India posthumously awarded him the Padma Vibhushan (Decoration of the Lotus).

Hillary's achievements gave him an international, if not legendary, status and his genuine interest in the people of Nepal, love of New Zealand, and the support, freely given, to individuals and groups not only in New Zealand but also world wide found him feted and honoured by organisations in the United Kingdom, France, Italy, Poland, Russia, Spain, the United States, Chile, Japan and the Republic of Korea, and honoured by several universities with honorary degrees.

Sir Edmund Hillary was born in Auckland on 20 July 1919 and died in that city on 11 January 2008. On 21-22 January 2008 he was accorded the rare distinction of a State Funeral in Auckland; and on 2 April 2008 a Service of Thanksgiving in St George's Chapel, Windsor Castle, the spiritual home of the Knights of the Garter.
