Professional

Career

- In 2003, best finish was a tie for 19th at the Wegmans Rochester LPGA.
- In 2001, tied for ninth at the ShopRite LPGA Classic, where she tied her career-low score of 66 during the first round.
- In 2000, best finish was a tie for eighth at the Jamie Farr Kroger Classic; suffered from a recurring back injury throughout most of the season.
- In 1999, played a limited schedule as a result of undergoing her second back surgery in July; recorded her first career hole-in-one during the first round of the AFLAC Champions Presented by *Southern Living*.
- In 1998, had outpatient surgery in April to relieve pressure and pain caused by a herniated disk in her back, a condition which made swinging a club almost unbearable; best finish was a tie for 24th, which she recorded at the City of Hope Myrtle Beach Classic (less than three weeks after her surgery) and the Star Bank LPGA Classic.
- In 1997, tied her career-low round of 66 during the second and third rounds to win the Los Angeles Women's Championship, an emotional victory for Myers, who was playing golf symptom-free from the painful bladder disease interstitial cystitis (IC) after taking a new drug called Elmiron; won her second title of the season at the Sara Lee Classic by winning a five-hole, sudden-death playoff with Nancy Harvey and Laurel Kean; tied her career-low round of 66 during the final round of the Firstar LPGA Classic, where she finished second; won the Heather Farr Player Award.
- In 1996, recorded two top-10 finishes, including a season-best tie for sixth at the Sara Lee Classic.
- In 1995, best finish was a tie for 14th at the McCall's LPGA Classic at Stratton Mountain.
- In 1994, revealed she had been playing for 11 years with IC; best finish was a tie for seventh at the Minnesota LPGA Classic.
- In 1993, best finish was a tie for 11th at the Mazda LPGA Championship; tied her career-low 66 during the second round of the Jamie Farr Toledo Classic.
- In 1991, best finish was a tie for sixth at the Northgate Computer Classic; tied her career-low 66 during the second round of the Rochester International.
- In 1990, best finish was a tie for eighth at the Centel Classic.
- In 1989, played in a limited schedule due to the birth of daughter Taylor-Jo on July 29; recorded her career-low score of 66 during the first rounds of the Orix Hawaiian Ladies Open and Women's Kemper Open; best finish was a tie for 25th at the Circle K LPGA Tucson Open.
- In 1988, collected her first career victory at the Mayflower Classic.
- In 1987, best finish was a tie for 10th at the Sarasota Classic.
- In 1986, her rookie season, best finish was 15th place at the Henredon Classic.
- In 1985, competed on the Asian and Futures Tours; qualified for the LPGA Tour by tying for 35th at the LPGA Final Qualifying Tournament to earn non-exempt status for the 1986 season.

Amateur

Myers collected several victories during her junior career. She was a five-time winner of the Southwest Florida Junior Golf Association Championship. In 1983, she won the Southwest Florida Women's Amateur. During her college career at Florida International University, she was runner-up at the 1984 Lady Buckeye Invitational.
