Pursuant to Section 3523 of the Elections Code, I hereby certify that on June 25, 1986 the certificates received from the County Clerks or Registrars of Voters by the Secretary of State established that the Initiative Statute, Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS), has been signed by the requisite number of qualified electors needed to declare the petition sufficient. The Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS). Initiative Statute is, therefore, qualified for the November 4, 1986 General Election.

ACQUIRED IMMUNE DEFICIENCY SYNDROME (AIDS). INITIATIVE STATUTE. Provides that AIDS is an infectious, contagious and communicable disease and that the condition of being a carrier of the HTLV-III virus is an infectious, contagious and communicable condition. Requires that both be placed on the list of reportable diseases and conditions maintained by the director of the Department of Health Services. Provides that both are subject to quarantine and isolation statutes and regulations. Provides that Department of Health personnel and all health officers shall fulfill the duties and obligations set forth in specified statutory provisions to preserve the public health from AIDS. Summary of estimate by Legislative Analyst and Director of Finance of fiscal impact on state and local government: Adoption of the proposed initiative would not result in a substantive net change in state or local finances.

Title: [AS PREPARED BY THE ATTORNEY GENERAL]

Section 1.

The purpose of this Act is to:

- A. Enforce and confirm the declaration of the California Legislature set forth in Health and Safety Code Section 195 that acquired immune deficiency syndrome (AIDS) is serious and life threatening to men and women from all segments of society, that AIDS is usually lethal and that it is caused by an infectuous agent with a high concentration of cases in California;
- B. Protect victims of acquired immune deficiency syndrome (AIDS), members of their families and local communities, and the public health at large; and
- C. Utilize the existing structure of the State Department of Health Services and local health officers and the statutes and regulations under which they serve to preserve the public health from acquired immune deficiency syndrome (AIDS).

Section 2.

Acquired immune deficiency syndrome (AIDS) is an infectuous, contagious and communicable disease and the condition of being a carrier of the HTLV-III virus is an infectuous, contagious and communicable condition and both shall be placed and maintained by the director of the Department of Health Services on the list of reportable diseases and conditions mandated by Health and Safety Code Section 3123, and both shall be included within the provisions of Division 4 of such code and the rules and regulations set forth in Administrative Code Title 17, Part 1, Chapter 4, Subchapter 1, and all personnel of the Department of Health Services and all health officers shall fulfill all of the duties and obligations specified in each and all of the sections of said statutory division and administrative code subchapter in a manner consistent with the intent of this Act, as shall all other persons identified in said provisions.

Section 3.

In the event that any section, subsection or portion thereof of this Act is deemed unconstitutional by a proper court of law, then that section, subsection or portion thereof shall be stricken from the Act and all other sections, subsections and portions thereof shall remain in force, alterable only by the people, according to process.

AIDS INITIATIVE BEGINS CIRCULATION REPORTS EU

SACRAMENTO -- Secretary of State March Fong Eu announced today (Dec. 24) that she has given two Los Angeles men the go-ahead to begin gathering signatures in an effort to qualify an initiative dealing with acquired immune deficiency syndrome (AIDS).

Khushro Ghandhi and Bruce Lutz are the proponents of an initiative statute which would designate AIDS as "an infectious, contagious and communicable disease" and the condition of being a carrier of the HTLV-III virus as "an infectious, contagious and communicable condition" and require that both be placed on the list of reportable diseases and conditions maintained by the State Department of Health. The measure further provides that both AIDS sufferers and carriers are subject to quarantine and isolation statutes and regulations and requires Department of Health personnel and all health officers to fulfill the statutory duties and obligations to protect the public health from AIDS. As an initiative statute, "Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS)" requires 393,835 valid signatures to be placed on the ballot. The last day the proponents can file with the county is May 22. However, if they wish to place the measure on the 1986 general election ballot, they are again encouraged to submit all signatures by April 18 to allow time for the full signature verification process before the June 26 deadline.

SECRETARY OF STATE EU WARNS PETITION CIRCULATORS TO HALT HARASSMENT

SACRAMENTO — Secretary of State March Fong Eu, in response to numerous complaints, today (May 19) warned circulators of the AIDS initiative that if they do not stop harassing potential petition signers and misrepresenting the contents of the measure, she will take immediate legal action.

In a telegram to Khushro Ghandi of Los Angeles, one of the two proponents of the AIDS initiative which seeks to declare AIDS an infectious, contagious and communicable disease subject to state Dept. of Health regulations, Dr. Eu said, "This is to warn you of the numerous complaints I have recently received regarding harassment by circulators of your AIDS initiative petition. Members of the public have been subjected to outrageous verbal abuse for mere failure to sign petitions, generating complaints by individuals and public and private property managers. To avoid possible litigation or removal of your circulators from public and private property, I urge you take immediate steps to ensure your circulators halt such offensive activities.

"I would also advise you that Elections Code section 29720 provides that any misrepresentation or false statements concerning the contents of an initiative petition to signers or potential signers is a misdemeanor. Such charges have been made, and any findings of fact in this regard will be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law."

SECRETARY OF STATE CHALLENGES AIDS REBUTTAL ARGUMENT

SACRAMENTO — Secretary of State March Fong Eu announced today (July 28) that she will file suit in Sacramento superior court challenging portions of the ballot pamphlet rebuttal argument submitted by proponents of the AIDS initiative, Prop. 64 on the November 4 general election ballot.

"The rebuttal to the argument against the AIDS initiative contains blatantly false information; as the person who provides the state ballot pamphlet I cannot in good conscience allow the distribution of such misleading data to California's more than 12 million registered voters," Dr. Eu said in announcing the lawsuit.

Provisions of the Political Reform Act allow any registered voter to bring legal action in Sacramento superior court against contents of the ballot pamphlet during the 20-day public review period if the voter believes such information is false or misleading.

Dr. Eu is challenging three statements contained in the rebuttal to the argument against Prop. 64 signed by Gus Sermos, former public health advisor for the Centers for Disease Control AIDS Program in Florida; Nancy Mullen, a Burbank doctor; and John Grauerholz, a doctor and fellow of the College of American Pathologists. The statements in question are: "AIDS is not 'hard to get'; it is easy to get."; "Potential insect and respiratory transmission has been established by numerous studies" and "Transmission by 'casual contact' is well established." Proponents have admitted the "casual contact" claim is erroneous.

Dr. Mervyn F. Silverman, Chairman to the Committee on AIDS and Sexually Transmitted Diseases for the California Medical Association and President of the American Foundation for AIDS Research, in a declaration submitted in behalf of

the secretary of state's lawsuit refutes the alleged false statements. He is an international expert on the medical aspects of AIDS. In his declaration, Dr. Silverman, states "that there is no medical, clinical or scientific evidence which shows that the virus which causes AIDS is transmitted by casual contact....

There is no evidence whatsoever that the AIDS virus has been transmitted casually in any environment: the workplace, schools, homes or restaurants. In fact, the opposite is true.

There absolutely are no medical studies or clinical data which support (the assertion of insect and respiratory transmission).... In fact, no cases of insect or respiratory transmission have been reported or documented."

This is the first time the Secretary of State has taken legal action with respect to the contents of arguments contained in the ballot pamphlet.

"These assertions by supporters of Lyndon La Rouche are dangerous fabrications and simply cannot go unchallenged," she said. The suit will be filed either today (July 28) or tomorrow (July 29).
