Kunsthistorisches Museum

The Kunsthistorisches Museum was built by Emperor Franz Joseph to house the fabulous Habsburg collections that had been assembled over centuries. Designed by architects Gottfried Semper and Karl Hasenauer, the Kunsthistorisches Museum on Vienna's Ringstraße is among the most impressive museums erected in the 19th century; it houses a number of world-renowned collections.

THE PICTURE GALLERY: of the Kunsthistorisches Museum, one of the foremost collections of Old Masters in the world, houses paintings assembled by the Habsburgs. Among them are celebrated masterpieces by Rubens, Rembrandt, Raphael, Vermeer, Velázquez, Titian and Durer, as well as the world's most extensive collection of paintings by Pieter Bruegel the Elder. Make your visit a truly memorable experience!

THE EGYPTIAN AND NEAR EASTERN COLLECTION: Spectacular statues and reliefs, mummyshaped coffins, three huge papyrus-stalk columns and much more offer a glimpse into the fascinating world of the Ancient Egyptians - much of it presented in galleries decorated in the 19th century neo-Egyptian style.

THE COLLECTION OF GREEK AND ROMAN ANTIQUITIES: See artworks that span three millennia - from the Bronze Age to the Dark Ages, from Cyprus to Greece, Italy and Austria. The collection includes spectacular antique cameos, hoards from Late Antiquity and the Dark Ages, Greek vases and Roman artefacts.

THE COIN CABINET: Coins from their invention until today. Natural and paper money, important medals and decorations - with over 700.000 objects, the collection is among the five largest in the world and invites visitors on a fascinating journey through the history of money.

THE CHAMBER OF ART (KUNSTKAMMER): At present the world's most important Kunstkammer collection is closed for renovation and a re-ordering of the displays.

THE COLLECTION OF ANCIENT MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS

One of the world's most important collections of Renaissance and Baroque instruments. The exhibition includes instruments once owned by famous musicians, among them the violin played by Leopold Mozart and Clara and Robert Schumann's grand piano. You can also see the zither on which Anton Karas played the haunting theme-song from the film "The Third Man". Audio Guides are available, and visitors can play on reproductions of original instruments.

THE COLLECTION OF ARMS AND ARMOUR

Marvel at magnificent arms and sumptuous suits of armour that document centuries of European history. Also on display are the ceremonial rapier of Emperor Maximilian II - perhaps the most beautiful ceremonial weapon ever made - and boys' armour of Habsburg princes, or elegant cuirassier armour worn for jousting by Emperor Maximilian I. These objects were expressly commissioned for important political events such as campaigns, Imperial Diets, coronations and weddings, making this probably the world's best documented collection of parade armour.

THE EPHESOS MUSEUM

For over a century Austrian archaeologists have been excavating at Ephesos, one of the great cities of the Ancient World. During the early excavations of 1895-1907, the archaeologists were allowed to bring a selection of finds excavated to Vienna, as a donation to the Imperial collection. Opened in 1978, the Ephesus Museum in the Neue Burg displays a wide selection of Roman sculpture and architectural fragments, among them the "Parthian Monument", the most important relief-cycle from Asia Minor, as well as parts of the altar of the Artemision, one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World.

Imperial Treasury

Located in the oldest part of the Hofburg Palace, the Schweizerhof, the Treasury houses Habsburg treasures and insignia, among them the Austrian imperial crown, and the crown, insignia and jewels of the Holy Roman Empire. Precious jewels such as the largest cut emerald in the world testify to the Habsburgs' former power and glory.

Other highlights are the golden cradle of Napoleon's son and treasures of the Order of the Golden Fleece, including magnificently embroidered robes from 15th century Burgundy.

Also on display are charming pieces of jewellery once worn by Empress Elisabeth and by Habsburg empresses and princesses. Come and discover such legendary objects as the eighth-century Holy Lance, the agate bowl once regarded as the Holy Grail, or the horn of a "unicorn".

The entrance to the Imperial Treasury is in the Schweizerhof, or Swiss Court; its name is a reminder of the Swiss Guards once stationed here.



Located near Schönbrunn Palace, the Imperial Carriage Museum's unique collection of imperial carriages and sleighs invites you on a tour through Austrian history. Magnificent carriages offer a glimpse of the eventful lives of rulers such as Maria Theresia, Napoleon or Emperor Franz Joseph. The highlight of the collection is the splendid baroque Imperial Coach, but there are also other exquisite carriages, comfortable coaches for travelling and charming children's carriages for Habsburg princes and princesses. You can also enjoy the "Sisi Trail", which showcases the Empress's sumptuous carriages and personal objects such as her only surviving saddle, her "riding chapel" and her magnificent court robes.
