

## TWO: FIRST WORLD WAR (1914-1918)

### INTRODUCTION

The basic unit was the company, a Major's command. RE companies could be Regular, Special Reserve or Territorial Force. At divisional level companies would be grouped into divisional RE under a Lieutenant Colonel.<sup>1</sup> Apart from that there were no engineer regiments (equivalents of infantry battalions) or other groupings. Corps and army troops RE were formed during the war, but did not have any sort of fixed organization.

The Regular companies were numbered in a single sequence from 1 to 59 (with various gaps). The Regulars included several different types of unit. There were 27 fortress companies, whose prime purpose was to co-operate with companies of the Royal Garrison Artillery in the provision of coastal defence. Most of these companies were stationed throughout the Empire and remained there during the war. There were two coast companies, two railway companies, three survey companies, a line of communications company, and two bridging trains in UK. There were only 16 field companies—most of recent formation—of which four were abroad and the other 12 assigned to the six divisions of the BEF. In addition there were five troops, one for each cavalry brigade. With the outbreak of war, the troops were consolidated into field squadrons for the mounted divisions.

The Special Reserve companies were grouped into two regiments of former militia: the Royal Monmouthshire RE and the Royal Anglesey RE. Each had three companies (railway or siege). These were the only non-Regular units for corps/army service. The Special Reserve companies retained their unique numbering system throughout the war, e.g. 1<sup>st</sup> Siege Coy, RMonRE.

The TF comprised three different kinds of company. Each of the 14 infantry divisions was allocated two field companies, with geographic designations rather than numbers (e.g., 1<sup>st</sup> East Anglian Field Coy RE). There were 18 units of fortress engineers for coast defence duties (e.g., Durham Fortress Engineers at Jarrow). Finally there were the London Electrical Engineers and the Tyne Electrical Engineers, both of which also manned searchlights for coastal defence. With the outbreak of war, TF field companies were duplicated as the TF was increased from 14 divisions (28 companies) to 28 divisions (56 companies).<sup>2</sup> In 1917 the complex TF system of names and numbering of field companies (e.g. 1<sup>st</sup> East Anglian had become 1/1<sup>st</sup> East Anglian, along with 2/1<sup>st</sup> East Anglian, and 3/1<sup>st</sup> East Anglian) was replaced by a single system beginning with 400 (after all the New Army units).

In addition, with the outbreak of war, a series of what would become 30 New Armies divisions were formed. As the New Armies were formed, their field companies were numbered from 61 upwards, in sequence immediately after the Regular companies.

The result was a fairly clear pattern (in the end) of company numbering during the war:

1- 60	Regulars (all types of companies)

<sup>1</sup> As the Signal Service was still part of the RE, divisions also included a signal company. These units are not part of this study.

<sup>2</sup> Initially the new companies became, e.g., 1<sup>st</sup> (Reserve) East Anglian Field Coy RE. In Mar 1915, a system of "fractional" designations was introduced: the original unit became 1/1<sup>st</sup> East Anglian Field Coy RE and 1<sup>st</sup> (Reserve) East Anglian Field Coy RE became 2/1<sup>st</sup> East Anglian Field Coy RE. It was also possible to have an (Extra Reserve) unit, which would become 3/1<sup>st</sup>. Units without a number simply added "1<sup>sb</sup>" to their designations, to allow for 1/1<sup>st</sup>, etc. Some new companies were also raised in the TF, and some of the Fortress Engineers formed companies for field service.

As noted, companies of the Royal Monmouthshire and Royal Anglesey RE were numbered within their regiments. Field squadrons were numbered in their own series, from 1 to 7. Gas companies were described as “Special Companies” and given lettered designations so that by 1918 A-Q existed.<sup>3</sup> They were employed under the direct command of GHQ.

All field companies of Indian Army divisions were formed by companies from three regiments: Bengal Sappers and Miners, Bombay Sappers and Miners, Madras Sappers and Miners.<sup>4</sup> Engineer units from the Dominions used their own national numbering systems.

#### Notes On Employment

Divisional engineers were employed in all theatres of the conflict: they went with their parent division. Some field companies were swapped around but most stayed with the same division. A number of TF companies were transferred to the Regular divisions in 1914/15 (to provide them with a third company). Many of the TF divisions had some or all of their original companies sent abroad, and then reformed their RE from the second line or new TF units.

Corps, army and lines of communication companies were few in number in 1914 but soon multiplied as the BEF expanded into five armies by 1916. Very few such non-divisional units were deployed anywhere outside France and Flanders. Although some were based on the expansion of SR and TF fortress and railway units, most were wartime creations.

By 1916, the BEF had RE units deployed at GHQ, army, corps and division level.

- Each division had three field companies, a signal company and a sanitary section.
- Each corps had one signal company, two corps troops companies, one tunnelling company and a camouflage unit.
- Each army had seventy-three units, including three gas units, 16 army troops companies, eight tunnelling companies, and two siege companies.
- Under GHQ were five ‘Special’ battalions [gas units] and a host of survey, works, wireless, postal, and dog messenger units.

<sup>4</sup> The exception was 15<sup>th</sup> Indian Division, which had three TF companies assigned as its divisional engineers.

By Nov 1918, all corps units had been transferred to army command and many GHQ troops moved down to army commands; only gas units remained under GHQ control.

Total RE manpower, which had been 25,090 in 1914 had risen to 229,336 by Nov 1918.

There were a total of 1,328 units of which 589 belonged to the RE Signal Service. Excluding them, the Corps deployed 739 units in 1918.

## BRITISH EXPEDITIONARY FORCE (FRANCE AND FLANDERS)

The BEF was created in Aug 1914 to control British units in France and Flanders. It functioned as an army headquarters until late Dec 1914 (when First and Second Armies were formed), from Jan 1915 it functioned as a GHQ.

## ARMY TROOPS RE

In 1916, each army troops RE had three special projector companies, one special mortar company, two advanced parks, sixteen army troops companies, two siege companies, eight tunnelling companies, one E&M company, one foreway (tramway) company, one mining company, one field survey company, one artisan works company and three forestry companies.

## CORPS TROOPS RE<sup>7</sup>

By 1916 each corps troops RE had two army troops companies, one tunnelling company and one special works park under command. ## SPECIAL [GAS] COMPANIES

The first four special companies (187<sup>th</sup>—189<sup>th</sup>) formed in 1915 were in the normal company numbering system. Sir Douglas Haig requested an expansion in this arm, and the result was the RE's Special Brigade; with HQ and depot it would grow to some 5500 personnel.

The planned organization was four special battalions (each with four cylinder companies), four special companies (using 4-inch Stokes Mortars), and four special sections with flamethrowers. By May 1916 Nos. 1 to 4 Special Battalions had been created, and No. 5 Special Battalion was the control element for the mortar companies.

#### ANTI-AIRCRAFT UNITS

The Army raised its first anti-aircraft units after the war began in 1914. These were initially formed as sections (two guns) in the Royal Garrison Artillery. The first units were for home defence, but by Nov 1914 six sections had been formed for the BEF. Because of their experience in manning searchlights (in fortress companies), the RE were given the role of raising searchlight sections to supplement the AA guns of the artillery. In early 1916 a total of six searchlight sections were allocated to each Army HQ in France. Artillery AA sections were gradually merged into batteries, and then grouped as brigades. As with the artillery, AA searchlight sections were gradually merged into larger units, companies in this case.
