Come for the Day or Come to Stay - Wings Wildlife Park, Gunns Plains

Looking for ideas for the school holidays? Camping on the flats along the banks of the Leven River at Wing's Wildlife Park is very popular, with so many things to do in a great location. Bring your kayaks, go fishing, splash about in the water, play cricket, go for walks, ride your bikes, or just relax under the shade of a tree. Why not bring some friends? We also have powered sites, backpacker units and cabin accommodation available, so there's something to suit everyone.

Is there anything cuter than a Tasmanian devil joey? You can get up close and personal with one of our babies as part of our Tassie devil feeding session and encounter, held at 1pm every day. We have hand-raised some little devils so that you can give them a pat, and you'll be amazed how soft their fur is. You'll see the bigger Tassie devils quarrelling over their food just like they would in the wild, and learn about their behaviour, personality, and breeding.

Other babies at the park include marmosets – sometimes venturing out on their own now, sometimes hanging on to Mum's back. They're very playful and mischievous.

Our emus have hatched their eggs. Emu chicks look very different from their parents, with their beautiful stripes and patterns, designed to camouflage them in the wild.

Koala interaction is at 11.30am and 2.30pm every day. Kangaroos, some with joeys in their pouches or by their side, will eat grain out of your hands. Fish will splash as they jump out of the water to catch the food you throw for them. You can talk to the cockatoos and see many more birds and animals. Wings Wildlife Park is fun for all ages.

Entry to the Farm Walk is included in all accommodation fees. This area includes buffalo, bison, camels, alpacas, ponies, ostrich, emus and more. Entry to the main Wildlife Area has an additional charge, but you will only need to pay once during your stay and it will cover you for all the subsequent days you stay at the Park. Cabin guests have discounted entry rates.
