



The Confederation Line project is the first stage in Ottawa's future light rail network. The 12.5 kilometre electric rail system will replace existing diesel powered buses, providing rapid transit between Blair Station in the east and Tunney's Pasture Station in the west. The route includes 13 stations and a 2.5 kilometre tunnel that will alleviate congestion through the downtown core. This look-ahead outlines the construction activities, traffic closures and detours through 2015.

Construction has been divided into three segments along the Light Rail Transit (LRT) alignment corridor:

- East Segment (includes Lees, Hurdman, Tremblay, St-Laurent, Cyrville and Blair stations and the Belfast Yard [Maintenance and Storage Facility])
- Central Segment (includes Lyon, Parliament, Rideau and uOttawa stations, and the 2.5 kilometre tunnel, including the West Portal, East Portal and central shaft)
- West Segment (includes Tunney's Pasture, Bayview and Pimisi stations)

Construction on the Confederation Line began in 2013 and works continue in all segments in 2015:

- Work on Belfast Yard buildings concludes to allow vehicle assembly to begin.
- Construction begins in East Segment, including at Hurdman, Tremblay, St-Laurent, Cyrville and Blair stations.
- Booth Street construction and widening of Scott Street begin.
- Guideway and catenary\* construction commence along the alignment.

In addition to LRT construction in 2015, a number of associated civic works are also taking place:

- Widening of Highway 417 continues and is scheduled to be complete in summer 2015 to allow OC Transpo buses (from Blair Station to Hurdman Station) to be detoured onto the highway during LRT construction.
- Final landscaping works wrap up on the new Coventry Pedestrian and Cycling Footbridge.
- Albert Street civic works continue with the installation of new watermains, upgrading sewer infrastructure, and widening and rebuilding Albert Street between Broad Street and Empress Avenue.

#### \* Definitions:

Traction Power Sub Station (TPSS): TPSS structures are approximately four metres high by five metres wide by 15 metres long. They convert electricity from the local power sources to the voltage levels needed by the LRT vehicles.

**Substructure works:** Substructure works involve foundation and below surface work.

**Superstructure works:** Superstructure works involve work to the aboveground structure.

Catenary: Catenary is a system of overhead wires used to supply electricity to light rail vehicles.



## CONSTRUCTION OF THE CONFEDERATION LINE

- Some disruption is unavoidable when building a project of this size and scope.
- Public access to residences will be maintained, although temporary inconveniences may occur when crews are working in the immediate area.
- Businesses in the construction area remain open and accessible and welcome your continued patronage.
- Cyclists are not permitted to ride through active construction areas; alternate routes will be provided and should be used for public and worker safety.
- All efforts will be made to ensure multi-use pathway access is maintained during construction if public and worker safety permits. Detours will be provided where closures are required for public safety.
- Businesses and residents may experience general disruption associated with truck traffic, noise from crews and heavy equipment, vibration, as well as impacts from excavation, elevated guideway work, station construction, and general construction activity.
- Crews will endeavour to minimize disruption to businesses and residents in the area, and we thank you for your understanding while we build.
- Throughout Confederation Line construction and operation, Rideau Transit Group (RTG) is adhering to noise and vibration standards defined in the Project Agreement.
