Noting ACC Football Clemson Ranked No. 1 by the AP for Third Straight Week

Clemson earned its third straight No. 1 ranking by the Associated Press, becoming only the third ACC team to have been ranked No. 1 for three consecutive weeks by the AP in the same year. The Tigers join Florida State (1993, 1995, 1999, 2013, 2014) and Virginia (1990) as the only ACC teams to have been ranked at No. 1 at least three straight weeks.

North Carolina Secures First Championship Game Berth

With a 30-27 overtime win over Virginia Tech, North Carolina earned its first berth in the Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game and a share of the Coastal Division title. A win over NC State this week would give the Tar Heels undisputed possession of the Coastal Championship. The title is UNC's and the Tar Heels will be playing for their first ACC Football title since 1980.

ACC Has Two Teams With Double-Digit Winning Streaks

For the first time in its history, the ACC has two teams with double-digit winning streaks at the same time. Clemson has won 14 games in a row, the longest current winning streak in the FBS, while North Carolina has now won 10 straight games, which is the third-longest current winning streak.

ACC Has Two of Five Finalists for Prestigious Nagurski Trophy

In a year when the Conference was nationally prominent on defense, two ACC defenders are among the five finalists named for the prestigious Nagurski Trophy, which is given by the FWAA to the nation's top defensive player. Duke **S Jeremy Cash** and Clemson **DE Shaq Lawson** were both named finalists.

Deshaun Watson, Dalvin Cook Named Semifinalists for **Walter Camp Player of the Year**
Clemson sophomore QB **Deshaun Watson** and Florida State RB **Dalvin Cook** have been named two of the 15 finalists for this year's Walter Camp Player of the Year Award.

North Carolina Set to Face Clemson in 2015 Dr Pepper ACC Championship

*Six In-State Rivalry Battles Highlight Week 13; Four of them Match ACC & SEC
Rivalry Week Also Features Miami at Pitt on ESPN on Black Friday*

The pairings for the 2015 Dr Pepper Atlantic Coast Conference Football Championship Game, scheduled for Saturday, Dec. 5 at Bank of America Stadium in Charlotte, N.C., are set with No. 1 **Clemson** set to face No. 17 **North Carolina** in the 11th Annual ACC Football title game...**Clemson**, which captured its third Atlantic Division crown, will face a **North Carolina** squad that earned its first berth in the Championship Game with a win last Saturday over **Virginia Tech**...The Tar Heels will be playing for their first ACC Football Championship in 35 years and sixth overall, while **Clemson**, which last won the title in 2011, has won or shared 14, just

one shy of **Florida State** (15), which has captured the most ACC Football titles...Both teams, though, have unfinished business ahead of them this week, as both face arch-rivals on the road...The Tigers travel to Columbia, S.C., to face **South Carolina** (12 p.m., ESPN) at Williams-Brice Stadium in one of four in-state rivalry battles that feature teams from the ACC facing teams from the SEC...**Clemson** and **South Carolina** will be meeting for the 113th time in a series which began in 1896... In all, ACC teams will play nine games this week, five of them conference contests and six games featuring in-state rivalry clashes...The Tigers are

coached by **Dabo Swinney** and led by **QB Deshaun Watson** on offense and **DE Shaq Lawson** on defense...Watson is a semifinalist for the Walter Camp Player of the Year Award, while Lawson is a semifinalist for both the Nagurski Trophy and the Lombardi Award...South Carolina is coached by interim head coach **Shawn Elliott**...The Gamecocks have won the last three meetings in Columbia with Clemson's last win there coming in 2007...**North Carolina**, coached by **Larry Fedora** and led by **QB Marquise Williams**, faces arch-rival NC State at Carter-Finley Stadium in Raleigh, N.C. (3:30 p.m.; ABC/ESPN2)...The Wolfpack is coached by **Dave Doeren** and led by **QB Jacoby Brissett**...Saturday's meeting will be the 105th meeting between the two schools on the gridiron in a series which began in 1894 in Chapel Hill, N.C...**NC State** has won six of the last eight meetings between the two teams, including last year's 35-7 decision in Chapel Hill...**UNC** did win in Raleigh in 2013...Should the Tar Heels finish the season with an unblemished ACC record, it would mark only the third time in FBS history that a conference championship game has matched two teams unbeaten in their conference...The weekend starts early with Pitt hoping to gain a share of the Coastal Division crown, hosting Miami on Black Friday at Heinz Field (Noon, ESPN2)...The Panthers, coached by **Pat Narduzzi** and led by **DE Ejuan Price**, would need a win over the Hurricanes and a loss by the Tar Heels to tie for the Coastal title, though UNC holds the tiebreaker for the berth in the ACC Championship Game by virtue of its win over the Panthers on Oct. 29....Price recorded 5.0 sacks, the most by an FBS player this year, in its win last Saturday over Louisville...**Miami**, coached by interim coach **Larry Scott** and led by **QB Brad Kaaya**, is looking to finish the season strong and improve its bowl resume...The Canes under Scott have posted a 3-1 record and won in their last appearance at Heinz Field in 2013....**Florida State**, ranked 14th by the College Football Playoff, AP and the Amway Coaches poll, travels to Gainesville, Fla., to face arch-rival and 8th-ranked **Florida** (CFP Rankings) at Ben Hill Griffin Stadium...The Seminoles are coached by **Jimbo Fisher** and led by **RB Dalvin Cook**...The Gators are coached by Jim McElwain...Cook ranks 2nd nationally in rushing and has run for 1,475 yards and an 8.0 yards-per-carry average but will be facing a Florida defense that is ranked 8th nationally in rushing defense (108.3), 6th in total defense (281.7) and 3rd in scoring defense (14.5)...The Seminoles have taken four of the last five games from the Gators during the Fisher era...In Atlanta, Ga., **Georgia Tech**, coached by **Paul Johnson** and led by freshman B-Back **Marcus Marshall**, will host arch-rival Georgia at Bobby Dodd Stadium (Noon, ESPN2)...Marshall, who is eighth in the ACC in rushing, leads a Tech ground attack that ranks seventh nationally, averaging 261.7 yards per game...The Bulldogs, coached by **Mark Richt**, are led by former

Virginia **QB Greyson Lambert**...Saturday's game will mark the 110th meeting of the two teams in a series which began in 1893...Tech took last year's meeting in Athens...The fourth ACC-SEC matchup of the weekend has **Louisville** travelling to Lexington, Ky., to face the Wildcats of **Kentucky** at Commonwealth Stadium (Noon, SEC Network)...The Cardinals are coached by **Bobby Petrino** and led by **WR Jamari Staples**...Kentucky is coached by former Florida State defensive coordinator **Mark Stoops**...Staples is coming off a nine-catch, 194-yard performance last weekend against Pitt... While Louisville is already bowl-eligible, **Kentucky** would qualify for the postseason with a win over the Cardinals...In Charlottesville, Va., bowl eligibility will be on the minds of the visiting **Virginia Tech** Hokies as they face arch-rival **Virginia** for the 97th time in a series which began in 1895...The game at Scott Stadium (Noon, ESPN2) will be the final regular-season game for **Virginia Tech** head coach **Frank Beamer**, who is the winningest active coach in the FBS with 278 career triumphs and ranks sixth on the all-time FBS coaching wins list...Tech, which is led by **QB Michael Brewer**, needs a win against the Cavaliers to continue its bowl streak of 22 consecutive years...Virginia, coached by Mike London and led by **QB Matt Johns**, is looking to finish the season in strong fashion after securing a decisive 42-34 win over Duke last week...Johns ranks third in the ACC in passing yards per game, while the Hokies' defense, led by **LB Andrew Motuapuaka**, ranks 11th nationally in passing yards allowed...Tech has won 11 straight games in the series, with UVA's last win coming in Charlottesville in 2003...In Winston-Salem, N.C., interdivisional rivals **Wake Forest** and **Duke** will square off for the 96th time in a series which began in 1889...Saturday's game at BB&T Stadium (12:30 p.m., ACC Network) is the first of two interdivisional matchups of the weekend with NC State-North Carolina to follow at 3:30 p.m....The Coastal Division has built an 8-4 advantage this year, narrowing the Atlantic Division's advantage to 99-95 since Divisional play began in 2005...**Wake Forest**, coached by **Dave Clawson**, is led by **LB Brandon Chubb**, while **Duke**, coached by **David Cutcliffe**, is led by **S Jeremy Cash**, a finalist for the Nagurski Trophy...Duke has won the last three meetings of the two teams, stopping a Wake run of 12 straight victories from 2000-2011...In Syracuse, N.Y., the Orange will host **Boston College**, coached by **Steve Addazio**, at the Carrier Dome (12:30 p.m., RSN) in the final game for both teams...The Eagles feature the nation's top defensive unit which leads the FBS in total defense, rushing defense and tackles for loss, led by LBs **Steven Daniels**, **Matt Milano** and **Connor Strachan**...**Syracuse**, which will be playing its final game under head coach **Scott Shafer**, features a youth laden offense led by **QB Zach Mahoney**, **RB Jordan Fredericks** and **WR Steve Ishmael**...The two teams have split the last 10 meetings, though Syracuse holds a 19-5 advantage in the series at home.

ACC Football By The Numbers

.909 - The field-goal percentage of Clemson **PK Greg Huegel**. Huegel, originally a walk-on who was not on the roster of Clemson's preseason media guide, has made 20 of 22 field-goal attempts and is tied for seventh nationally in field-goal percentage. He has made all 17 of his field-goal attempts in ACC play, the most consecutive field goals this year in league play nationally.

1 - **Boston College** leads the nation in total defense (255.6) in rushing defense (76.7) and in team tackles for loss (9.6). The Eagles are ranked second nationally in first downs defense (127), third in third-down conversion percentage defense (0.236), and fifth in scoring defense. (14.8)

2 - Clemson **DE Shaq Lawson**, who was named a finalist for the Nagurski Trophy as the nation's top defensive player, is ranked second nationally this week in tackles for loss. Lawson has 19.0 in 11 games, an average of 1.8 per game.

3rd - Clemson sophomore **QB Deshaun Watson** ranks third nationally in pass completion percentage. Watson has completed 241 of 344 passes for a .701 completion percentage.

5.0 - The number of sacks for Pitt **DE Ejuan Price** in the Panthers' win over Louisville, that is the highest total by any ACC player this year and the highest by any player in the FBS this season. Price had 6.0 tackles for loss. Only two players in the FBS have had five or more sacks in a game in this century.

6 - Duke **S DeVon Edwards** returned a kickoff 94 yards for a touchdown against Virginia. The TD was Edwards' sixth on a kickoff return. The total is one short of the ACC record, set by C.J. Spiller of Clemson from 2006-09. It was also the third of the season for Edwards, which is also one shy of the ACC record set in 2009 by Spiller.

8-9 - Clemson sophomore **QB Deshaun Watson** and North Carolina senior **QB Marquisie Williams** are ranked eighth and ninth respectively in pass efficiency rating. Watson has a rating of 161.2 and is ranked eighth nationally, while Williams is ranked ninth with a rating of 160.2.

8 - The ACC has eight teams that have achieved **bowl eligibility** in **Clemson, Duke, Florida State, Louisville, Miami, North Carolina, NC State** and **Pitt. Virginia Tech** can become the ninth bowl-bound league team with a win this Saturday against Virginia.

9 - Pitt head football coach **Pat Narduzzi** joined a select club when his Panthers captured their eighth win of the season against Louisville. He is now one of just nine first-year head coaches in the ACC to have won at least eight games in their inaugural seasons.

9.91 - The career average number of tackles per game for Virginia sophomore **S Quin Blanding**. Blanding ranks 2nd nationally among all active players in the FBS. He also ranks third nationally in solo tackles per game (5.39).

10 - **North Carolina** has now won 10 consecutive games. That is the third-longest current winning streak in the FBS.

12 - The number of pass receptions Saturday for Duke true freshman **WR T.J. Rahming**. He had 190 receiving yards and a TD.

14 - **Clemson** has now won 14 straight games, and that is the longest current winning streak in the nation and the longest for the Tigers since 1947-49 when the Tigers won 15 straight. It is also the sixth-longest winning streak in ACC history.

18.0 - Duke **S Jeremy Cash** is ranked sixth nationally in tackles for loss, averaging 1.6 per game with 18.0 in 11 games. Cash is the only defensive back listed among the Top 50 players nationally in tackles for loss.

25 - With two regular-season games remaining, Duke head coach **David Cutcliffe** has already led Duke to 25 wins over the past three seasons, tying the school record. The school mark was set originally by the 1936-38 teams of Wallace Wade, which posted a 25-4-1 record, and tied by Cutcliffe's 2012-14 teams (25-15). Duke is now 25-12 since the start of the 2013 season.

72 - **Dabo Swinney** is now 72-26 in his career at Clemson. He is now tied for 12th-

place on the ACC career wins list.

243 - The number of career receptions for Pitt **WR Tyler Boyd** in less than three full seasons. Boyd has moved into fourth place on the ACC career list trailing only Duke's Jamison Crowder and Conner Vernon (283) and Florida State's Rashad Greene (270).

278 - The number of career victories for Virginia Tech head coach **Frank Beamer**. That is the most of any active FBS head coach and ranks sixth on the NCAA's FBS all-time list. Beamer trails only the icons of the game in career wins in Joe Paterno (409), Bobby Bowden (377), Paul "Bear" Bryant (323), Glenn "Pop" Warner (319) and Amos Alonzo Stagg (314). To give perspective, Florida State's Jimbo Fisher has averaged 11.6 wins a year in his first five years as a head coach, the best mark in league history. Fisher would have to average 11.6 wins a year for the next 19 years, or until 2034, to pass Beamer on the all-time wins list.

407 - The number of career points for Duke **PK Ross Martin**. Martin moved into second place on the ACC career list past Chandler Catanzaro of Clemson (404, 2010-13) and now trails only Dustin Hopkins of Florida State (466, 2009-12).

700 - **Clemson** became the fifth ACC team to top the 700 win mark with its 33-13 win over Wake Forest. The Tigers joined Virginia Tech, Georgia Tech, Pitt and Syracuse in the 700 club.

1,475- The number of rushing yards this year for Florida State **RB Dalvin Cook**, which is an FSU school season record. With two games remaining, his total is already the eighth-best in league history and his 8.0 yards-per-carry average is by far the best of anyone in the ACC's Top Ten in total yards or yards per game.

2,243 - The number of career rushing yards for North Carolina senior **QB Marquisie Williams**. Williams ranks third on the ACC career rushing yardage list for quarterbacks, and trails only Georgia Tech's Joshua Nesbitt (2,806) and Clemson's Woodrow Dantzler (2,761).

Atlantic Coast Conference Announces Football Players of the Week

*NC State Leads With Two Selections; Clemson's Watson Earns Fourth Honor
Nov. 23, 2015*

NC State leads this week's ACC Football Player of the Week selections with two honorees, while Clemson quarterback Deshaun Watson earned his fourth weekly honor of the season and Pitt defensive end Ejuan Price was recognized for the second time following his impressive performance. NC State's Joe Thuney was honored for the second time this season as the ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week after leading the blocking in Saturday's 42-29 win over Syracuse. Wolfpack teammate Nyheim Hines was voted the ACC Rookie of the Week. Clemson's Watson received his fourth ACC Offensive Back of the Week award of the year after leading the top-ranked Tigers past Wake Forest.

Pitt's Price was named the Defensive Lineman of the Week after registering five quarterback sacks in Saturday's 45-34 win over Louisville. Other ACC weekly honorees include Louisville's Jamari Staples (Receiver of the Week), Virginia's Micah Kiser (Linebacker of the Week), Boston College's Justin Simmons (Defensive Back of the Week) and Duke's DeVon Edwards (Specialist of the Week). The Specialist of the Week honor is Edwards' second of the season.

ACC Football Player of the Week selections are determined by a vote of a 14-member media panel.

OFFENSIVE BACK – Deshaun Watson, Clemson, So., QB, 6-2, 210, Gainesville, Ga.

Watson completed 24-of-35 passes for 343 yards and three touchdowns in Clemson's 33-13 win over Wake Forest. He threw touchdown passes of 44 yards to Charone Peake, 11 yards to Deon Cain, and 47 yards to Germone Hopper, all in the first half when Clemson took a 30-7 lead. Watson added 10 rushes for 44 yards and a score, giving him 387 yards of total offense and four touchdowns. He led Clemson to 552 yards of total offense, the seventh straight game Clemson has gone over the 500-yard mark.

OFFENSIVE LINEMAN – Joe Thuney, NC State, Sr.-r, OT, 6-5, 295, Centerville, Ohio

Thuney played 83 snaps in the Wolfpack's 42-29 Atlantic Division victory over visiting Syracuse, helping pave the way for 511 yards of total offense. Thuney did not allow a sack or miss an assignment as NC State rushed for 276 yards.

RECEIVER – Jamari Staples, Louisville, Jr., WR, 6-4, 195, Lineville, Ala.

Staples caught nine passes for a career-high 194 yards in Saturday's 45-34 loss at Pitt. The 194 receiving yards tied for the sixth-most in a single game in school history. Staples' big receiving day included a 49-yard touchdown catch with three seconds remaining in the first half.

DEFENSIVE LINEMAN – Ejuan Price, Pitt, Sr., DE, 6-0, 250, Rankin, Pa.

Price posted one of the finest defensive performances in recent Pitt history with 10 tackles, five sacks and six tackles for loss in Saturday's 45-34 win over Louisville. Price's sack total was the highest by an FBS player in 2015 and fell one shy of the national record. He spearheaded a defensive effort that limited Louisville to minus-one yard on the ground, the first time Pitt held an opponent to negative yards rushing since 2002. Price became the first Pitt player with at least 4.5 sacks in a game since 1987, and his six tackles for loss were the most by a Panther since Aaron Donald also had six vs. Georgia Tech in 2013. Price now ranks fourth in the nation and first in the ACC with an average of 1.05 sacks per game. His 11.5 total sacks are the most in a single season by a Pitt player since 2000. Price was awarded a "Helmet Sticker" on ESPN College Football Final for his Louisville performance.

LINEBACKER – Micah Kiser, Virginia, So., LB, 6-2, 235, Baltimore, Md.

Kiser had a career high 17 tackles in the Cavaliers' 42-34 win over visiting Duke. He had 10 solo stops, one sack and two total tackles for loss as the Blue Devils managed just 100 rushing yards and UVA posted five sacks in the win.

DEFENSIVE BACK – Justin Simmons, Boston College, Sr., FS, 6-3, 201, Stuart, Fla.

Simmons had a career day against fourth-ranked Notre Dame, helping to force the Fighting Irish's highly-touted offense to turn the ball over three times. Simmons forced and recovered a fumble in the first quarter on the Irish's third drive of the game. Before the end of the first half, he recorded an interception at the BC 31-yard line, and then made a second interception in the red zone at the BC 3-yard line. Simmons helped the Eagles defense, tops in the nation, hold the Irish to 19 points – 17.2 below their season average. He tied for the team lead with eight tackles. Simmons has five interceptions on the season, tied for 11th in the nation and tied for first in the ACC.

SPECIALIST – DeVon Edwards, Duke, Jr.-r, KR, 5-9, 180, Covington, Ga.

Edwards returned five kickoffs for 174 yards in Saturday's road game at Virginia, including a 94-yard return for a touchdown. Edwards established a new school record for kickoff returns for touchdowns in a season with three, the breaking previous record of two first set by Randy Jones in 1990 and tied by Edwards in 2013. Edwards pushed his career total of kickoff returns for TDs to six – one shy of the ACC record of seven held by Clemson's C.J. Spiller.

ROOKIE – Nyheim Hines, NC State, Fr., RB/WR, 5-9, 190, Garner, N.C.

Hines saw action at both running back and wide receiver in the Wolfpack's 42-29 win over Syracuse. Despite playing just 23 snaps, Hines tallied 208 all-purpose yards. The freshman's big day included his first rushing touchdown of the season on a 4-yard run, and a 38-yard run from scrimmage for NC State's longest play of the game. Hines graded out at 96 percent overall for his performance.

Virginia Tech's **Frank Beamer** has claimed yet another milestone. The active career wins leader in the FBS, Beamer is now fifth on the NCAA's list of most games coached in the FBS. To date, Beamer has coached in 426 games, one better than Paul "Bear" Bryant for fifth-place on the all-time list. Of the Top 10 on the list, five of the coaches have ties to the ACC, including **Bobby Bowden** (3rd, Florida State), **Beamer**, **Jess Neely** (8th, Clemson), **Lou Holtz** (9th, NC State) and **Mack Brown** (10th, North Carolina).

Virginia Tech's Frank Beamer Is NCAA FBS Active Career Leader in Wins

Virginia Tech's **Frank Beamer** is now the leading active head coach in the NCAA's FBS in career victories with a total of 278 triumphs in his 35-year coaching career. Georgia Tech head coach Paul Johnson ranks ninth on the active FBS list with 168 career wins. Beamer is sixth on the all-time list and Amos Alonzo Stagg is next on the list with 314 wins at Springfield, Chicago and Pacific. Former Florida State head coach Bobby Bowden, who retired after the 2009 season, is second in the NCAA's FBS with 377 career victories only to Penn State's Joe Paterno. Glenn "Pop" Warner, who ranks third on the all-time list with 336 wins, coached at seven different schools including a nine-year stint at Pitt (2015-23).

Clemson's Swinney, Georgia Tech's Johnson In Good Company As ACC Head Coaches

After their first seven seasons at Clemson and Georgia Tech, head coaches **Dabo Swinney** and **Paul Johnson** have recorded excellent numbers. Only four other coaches in league history have had a better winning percentage after seven years than Swinney (.701) and only two have won more games. Only four other coaches in league history have won more games (58) than has Johnson after his first seven seasons in the league and he ranks 10th in winning percentage.

Home Sweet Home for Noles' Fisher, Tigers' Swinney

Florida State head coach **Jimbo Fisher** and Clemson head coach **Dabo Swinney** have both enjoyed coaching in the cozy and imposing confines of the Seminoles' Doak Campbell Stadium and the Tigers' Memorial Stadium, also known as Death Valley. Now, in his sixth season as head coach of the Seminoles, Fisher's teams have won 22 of 24 ACC games at home, a winning percentage of .917, the best by any ACC coach with a minimum of five seasons on the job. Swinney is right behind as his teams have won 27 of his first 39 home ACC games, a winning percentage of .897. They are both just ahead of legendary FSU coach Bobby Bowden, who also won more ACC home games than any other coach, with 62 triumphs in his 18 years in the league.



Cutcliffe Leading Duke to Unprecedented Success

Duke's **David Cutcliffe** is leading the Blue Devils to success unprecedented in the school's history. Cutcliffe has led Duke to three consecutive bowl game appearances, a first in Blue Devil history. He has also led Duke to 19 wins in 2013 and 2014, the most in a two-year span since Duke began playing football in 1888. Now in his 8th season, Cutcliffe has led Duke to more wins (46) as the program experienced in the 18 years (43) before he took over the reins in Durham.

Boston College's Steve Addazio Leads Eagles to Back-to-Back Bowl Bids

In his first two seasons as the head coach at Chestnut Hill, Steve Addazio led Boston College to back-to-back bowl appearances utilizing a physical ground game and a hard-hitting defensive unit. In each of his first two years, Addazio has had a player lead the nation in rushing. In 2013, tailback Andre Williams led the nation and set an ACC single-season record with 2,177 yards. On year later, QB Tyler Murphy led all quarterbacks nationally, rushing for 1,184 yards, while setting an ACC rushing mark for signal-callers. Last year, BC was one of just three schools (Oklahoma and Toledo were the others) that ranked in the nation's Top 15 in rushing defense (2nd) and rushing offense (14th).



North Carolina's Fedora Putting Points on the Board for the Tar Heels

Now, in its fourth season with Larry Fedora as head coach, North Carolina has topped the 40-point mark 21 times and bettered 30 points 33 times in 49 games. His Tar Heel teams have averaged 36.5 points per game. In the previous 13 seasons before Fedora came to Chapel Hill, UNC had averaged just 23.3 points per game, a 13.5-point difference. Also, in his first four seasons, UNC has averaged 456 yards per game of total offense. That compares with the previous 13 seasons when the Tar Heels averaged just 349.25 yards per game on offense. Fedora's first three Tar Heel teams bettered the previous school mark for scoring. UNC scored a school-record 487 points in 2012 and tallied 425 points in 2013 and 432 in 2014. Previously, the school had only topped 400 points once. The school put up 421 points in 1993. With at least three games remaining, UNC has scored 450 points this season, an average of 40.9 points per game.



NC State's Dave Doeren: Winning the Close Ones

Now in just his third season as head coach at NC State, Dave Doeren has already made a name for himself on the national stage. After winning 23 of his first 27 career games as a head coach at Northern Illinois, he had an 8-5 mark in 2014, winning his final three games, including a 34-27 win over Central Florida in the Bitcoin St. Petersburg Bowl. Doeren's teams are 7-2 (.778) in games decided by four or fewer points. That's the best winning percentage in such games by any Power 5 coach. Doeren guided State to three wins by a touchdown or less in 2014.

ACC 2015 Football Championship Game Legends Class

Quartet of National Champions Headline the 2015 ACC Legends Class in Pitt's Tony Dorsett, Georgia Tech's Bobby Ross, FSU's Warrick Dunn, Miami's Clinton Portis

One of the game's most renowned Heisman Trophy winners and a trio of other major contributors to national championship teams lead the 2015 Atlantic Coast Conference Class of Football Legends announced on Sept. 29.

Pitt running back Tony Dorsett, Florida State running back Warrick Dunn, Georgia Tech coach Bobby Ross and Miami running back Clinton Portis are among the 14 all-time greats who will be honored during the weekend of the 2015 Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game, which will be played in Charlotte, N.C., on the evening of Saturday, Dec. 5.

Boston College center Dan Koppen, Clemson linebacker Anthony Simmons, Duke running back Chris Douglas, Louisville quarterback Chris Redman, North Carolina offensive lineman Ken Huff, NC State defensive back and return specialist Fred Combs, Syracuse tight end Chris Gedney, Virginia defensive end Patrick Kerney, Virginia Tech defensive end Corey Moore and Wake Forest punter Chuck Ramsey also headline this year's Legends class.

Dorsett – a member of both the College and Pro Football Halls of Fame – earned the Heisman Trophy as a senior in 1976, when he led Pitt to the national title to conclude a stellar collegiate career in which he rushed for over 6,000 yards. Dunn cemented his lasting impact on Florida State football as a freshman in 1993, when he helped key the Seminoles and head coach Bobby Bowden to their first national championship.

Ross oversaw a return to football glory at Georgia Tech, highlighted by the 1990 national title and the Yellow Jackets' first ACC football crown. Portis helped Miami claim the national championship in 2001 by rushing for 1,200 yards and 10 touchdowns on 220 carries.

Koppen made his mark as the center on Boston College's strong offensive lines before moving on to start on four Super Bowl teams with the New England Patriots. Clemson's Simmons established himself in the 1990s as one of the leading tacklers ever to take the field for an ACC team. Duke's Douglas set school rushing marks that still stand, while Louisville's Redman displayed passing skills that led to national honors, including the trophy named for ultimate Cardinal great John Unitas.

North Carolina's Huff epitomized the "Tailback U" teams of head coach Bill Dooley in the early 1970s, opening holes for 1,000-yard rushers in the patented ground game. The multi-talented Combs proved a mainstay for head coach Earle Edwards' NC State teams of the mid-1960s, including a starring role on the 1967 squad that played its way to a No. 3 national ranking.

Gedney upheld the high standard for tight ends at Syracuse, set by the legendary John Mackey, establishing school receiving records for his position and leading the Orange to four bowl games. Virginia's Kerney emerged as one of the game's top pass rushers, earning All-America honors after ranking second in the nation in quarterback sacks as a senior.

Virginia Tech's Moore was another elite defensive end, garnering both the Nagurski and Lombardi awards in his final collegiate season and piling up 35 quarterback sacks over his three years in Blacksburg. Wake Forest's Ramsey proved a valuable weapon in the battle for field position, leading the nation in punting in 1973 and claiming consensus All-America honors.

Each of the ACC's 14 football schools selected its 2015 Legend. The group will be honored at the ACC Night of Legends on Friday, Dec. 4, and on Saturday Dec. 5, during the 11th annual Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game at Bank of America Stadium. The game will be nationally televised with either a 7:45 pm (ESPN) or 8 p.m. (ABC) kickoff.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

The College Football Playoff begins its second year of operation after a highly-acclaimed first season in 2014-15. The Playoff features the top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and a national championship game played in a different city each year. Each semifinal is played during the New Year's holiday with the National Championship Game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

The College Football Playoff selection committee chooses the four teams for the playoff based on their performance during the regular season, including, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams will be seeded so that #1 will play #4 in one semifinal and #2 will meet #3 in the other, with the winners advancing to the national championship game. The selection committee will announce its rankings each week on Tuesdays beginning this year on Nov. 3. The final rankings will be announced on Sunday, Dec. 6.

The semifinals will rotate among six different bowls: the Chick-fil-A Peach, Goodyear Cotton, Fiesta and Capital One Orange Bowls; the Rose Bowl presented by Northwestern Mutual and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.

ACC Bowl Quick Selection Order

(The ACC is in the second year of six-year contracts with its current bowl partners. The current College Football Playoff format is a 12-year agreement)

College Football Playoff (four teams)

If the ACC Champion is not in one of the semifinal games this year, it will appear in one of the Playoff "host" bowls, either the Fiesta or Chick-fil-A Peach, since the Capital One Orange Bowl will serve as a semifinal site this year. There is no limit on how many teams the College Football Playoff may choose from a particular conference.

Capital One Orange Bowl

The ACC champion, if not in the College Football Playoff, would normally play in the Capital One Orange Bowl against the highest-ranked and available team from Notre Dame, the SEC or the Big Ten. With the Capital One Orange Bowl serving as a Playoff semifinal this year, the CFP Selection Committee will determine the game (Chick-fil-A or Fiesta) and opponent for the ACC champion if that team is not in the Playoff.

Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl

Only if the ACC opponent in the Capital One Orange Bowl in a non-semifinal year, is a team from the Big Ten. This will not occur in 2015 due to the fact that the Orange Bowl this year is a semifinal site for the College Football Playoff.

Russell Athletic Bowl

Has first pick of ACC teams in 2015 after the College Football Playoff and the Host Bowls.

The One-Win Rule Applies Only to Notre Dame

The ACC's bowl selection will no longer be bound by the rigidity of a "one-win rule" but will have a general list of criteria to emphasize regionality and quality matchups on the field. A one-win rule does apply to Notre Dame's participation in the ACC Bowl structure. Notre Dame is now eligible for ACC Bowl selection beginning with the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl and continuing through the league's bowl selections. However, Notre Dame must be within one win of the ACC available team which has the best overall record, in order to be chosen. In other words, if an ACC team was 9-3, a 7-5 Notre Dame team could not be chosen in its place. Notre Dame would have to be 8-4 to be chosen over a 9-3 league team.

ACC Bowl Expenses And Revenue

The Atlantic Coast Conference shares all bowl revenues. Each school is provided an initial expense allotment. The Conference will share in the cost of resold tickets for participating bowl institutions. After all bowl expense allotments and ticket reimbursements are subtracted from the total bowl revenue, the remaining revenue is distributed evenly among ACC schools.

The ACC In Overtime

The ACC & Overtime

When North Carolina and Virginia Tech ended regulation tied at 24-24 on November 21, 2015, they played the 76th game featuring an ACC team that has had to go to extra sessions. Of the 76 overtime contests, a large portion of them--31--have been played in September. Games have gone into overtime for ACC teams a total of 20 times in November, while 14 have been played in October, three in August, six in December and two in January (2006 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2012 Allstate Sugar Bowl). Of the 76 overtime contests, 38 have been ACC games while 38 nonconference games have gone into overtime. The home team has a 41-26 advantage in the 67 games played on campus. The team which wins the toss has a 41-35 record. Fifty-five of the games were decided in the first overtime with 14 games in double overtime, six in triple overtime and one in four overtimes.
