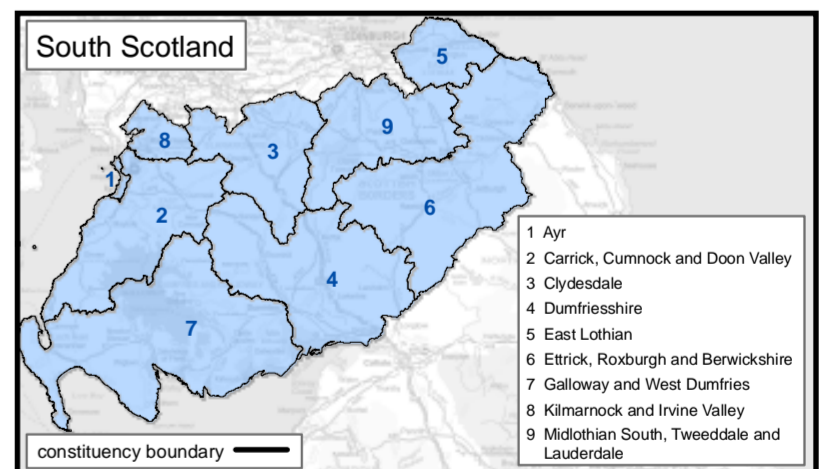

Your views on the recommendations are sought

The Boundary Commission for Scotland has made Revised Recommendations for the Scottish Parliament regions of: Central Scotland; Highlands and Islands; Lothian; South Scotland; and West Scotland. The changes are:

- Dumbarton constituency to be in West Scotland region rather than Highlands and Islands region;
- Clydebank and Milngavie constituency and Strathkelvin and Bearsden constituency to be in West Scotland region rather than Central Scotland region;
- East Kilbride constituency and Hamilton, Larkhall and Stonehouse constituency to be in Central Scotland region rather than West Scotland region;
- Linlithgow constituency to be in Lothian region rather than Central Scotland region;
- East Lothian constituency to be in South Scotland region rather than Lothian region;
- region names to be Central Scotland instead of East Central Scotland; and West Scotland instead of West Central Scotland.

The Commission is not proposing any changes to its Provisional Proposals for: Glasgow; Mid Scotland and Fife; and North East Scotland regions.
