July 7, 2011 – Former Vice President of Guatemala and Chairman of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission Eduardo Stein met with Honduran President Porfirio Lobo and OAS Secretary General Jose Miguel Insulza in the Honduran capital of Tegucigalpa for the release of the Commission's report "Para que los hechos no se repitan" ("So that events are not repeated"). The report represents the cumulative work of more than a year aiming to clarify the events before and after the constitutional crisis that took place on June 28, 2009. The report is a product of an investigation undertaken through interviews, testimonies and reports with governmental authorities, international organizations, and civil society, political parties, the private sector, academics and professionals from the country's 18 departments.

<u>The Truth and Reconciliation Commission</u> was established on May 4, 2010 as a result of the Guaymuras Dialogue: Tegucigalpa/San José Accord for the national reconciliation and strengthening of democracy in Honduras. It aims to clarify the events occurred before and after the constitutional crisis of June 28, 2009, to identify actions that led to the crisis situation and provide the people of Honduras with fundamentals for preventing these events from occurring in the future.
