Supplementum Epigraphicum Graecum (SEG) is an annual publication collecting newly published Greek inscriptions and studies on previously known documents. Material later than the 8th century A.D. is not included. *Supplementum Epigraphicum Graecum* presents complete Greek texts of all new inscriptions with a critical apparatus; it summarizes new readings, interpretations and studies of known inscriptions, and occasionally presents the Greek text of these documents. Inscriptions are listed by their provenance, e.g. Dodona or Abdera. These place names are grouped into regions, such as Attica or Illyria. In the *SEG Online*, in order to keep lists and loading times short, these regions are grouped into several larger areas:

1. Greece
2. North
3. Aegean
4. West
5. Asia Minor
6. East
