The Edinburgh experience

The University of Edinburgh is one of the largest and most diverse universities in the UK. We host more than 30,000 students from some 140 countries studying across more than 150 academic disciplines.

Whether you choose to study on campus or online, your postgraduate experience at Edinburgh will be supported and enhanced by the wealth of resources and opportunities that a university of our size can offer.

Quality teaching and research

All our postgraduates benefit from our inspiring research culture. The academics involved in your teaching and learning are leaders in their fields and although the emphasis at postgraduate level is very much on independent study, support from our teaching staff is always on hand.

The University is committed to delivering high-quality, innovative teaching. The latest report from the Quality Assurance Agency awarded us the highest rating possible for the quality of the student learning experience.

Outstanding facilities

During the last five years we have invested £80 million to maintain and enhance our teaching and learning spaces and we're investing more than £1 billion in the next few years. You will have access to a wealth of study resources:

- 10 libraries, including the third largest academic library in Europe, four million printed volumes and an extensive digital collection;
- state-of-the-art laboratories and world-leading analytical facilities, including a 1.5km deep subsurface biology laboratory, an Eco Diamond HK36 small aircraft for measuring trace gases at 3,000 metres, the UK All-Waters Combined Current and Wave Test Facility for measuring wave and tide facilities – the largest of its kind in Europe – to name but a few;
- the University's Centre for Research Collections, one of the most important resources of its kind in the world, encompassing rare books, Shakespeare first editions, oriental manuscripts, architectural drawings, paintings, sculpture, photography and much, much more;
- Europe's foremost Clinical Imaging Research Facility alongside the world-leading Scottish Centre for Regenerative

Medicine, and one of the UK's largest state-of-the-art teaching hospitals;

- the University's own art gallery, the Talbot Rice Gallery, hosting a range of contemporary art exhibitions throughout the year;
- the Edinburgh University Collection of Historical Musical Instruments, one of the world's most important collections of musical heritage spanning 500 years and 5,000 objects across two museums;
- the University's Anatomy Museum, which first opened in 1884 and hosts a wealth of unique anatomical objects.

Edinburgh was one of the first UK universities to develop commercial links with industry, government and the professions. Our commercialisation office, Edinburgh Research and Innovation (ERI), has – for more than 40 years – developed the promotion and commercialisation of the University's research excellence.

ERI can help postgraduates take their first step to market, whether it's through collaborative research, licensing technology or providing consultancy services.

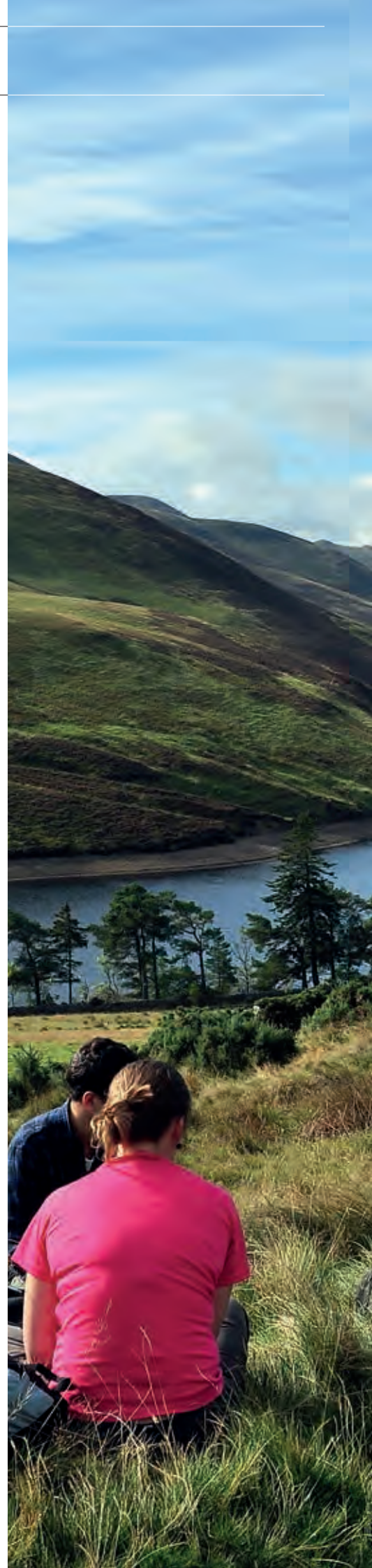
Social scene

This means international students completing a PhD or other doctorate-level qualification on a Tier 4 visa may be eligible to apply to stay in the UK for employment for an additional 12 months with extended support from the University as your sponsor. MY EXPERIENCE: USING THE CAREERS SERVICE

GIS Developer, thinkWhere



During the three years that I worked as a GIS consultant I grew the desire to acquire more technical skills and become a GIS developer. The MSc in GIS at the University of Edinburgh provided the foundations of these competences and the Careers Service support was fundamental to helping me understand how to build on these skills and engage with the labour market.

I started early in the year to plan my job hunting, going frequently to the Careers

Service, both in King's Buildings and in the Central Area, to receive help and advice. I also participated in organised events such as careers fairs, plus presentations given throughout the year in the School of GeoSciences.

I always received appropriate and valid help from all the consultants and used all the services they offer, including CV and cover letter feedback, mock interviews and online resources.

I now work as a GIS developer for thinkWhere, a Scottish company that produces and distributes mapping services for a large number of private and public sector customers. I achieved my objectives and the credit of this result also belongs to the Careers Service and the work of its staff.

I wanted to translate my degree in engineering into a career in technology and with that aim, I attended the various career fairs that the School of Engineering hosts throughout the year. This helped me interact with potential employers and focus on the companies I really wanted to apply to.

By the close of the academic year, I had connected with a careers consultant who helped me tailor my CV to target top

employers along with helpful advice about career choices. This was followed by telephone interview preparation. It was useful to have that level of guidance as I was trying to navigate in a new country where a lot of recruitment processes were unfamiliar to me.

I cracked one of the most competitive graduate programmes, and I'm now working with RBS as a Middleware Analyst.

Looking back, the Careers Service was a great help during what was a very stressful time with little margin for error and I'm glad I availed myself of their expertise in the area.

Supporting you and your studies

The University provides a wide range of support services to cater for your academic and personal needs.

Institute for Academic Development

Our Institute for Academic Development (IAD) offers one of the most established university research and career skills training packages in the UK.

The Institute provides PhD researchers and Masters by Research students with dedicated training in topics such as research management; personal effectiveness; communication skills; public engagement, networking and team-working; leadership; and career management. You can gain expertise in information technology and presentation skills; confidence in undertaking independent and creative research; the ability to critically evaluate source materials; and the capacity to construct intellectually rigorous arguments.

There's a lot of help available at Edinburgh if someone wants to pursue a career in industry or start their own business.

The Institute for Academic Development runs workshops throughout the year, giving you basic knowledge of business finance, business plans and team building.

Last year I attended the Institute's LEADER Summer School in Denmark. It was really helpful because there were sessions on entrepreneurship and business, personality development, leadership and

communication, and intellectual property
and copyright. We also learned how to
communicate our research to the public.

I think it's always important to have
additional skills because when you go
for a job it's not only your theoretical
knowledge or how you work in the lab
that counts, but how you communicate
with others, or how you work in a team,
so all this training really helps.

I think I'd be pretty competitive when
applying for jobs because employers
also look for what you do alongside your
qualification, and I can demonstrate skills
from these workshops and the other
things I've done here.

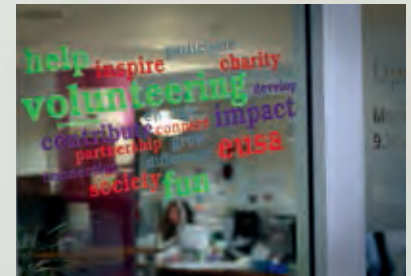

Accommodation for postgraduate students is all self catered and can be found across a range of convenient locations within easy reach of most key University buildings and Edinburgh's city centre.

University accommodation offers:

- comprehensive community and welfare networks from our Residence Life team;
- mixed gender residences, with some single sex flats available;
- laundry facilities;
- secure cycle storage;
- data network services in each bedroom for access to email and the internet.

Guarantees and deadlines

We guarantee offers of accommodation to:

- all new, single postgraduate research students from the UK, EU or overseas;
- all returning single postgraduate students who wish to stay on in, or move to, University accommodation;
- new, single postgraduate taught students from outside the EU only.

In such cases, guarantees apply as long as:

- your accommodation application is received by 31 July 2016;
- you have accepted an unconditional firm offer to study at the University by 31 July 2016;
- you will be studying in Edinburgh for the whole of the academic year starting in September 2016.

While we cannot guarantee accommodation for UK and EU taught postgraduates, we expect to have more than 200 rooms available for UK and EU students, so an early application is worthwhile.

Accommodation options

We can offer a wide variety in either traditional halls of residence or blocks of self-contained flats, the latter typically varying in size from four to six single study-bedrooms. There is a mix of en-suite rooms and those with shared bathroom facilities. We offer accommodation for those with disabilities. Please contact Accommodation Services for details.

New to Edinburgh, we can now offer 480 en-suite bedrooms in the Holyrood Postgraduate Residence Hall. Based on successful international models the Holyrood Residence Hall provides a fantastic opportunity for those wishing to live with a truly international group of postgraduate students. The flats are self-catering, but with all the kitchen facilities located in an open-plan area on the ground floor, alongside a large dining area. Each bedroom floor has a dedicated resident's lounge. The ground floor has a 24-hour reception and a large common room with separate meeting and study space. For the musically minded there are three sound-proofed music practice rooms.

Residence Life

Our properties are managed by professional Wardens, supported by specially trained Resident Assistants who are usually students living on site, readily available to address any welfare or community issues. They also organise and host a wide range of both social and academic activities.

Costs

Rents for University accommodation typically include utility costs, internet services, personal contents insurance and some cleaning services. Rents for single rooms during the 2016/17 academic year, based on a typical 51-week lease, are in the range of £5,295-£8,457.

Sharing rooms

If you are interested in sharing a twin room and express a preference for doing so in your application, we will do our very best to satisfy your request. There are many advantages to sharing. We make every effort to use larger rooms and provide additional storage and study spaces. Sharing can mean that you benefit from having more immediate company and access to a larger network of potential friends. With rents starting from £4,080 per 51-week lease, your costs are significantly reduced.

Private accommodation

Where we are unable to provide you with an offer of University accommodation, we can often offer assistance with alternative accommodation in Edinburgh.

The University of Edinburgh is at the heart of the city, one of Europe's great cultural hubs.

Edinburgh is an inspiring place to study. Scotland's famous mountains, lochs and forests are only a short trip away and our landscape offers one of the longest coastlines for a country of its size, so visiting the beach is easy and highly recommended.

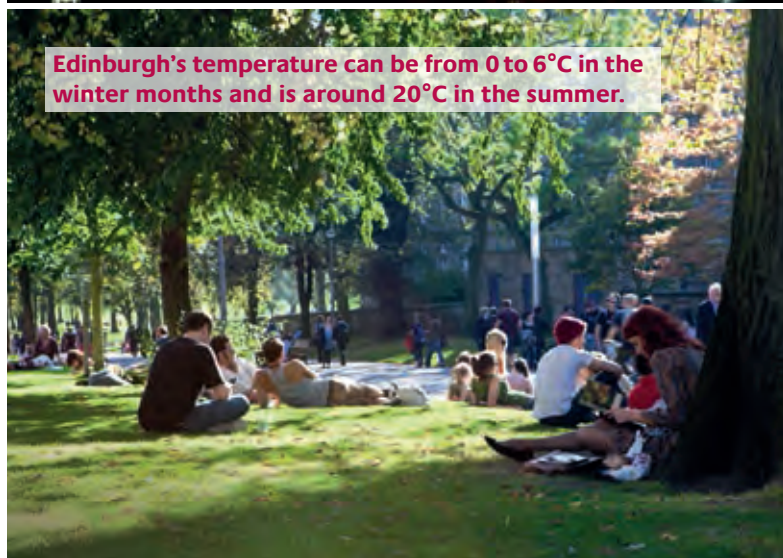
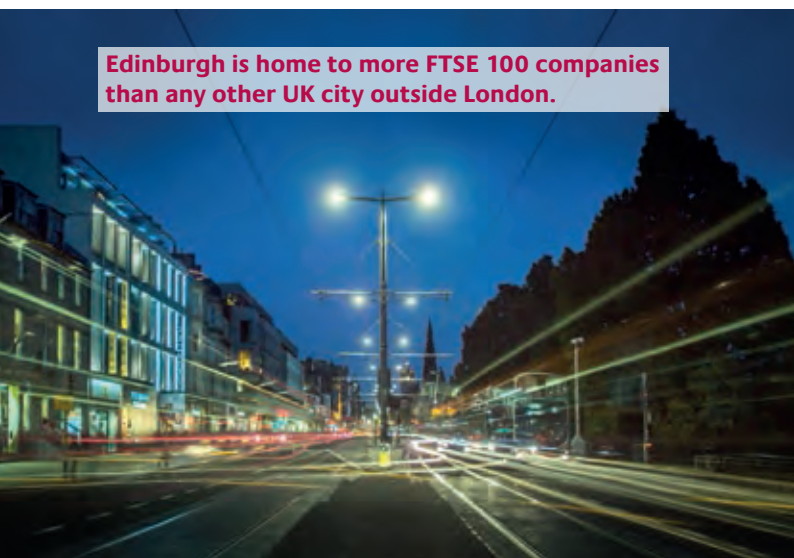
Edinburgh is home to more FTSE 100 companies than any other UK city outside London.

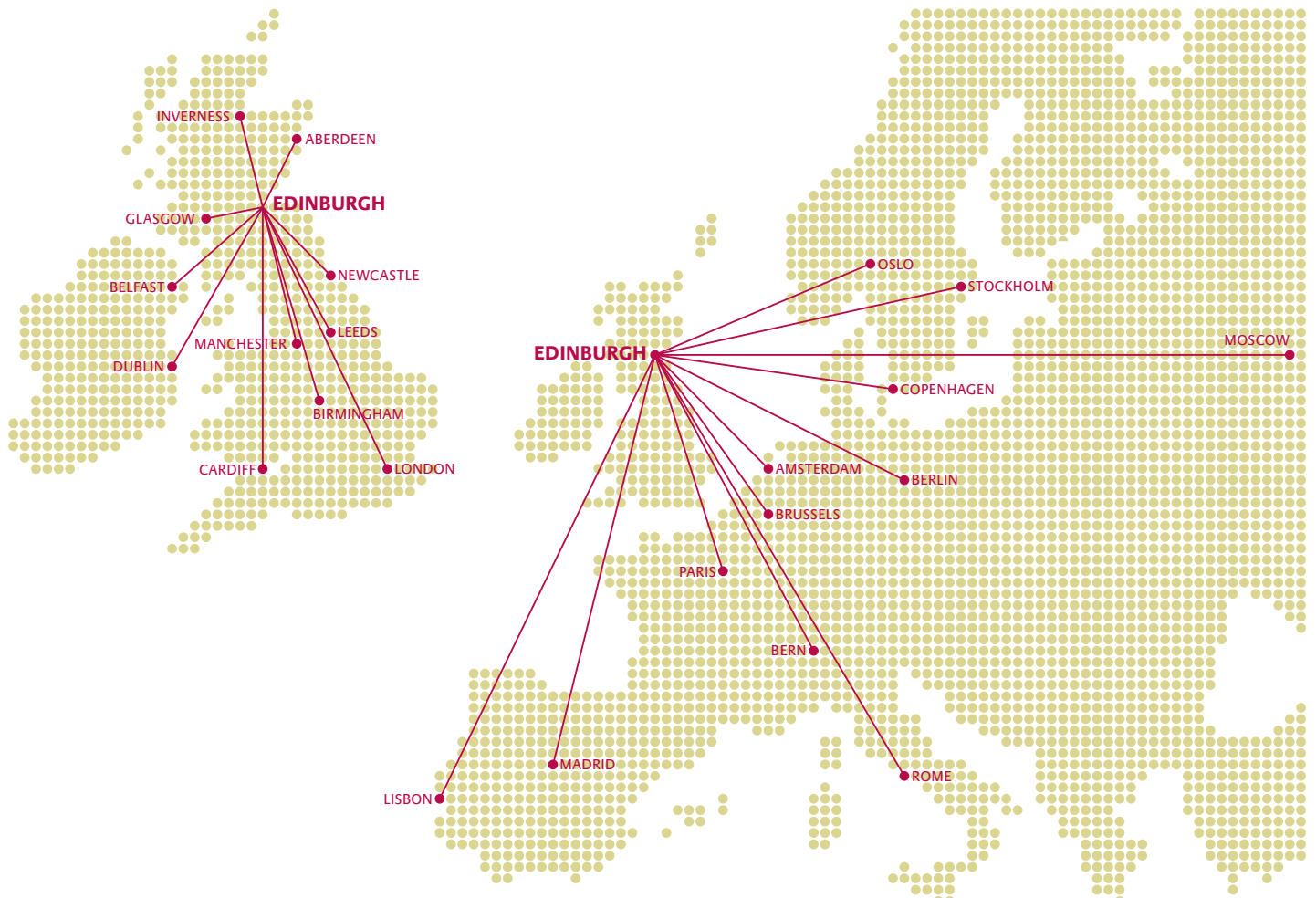

01 George Square

Most of our Schools are located in the city centre, with the Royal Mile and Princes Street close by.

02 Edinburgh College of Art

The art college's main building, where you'll find studio and exhibition space, is based on Lauriston Place, close to George Square.

03 New College

The striking New College – home to the School of Divinity – lies close to Edinburgh Castle and overlooks Princes Street.

04 Holyrood

The Moray House School of Education is near the Royal Mile, the Scottish Parliament and the Palace of Holyroodhouse.

05 King's Buildings

Science and engineering subjects are taught at King's Buildings, a 10-minute bus ride from the Central Area (a free University shuttle bus operates during semester time).

06 Little France

The Royal Infirmary of Edinburgh lies just four miles from the city centre, next to our medical teaching and research facilities.

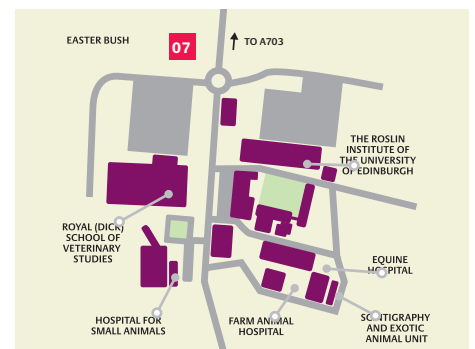
07 Easter Bush/Roslin

Academic and English language entry requirements

Applicants for postgraduate study at Edinburgh are typically expected to hold a minimum of a 2:1 honours degree, or its international equivalent. Guidance on international equivalents is available on our website at: www.ed.ac.uk/international/country. Your first degree should typically be in a relevant subject but some programmes are open to candidates from other disciplines.

Supporting your application

The supporting documentation required will depend on the programme you are applying for. Typically you will be asked to provide academic transcripts, a personal statement and academic reference(s). Some programmes may ask for specific evidence of your suitability for study, such as a portfolio, demonstration of relevant experience, or in a small number of cases, attendance at interview. Check specific programme entry requirements online. www.ed.ac.uk/postgraduate/degrees

English language requirements

If English is not your first language you will have to provide evidence of your written and spoken English skills. English language requirements are listed by programme on pages 26-31. Please check which language level relates to the programme you want to apply for. Requirements for each level are provided in the table, right. Although this table is as comprehensive as possible there are some exceptions. Please treat it as a guide and check the detailed language requirements for your programme online.

Conditions and exemptions

Your English language certificate must be dated no earlier than the summer two years prior to the proposed start of the programme.

Choosing your degree

We offer a range of options for postgraduate study at Edinburgh. From professional qualifications to independent research, on-campus taught programmes to online part-time study, you'll find a mode of learning that suits your needs.

Taught masters programmes

Masters programmes are designed to deepen knowledge in a subject studied at undergraduate level, although some of our postgraduate offerings may be suitable for students looking to change direction. Students on our taught masters programmes typically undertake a combination of taught modules, coursework and supervised research. Studies culminate in a dissertation or equivalent project.

Most of our taught masters programmes, across all subjects, lead to the award of MSc to distinguish postgraduate masters from our undergraduate MA degree. This is with the exception of awards from Edinburgh College of Art, which are normally postgraduate Master of Art (MA) or Master of Fine Art (MFA) awards. Other qualifications we offer include MBA, LL.M., MMus, MEd and MTh.

Full-time duration: typically one year, but occasionally can be longer if, for example, the programme includes a placement.

Research programmes

Masters by Research

The MSc by Research is designed to prepare students for advanced research, although it can be taken as a qualification in its own right. An MSc by Research is assessed by research coursework, examination and a dissertation.

Full-time duration: one year

MPhil

The MPhil is ideal for students who need to develop strong all-round knowledge of their subject, in-depth understanding of a specialised area, and the research skills to carry out and present a piece of original research for submission for a higher degree. The MPhil is assessed by thesis. You may extend your studies to PhD registration subject to satisfactory progress.

Full-time duration: two years

PhD

A PhD is the highest academic research qualification, entailing research training and supervised research, either on a one-to-one basis with a supervisor or as part of a research team. PhD students gain the specialist background knowledge for the projected research, and develop the skills appropriate to research in that field. Their work culminates in a thesis. The precise focus of the research will be agreed between the student and the supervisor and is likely to develop over the course of the PhD. The PhD is assessed by an oral examination in which the candidate defends his or her research thesis.

Full-time duration: three years

Professional doctorates

Professional doctorates are specialist qualifications designed for professional development in specific areas, such as engineering, education and psychology. Professional doctorates combine advanced research training, a substantial contribution to knowledge through your own research and a rigorous reflection on professional practice.

Full-time duration: varies between three and seven years

Part-time study

Please note that although many of our on-campus programmes offer part-time options, these are only available to UK and EU students due to UK visa regulations.

Online distance learning

As the largest provider of online distance learning in the UK's collection of research-intensive universities, the Russell Group, we can offer an exceptional range of online study – more than 60 online programmes across more than 15 subject areas. Just like our on-campus provision, all our online masters are delivered by dedicated academics, many of whom are leaders in their fields.
