

Determine a specific location where your friends and family should meet in case the need to evacuate arises. Check if you are in an Evacuation Zone (see evacuations map link). If you live in an Evacuation Zone, you may not have time to meet up at your predetermined location. Have a back up location where your family and friends can meet. Establish an out-of-the-area contact that everyone can reach to relay news and information. (Quick tip: the best way to connect when all the wireless lines are jammed up is to use text messaging.) Review your Emergency Plan with your friends and family. Make sure everyone knows where to go and who to call in the event of an emergency.

YOUR IMPORTANT DOCUMENTS PLAN
 Locate your import documents, such as insurance and medical paperwork, financial documents, marriage licenses, birth certificate, passports, and so on, and store them in a place you can easily grab in the event you need to evacuate your home. Identify your key items, like photos and family keepsakes, that you may want to take with you in case you need to evacuate.
YOUR EMERGENCY KIT
 If it is safe to stay at your home and an evacuation order has been issued, put water, canned food, cash, and a first aid kit in a waterproof box. If your pets will be with you, be sure to include food for them as well (if keeping dried pet food in your kit, rotate the food every 2 months).
