1.	1926	J M Wordie, Esq	His oceanographical and geological work in both Polar regions
2.	1928	H U Sverdrup, Esq	His contributions to the knowledge of the meteorology, magnetism and tides of the Arctic, as an outcome of his travels with the Norwegian expedition in the 'Maud', 1918-25
3.	1930	N A MacKintosh, Esq	His researches into the biology of whales in the waters of the Falkland Islands dependencies
4.	1932	H G Watkins, Esq	His important contributions to the topography of Spitsbergen, Labrador and east Greenland, and investigation of the ice cap of Greenland
5.	1936	J W S Marr, Esq	His work in the southern ocean and more particularly for his monograph on the South Orkney Islands
6.	1938	A R Glen, Esq	His work in Spitsbergen, including survey in New Friesland and the completion of the map of north east land
7.	1940	B Roberts, Esq	His work in survey, ornithology and general biology in the Polar regions - north and south
8.	1942	Dr G C L Bertram	Valuable biological work in the Arctic and Antarctic from 1932 to 1937
9.	1944	Lieut T H Manning,	His valuable survey and biological work, 1931-39 in Iceland, Lapland, Southampton Island, Hudson Bay and at Foxe Basin (1936-39)
10.	1946	Lt-Col P D Baird	His valuable survey and geological work with Mr J M Wordie in NW Greenland and Baffin Island in 1934 with Mr T H Manning's British Canadian Arctic expedition (1936-1937), and later work, during the war, in charge of the Musk-Ox operation in Arctic Canada
11.	1948	Dr W A Deer	His work in East Greenland, 1935-36, especially in regard to the Petrology of the Skaergaard Gabbro Intrusion
12.	1950	Dr M J Dunbar	His biological researches in the Canadian Arctic
13.	1952	G de Q Robin, Esq	His initiative and resource in carrying out glaciological and meteorological researches in the Antarctic
14.	1954	Dr R M Laws	His investigations in the South Orkney Islands and South Georgia, particularly on the biology and life history of elephant seals
15.	1956	J W Cowie, Esq	His investigations into the stratigraphy and palaeontology of Greenland
16.	1958	Dr H Lister	His glaciological work with the 1957-58 Transantarctic expeditions.
17.	1960	Mr J MacDowall	His work in the fields of Antarctic meteorology and geomagnetism and as leader of the Royal Society (London) expedition to Halley Bay, 1958
18.	1962	Mr K V Blaiklock	His contributions by way of navigation to the exploration of the Antarctic continent and for his mapping of lands bordering the Weddell Sea
19.	1964	Dr M W Holdgate	His work on the zoology of the islands of the Antarctic seas.
20.	1966	Dr S Evans	His many applications of physics to scientific exploration in the Antarctic and particularly for his development of radio echo-sounding of ice
21.	1968	Dr W S B Paterson	His pioneer work both theoretical and practical on the physics of glaciers
22.	1972	Dr P Friend	His leadership on three visits to East Greenland, and for his valuable investigations into the Devonian sedimentation of the region.
23.	1977	Dr P Wadhams	His oceanographic investigations, especially in studying the behaviour of pack ice near Spitsbergen, the North Pole and off east Greenland
24.	1980	Dr A Clarke	His studies relating to the biochemistry and ecology of Antarctic zooplankton and in particular the Antarctic krill, a shrimp-like organism that serves as a major dietary source for many species of whale, seals and sea birds
25.	1987	Dr J E Gordon	His geomorphological research in Antarctica, Greenland and other high latitude regions
26.	1994	Dr I L Boyd	His contribution to polar studies particularly through his work on Antarctic seal
27.	1999	Professor D Marchant	His contribution to the field of earth science, especially in relation to his work on the East Antarctic Ice Sheet
28.	2004	Dr M J Bentley	His outstanding work on Antarctic glaciers and ice sheets in relation to global climate change
