ackson State University is a four-year modern institution offering a 133-year tradition of academic excellence, and wide-ranging world-class research and educational opportunities.

Founded by the American Baptist Home Mission Society in 1877, this historically black, co-educational public university is located just west of Jackson, Mississippi's thriving business district. Already blessed with a rich heritage, Jackson State continues to grow in size and reputation, with a diverse campus of more than 8,400 students, and more than 1,500 faculty and staff united in the pursuit of enlightenment on the scenic 172-acre campus.

#### Campus

With approximately 200 acres on its main campus on John R. Lynch Street near downtown Jackson, Miss., Jackson State University has three satellite campuses throughout the city. The Jackson Medical Mall on Woodrow Wilson Avenue houses the College of Public Service, the Jackson Heart Study and the Mississippi Urban Research Center. The E.E. Thrash Universities Center on Ridgewood Road is home to the College of Lifelong Learning. The Mississippi e-Center @ JSU, located on Raymond Road, is the university's technology hub.

#### History

Jackson State University's distinguished history began in 1877 as Natchez Seminary, a private church school under the auspices of the American Baptist Home Mission Society of New York. Beginning with 20 students, the seminary educated newly freed African Americans and trained ministers and teachers.



#### Enrollment

With an enrollment of more than 8,400 students, Jackson State – the fourth largest university in Mississippi and the only one in the capital city – provides students from more than 50 countries and nearly all of the state's 82 counties with quality academic opportunities.

#### Faculty and Staff

#### Research

Designated a "high research activity" university by the Carnegie Foundation, Jackson State is involved in projects that help solve some of the world's most challenging problems and prepare students for a life of research and service. A 25 percent increase in external awards over the past five years has made significant research possible. Jackson State raised more than \$66 million in research and other sponsored program awards in 2009.

#### Libraries

The Division of Library and Information Resources is based in the H.T. Sampson Library. More than 500,000 volumes are housed in the 160,000-square-foot space, which also is home to special collections, government documents and audiovisual resources. Students have access to 3,000 full-text electronic books and more than 37,000 unique electronic resources

from some 100 databases.

#### **Technology**

Jackson State University offers Internet access throughout each of its campuses. Three supercomputers allow students to view scientific data in three dimensions, participate in video conferencing and process large amounts of data.

#### Housing

Jackson State's Department of Housing accommodates up to 2,600 students on the main campus. Among the residence halls are the

historic Alexander Hall and the newly constructed Campbell College Suites.



## **UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT**

### Interim President Leslie Burl McLemore, Ph.D.



Leslie Burl McLemore was appointed Interim President of Jackson State University, effective July 1, 2010. At the time of his appointment by the Board of Trustees, Mississippi Institutions of Higher Learning, Dr. McLemore was serving as Director of the Fannie Lou Hamer National Institute on Citizenship and Democracy at Jackson State University.

Dr. McLemore brings to the position a wealth of experience as an educator, administrator, scholar and community leader. Prior to his 2009 retirement from full time employment at Jackson State University, Dr. McLemore enjoyed a distinguished career of more than 35 years at the University. He was the Founding Chair of the Department of Political Science and was a member of the Political Science faculty from 1971 until 2009. He also served as Dean of the Graduate School, Founding Director of the Office of Research Administration and Acting Director of the Universities Center. Since

his retirement, he has worked with the Hamer Institute, which was formed in 1997 by Dr. McLemore and several colleagues to engage primary and secondary schools systematically in the exploration of the Civil Rights Movement as it charts, fosters and expands the meanings of citizenship and democracy.

Dr. McLemore was elected to the Jackson City Council in 1999 and continued to serve as a Councilman until 2009. He was President of the City Council for five of his ten years on the Council. During the last months of his tenure on the City Council, he was named Interim Mayor of the City of Jackson.

A veteran of the Civil Rights movement, Dr. McLemore is a recognized authority on the Mississippi Civil Rights Movement and Black Politics in the American South. He has published articles and book chapters on Black Politics and the Civil Rights Movement. His work on the Mississippi Freedom Democratic Party is used in schools and colleges throughout the United States.

Dr. McLemore has a distinguished record in the field of Political Science and Graduate Studies, and has served as Chair of the Council of Graduate Schools Committee on Minority Graduate Education. He was one of the founders of the National Conference of Black Political Scientists, serving as President of the organization for two years, and he also served as President of the Council of Historically Black Graduate Schools. In addition to his scholarly activities, Dr. McLemore is a past President of 100 Black Men of Jackson, and he was founding chair of the Youth Leadership Development program for middle school students in Jackson. He also served as Chair of the Mississippi Humanities Council and past Vice Chair of the Board of the Federation of State Humanities Councils.

A native of Walls, Mississippi, in DeSoto County, Dr. McLemore received the Bachelor of Arts degree at Rust College, the Master of Arts at Atlanta University, and the Doctor of Philosophy from the University of Massachusetts at Amherst. He has been a post-doctoral fellow at The Johns Hopkins University Institute of Southern History and at Harvard University's W.E.B. DuBois Institute for African American Research. He is married to Attorney Betty A. Mallett and has one son, Leslie II.

# DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

Director of Athletics Robert L. Braddy, Sr.



Robert L. Braddy, Sr. enters his fifth year as Jackson State's director of athletics. Having served as the Tigers' baseball coach for 28 years, Braddy has a long and impressive association with Jackson State athletics. A 1964 JSU graduate, Braddy also served as the University's interim director of athletics in 2000. Under his leadership the JSU Athletics programs have won 17 SWAC titles and captured the Commissioner's Cup (the James Frank Award) four times, as well the men's and women's all sports awards.

Braddy is the winningest baseball coach in SWAC history. Between 1973 and 2001, his teams won 12 SWAC championships, more than any other coach in league history. He guided the Tigers to three NCAA tournament appearances, two NCAA play-in games and four NAIA tournaments. Braddy was named SWAC Coach of the Year nine times. In 2003, Braddy became the first African American to be inducted into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame.

In 1973, T.B. Ellis, JSU's director of athletics, invited Braddy to join the department as the first full-time head baseball coach. Braddy's first conference title came during his first season as JSU's head coach. His team won back-to-back titles in 1977 and 1978, and again in 1989 and 1990. He also won three consecutive SWAC titles from 1993-95. His other league championships came in 1980, 1982, 1986 and 2000.

Since Braddy's first season at JSU, 52 of his players have reached the professional ranks, including Dennis "Oil Can" Boyd, Marvin Freeman, Wes Chamberlain, David Clark and Curtis Ford. He produced two first round draft choices in outfielder Clark (1983) and pitcher/outfielder Earl Sanders (1986).


Braddy finished his JSU coaching career with an 824-546 record in 2001. His 1978 team won 52 games while losing only 12, which is a university and conference record. The 1982 Tigers baseball team was the first to represent the SWAC in the NCAA playoffs.

Braddy was named NAIA District 30 Coach of the Year twice and SWAC Coach of the Year nine times. He was inducted into the JSU Hall of Fame in 1985. Braddy also played baseball for the JSU Tigers under Coach Joe Gilliam, Sr. and was named to the 1962-63 All-Conference SWAC teams.

Before joining the Tiger athletics staff, Braddy coached at McLaurin High in Florence, Miss. where his team compiled a 64-14 record and won the Highland Conference championship four of the six years he coached. He spent one year as Florence High School's coach.

On April 26, 2009, Braddy was honored by the University by having the Tigers baseball facility named in his honor. Jackson State's baseball field is named the Robert L. "Bob" Braddy, Sr. Field.

Braddy and his wife, Diane, have two children: Robert, Jr. and Artimese Anita.







is coming off a 3-7 record; the only losing season in Comegy's four with the university. The Tigers were selected to win the SWAC Eastern Division title and square off against Grambling State for the conference crown in the 2009 preseason polls. The Tigers struggled most of the season, mainly because of offensive inefficiency, and when the season came to an end Jackson State sat in third place in the East.

**OFFENSE** 

The JSU offense struggled to produce on a consistent basis. The Tigers were hampered by injuries along the offensive line which contributed to the sluggish offensive output. Heading into 2010 the JSU coaching staff has several athletic signal callers to plug into the new system. Eight starters will return from last season's team.

Dedric McDonald (6-5, 215) will look to take over as the full time starter this season. He is the only QB on roster with significant Division I (FCS) experience. To go along with a season of collegiate football under his belt, he also spent the spring learning the

new offense. In the annual spring game he showed flashes of excitement, as he completed nine passes for 141 yards and a touchdown. Red-shirt freshman Ryant Denton (6-2, 190) will also compete for the starting position. Denton learned from the sidelines last season and also benefited from spring practice

in the new offense. He did not complete any passes (0-3) but showed athleticism and elusiveness, picking up 18 yards and a rushing TD on three scrambles.

Three newcomers are also expected to push for playing time. Casey Therriault (6-3, 205), Tevin Chapman (6-1, 195) and Teshon Burton (6-3, 190) should all be in the mix for JSU. Therriault is the only newcomers with any collegiate experience. Last season

at Grand Rapids CC he led his team to an appearance in a JUCO National Championship game. Chapman, a fresh man from Central High School (Hattiesburg, MS) is a one-start rated dual QB by Scout.com. As a senior he threw for 1,008 yards and five touchdowns and ran for 1,097 yds and 15 TDs. Burton, a freshman from Leuzinger HS (CA), is a two star dual threat prospect according to Rivals.com and Scout. com. During his senior season he passed for 2607 yards, 23 touchdowns and only six interceptions. He also rushed for a team high 442 yards and



another seven touchdowns.

To go along with the quarterbacks, JSU has a group of talented receivers. Juniors Marcellos Wilder (6-3, 195) and Keenan Tillman (6-5, 220) look to have the breakout season that JSU fans have

been waiting on. In the receiver friendly spread offense both players should be able to thrive. Wilder is one of the faster players on the team and Tillman is a huge target with good hands.

Also returning is senior wide receiver Anthony Mayes (5-9, 180), who tied for a team high 24 receptions for 285 yards and two TDs last season. Sophomore Rico Richardson (5-10, 185) caught

15 passes for 135 yards. Richardson was also a standout on special teams. He was second in the SWAC in punt return

average (9.2 avg). Junior college transfer Desmond Ratliff (6-1, 215) will also look to play a prominent part in the passing attack. Last season at Pearl River CC he caught 85 passes for 1055 yards and 10 touchdowns.

The Tigers have a stable of solid running backs. Junior Luther Edwards (5-8, 225) looks to bounce back from a disappointing sophomore campaign. Edwards finished with 102 yards and two TDs on 51 attempts.

Senior Jewrad Smith (5-10, 185) will also look to get involved in the offense as a pass catcher out of the backfield. Last season he caught three passes for 26 yards and rushed for another 22 yards. Junior Demario Pippen (5-9, 215) will also look to be a pass catching threat. Last season he six passes for 49 yards. Newcomers

B.J. Lee (5-7, 185) and Tommy Gooden (6-0, 215) are expected to be contributors this season.

The offensive line should be strength for the Tigers. JSU improved its depth along the line and because of the injury bug last season a lot of young players got playing time early in the season. The offensive line will have five starters return this season. Seniors Terrael Williams (6-8, 350), Michael Odister (6-3, 330) and Antonio Colston (6-2, 295) will lead the line. Also returning for JSU are senior Talon Boudreaux (6-4, 290), senior Jarel Walker (6-2, 285), junior Keyun Sweeny (6-4, 315), sophomore Roderick Gladney (6-4, 360), and sophomore Luis McLeod (6-3, 330).

While the offense is expected to be better than last season, Tiger fans should not get their hopes up for an offensive powerhouse through the first half of the season.

#### DEFENSE

Last season the Dark Side defense kept the Tigers in every game. This season, with some help from the offense, the JSU defense could be even better. Seven starters will return from the 2009 team.

Seniors Ryan Rich, Sam Washington, Kerry Hoskins and Anthony Johnson will lead the defense in 2010. Rich (6-1, 218), who

recorded 40 tackles, 8.5 tackles for loss, and six interceptions last season, will lead the linebackers. He was also ranked fifth in the FCS in interceptions and was tied for 16th in the SWAC in pass breakups. Washington (6-3, 255) returns from a back injury in 2009 to anchor a talented defensive line. He was an All-SWAC performer during the 2008 season and looks to return to form this season. Safety Hoskins (5-11, 195) and corner back Johnson (6-0, 205) highlight a talented secondary. Hoskins had an outstanding season in 2009. He recorded 36 tackles. seven interceptions and four pass breakups. He was ranked second in the FCS in INTs, fifth in the SWAC in passes defended and was a College Sporting News All-American honorable mention. Johnson is perhaps the most complete corner back in the SWAC. Last season he had 19 tackles, three interceptions (ranked 50th in FCS) and five pass breakups. He was also ranked ninth in the



SWAC in passes defended.

JSU will have depth on the defensive line. Juniors Donovan Robinson (6-4, 250), Charles Mustafaa (6-3, 265) and Neal Pogue (6-2, 280) bring great experience to the table. Robinson was the fourth leading tackler last season, as he recorded 51 tackles, 13.5 tackles for loss (ranked 22nd in FCS, 5th in SWAC) and four sacks. He was also ranked 32nd in the SWAC in total tackles. Mustafaa came on strong in the second half of the season and finished with seven tackles, while Poque had 27 tackles and four sacks.

Sophomores Johnathan Billups (6-1, 320) and Javarius Conner (6-3, 250) each finished with three tackles last season. Sophomore Jamal Carter (6-3, 215), who is one of the strongest members of the team, had one tackle, a tackle for loss and a sack.







Joining Rich at linebacker are senior Ernest Brocks (6-2, 230) and David Graddy (6-2, 219), sophomores Milton Patterson (6-0, 230) and Corderic Govan (6-3, 235). Brocks had one tackle last season and Graddy finished with five. Govan had 25 tackles.


Seniors Jalil Johnson (5-11, 190) and Jeremy Keys (6-3, 215) also bring experience to the secondary. Johnson recorded 19 tackles and four pass breakups, and Keys had nine tackles last season. Junior Andre Wright (6-0, 200) and sophomore Richard Hughes (6-0, 185) will add depth.

#### **SPECIAL TEAMS**

The Tigers will have to replace All-SWAC performers in kicker Eric Perri and punter Brett Bennett in the kicking game. Redshirt sophomore Jabril Smith (6-1, 180) and transfer David Gallagher (5-10, 180) will look to pick up where Perri and Bennett left off. Smith is a strong legged kicker. As a freshman he averaged 50.1 yards per kickoff and in the 2010 spring game he made field goals from 48 and 41 yards. Last season Gallagher played at Coahoma Community College.

Last season the Tigers had problems with the snappers, but solidified the position with sophomore Ladarius Kimp (6-1, 245). He took over the position late in the season and had a solid spring. Sophomore Alfred Moreland (5-7, 185) will handle kick return duties. Last season he returned 25 kicks for 466 yards (18.6 avg). He was ranked eighth in the SWAC in the category. Rico Richardson will see time as a punt returner. Last season he returned nine for 83 yards (9.2 avg). He was ranked second in the SWAC in punt return average.





For more than 30 years, Rick Comegy has crafted a career filled with successful student-athletes and championship-winning teams. During the 2007 season, his second year at Jackson State, he added a Southwestern Athletic Conference championship to his prolific resume.'

Now in his fifth season, Comegy continues to build on his stellar reputation while leading JSU to prominence in the SWAC. In four seasons, he has resurrected the JSU program, producing three consecutive winning seasons (2006-2008). Under Comegy's leadership the Tigers have produced 22 All-SWAC selections, the SWAC Defensive Player of the Year and AFCA All-American (Marcellus Speaks-2008), SWAC Championship Game Offensive Player of the Game (Jimmy Oliver-2007) and Defensive Player of the Game (Domonique Johnson-2007). Wide receiver Jaymar Johnson was drafted by Minnesota in the sixth round of the 2008 draft and

Domonique Johnson and Marcus Benard signed NFL contracts (with Denver and Cleveland respectively) in 2009.

In 2006, his inaugural season, he opened with a 44-20 victory over Paul Quinn and went on to post a 6-4 overall record. In 2007, he led the Tigers to a SWAC Eastern Division title and the schools 16th conference championship with a 42-31 victory over Grambling State. He was named the SWAC Coach of the Year, Coach of the Year by the Pig Skin Club of Washington, D.C., and Coach of the Year by the 100% Wrong Club. City of Jackson councilman Kenneth I. Stokes named him "Man of the Year" at the Martin Luther King, Jr. Awards Dinner. In 2008 his Tigers finished with a 7-5 overall record (6-2 SWAC), as the Tigers won their second consecutive SWAC Eastern Division title.

Comegy came to JSU after serving as head football coach for the Tuskegee University Golden Lions, where he complied a 90-26 overall record in a ten-year span. He captured four Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference championship titles (1998-2001, and 2004) and three-of-five bowl games from 1998 to 2004. In 2001, the Golden Tigers

led the SIAC in both scoring offensively and defensively. In 2000, he finished the season with a perfect 12-0 record and went on to win the National Black College Football Championship. Comegy's coaching career began as a defensive back coach at Millersville University in 1975. After a three-year stint with Millersvilles as the defensive and receiver coach, he joined the coaching staff at Colgate University as the defensive coach and assistant track coach.

In his seven years at Colgate, he would hold the title as head baseball coach for four years as well as the defensive coach and quarterback and receiver coach. After serving as defensive line/coordinator at Central State University from 1985-1993 he left for the head coaching position at Cheyney State. After two years, he returned to Central State as head coach and led the team to consecutive NAIA appearances and one championship in 1995. In two years as head coach, he posted an 18-3 overall record. During his career, Comegy

has helped send many athletes to the National and Canadian Football leagues. Some of his athletes are: Eric Williams, Jacon Shelly and Teka Brown of the Dallas Cowboys; Hugh Douglas of the New York Jets (1995 Rookie of the Year); Vince Buck of the New Orleans Saints; Marvin Pope of the San Francisco 49ers; Milton Jones of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers; Kervin Wardroup of the Detroit Lions; Marvin Coleman of the Washington Redskins; Russell Meeks of the Calgary Stampeders; Jim Williams of the Chicago Bears; Drayton Florence of the San Diego Chargers; Frank Walker of the New York Giants; Kelvin Powell of the CFL's Edmonton Eskimos; Roosevelt Williams of the Chicago Bears; Bennitte Waddell of he Minnesota Vikings; Anthony Mitchell of the 2001 Super Bowl Championship Baltimore Ravens. In 2008, Jackson State's Jaymar Johnson was drafted in the seventh round by the Minnesota Vikings and Lavarus Giles signed with as a free agent running back for the Jacksonville Jaguars.



The Comegy family suffered a great loss on June 22, 2009 when his wife of 25 years, Connie lost her battle against cancer. Connie was 54 years old when she passed away. Coach Comegy and Connie are the parents of two girls and three boys: Mary, Connie, William, Rick and Billy Joe and have 12 grandchildren and three great-grand children.



Darrin Hayes
Defensive Coordinator
Knoxville College, 1993

Darrin Hayes is in his fifth season as Defensive Coordinator and defensive backs coach at Jackson State University. In 2009, the "Dark Side Defense" was ranked third in the nation in tackles for loss and led the Southwestern Athletic Conference in the same category. The defense was number one in total defense(259 yards/game), number one

in pass defense (150.7 yards/game), number one in Red Zone defense, and number two in rushing defense (105.2 yards/game). The secondary was also ranked at the top of all SWAC/NCAA categories and boasts two All-Americans: Seniors Anthony Johnson and Kerry Hoskins. The "D" was ranked eighth in the NCAA in total defense, third in tackles for loss, and led the SWAC in the same category.

In 2008 JSU's defense was ranked second in the SWAC in total defense (238.5 yards/game), rushing defense (76.5 yards/game), pass defense (162 yards/game) and fourth in scoring defense (20.7 points/game). Nationally, JSU's defense was second in total defense and tackles for loss, fourth in sacks, fifth in rushing defense, and tenth in pass defense.

In 2007 the JSU defense was ranked in the top three in five SWAC defensive categories. JSU was ranked No. 1 in rushing defense (82.2 yards/game) and total defense (282.2 yards/game). The Tigers were second in sacks (37 for 272 yard) and third in pass defense efficiency (106.3) and red zone defense (65.9 %). Nationally, JSU was ranked No. 5 in rushing defense and No. 8 in total defense. JSU defensive back, Domonique Johnson was named the Defensive MVP of the 2007 SWAC Championship game.

In 2006 Hayes' defensive unit was ranked No. 1 the SWAC in rushing defense and was No. 7 in the NCAA. The Tigers were also No. 16 in the NCAA in total defense.

At JSU, Hayes has coached six All-Americans: SWAC Defensive Player of the Year, Marcellas Speaks; and has had two players sign with NFL teams (Marcus Beard with Cleveland, Domonique Johnson with New York Giants, and Marcell Young with New Orleans).

Hayes came to JSU from Tuskegee University, where he served as Defensive Coordinator under Rick Comegy. Hayes' unit was the No. 1 defense in the SIAC (third in NCAA) in 2005. His defense was ranked No. 1 in every defensive category in the SIAC. They were No. 1 against the run, the pass, in takeaways and in points allowed.

Hayes is a native of Cleveland, Ohio and is a 1993 graduate of Knoxville College. He received a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Management from Knoxville College and a master of education degree with an emphasis in sports administration.

Before accepting the Defensive Coordinator's position at Tuskegee in 2005, Hayes coached five years at Lane College in Jackson, Tenn. In 2004, Hayes had the No. 1 defense in the SIAC. His secondary was ranked No. 1 in the SIAC and his total defense has been in the top five of the NCAA four of the last five of those years. He has coached six All-Americans in his coaching tenure.

Hayes served as Lane's Defensive Coordinator for three years (2000-2002) before being elevated to the head coaching position in 2003. Hayes

had been a head coach for two (1997-1998) seasons with the Knoxville Crusaders, a semi-pro team in Knoxville, Tenn. There, he had a two-year record of 22-4 and a division championship, and the No. 1 defense in the 32 team IFL. He also had one year stints with the NFL - Europe's Barcelona Dragons, Barcelona, Spain (1999) and Aux En Argonauts, Aux En, France, where he served as defensive backs coach in 1996.

Hayes'first coaching experience came at his alma mater, Knoxville College (1993-94), serving his first year as defensive backs coach and the second year as defensive coordinator, where he had the No. 1 total defense in the nation.

He is a member of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc., the American Football Coaches Association, the Black Coaches Association, and the Great Light 300 Masonic Lodge.



Earnest Wilson
Offensive Coordinator
Texas Tech, 1989

Earnest Wilson is in his first season as the Offensive Coordinator at Jackson State. He comes to JSU after serving as the running backs coach at New Mexico State.

While at New Mexico State, Wilson's running back corps tallied 1,278 yards on the ground. Prior to that season, Wilson was given an opportunity of a

lifetime, as an intern coach for the Super Bowl Champion Indianapolis Colts. He spent several weeks at the Colts preseason Training Camp. While with the Colts, Wilson worked with the running backs, attending team meetings and running practices. Wilson came to NMSU after serving as offensive coordinator at Benedict College in Columbia, South Carolina.

Wilson has an impressive background, which includes a stint as the head coach and director of football operations for the Jacksonville Tomcats and Carolina Rhinos of Arena League Football 2. In his first stint as head coach in AFL2, he led the Rhinos to a 13-5 record in 2001 and advanced to the second round of the playoffs. In his first season as head coach in 2000, the Rhinos posted a 10-8 record. In 2002 he took over at Jacksonville, leading the Tomcats to an 8-8 record.

He has been at Benedict, an NCAA Division II school, the past two seasons. In 2003, Benedict posted a 6-5 overall record, the best for the school since 1962.

Wilson has also served as head coach of the Dayton Skyhawks of the Indoor Football League (1999), offensive coordinator at Oberlin College (1998), offensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator at Elizabeth City State University (1996-97), special teams, receivers and tight ends coach at Alabama A&M (1994-95), receivers and tight ends coach at Maine (1992), and receivers and tight ends coach at Allegheny College (1990-91). While at Allegheny, he served on a staff that won the 1990 NCAA Division III national championship.

Wilson played football while receiving both his graduate and undergraduate degrees from Texas Tech University. His full name is Ernest J. Wilson, III. His wife is Maria and the couple have three children: E.J., Jonathan, and Mya. Wilson was born in Columbus, OH on March 30, 1965. He earned a B.S. degree in recreation in 1989 and a M.ED. in sports administration in 1990.





James Hartfield Assistant Coach Jackson State, 1968

James "Coach Toe" Hartfield is in his 30th season as an assistant coach in charge of Jackson State's kickers and punters.

Hartfield, a Jackson, Miss. native, is a 1964 graduate of Lanier High School. He came to Jackson State in the fall of 1964 and earned a position on the Tigers team as a place kicker. Hartfield was a

four year letterman at Jackson State. During his freshman year he received his nickname from former J-State sports information director and PA announcer, Alvin Benson, during a game against Mississippi Valley State. He booted an un-returnable kick-off out of the Delta Devils end zone, which prompted Benson to dub him the "Golden Toe". After coming back to JSU as a coach the nickname changed to "Coach Toe".

After earning a health and physical education degree from Jackson State coach Toe went on to sign a professional contract with the San Francisco 49ers in 1968. In 1969 he enlisted in the army, where he put in 24 years of service. While in the army coach Toe served as a youth director for American children stationed in Germany.

In 1993 he returned to Jackson. For 18 years he served as the North Jackson youth baseball coach (Dixie League). Coach Toe was inducted into the JSU Sports Hall of Fame in 2003.



Antonio Knight Linebackers Coach Central State, 2000

Antonio Knight is in his fifth season with the Tigers as the linebackers coach. Knight came to JSU from Tuskegee University where he served as defensive backs coach under Rick Comegy.

In 2008, JSU linebacker Marcellus Speaks was named the SWAC Defensive Player of the Year, All-SWAC First Team and AFCA FCS Coaches' All-American

Team member. Over the last three seasons JSU's members of the line-backer corps have been among the team's leading tacklers. Knight is a 2001 Tuskegee University graduate with a Bachelor of Science degree in management Information Science.

He was a stellar performer for the football Golden Tigers from 1996-1999. A Monroe, La. native, Knight was a financial service representative for Regions Bank in Madison, Ala., 2001-2002. He ran the athletic residence hall director at Alabama A&M during the academic year, 2001-2002.

Knight served, for two years, as head baseball coach at Tuskegee. He led the Golden Tigers to 35 wins in 2004 and 2005. He was a versatile athlete who played three positions at Tuskegee -- strong safety, punter, and back-up quarterback. With one snap in the 1998 Pioneer Bowl, Knight scored a 10-yard rushing touchdown to seal the victory for the Golden Tigers.

Knight was an all-state high school player at Wossman High School in Monroe. La., where he earned offensive most valuable player. He is mar-

ried to Nikkia W. Knight and the proud father of Antonio D. Knight Jr and Niayla Knight. He is a member of Masonic Silver Trowel Lodge #10.



#### Derrick McCall Quarterback Coach Jackson State/Spring Hill, 2001

Coach Derrick McCall is in his third season as a member of the Jackson State coaching staff. For the first two seasons he was the wide receivers coach. He is now the quarterbacks coach. Prior to coming to JSU he served two seasons with Shaw University as the Associate Head Coach/Offensive Coordinator.

McCall has a wealth of knowledge and

experience. In 2007, his second season at Shaw, McCall helped lead the Bears to a Central Intercollegiate Athletics Association Championship and a historic NCAA Division II berth.

From 2002-05, he was the wide receivers coach for the Tuskegee University Golden Tigers. While at Tuskegee, he served as Interim Head Football Coach and won a SIAC Championship and Pioneer Bowl Championship. He has helped send two athletes to the National Football League, Harry Williams of the Houston Texans and Calvin Russell of the Green Bay Packers and one athlete to the Arena Football League, Ken Henderson of the Philadelphia Soul.

From 1985-87, he coached with the semi-pro football team, Buck Town Suns. He spent one season, in 1988, as the quarterback coach at Edison High School in Miami, Fla. From 1996-97, he coached at Shaw High School in Mobile, Al. From 1997-2000, McCall was the assistant head football coach and offensive coordinator at M.T. Blount High School, where he helped led them to three consecutive Alabama 5-A State Championship titles. He also served as quarter back coach for the Mobile Seagulls Arena Football League from 1999-2000.

McCall also had a successful collegiate career as a quarterback for Jackson State from 1979-82. While at Jackson State, he won two SWAC Championships and made two NCAA Division I-AA playoff appearances.

The Mobile, Ala. native is a 2001 graduate of Spring Hill College, he received a bachelor's degree in communications with a minor in management. He is a member of the American Football Coaches Association, Fellowship of Christian Athletes and Mt. Hebron Baptist Church. McCall is the proud parent of three daughters, Tiffany, Tanesha and India. He has two grandchildren, Isaac and RhyAnn.





# Carl Roberts Special Teams Coach Jackson State, 1982

In 1984 and 1985 he played professionally with the Oklahoma Outlaws and San Antonio Gunslingers of the USFL. Roberts first joined the JSU coaching staff in 1983 as a graduate assistant. He came on as Va full time staff member in 1987, when he served as the offensive line and strength coach. He remained a member of the JSU coaching staff until 2003.

Roberts is a graduate of B.L. Moore High School in Crawford, Mississippi. At B.L. Moore he lettered four years as an offensive and defensive tackle. He also threw the shot put for the track and field team. He is married to the former Mildred Lynelle McElroy.



Gregory Ruffin Running Backs Coach Lane College, 1997

Gregory Ruffin is in his fifth season as the running backs coach at Jackson State. He is a graduate of Lane College in Jackson, TN. Ruffin came to Jackson State from Tuskegee University where he served as running backs coach under head coach Rick Comegy. In 2006 and 2007 Ruffin coached the "Fastest Man" in the SWAC, Lavarius Giles. Giles' long runs helped secure the 2007 SWAC title

for JSU. He went on to win the SWAC 100 and 200 meter dash in track and field

Before his arrival at Tuskegee in 2005, Ruffin served one season (2004) as defensive backs coach at Ouachita Baptist University in Arkadelphia, AR. Prior to Ouachita Baptist, he served one year (2002) as head football coach at Shaw University in Raleigh, N.C. He resurrected the football Shaw program after a 23-year hiatus, propelling the first-year program to a 7-3 record. Ruffin spent one year at Benedict College (2001) as the offensive coordinator and quarterback coach.

During two seasons (1999-2000) at Lincoln University in Jefferson City, MO, he worked in four different capacities - offensive coordinator, wide receivers coach, strength and conditioning coach and recruiting coordinator. He served on the staff of his alma mater for one season (1998) as receivers coach and recruiting coordinator. His first coaching assignment was in 1997 with Kemper Military Community College in Booneville, MO, as the running backs coach. In 1997, Kemper Military finished 10-2 and was ranked seventh in the country. In 1995, Ruffin coached the wide receivers and defensive backs at Northside High School in Jackson, TN; and running backs in 1996 at Jackson Central-Merry High School, Jackson, TN.

Ruffin started as a freshman at quarterback at Wentworth Military Academy, before transferring to Lane College in 1993. At Lane he was the starting fullback who paved the way for the late Fred Lane. Jr., who had a successful NFL career with the Carolina Panthers. In 1995, the Lane posted

a 9-1 record, the best in the school's history.

He is a member of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc., the American Football Coaches Association and the Collegiate Umpires Association. Ruffin is married to Mia Ruffin, and they are the parents of DeAndre, DeMadre, Garrett, and Zoe. The Blytheville, AR, native earned a bachelor of arts degree in criminal justice in 1997.



# Jonathan Thompson Defensive Line Coach Central State, 2000

Jonathan Thompson is in his fourth season as defensive line coach at Jackson State University. Thompson joined the JSU coaching staff after spending a season at Savannah State University (GA), where he was the defensive line coach. Under Thompson's leadership defensive lineman Marcus Benard set JSU's single season sack record in 2008. In 2009 Terrance Oniuke was second on the team

in tackles and an All-SWAC Second Team selection.

Prior to his stint at Savannah State, he was the defensive line coach at Central State University in Wilberforce, OH from 2004-2005. From 2001-2002 he was the defensive line coach with the Dayton Skyhawks (Indoor Arena Football). Thompson also worked as a student assistant defensive line coach at Tuskegee University from 1998-1999.

As a student-athlete Thompson anchored the defensive line when the Central State Marauders won the 1995 NAIA National Football Championship. He was named Second Team All-NAIA at Central State in 1995, and Second Team All-SIAC when he played for Tuskegee in 1997.

Thompson, a native of Miami, Florida, is a 2000 graduate of Central State where he earned a bachelor of arts degree in heath and recreation. Thompson has contributed his success to his mother Cassandra McKenzie. He is married to the former Trista Williamson and has one daughter, Alexis.





#### Marcus Hill Tight Ends Coach Arkansas Monticello, 2003

Marcus Hill is in his second season as a member of the Jackson State University football coaching staff. He is in charge of the tight ends and assists with the offensive line.

Hill graduated with an undergraduate degree in Computer Information Systems from the University of Arkansas at Monticello in 2003. At UAM, Hill was

an All-American Offensive Guard, pre-season All-American and All Gulf South Conference (2002 - 2003). In 2008, Hill graduated from the University of Phoenix with a Masters in Information System.



#### Vincent Dancy Graduate Assistant

Vincent joined the Tigers coaching staff in 2009 as a graduate assistant. He works with the linebackers at his alma mater. While at Jackson State Dancy was one of the premier linebackers in the Southwestern Athletic Conference. He was an All-SWAC performer for JSU.








The Jackson State University Sports Medicine Department oversees the physical health of nearly 400 athletes in 18 intercollegiate athletic sports. The department provides therapy through sessions in ultrasound, massages, stretching, exercising, the whirlpool, or all of the above. The primary function of the staff is to ensure that JSU's athletes are getting the proper treatment, and that they are healthy enough to compete.

Sports medicine is a year-round department. The department is always active in the care of JSU's athletes. The department is responsible for caring for the student-athletes after surgery, even during the summer months. Players come in and out all day. The department also is responsible for keeping the coaches abreast of the status of each player. The status of the injured player is very important to the game plan of each coach on staff, making it one of the most critical parts of the Athletic Department.

The training rooms are housed in the Lee E. Williams Athletics and Assembly Center (AAC) on Prentiss Street on the JSU campus and the T.B. Ellis Gymnasium on Dalton Street.

Fred Robinson, the Director of Sports Medicine, is a graduate of Forest Hill High School in Jackson, Miss., and also has his undergraduate and graduate degrees from Jackson State University. He is the first trainer in Jackson State's history to be certified. He received his certification through the National Athletic Trainers Association, which governs the profession. Robinson also has experience at the professional football level, working with the NFL's Seattle Seahawks for five years.

### History at a Glance

In 1920, eight men representing six colleges from the state of Texas met to discuss collegiate athletics and the many challenges that face their respective institutions. By the time the session in Houston had concluded, they had founded an athletic league that has slowly became one of the leading sports associations in the world of collegiate athletics, the Southwestern Athletic Conference.

The founding fathers of the original "Super Six" were C.H. Fuller of Bishop College, Red Randolph and C.H. Patterson of Paul Quinn, E.G. Evans, H.J. Evans and H.J. Starns of Prairie View A&M, D.C. Fuller of Texas College and G. Whitte Jordan of Wiley College.

### Football At Jackson State

Football began at Jackson State during the early 1910s. The team consisted of volunteer students and the schedule was regional. The team played an in-state schedule including opponents like Campbell College and Tougaloo College. The university now fields a highly competitive and successful NCAA Football Championship Subdivision program. The team plays its home games in the 62,500-seat Mississippi Veterans Memorial Stadium. Since the inception of conference titles, Jackson State has won or shared 16 SWAC crowns. The Tigers last won the SWAC in 2007.

# The Bragg Story

Jubie Bragg served as head coach at Jackson College from 1913-1919. During those years Bragg's son, Eugene, was enrolled in the Jackson College Primary School. Eugene attended Jackson College from the first to the seventh grade. After leaving Jackson College, Jubie Bragg returned to Florida A&M were he coached from 1923-25 and 1930-31. Eugene Bragg went on to become FAMU's fourth head coach in 1934. He coached the Rattlers until 1935 when he was killed in an automobile accident. The current home for the Florida A&M Rattlers (Bragg Memorial Stadium) was built and dedicated to the Bragg family in 1957.

### "The Iron 13"

With the departure of Bragg the Tigers were left without a head coach to begin the 1920 season. For at least two weeks there were only five to six players present at practices. With reluctence the college's president Hubert T. Zachary (who began the athleic program) suggested the players forget about football for that year. The sudents continued to practice daily until they had 13 players on the squad. The team, known as the "Iron Thirteen" selected Earnest Richards, a Frehch teacher who had never played football, to serve as coach. The players only needed a supervisor, since they drew up their own plays and directed their own practices. Led by team captains, Edgar Stewart and Percy Greene, the team started the season with a victory over Tougaloo College (13-0). Jackson College went on to get victories over Utica (63-0) and Mississippi Industrial College (21-14). The 1920 team went undefeated and won the Mississippi Louisiana Conference Championship (the college's second MLC championship).

### Alumni Field and Memorial Stadium

In 1923, President Hubert requested \$5,000 from the General Education Board for the construction of Jackson College's first football stadium. Alumni Field was dedicated in 1949. The team played home games there until 1967 when all home games were moved to Mississippi Veterans Memorial Stadium. Jackson State played its very first game at Memorial Stadium on Oct. 21 against Grambling State for the Homecoming game. Rod Paige's Tigers pulled off a 20-14 victory over Eddie Robinson's G-Men. In 1969 Alumni Field was demolished to make room for the construction of John Peoples Science Building.

### No Place Like Home

The JSU Tigers have played their home games in Mississippi Veterans Memorial Stadium for over 40 years and have compiled and impressive 144-63-1 record. While at Memorial JSU has led the nation in home game attendance 13 times.

### **JSU NCAA MILESTONES**

Destry Wright is No. 30 on the NCAA all-time list for career yards per game. From 1997-99 Wright played in 34 games, had 4,049 rushing yards and scored 30 touchdowns. He averaged 119.0 yards per game throughout his career as a Tiger.

Mark Washington is No. 7 on the NCAA all-time career passing efficiency. From 1996-99 Washington completed 384 of 724 passes, had 24 passes intercepted and had 6,561 yards. He threw for 68 touchdowns and had a pass efficiency rating of 153.5

Robert Kent is No. 5 on the NCAA all-time career yards list. Kent had 11,784 total yards from 2000-03. He had 3,615 yards and 31 touchdowns during the 2001 season. He is No. 28 on the NCAA all-time list for season yards. Robert Kent in No. 4 on the NCAA all-time career touchdown passes list. From 2000-03 he played 45 games and had 104 touchdown passes.

Sylvester Morris is No. 16 on the NCAA all-time career touchdown receptions list. From 1996-99 Morris had 34 receptions for touchdowns. In 1995 he had 17 touchdown catches, enough to place him at No. 11 on the NCAA all-time list for touchdown receptions

in a season.

### >> FOOTBALL FACTS

Kevin Dent is No. 25 on the NCAA all-time career interceptions list. From 1985-88 Dent had 21 interceptions returned for 280 yards.

Anthony Young is No. 3 on the NCAA all-time season interceptions list. In 1978 Young had 11 interceptions returned for 108 yards. He was named the 1978 NCAA Interceptions Champion.

Picasso Nelson was named the 1995 NCAA Interception Champion after grabbing 8 interceptions in 9 games.

William Arnold is No. 22 on the NCAA all-time list for all-purpose single -game highs. Arnold had 373 total yards

versus Texas Southern on November 6, 1993.

Jackson State was named the 2002 NCAA Offense Champion. The team averaged 485.5 yards per game. Alcorn State is the only other SWAC member to ever receive the title.

Jackson State was named the NCAA Rushing Offense Champion in 1978 and 1979. The Tigers averaged 314.5 rushing yards per game.

The 1979 JSU team was named the NCAA Rushing Offense Champion. The Tigers averaged 288.4 rushing yards per game.

The 2001 JSU team was name the NCAA Passing Offense Champion. The Tigers averaged 344.4 passing yards per game.

The 1990 JSU team was name the NCAA Scoring Offense Champion. The Tigers averaged 38.0 points per game.

Jackson State won the NCAA Scoring Defense Championship in 1981. The defensive unit averaged 9.4 points per game.

In 2004 Jackson State had the No. 9 toughest schedule in NCAA. Their opponents had a winning percentage of .564.

Jackson State Football prides itself on a winning tradition. The Tigers are No. 16 on the NCAA all-time won-lost record list. In 63 years of NCAA football Jackson State has a 402-239-15 record.

The Tigers were named NCAA Rushing Defense Champions in 1983 and 1999. In '83 JSU allowed only 79.2 rushing yards per game. In 1999 the team allowed 67.8 rushing yards per game.

Kevin Dent is No. 17 on the NCAA all-time season interceptions list. In 1986 Dent had 10 interceptions returned for 192 yards.

On November 20, 1999 Mark Washington set the NCAA Division I-AA record for highest passing efficiency rating points in a game. Washington had a rating of 389.9 versus Alcorn State in the 1999 Capital City Classic, where he completed 16 of 17 passes for 363 yards, 0 interceptions and 6 touchdown passes. That day 37.5 percent of his passes went for touchdowns.

Robert Kent is No. 4 on the NCAA all-time list for career yards. From 2000-03 Kent had 12,538 yards. Kent joins two fellow SWAC great on the list. Alcorn's Steve McNair is No. 1 with 16,823 yards

from 1991-94. Mississippi Valley's Jerry Rice had 13,007 yards as a Delta Devil from 1982-85.


On October 6, 2001 Robert Kent set the NCAA record for yards in a single game versus Alabama State. Kent torched the Hornets for a total of 668 yards on the day. JSU, however, lost the high-scoring game 61-58.

In 1985 JSU set the NCAA record for the most touchdowns

on interception returns. The Tigers hold the record along with Northeastern's 1996 team. Both had 7 interceptions returned for touchdowns.

In 1986 Jackson State set the NCAA record for most safeties scored. The team scored 5 safeties in the season.

Jackson State holds the NCAA record for most yards gained per completion in a game. JSU averaged 33.0 yards per completion against Southern on October 13, 1990. Sean Gregory had 14 completions for 462 yards. The Tigers won the game 52-14.

During the 1990 season JSU set the NCAA record for highest average gain per pass completion. The Tigers averaged 19.3 yards per catch and had 156 completions for 3,006 yards.

The record for most players selected by the NFL in a single draft from a school in Mississippi is 11 from Jackson State in the 1968 draft. The players chosen were Tom Funchess (Boston Patriots), John Outlaw (Boston Patriots), Sidney Ellis (Cincinnati Bengals), Jimmy Smith (Cincinnati Bengals), Doug Chatman (New York Giants), Harold Jackson (Los Angeles Rams), Cephus Jackson (Los Angeles Rams), Edgar Whipps (Cleveland Browns), Willie Turner (Cleveland

Brown), Jimmie Holifi eld (New York Giants) and James Jackson (Baltimore Colts).

Willie Richardson became the fi rst Tiger to play in the North-South All-Star Game in 1963. Lem Barney became the fi rst Tiger to play in the Blue-Gray Game in 1966.

Some of the most notable performances include halftime appearances for the Atlanta Falcons, Detroit Lions, New Orleans Saints, and the 1991 NBA All-Star Game, New York Jets, Houston Oilers, Philadelphia Eagles, Cincinnati Bengals, Senior Bowl (1997 and 2004), Indianapolis Colts and Dallas Mavericks.

like these have influenced many to refer to the unit as Hollywood's band of choice.

ackson State University has some of the finest athletic facilities in the Southwestern Athletic Conference. The Tigers play their home football games at the historic Mississippi Veterans Memorial Stadium. Home men's and women's basketball games are played on the JSU campus at the Lee E. Williams Athletics and Assembly Center, while home volleyball games are played at the T.B. Ellis Physical Education Center, Lady Tigers soccer games are played at the newly constructed soccer field on campus and baseball and softball games are played at the University Baseball/Softball Complex. The Tigers and Lady Tigers tennis teams also play on campus on recently constructed courts.

### Mississippi Veterans Memorial Stadium

Mississippi Veterans Memorial Stadium was originally built in 1941 with a two-sided configuration. The stadium's west end was closed-in in 1980 to make Memorial the largest athletic facility in the State of Mississippi. Approximately fi ve miles from Jackson State University's main campus, Memorial Stadium has served as the home of Tiger Football since 1967. J-State's first game played in Memorial was in October of 1967 when the Tigers hosted Grambling. JSU won that game 20-14.

Since 1967, Jackson State and Memorial Stadium have continued to be a winning combination. Jackson State set a NCAA Division I-AA home game attendance record in 1997, when an average of 38,873 fans attended JSU games. The record still stands today. The 1999 contest versus Southern marked the most attended JSU game at Mississippi Veterans Memorial Stadium. Over 65,000 fans saw a great game between the two rivals which ended in a 26-14 Southern win.

Lee E. Williams Athletics and Assembly Center The Lee E. Williams Athletics and Assembly Center was completed in August of 1981. The multi-purpose facility is located at the northwest corner of the campus and houses the Athletics Department, the JSU basketball arena, athletic training rooms and classroom for health related courses. The "AAC" arena is home to JSU men's and women's basketball and has a seating capacity of 8,000

# T. B. Ellis Physical Education Center

The T. B. Ellis Physical Education Center is the home of Lady Tigers volleyball and houses the Department of Health, Physical Education and Recreation, is among the largest of Jackson State University's structures. An Olympic-size pool and a gymnasium are maintained. The gymnasium has two basketball courts and fl oor space for indoor tennis, table tennis, badminton and volleyball. In addition, there are dance studios and faculty offices.

#### Martin Epps Track and Field Facility

The Jackson State University Track and Field was renovated and named the "Martin Epps Track and Field Facility" in 2004 to become a world-class on-campus facility and home of JSU Men's and Women's Track and Field programs. Named for legendary JSU Men's Track and Field coach, Martin Epps, the facility is a part of the state-of-the-art Walter Payton Athletics Complex on JSU's campus. The Martin Epps Track and Field has hosted several meets and is used by all student athletes.

#### Jackson State Tennis Facility

Construction on the JSU Tennis Facility was completed in the Spring of 2009. The facility, which will be home to JSU men's and women's tennis, features 12 lighted courts, with scoreboards and stadium seating for 100.

Tiger Strength and Conditioning Facility
The Jackson State University Strength and
Conditioning Facility was constructed in
2003 as the Tigers' new home for strength
and weight training. The 15,000 square foot
physical training center is located near the
eastern gateway to the campus. A part of the
new Walter Payton Athletics Complex, the
facility is a state-of-the-art weight-training and
conditioning center used by all JSU student
athletes.

# T. B. Ellis Football Annex

In 1973 the T. B. Ellis Annex building was constructed near the T. B. Ellis Gymnasium at Jackson State University. The building was originally used as offi ce and storage space for JSU's track and fi eld team. In 1992 the facility was renovated and transformed into a football facility equipped with space for the team's locker room, equipment storage and strength and conditioning rooms. In 2004 the T. B. Ellis Annex saw its second facelift. This time the building was overhauled into the current home of JSU football operations. Today the facility houses coaches offi ces, team meeting rooms, a locker room, equipment storage areas and a players lounge.

### The Jackson State University Softball Stadium

The Jackson State University Softball Stadium was constructed in 2004. The stadium, located at the Terry Road entrance to the campus, has a seating capacity of 200. The facility is a part of the Walter Payton Athletics Complex and is the first on-campus home for the JSU Softball program.

### Robert "Bob" Braddy, Sr. Baeball Field

The Jackson State Baseball Stadium we constructed in 2007. The Stadium locat adjacent to the Softball. The facility is second home to the JSU Baseball Tigers, batting cages, bull pens and dugouts we rst used during the 2007 season.

#### Soccer Field
