# JANUARY 2018

This report provides a monthly review of selected agricultural produce available at the Local Markets in Upolu and Savaii based on the price data and volume index survey. Corresponding tables are attached for ease of reference.

#### **Key findings:**

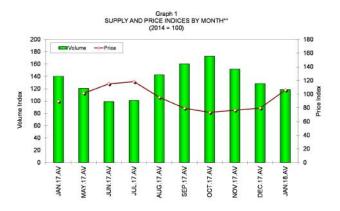
The Local Market Survey in January 2018 revealed overall volume decrease 8 percent while limited supply pushed average prices up 33 percent when compared to December 2017.

- Wet weather conditions affected the supply of most vegetable produce to the market driving prices up.
- The value of supplies increased 23 percent to \$75,500 from the previous month.
- An average of 350 sellers trading at the Local Market was recorded in the month under review, 3 percent lower than the previous month and also 11 percent lower when compared with the same month last year.

#### **OVERVIEW**

The monthly survey of Agricultural food supplies at the Local Markets by the Samoa Bureau of Statistics in January 2018 showed overall volume decrease 8 percent from December 2017. Significant decreases were recorded for all agricultural produce with the exception of taro, yam, Chinese cabbage and cucumber. When compared with the same month last year, current supply was 15 percent lower. (See Graph 1 and Tables 4 & 5)

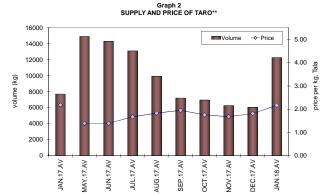


Limited availability of most local produce led the overall price level to increase 33 percent from the previous month. The rise in average prices of all local produce with the exception of banana and coconut contributed to the rise in the price index. The current

price level was 18 percent higher when compared with January 2017.

## **TARO**

At 12,262 kilograms, the supply of taro to the local markets in January 2018 was more than doubled from the previous month while strong domestic demand led its average price to climb 19 percent (to \$2.16 per kilogram). When compared with January 2017, current supply of taro was 59 percent higher while its average price was 1 percent lower. (See Graph 2 and Tables 1&2)

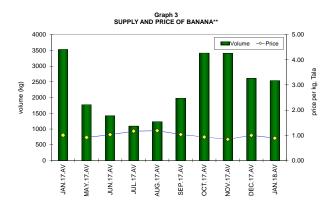


Current supply of taro in the month under review contributed to a 111 percent rise in volume when comparing the twelve months ending January

#### **BANANA**

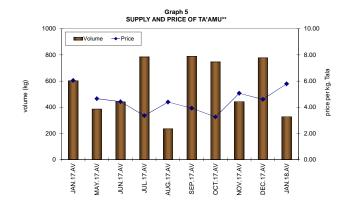
The supply of banana to the Local Markets in January 2018 fell 3 percent (to 2,535 kilograms) from December 2017; a level that was 28 percent lower than the same month a year ago. Weakened demand pushed its average price down 11 percent (to \$0.88 per kilogram). When compared with the same month last year current price was 12 percent lower. (See Graph 3 and Tables 1 & 2)



When comparing the twelve months ending January 2018 over the twelve months ending January 2017, banana supplies were 39 percent higher while increased availability pushed its average price down 34 percent.

## TA'AMU

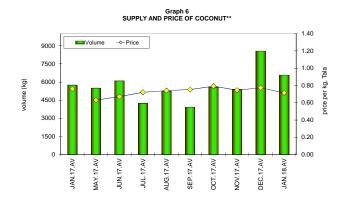
At an average of 327 kilograms, ta'amu supply in January 2018 decreased 58 percent from the previous month. Limited supplies pushed average price for ta'amu up 26 percent (to \$5.78 per kilogram). Compared to January 2017, current supply of ta'amu was 46 percent lower while its average price was also 4 percent lower. (See Graph 5 and Tables 1&2)



Current supply of ta'amu in the month under review contributed to a 76 percent increase in ta'amu volume when comparing the twelve months ending January 2018 over the twelve months ending January 2017 while increased availability pushed its average price down 26 percent.

## COCONUT

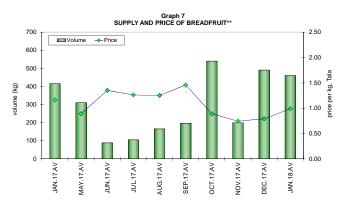
Coconut supplies in January 2018 dropped 23 percent (to 6,570 kilograms) from December 2017 while weakened demand pushed its average price down 8 percent (to \$0.71 per kilogram). Current availability of coconut was 14 percent higher than average availability in January 2017 while average price fell 6 percent over the year. (See Graph 6 and Tables 1 & 2)



When comparing the twelve months ending January 2018 over the twelve months ending January 2017 supply of coconut was 18 percent higher while its average price also rose 4 percent.

#### **BREADFRUIT**

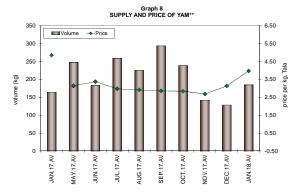
In the month under review, the supply of breadfruit declined 6 percent (to 460 kilograms) from December 2017, while strong demand pushed its average price up 25 percent (to \$0.99 per kilogram). Current availability of breadfruit was 11 percent higher than average availability in January 2017 while average price fell 15 percent over the year. (See Graph 3 and Tables 1& 2)



Current supply of breadfruit contributed to a 6 percent decline in volume when comparing the twelve months ending January 2018 over the twelve months ending January 2017 while its average price also decreased 13 percent.

#### YAM

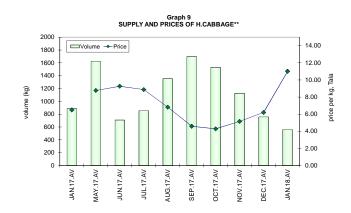
Yam supplies at 185 kilograms increased 44 percent from December 2017 while strong domestic demand pushed its average price up 27 percent (to \$3.97 per kilogram). When compared with January 2017, current supply of yam was 12 percent higher while its average price was 18 percent lower. (See Graph 8 and Tables 1 & 2)

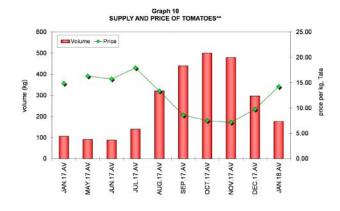


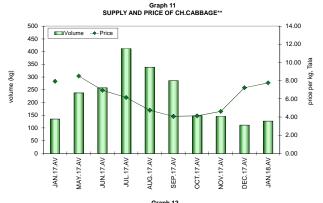
Despite the increase of yam supplied in the month under review, current yam supply contributed to a 2 percent decline in volume in the twelve months ending January 2018 over the twelve months ending January 2017, while its average price also fell 19 percent.

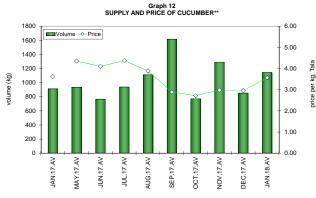
## VEGETABLE PRODUCE

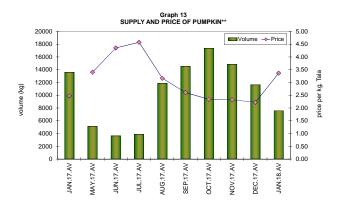
Wet weather conditions affected the supply of vegetable produce to the Local Markets in January 2018 resulting in substantial loss in the supply of all vegetable produce with the exception of Chinese cabbage and cucumber supplies recording moderate increases of 14 percent (to 127 kilograms) and 34 percent (to 1,143 kilograms) respectively. Tomato supplies fell 40 percent (to 177 kilograms) while pumpkin supplies also decreased 35 percent (to 7,529 kilograms). Head cabbage supplies declined 26 percent (to 559 kilograms) from December 2017. (See Graphs 9 to 13 and Tables 1 & 2)







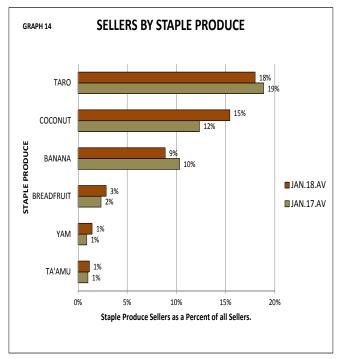




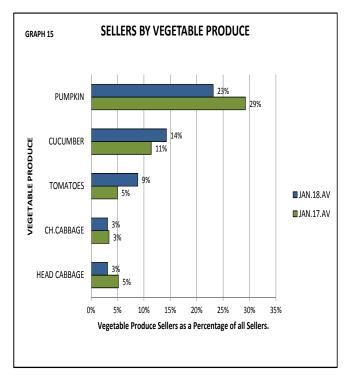
Subsequent to the limited availability of most vegetable produce to the Local Markets in the month under review and strong demand for Chinese cabbage and cucumber, average prices for all vegetables increased. Head cabbage prices registered the largest increase of 78 percent (to \$10.99 per kilogram), followed by pumpkin prices increasing 51 percent (to \$3.36 per kilogram), while tomato prices rose 46 percent (to \$14.24 per kilogram). Driven by demand cucumber and Chinese cabbage were the vegetables of choice in January 2018 recording price increases of 20 percent (to \$3.56 per kilogram) and 7 percent (to \$7.75 per kilogram) respectively.

#### **SELLERS**

At 350, the number of sellers at the Local Markets on the days surveyed in January 2018 fell 3 percent from the previous month and was also 11 percent lower when compared with the number of sellers in the same month a year ago. (See Graphs 14 and 15 and Table 6).



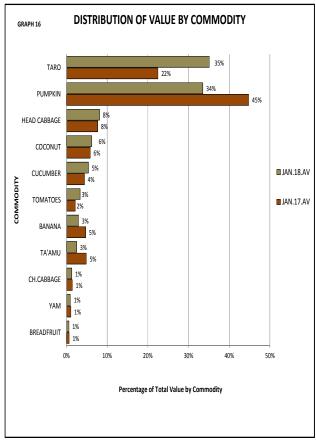
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In January 2018, pumpkin sellers at 81 were the largest group at the local markets decreasing from 108 in the previous month and 116 in the same month last year. Taro sellers followed recording an increasing total of 63 from 51 last month but were lower than 75 in the same month a year ago, while coconut sellers increased to 54 from 42 in the previous month and 49 a year ago. Cucumber sellers recorded a total of 50 increasing from 49 in the previous month and 45 in January 2017. Banana and tomato sellers both recorded a total of 31 with banana sellers decreasing from 32 in the previous month and 41 in January 2017, while total sellers of tomato fell from 42 in December 2017 but were higher than 20 in the same month last year. Sellers of head cabbage at 11 fell from 12 in the previous month and 21 in the same month a year ago while sellers of Chinese cabbage remained at 11 from December 2017 but were lower than 14 in January 2017. Breadfruit sellers followed with an increasing total of 10 from 8 in December 2017 and 9 in January a year ago, while total sellers of yam recorded an increasing total of 5 from 4 in the previous month and the same month last year. Ta'amu sellers recorded a decreasing total of 4 from 5 in the previous month and remained unchanged from the same month last year.

### VALUE OF SUPPLIES

The average value of selected produce supplied to the Local Markets at \$75,500 in January 2018 increased 23 percent from the previous month and 1 percent when compared with January 2017.



Taro supplies contributed the most to the total value of produce surveyed with a share of 35 percent in January 2018, a level that was higher than 18 percent in December 2017 and 22 percent in January 2017. Pumpkin supplies followed with a 34 percent contribution to total value decreasing from 42 percent in the previous month and 45 percent when compared with a year ago. Supplies of head cabbage contributed 8 percent to total value remaining unchanged from the previous month and January 2017 while shares of coconut accounted

for 6 percent of total value decreasing from 11 percent in the previous month but remained unchanged from a year ago. Supplies of cucumber contributed 5 percent to total value, increasing from 4 percent in December 2017 and January

2017. Supplies of tomato, banana and ta'amu contributed 3 percent each to total value with tomato shares decreasing from 5 percent in the last month but were higher than 2 percent when compared with January 2017 while banana supplies fell from 4 percent in the previous month and 5 percent in a year ago, followed by ta'amu shares decreasing from 6 percent last month and 5 percent in the same month last year. Chinese cabbage, yam and breadfruit supplies contributed 1 percent each to total value. (See Graph 16 & Table 3)

#### **Technical Notes**

The Local Market Survey measures the price and volume of selected agricultural produce from the Local Markets at Fugalei, Taufusi, Vaitele, Afega, Saleimoa, Toleafoa, Savaia, and Salelologa every month. Prices for selected produce are taken from the Consumer Price Index.

\*\* Data shown reflects the average availability and prices of selected produce. This survey is conducted on each Thursday for rural markets on Upolu and each Friday for urban markets on Upolu and Savaii in the months under reference.

Weights for selected produce have been revised using 2014 as the base period and have been incorporated starting from June 2016 report.
