LOCAL MARKET SURVEY

JANUARY 2019

This report provides a monthly review of selected agricultural produce available at the Local Markets in Upolu and Savaii based on the price data and volume index survey. Corresponding tables are attached for ease of reference.

Key findings:


The Local Market Survey in January 2019 revealed overall volume drop 3 percent while limited supply pushed average prices up 17 percent when compared to December 2018.

- Significant reductions in the supply of coconut, tomato and pumpkin contributed to the decline of the volume index.
- The value of supplies grew 16 percent to \$77,100 from the previous month.
- An average of 325 sellers trading at the Local Market were recorded in the month under review; 4 percent higher than the previous month but 7 percent lower when compared with the same month last year.

OVERVIEW


The monthly survey of Agricultural food supplies at the Local Markets by the Samoa Bureau of Statistics in January 2019 showed overall volume decrease 3 percent from December 2018. This decrease in volume stem from significant reduction of coconut, tomatoes and pumpkins. When compared with the same month last year, current supply was 3 percent lower. (See Graph 1 and Tables 4 & 5)



With the decreased volume in the month under review, the overall price level rose 17 percent from the previous month. This increase in price was largely due to increased prices of all vegetable produce. When compared with January 2018 the current overall price level was 8 percent higher.

TARO

The supply of taro to the Local Markets in January 2019 increased 44 percent (to 5,727 kilogram) from December 2018; a level that was 53 percent lower than the same month last year. Increased availability led its average price to drop 4 percent (to \$2.95 per kilogram). When compared with January 2018, current price of taro was 36 percent higher. (See Graph 2 and Tables 1&2)




Despite the increase in volume in the month under review, current supply of taro contributed to a 39 percent decline in volume when comparing the twelve months ending January 2019 over the twelve months ending January 2018. Price rose 59 percent.

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BANANA


The volume of banana supplied to the Local Markets in January 2019 increased 25 percent (to 3,061 kilograms) from December 2018; a level that was 21 percent higher than the same month last year. The average price of banana rose 2 percent (to \$1.10 per kilogram) due to strong domestic demand. When compared with the same month last year current price was 24 percent higher. (See Graph 3 and Tables 1&2)



When comparing the twelve months ending January 2019 over the twelve months ending January 2018, banana supplies were 41 percent lower while limited availability pushed its average price up 38 percent.

TA'AMU


Ta'amu supplies in January 2019 expanded its volume by a factor of 3 (to 319 kilograms) from the previous month, while increased availability pushed its average price down 27 percent (to \$6.37 per kilogram). When compared with the same month last year, current supply of ta'amu was 3 percent lower while its average price was 10 percent higher. (See Graph 5 and Tables 1&2)



PO Box 1151 APIA, SAMOA Telephone (685) 62000 Fax: (685) 24675 Current supply of ta'amu in the month under review contributed to a 10 percent decrease in ta'amu volume when comparing the twelve months ending January 2019 over twelve months ending January 2018 while limited availability pushed its average price up 29 percent.

COCONUT

In the month under review coconut supplies dropped 4 percent (to 6,825 kilograms) from the previous month while limited supply pushed its average price up 26 percent (to \$1.21 per kilogram). Compared to January 2018, current supply of coconut was 4 percent higher while average price increased 70 percent. (See Graph 6 and Tables 1&2)




Comparing the twelve months ending January 2019 over the twelve months ending January 2018 supply of coconut was 13 percent higher while its average price also rose 37 percent.

BREADFRUIT

At an average of 605 kilograms, breadfruit supply in January 2019 was more than doubled from the previous month. Increase availability of breadfruit to the markets pushed its average price down 1 percent (to \$1.16 per kilogram). When compared with the same month last year, current breadfruit supply was 32 percent higher while strong domestic demand pushed its average price up 17 percent. (See Graph 7 and Tables 1& 2)


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Despite the increase in breadfruit volume in the month under review, current supply contributed to a 12 percent decline in volume when comparing the twelve months ending January 2019 over the twelve months ending January 2018 while its average price increased 40 percent.

YAM


At 124 kilogram, the supply of yam to the Local Markets rose 18 percent (to 124 kilograms) from the previous month while strong domestic demand pushed its average price up 21 percent (to \$6.84 per kilogram). When compared with the same month last year, current supply of yam was 33 percent lower while limited supply over the year pushed its average price up 72 percent. (See Graph 8 and Tables 1 & 2)




Current supply of yam in the month under review contributed to a 41 percent decrease in volume in the twelve months ending January 2019 over the twelve months ending January 2018, while its average price rose 57 percent.

VEGETABLE PRODUCE

Despite the decline of the overall volume in the month under review, a general overview of all vegetable produce to the Local Markets revealed significant gains in all vegetable supplies with the exception of tomato and pumpkin whose volume dropped 68 percent (to 116 kilograms) and 14 percent (to 10,948 kilograms) respectively from the previous month. Chinese cabbage supplies registered the largest increase at 31 percent (to 63 kilograms) from December 2018 followed by cucumber supplies increasing 22 percent (to 926 kilograms) while head cabbage supplies rose 5 percent (to 566 kilograms) when compared with the last month. 
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


Subsequent to the increase in the supply of most vegetable produce to the Local Markets, average prices in the month under review also increased due to strong domestic demand. Head cabbage prices experienced the largest price increase of 59 percent (to \$11.32 per kilogram) while limited availability for tomato drove its price up 47 percent (to \$14.36 per kilogram) respectively from the previous month. Average prices for Chinese cabbage rose 34 percent (to \$8.19 per kilogram) while cucumber prices also increased 17 percent (to \$4.27 per kilogram). Limited availability for pumpkin led its average price to edge up 16 percent (to \$2.96 per kilogram).

SELLERS

At 325, the number of sellers at the Local Markets on the days surveyed in January 2019 increased 4 percent from the previous month and was 7 percent lower when compared with the number of sellers in the same month a year ago. (See Graphs 14 and 15 and Table 6).






In January 2019, pumpkin sellers at 89 were the largest group at the local markets decreasing from 96 in the previous month but were higher than 81 in the same month last year. Taro sellers followed recorded an increasing total of 66 from 42 last month and 63 in the same month a year ago while coconut sellers increased to 53 from 41 in the previous month but were lower than 54 in the same month last year. Sellers of banana recorded an increasing total of 41 from 28 in December 2018 and 31 in January 2018 while total sellers of cucumber decreased to 30 from 34 last month and 50 in Sellers of tomato recorded a January 2018. decreasing total of 16 from 27 in the previous month and 31 when compared with same month a year ago; while sellers of breadfruit recorded a decreasing total of 10 from 12 in December 2018 but remained unchanged from January 2018. Head cabbage sellers followed with a decreasing total of 8 from 19 in the previous month and 11 in the same month a year ago. Chinese cabbage sellers recorded a decreasing total of 7 from 8 in the previous month and 11 in the same month last year. Sellers of ta'amu recorded an increasing total of 3 from 1 in the previous month but were lower than 4 in the same month a year ago while sellers of ta'amu remained at a total of 3 from last month but were lower than 5 when compared with January 2018.

VALUE OF SUPPLIES

The average value of selected produce supplied to the Local Markets at \$77,100 in January 2019 increased 16 percent from the previous month and was 2 percent higher when compared with January 2018.



Pumpkin supplies contributed the most to the total value of produce surveyed with a share of 42 percent in January 2019, a level that was lower than 49 percent in the previous month but were higher than 34 in the same month a year ago. Taro supplies followed with a 22 percent contribution to total value increasing from 18 percent in the previous month but were lower than 35 percent when compared with the same month a year ago. Supplies of coconut contributed 11 percent to total value increasing from 10 percent last month and 6 percent in the same month a year ago while supplies of head cabbage contributed 8 percent to total value increasing from 6 percent last month and remained unchanged from the same month last year. Shares of cucumber accounted for 5 percent of total value increasing from 4 percent in the previous month and remained unchanged when compared with January 2018. Banana supplies accounted for 4 percent of total value remaining unchanged from last month but were higher than 3 percent in the same month last year. Supplies of ta'amu recorded a 3 percent share in the month under review rising from 1 percent in the previous month but revealed no changed when compared with the same month last year. Tomato supplies contributed 2 percent to total value decreasing from 5 percent in the previous month and 3 percent in January 2018 while yam, breadfruit and Chinese cabbage supplies accounted for 1 percent each of total value in January 2019. <u>Technical Notes</u>

The Local Market Survey measures the price and volume of selected agricultural produce from the Local Markets at **Fugalei, Taufusi, Vaitele, Afega, Saleimoa, Fasitootai, Savaia, and Salelologa** every month. Prices for selected produce are taken from the Consumer Price Index.

** Data shown reflects the average availability and prices of selected produce. This survey is conducted on each Thursday for rural markets on Upolu and Savaii while each Friday for urban markets on Upolu in the months under reference.

Weights for selected produce have been revised using 2014 as the base period and have been incorporated starting from June 2016 report.
