

# GOVERNMENT OF SAMOA SAMOA BUREAU OF STATISTICS LOCAL MARKET SURVEY

# February2015

This report provides a monthly review of selected agricultural produce available at the Local Markets around the Apia town area based on the price data and volume index survey. Corresponding tables are attached for ease of reference.

## Key findings:

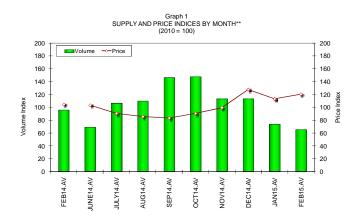
The Local Market Survey in February 2015 showedoverall volume decrease 11 percentwhile limited supply pushed average prices up 6 percent when compared to January 2015.

- There was a significant reduction in the supply of all vegetable produce due to the rainy weather conditions in February 2015.
- Value of supplies dropped 20 percent to \$29,200 from the previous month.
- The number of sellers fell to 219 from 258 in January 2015.

# OVERVIEW

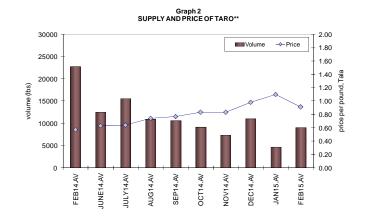
The monthly survey of Agricultural food supplies at the Local Markets by the Samoa Bureau of Statistics in February 2015showedoverall volume decrease 11percent from January2015. Significant decreases were recorded for all agricultural produce with the exception of taro, ta'amu, coconut, and banana.When compared with the same month last year, current supply was 32 percent lower. (See Graph 1 and Tables 4 & 5)



Due to limited availability of most agricultural produce, overall price level rose 6 percent from the previous month. Higher pricesofta'amu, banana, yam, and all vegetable produce contributed to this increase. When compared with February 2014 the current overall price level was 15 percent higher.

# <u>TARO</u>

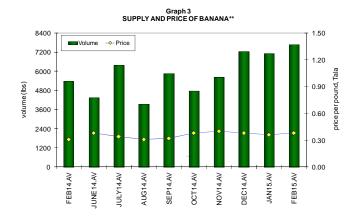
The volume of taro supplies in February 2015rose 94 percent (to 9,112 pounds) from January 2015; a level that was 60 percent lower than the same month last year. The average price of taro decreased 17 percent to \$0.91 per pound due to increased availability at the markets. When compared with February 2014, current price was 60 percenthigher.(See Graph 2 and Tables 1 & 2)



Current supply of taro in the month under review contributed to a 44 percent decline in volume whencomparing the twelve months ending February 2015 over the twelve months ending February 2014. Price fell 4 percent.

## BANANA

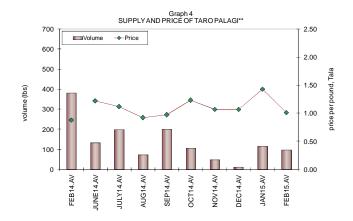
The supply of banana to the Local Markets in February 2015increased 8 percent to 7,682 pounds from January 2015; a level that was 43 percent higher than the same month last year. The average price of banana also rose6 percent to \$0.38 per pound, a level that was23 percent higher thanFebruary 2014. (See Graph 3 and Tables 1 & 2)



When comparing the twelve months ending February 2015 over the twelve months ending February 2014, banana supplies were 53 percent higher while increased availability pushed its average price down 33 percent.

#### TARO PALAGI

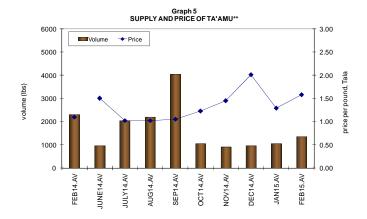
At 97 pounds, the supply of taro palagito the market in the month under reviewdropped 16 percent from the previous month while average price also fell29 percent to \$1.01 per pound.Current volume of taro palagi was 75 percent lower than the same month last year while its average price was 15 percent higher.(See Graph 4 and Tables 1 & 2)



The twelve months ending February 2015 revealed taro palagi supplies were 37 percent lower than that of the twelve months ending February 2014 while its average pricefell 1 percent.

#### TA'AMU

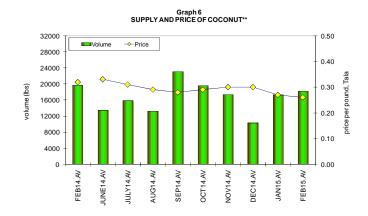
At 1,360 pounds, the supply of ta'amu in February 2015 increased 30 percent fromJanuary 2015 while increased demand drove its average price up22 percent to \$1.58 per pound. When compared with the same month last year, current supply of ta'amu was41 percent lower while its average price was 44 percent higher.(See Graph 5 and Tables 1 & 2)



When comparing the twelve months ending February 2015 over the twelve months ending February2014, ta'amusupplieswere58 percent lower while limited availability pushed its average price up 3 percent.

# COCONUT

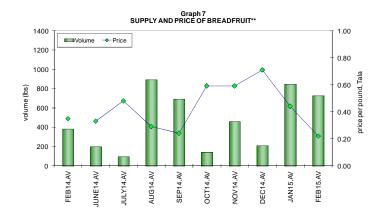
In the month under review the supply of coconut expanded5 percent (to 18,227 pounds) from the previous month. Increased availability of coconut pushed its average price down 4 percent to \$0.26 per pound.Current availability of coconut was 8 percent lower than average availability in February 2014 while average price declined19 percent. (See Graph 6 and Tables 1 & 2)



Current supply of coconut contributed to a 3 percent increase in volume while increasedavailability pushed its average price down18percent when comparing the twelve months ending February 2015over the twelve months ending February 2014.

# BREADFRUIT

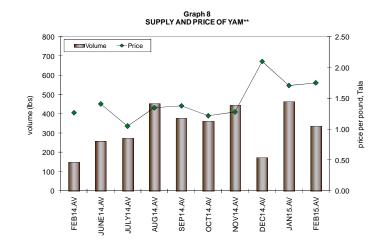
Breadfruit supply in February 2015 declined 14 percent (to 726 pounds) from the previous month while increased availability of its close substitutes (taro, banana, ta'amu)pushedits average price down 50 percent to \$0.22 per pound. When compared with the same month last year, current breadfruit supply was 89 percent higher while increased availability to the market over the year pushed its average price down 37 percent. (See Graph 7 and Tables 1 & 2)



When comparing the twelve months ending February 2015 over the twelve months ending February 2014, breadfruit supplies were 27 percent lower while its average price fell 25 percent.

# YAM

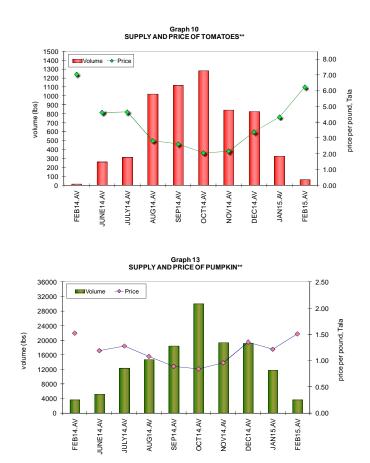
The supplies of yam in February 2015 decreased 28 percent (to 337 pounds) from the previous month while limited availability pushed its average price up 2 percent to \$1.75 per pound. When compared with the same month last year, current supply of yam was two times greater while increased demand of over the year pushed its average price up 38 percent. (See Graph 8 and Tables 1 & 2)

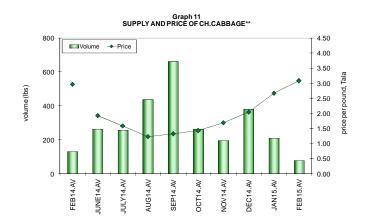


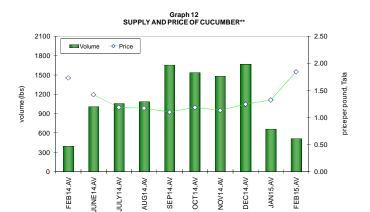
Currentsupply of yam in the month under review contributed to a 44 percent increase in volume in the twelve months ending February 2015 over the twelve months ending February 2014 while its average price remained unchanged.

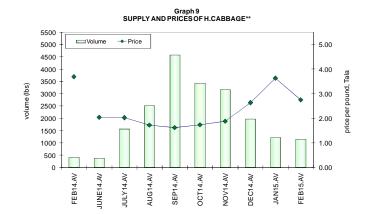
### **VEGETABLE PRODUCE**

Continued wet weather conditionsin February 2015 affected the supply of vegetable produce to the Local Markets resulting in the reduction of the supply of all vegetable producewhen compared with January2015. Tomato supplies dropped 81 percent (to 62 pounds) while pumpkin and Chinese cabbage volume fell 69 percent (to 3,653 pounds) and 63 percent (to 79 pounds) respectively. The supply of cucumber also declined 22 percent (to 513 pounds)whilehead cabbage volumefell 5 percentto 1,156 poundsin that order. (See Graphs 9 to 13 and Tables 1 & 2)





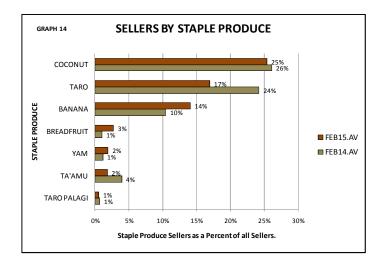


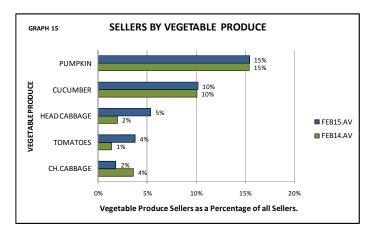


Subsequent tothe limitedavailability ofvegetable produce suppliedto the markets, average pricesfor all vegetable produce increased with the exception of head cabbage prices recording a 24 percent decline to \$2.75 per pound. Tomato prices rose 44 percent (to \$6.23 per pound) followed by cucumber prices increasing39 percent (to \$1.84 per pound). Pumpkin and Chinese cabbage pricesrose 24 percent (to \$1.51 per pound) and 15 percent (to \$3.08 per pound) respectively.

## **SELLERS**

At 219; the number of sellers at the Local Markets on the days surveyed in February 2015decreased 15 percent from the previous month but was 1 percent higher when compared with the number of sellers in the same month a year ago. (See Graphs 14 and 15 and Table 6)



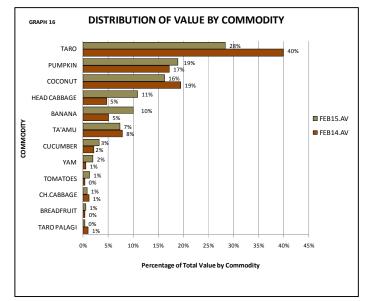


In February 2015, coconut sellers at 56 were the largest group at the local markets increasing from 47 in the previous month but recorded an unchanged total when compared to the same month a year ago. Sellers of taro recorded a total of 37 increasing from 26 in January 2015 but was lower than 52 in February 2014. Pumpkin sellers at 34 dropped from 65 in January 2015 but was higher than 33 in the same month last year. Sellers of Banana at 31 fell from 36 in the previous month but was higher than 23 in the same month a year ago. Cucumber sellers recorded a decreasing total of 22 from 28 in the previous month but remained unchanged when compared with February 2014. Head cabbage sellers

recorded anincreasing total of 12 from 10 in January 2015and was much higher than 4recorded in February 2014 while sellers of tomato at 8decreased from 23 in January 2015but was higher than 3a year ago. Breadfruit sellers recorded a decreasing total of 6 from 8 in the previous month but was higher than 2a year ago. Sellers of ta'amurecorded an increasing total of 4 from 2 in the previous month but fellfrom9in February 2015. Sellers of yam and Chinese cabbage also recorded 4 each dropping from 5 and 6 in January 2015 respectively but when compared to a year ago total current number of yam sellers increased from 3 while current Chinese cabbage sellers decreased from 8. Taro palagi sellers remained unchanged with a total of1 seller in February 2015.

#### VALUE OF SUPPLIES

The average value of selected produce supplied to the market at \$29,200 in February 2015decreased 20percent from the previous month and was 10percent lower when compared with February2014.



Taro supplies contributed the most to the total value of produce surveyed with a share of 28 percent in February 2015, a level that was higher than 14 percent in January 2015 but was lower than 40 percent in February 2014. Pumpkin supplies followed with a 19 percent share decreasing from 39

percent in the previous monthbut was higher than 17 percenta year ago. Supply of coconut accounted for 16 percent of total value, increasing from 13 percent in the previous month but was lower than 19 percent in the same month last year. Head cabbage supplies contributed 11 percent to total value decreasing from 12 percent in January 2015but were much higher than5 percent in February 2014. Supplies of banana contributed 10 percent to total value increasing from 7 percent in the previous month and 5 percent a year ago. Ta'amu supplies accounted for 7 percentof total value in the month under review increasing from 4 in the previous month but were slightly lower than 8 in same month of last year. Supplies of cucumber contributed 3 percentto total valueincreasing from 2 percent inJanuary 2015 and February 2014 while yam accounted for 2 percent of total value remaining unchanged from the previous month but higher than 1 percent a year ago. Supply of breadfruit, tomato, and Chinese cabbage all contributed 1 percent each to the total value of supplies in February 2015 whilerelatively lower shares were recorded for the rest of the other commodities. Weights for the selected produce have been revised using 2010 as the base period and have been incorporated starting from January 2010 report.

\*\* Data shown reflects the average availability and prices of the selected produce at the Local Fugalei and TaufusiMarket stalls. This survey is conducted on each Friday (Thursday where Friday is a public holiday) in the months under reference.
