LOCAL MARKET SURVEY FEBRUARY 2018

This report provides a monthly review of selected agricultural produce available at the Local Markets in Upolu and Savaii based on the price data and volume index survey. Corresponding tables are attached for ease of reference.

Key findings:

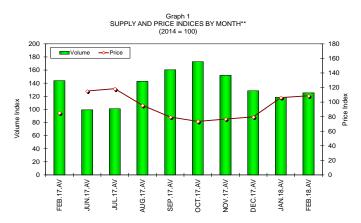
The Local Market Survey in February 2018 revealed overall volume increase 5 percent while limited supply for most vegetable produce contributed to average prices rising 2 percent when compared to January 2018.

- There was a significant reduction in the supply of most vegetable produce due to the rainy weather conditions in February 2018.
- The value of supplies increased 4 percent to \$78,300 from the previous month.
- An average of 330 sellers trading at the Local Market was recorded in the month under review; 6 percent lower than the previous month and 13 percent lower when compared with the same month last year.

OVERVIEW

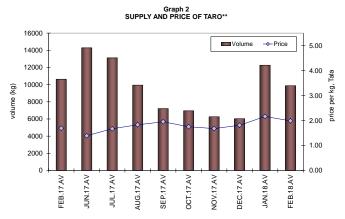
The monthly survey of Agricultural food supplies at the Local Markets by the Samoa Bureau of Statistics in January 2018 showed overall volume increase 5 percent from January 2018. Significant decreases were recorded for all agricultural produce with the exception of banana, ta'amu, coconut and pumpkin. When compared with the same month last year, current supply was 13 percent lower. (See Graph 1 and Tables 4 & 5)



Limited availability of most local produce led the overall price level to increase 2 percent from the previous month. The rise in average prices of all local produce with the exception of taro, coconut, breadfruit and head cabbage contributed to the rise in the price index. The current price level was 27 percent higher when compared with February 2017.

TARO

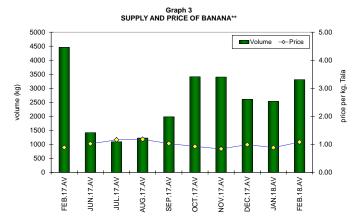
The volume of taro supplies in February 2018 dropped 19 percent (to 9,877 kilograms) from January 2018; a level that was 7 percent lower than the same month last year. The average price of taro decreased 8 percent (to \$1.99 per kilogram) with demand shifting to its close substitutes (banana, yam, ta'amu). When compared with February 2017, current price for taro was 18 percent higher. (See Graph 2 and Tables 1&2)



Despite the decline in volume, current supply of taro in the month under review contributed to a 90 percent rise in volume when comparing the twelve months ending February 2018 over the twelve months ending February 2017. Price fell 37 percent.

BANANA

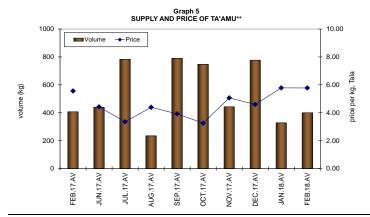
The supply of banana to the Local Markets in February 2018 rose 30 percent (to 3,307 kilograms) from January 2018; a level that was 26 percent lower than the same month a year ago. Strong demand pushed its average price up 23 percent (to \$1.08 per kilogram). When compared with the same month last year current price was 22 percent higher. (See Graph 3 and Tables 1 & 2)



When comparing the twelve months ending February 2018 over the twelve months ending February 2017, banana supplies were 16 percent higher while increased availability pushed its average price down 31 percent.

TA'AMU

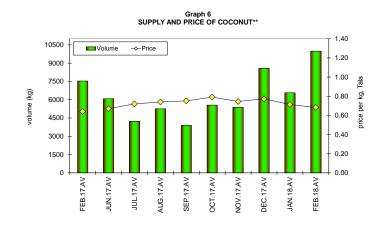
In the month under review ta'amu supplies increased 22 percent (to 400 kilograms) from January 2018. Average price for ta'amu remained at \$5.78 per kilogram from the previous month. Compared to February 2017, current supply of ta'amu was 2 percent lower while its average price was 4 percent higher. (See Graph 5 and Tables 1&2)



PO Box 1151 APIA, SAMOA Telephone (685) 62000 Fax: (685) 24675 Current supply of ta'amu in the month under review contributed to a 63 percent increase in ta'amu volume when comparing the twelve months ending February 2018 over the twelve months ending February 2017 while increased availability pushed its average price down 26 percent.

COCONUT

At 9,986 kilograms the supply of coconut in February 2018 increased 52 percent from the previous month while increased availability pushed its average price down 4 percent (to \$0.68 per kilogram). Current availability of coconut was 33 percent higher than average availability in February 2017 while average price rose 7 percent over the year. (See Graph 6 and Tables 1 & 2)

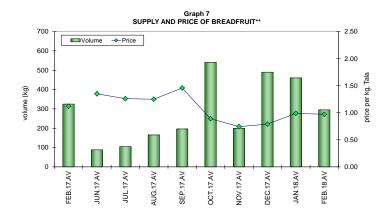


When comparing the twelve months ending February 2018 over the twelve months ending February 2017 supply of coconut was 18 percent higher while its average price also rose 3 percent.

BREADFRUIT

At an average of 295 kilograms, breadfruit supply in February 2018 dropped 36 percent when compared to the previous month while weakened demand pushed its average price down 2 percent (to \$0.97 per kilogram). When compared with the same month last year, current breadfruit supply was 9 percent lower while its average price was also 13 percent lower. (See Graph 3 and Tables 1& 2)

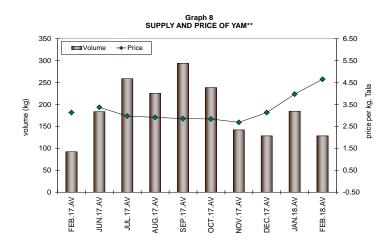
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Current decline in the supply of breadfruit contributed to an 8 percent decrease in volume when comparing the twelve months ending February 2018 over the twelve months ending February 2017 while its average price also decreased 17 percent.

YAM

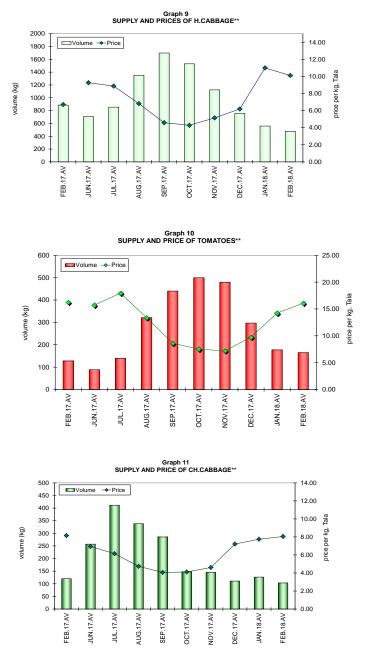
Yam supplies at 128 kilograms decreased 30 percent from January 2018 while limited availability pushed its average price up 17 percent (to \$4.65 per kilogram). When compared with February 2017, current supply of yam was 39 percent higher while strong demand over the year pushed its average price up 48 percent. (See Graph 8 and Tables 1 & 2)



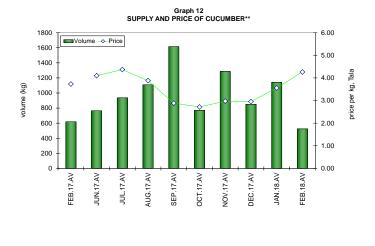
Current supply of yam in the month under review contributed to a 2 percent decline in volume in the twelve months ending February 2018 over the twelve months ending February 2017, while its average price also fell 15 percent.

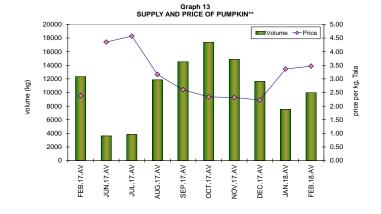
VEGETABLE PRODUCE

Lingering wet weather conditions in February 2018 affected the supply of vegetable produce to the Local Markets resulting in the reduction of the supply of all vegetable produce with the exception of pumpkin supplies recording a moderate increase of 32 percent (to 9,962 kilograms) from the previous month. Cucumber supplies fell 54 percent (to 524 kilograms) while Chinese cabbage volume fell 18 percent (to 103 kilograms). Supplies of head cabbage declined 15 percent (to 477 kilograms) from January 2018 while supplies of tomato fell 7 percent (to 165 kilograms) when compared to the previous month. 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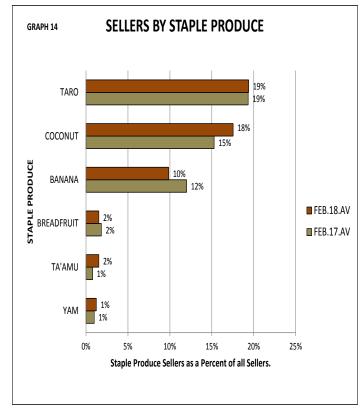


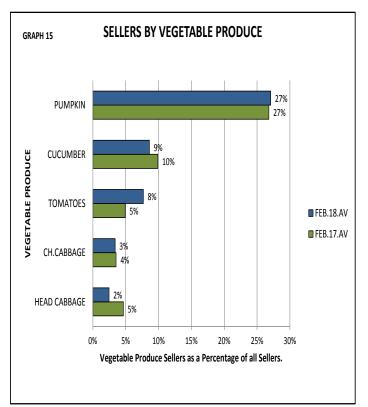


Subsequent to the limited availability of most vegetable produce to the Local Markets in the month under review coupled with increased demand for pumpkin, average prices for all vegetable produce increased with the exception of head cabbage prices recording an 8 percent decline (to \$10.11 per kilogram). Cucumber prices registered the largest price increase of 20 percent (to \$4.26 per kilogram), followed by tomato prices increasing 13 percent (to \$16.09 per kilogram), while Chinese cabbage prices rose 4 percent (to \$8.05 per kilogram). Pumpkin was the vegetable of choice in February 2018 recording a price increase of 3 percent (to \$3.47 per kilogram).

SELLERS

At 330, the number of sellers at the Local Markets on the days surveyed in February 2018 fell 6 percent from the previous month and was also 13 percent lower when compared with the number of sellers in the same month a year ago. (See Graphs 14 and 15 and Table 6).





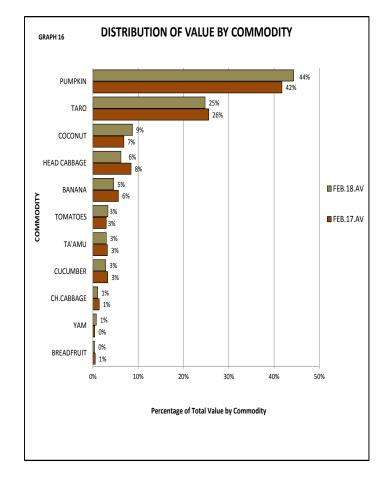
In February 2018, pumpkin sellers at 89 were the largest group at the local markets increasing from 81 in the previous month but were lower than 102 in the same month last year. Taro sellers followed recording an increasing total of 65 from 63 last month but were lower than 74 in the same month a year ago, while coconut sellers increased to 57 from

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54 in the previous month but were lower than 58 a year ago. Banana sellers recorded a total of 32 increasing from 31 in the previous month but were lower than 46 in February 2017. Sellers of cucumber recorded a decreasing total of 29 from 50 in the previous month and 38 in the same month a year ago, while sellers of tomato also recorded a decreasing total of 26 from 31 in January 2018 but were higher than 19 in February 2017. Chinese cabbage sellers followed recording an unchanged total of 11 from the previous month but were lower than 14 when compared with the same month a year ago. Sellers of head cabbage at 8 fell from 11 in the previous month and 18 in the same month a Breadfruit and ta'amu sellers both year ago. recorded a total of 5 with breadfruit sellers decreasing from 10 in the previous month and 7 in February 2017, while total sellers of ta'amu increased from 4 in January 2018 and 3 in the same month last year. Total sellers of yam recorded a decreasing total of 4 from 5 in the previous month but remained unchanged from the same month last year.

VALUE OF SUPPLIES

The average value of selected produce supplied to the Local Markets at \$78,300 in February 2018 increased 4 percent from the previous month and 11 percent when compared with February 2017.



Pumpkin supplies contributed the most to the total value of produce surveyed with a share of 44 percent in February 2018, a level that was higher than 34 percent in January 2018 and 42 percent in February 2017. Taro supplies followed with a 25 percent contribution to total value decreasing from 35 percent in the previous month and 26 percent when compared with a year ago. Supplies of coconut contributed 9 percent to total value increasing from 6 percent in the previous month and 7 percent in February 2017 while shares of head cabbage accounted for 6 percent total value, decreasing from 8 percent in January 2018 and a year ago. Supplies of banana accounted for 5 percent to total value, increasing from 3 percent in January 2018 but were lower than 6 percent when compared with February 2017. Supplies of tomato, ta'amu and cucumber contributed 3 percent each to total value with tomato and ta'amu shares remaining unchanged from last month and the same month a year ago while cucumber supplies fell from 5 percent in the previous month and remained the same from a year ago. Chinese cabbage and yam supplies contributed 1 percent each to total value, while lower contributions were recorded for all

other commodities in the month under review. (See Graph 16 & Table 3)

Technical Notes

The Local Market Survey measures the price and volume of selected agricultural produce from the Local Markets at **Fugalei, Taufusi, Vaitele, Afega, Saleimoa, Toleafoa, Savaia, and Salelologa** every month. Prices for selected produce are taken from the Consumer Price Index.

** Data shown reflects the average availability and prices of selected produce. This survey is conducted on each Thursday for rural markets on Upolu and each Friday for urban markets on Upolu and Savaii in the months under reference.

Weights for selected produce have been revised using 2014 as the base period and have been incorporated starting from June 2016 report.

The Local Market Survey Report for March 2018 will be available on 23rd April 2018.
