LOCAL MARKET SURVEY AUGUST 2018

This report provides a monthly review of selected agricultural produce available at the Local Markets in Upolu and Savaii based on the price data and volume index survey. Corresponding tables are attached for ease of reference.

Key findings:

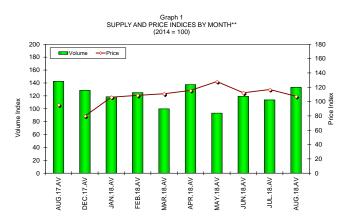
The Local Market Survey in August 2018 showed overall volume increase 17 percent while increased availability pushed average price down 8 percent when compared to July 2018.

- Increases in the volume of breadfruit along with the rise of most vegetable produce supplied to the Local Markets strongly contributed to the rise in the volume index.
- The value of supplies rose 8 percent to \$87,900 from the previous month.
- An average of 356 sellers trading at the Local Markets was recorded in the month under review; 14 percent higher than the previous month but 27 percent lower when compared with the same month last year.

OVERVIEW

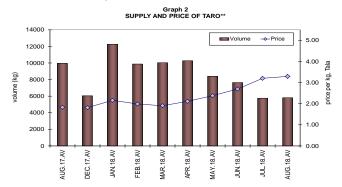
The monthly survey of Agricultural food supplies at the Local Markets by the Samoa Bureau of Statistics in August 2018 showed overall volume increase 17 percent from July 2018. Significant increases in volume were recorded for all agricultural produce with the exception of banana, ta'amu, yam and Chinese cabbage. When compared with the same month last year, current supply was 7 percent lower. (See Graph 1 and Tables 4 & 5)



Due to the increase availability of most agricultural produce, overall price level declined 8 percent from the previous month. Lower prices recorded for all agricultural produce with the exception of taro and coconut contributed to the decline in the price index. When compared with August 2017 the current overall price level was 12 percent higher.

TARO

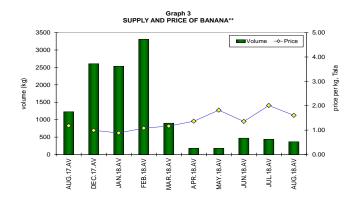
The supply of taro to the Local Market in August 2018 edged up 1 percent (to 5,812 kilograms) from the previous month. At this current level, taro volume was 42 percent lower than the same month last year. The average price of taro increased 3 percent (to \$3.29 per kilogram) driven by increased demand. When compared with August 2017 current price for taro was 80 percent higher. (See Graph 2 and Tables 1&2)



Despite the slight increase in taro volume in the month under review, current supply contributed to a 25 percent decline in volume when comparing the twelve months ending August 2018 over the twelve months ending August 2017. Price rose 16 percent.

BANANA

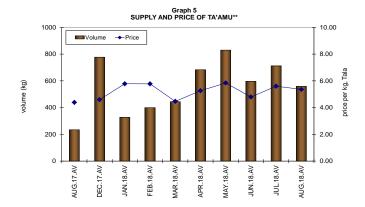
The volume of banana supplied to the Local Markets in August 2018 decreased 16 percent (to 365 kilograms) from July 2018; a level that was 70 percent lower when compared with the same month a year ago. Weakened domestic demand for banana pushed its average price down 20 percent (to \$1.61 per kilogram). When compared with the same month last year current price 36 percent higher. (See Graph 3 and Tables 1 & 2)



When comparing the twelve months ending August 2018 over the twelve months ending August 2017, banana supplies were 28 percent lower while average price increased 14 percent.

TA'AMU

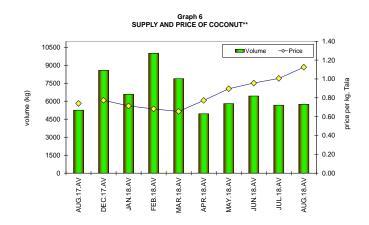
Ta'amu supplies in August 2018 declined 21 percent (to 560 kilograms) from the previous month, while weakened domestic demand pushed its average price down 4 percent (to \$5.36 per kilogram). When compared with August 2017, current supply of ta'amu was more than doubled while its average price was 22 percent higher. (See Graph 5 and Tables 1&2)



PO Box 1151 APIA, SAMOA Telephone (685) 62000 Fax: (685) 24675 Current supply of ta'amu in the month under review contributed to a 40 percent increase in ta'amu volume when comparing the twelve months ending August 2018 over the twelve months ending August 2017 while increased availability pushed its average price down 1 percent.

COCONUT

In the month under review volume for coconut rose 1 percent (to 5,750 kilograms) from July 2018 while strong domestic demand pushed its average price up 12 percent (to \$1.12 per kilogram). Current availability of coconut was 10 percent higher than average availability in August 2017 while average price also increased 52 percent over the year. (See Graph 6 and Tables 1 & 2)

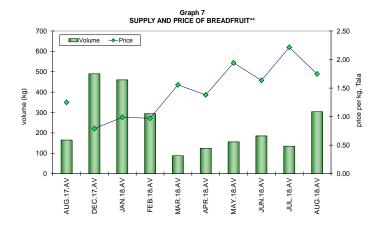


Comparing the twelve months ending August 2018 over the twelve months ending August 2017 supply of coconut was 16 percent higher while its average price also rose 16 percent.

BREADFRUIT

At an average of 304 kilograms, breadfruit supply in August 2018 was more than doubled from the previous month. Increased availability of breadfruit to the markets pushed its average price down 21 percent (to \$1.75 per kilogram). When compared with the same month last year, current breadfruit supply was 84 percent higher while its average price was 40 percent higher. (See Graph 3 and Tables 1& 2)

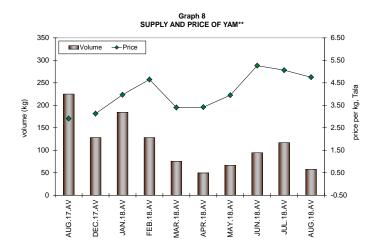
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When comparing the twelve months ending August 2018 over the twelve months ending August 2017, breadfruit supplies were 20 percent lower while its average price increased 25 percent.

YAM

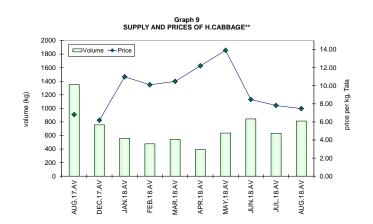
The supply of yam in the month under review fell 51 percent (to 58 kilograms) from the previous month while weakened domestic demand pushed its average price down 6 percent (to \$4.75 per kilogram). When compared with August 2017, current supply of yam was 74 percent lower while limited supply over the year pushed its average price up 63 percent. (See Graph 8 and Tables 1 & 2)

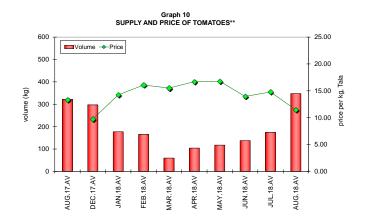


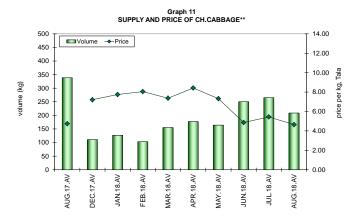
Current supply of yam in the month under review contributed to a 28 percent decrease in volume in the twelve months ending August 2018 over the twelve months ending August 2017, while its average price rose 19 percent.

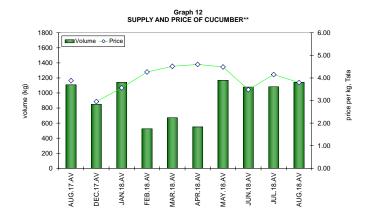
VEGETABLE PRODUCE

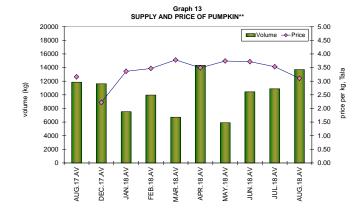
A general overview of all vegetable produce to the Local Markets in August 2018, revealed significant gains in all vegetable supplies with the exception of Chinese cabbage supplies whose volume dropped 21 percent (to 209 kilograms) from the previous month. Tomato supplies registered the largest increase at 100 percent (to 348 kilograms) from July 2018 followed by head cabbage supplies increasing 29 percent (to 813 kilograms). Pumpkin supplies rose 26 percent (to 13,703 kilograms) while cucumber supplies grew 5 percent (to 1,141 kilograms) when compared to the previous month. (See Graphs 9 to 13 and Tables 1 & 2)







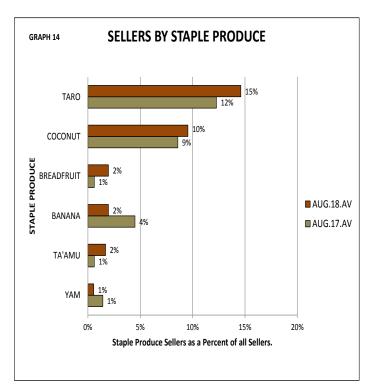


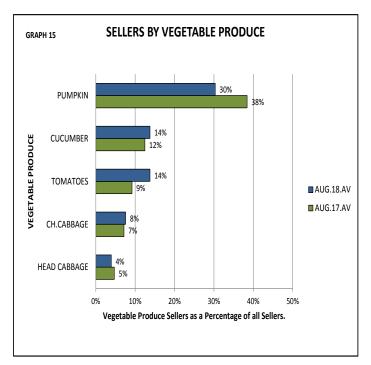


Subsequent to the increase in the supply of most vegetable produce to the Local Markets, average prices in the month under review decreased for all vegetable produce. Average price for tomatoes fell 23 percent (to \$11.45 per kilogram) while Chinese cabbage prices declined 15 percent (to \$4.65 per kilogram). Average price for pumpkin fell 12 percent (to \$3.10 per kilogram). An abundance of cucumber pushed its average price down 9 percent (to \$3.79 per kilogram) respectively.

SELLERS

At 356, the number of sellers at the Local Markets on the days surveyed in August 2018 rose 14 percent from the previous month and was 27 percent lower when compared with the number of sellers in the same month a year ago. (See Graphs 14 and 15 and Table 6).



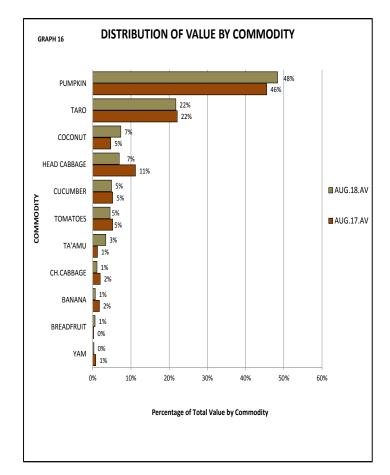


In August 2018, pumpkin sellers at 108 were the largest group at the local markets increasing from 97 in the previous month but were lower than 188 in

the same month last year. Taro sellers followed recording an increasing total of 52 from 47 last month but were lower than 60 in the same month a year ago. Tomato and cucumber sellers recorded an average of 49 each with tomato sellers increasing from 31 in the previous month and 45 a year ago, and cucumber sellers increased from 43 in July 2018 but were lower than 61 in August 2017. Coconut sellers recorded a decreasing total of 34 from 36 in July 2018 and 42 in August 2017. Sellers of Chinese cabbage recorded a decreasing total of 27 from 28 in the previous month and 35 when compared with a year ago; while sellers of head cabbage recorded an increasing total of 14 from 13 in July 2018 but were lower than 23 in August 2017. Banana and breadfruit sellers recorded 7 each with banana remaining unchanged from the previous month but were lower than 22 in the same month last year and breadfruit sellers increased from 3 in July 2018 and August 2017. Ta'amu sellers remained at 6 from the previous month but were higher than 3 when compared with the same month a year ago. Sellers of yam recorded a decreasing total of 2 from 3 in the previous month and 7 in the same month a year ago.

VALUE OF SUPPLIES

The average value of selected produce supplied to the Local Markets at \$87,900 in August 2018 increased 8 percent from the previous month and was 7 percent higher when compared with August 2017.



Pumpkin supplies contributed the most to the total value of produce surveyed with a share of 48 percent in August 2018, a level that was higher than 47 percent in July 2018 and 46 percent in August 2017. Taro supplies followed with a 22 percent contribution to total value decreasing from 23 percent in the previous month and remained unchanged 22 percent when compared with the same month a year ago. Supplies of coconut accounted for 7 percent of total value, remaining unchanged from the previous month but were higher than 5 percent in the same month a year ago. Supplies of head cabbage also contributed 7 percent to total value increasing from 6 percent in the previous month but were lower than 11 percent in August 2017. Supplies of cucumber and tomato both contributed 5 percent each to total value; with cucumber contributions remaining unchanged from last month and in August 2017 while tomato contributions increased from 3 in July 2018 and remained unchanged from 5 percent in the same month a year ago. Ta'amu supplies accounted for 3 percent of total value decreasing from 5 percent in the previous month but were higher than 1 percent in August 2017. Supplies of Chinese cabbage, banana

and breadfruit contributed 1 percent each to total value while relatively lower contributions were recorded for yam in the month under review. (See Graph 16 & Table 3)

Technical Notes

The Local Market Survey measures the price and volume of selected agricultural produce from the Local Markets at **Fugalei, Taufusi, Vaitele, Afega, Saleimoa, Fasitootai, Savaia, and Salelologa** every month. Prices for selected produce are taken from the Consumer Price Index.

** Data shown reflects the average availability and prices of selected produce. This survey is conducted on each Thursday for rural markets on Upolu and each Friday for urban markets on Upolu and Savaii in the months under reference.

Weights for selected produce have been revised using 2014 as the base period and have been incorporated starting from June 2016 report.
