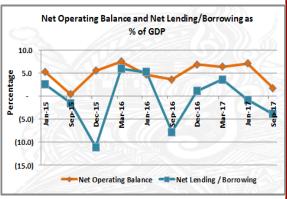

Central Government operations in the September quarter of the financial year 2017/18 resulted in a **Net operating balance** surplus of \$9.7 million. The outturn was the lowest following a period of 7 consecutive quarters recording surpluses of \$20 - \$40 million with a quarterly average of \$30.9 million. When compared to September 2016, net operating balance was \$10 million lower, mainly because of the significant increase of 9.1 percent in operating expense which more than offset the slight increase in revenue of \$1.5 million.

Net Lending (+)/Borrowing (-) was a deficit of \$21.4 million. Governments commitment to infrastructure developments to further improve roads, wharf as well as the international airport

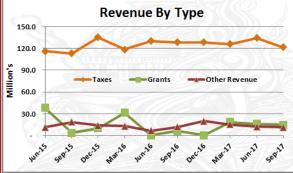
and other developments resulted in the development expenditure aggregated to \$31.1 million.

The deficit was funded primarily from a drawdown of the Government resources in the banking system.

REVENUE BY TYPE:

Total revenue stood at \$147.6 million as at the end of September quarter 2017. Of this amount, taxes accounted for 82.3 percent at \$121.5 million. Grants received was \$14.8 million or 10.0 percent while Other revenue amount to \$11.3 million or 7.6 percent of the revenue.

Chart 2: Major Revenue categories trend growths from June 2015 - September 2017

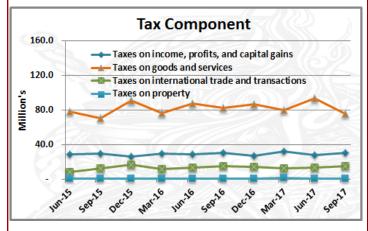


Taxes

Total receipts from taxes aggregated to \$121.5 million, a slight decrease of \$6.8 million (5.3 percent) from September 2016. Nearly every major tax components recorded shortfalls in the

Taxes on property, Taxes on goods and services which included VAGST and Excise Tax, and Tax on international trade all decreased by 8.9 percent, 8.5 percent and 0.3 percent respectively. Tax on income and profits increased by 1.0 percent due to good collection on corporate tax.

Grants

Grant revenue received from donors in the first three months of the FY17/18 was \$14.8 million. This was translated into an increase of \$8.7 million compared to September 2016. Grants accounts for 10.0 percent of total revenue.

Other Revenue

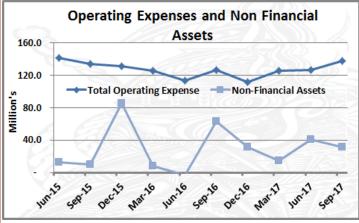
Other revenues stood at \$11.3 million, down by 3.6 percent Summary Table 1: Summary of Operating Expenses (\$0.4 million) compared to September quarter 2016. This was attributed to shortfalls in property income and administrative fees with decreases of \$3.0 million and \$4.3 million compared to the same period of previous financial year.

EXPENDITURE BY TYPE:

Total expenditures (Operating expense plus Net Acquisition of Fixed Assets) was \$169.0 million for September 2017. Of this amount, 81.6 percent were operating expenses at \$137.9 million and 18.4 percent were spent on Non-Financial Assets (\$31.1 million). The aggregated expendi-

Chart 3: Operating Expenses and Non-Financial Assets trend growths from June 2015 - September 2017



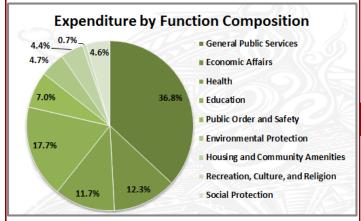
Operating expenses for the Budgetary Central Government in the quarter ending September 2017 amounted to \$137.9 million. The amount increase by \$11.6 million (9.1 percent) from its comparable 2016 quarter and also higher when compared to June 2017 at \$11.7 million (9.2 percent). Contribute to this 9.1 percent increased in operating expense was mainly Grant to other government unit and Use of Goods and Services which amount to \$47.5 million and \$29.1 million. Other minor contributors such as Social benefit, other expense, compensation of employees, subsidies, and interest and contributed of 2.0 percent to total operating expenses.

EXPENDITURE BY FUNCTION OF GOVERNMENT:

Total government spending amounted to \$169.0 million at the end of September 2017. This represents a decrease of 10.7 percent on a year on year basis and 1.3 percent more than the previous quarter June 2017.

The major contributor for above decrease was mainly due to Economics affairs expenditure down to \$20.8 million and represents a 33.3 percent lower on a year to year basis.

In terms of composition, General Public Services received the highest share of \$62.2 million (36.8 percent of the total expenditure) during the quarter under review. This translates into a 62.1 percent increase from previous year, contributing 12.6 percent to overall COFOG change.

The Education and Health sectors received a combined total of \$49.7 million with a share of 17.7 percent and 11.7 percent each. Both sectors expenditures increased by \$7.8 million from September 16. Other minor government function such as Public order and safety, environmental protection, Housing and Community Amenities, Social Protection and Recreation, Culture, and Religion received a combined share of \$36.2 million with an increase of 51.3 percent. Other Functions comprised of 21.4 percent of overall government spending presented in the table below.

GOVERNMENT DEBT:

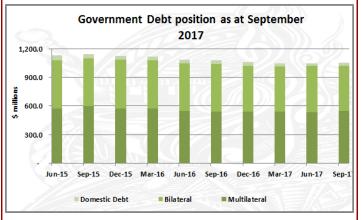
The Government outstanding Debt as at the end of September 2017 stood at \$1.05 billion. Within the amount, total external debt amounted to \$1.02 billion with 51.9 percent pertaining to Multilateral loans and 45.6 percent Bilateral. The total outstanding debt amount has increased by \$1.3 million (0.1 percent) compared to June quarter 2017.

Moreover, loans on **Multilateral** agreements was at \$543.8 million with an increase of \$9.3 million compare to June 2017

Bilateral loans on the other hand went down from June quarter by \$5.6 million to stand at \$477.9 million in September 2017.

Domestic Debts for September 2017 quarter stood at \$26.9 million, \$2.4 million (8.3 percent) lower than the previous quarter.

What are Government Finance Statistics?

Government Finance Statistics provide statistics that enable policymakers and analysts to study developments in the financial operations, financial position and liquidity situation of the government sector in a consistent and systematic manner. Balancing items have been created to provide summary information such as Net Operating Balance (NOB) and Net Lending (+) or Borrowing (-). The detailed data can also be used to examine specific areas of government operations, example: particular forms of taxation, level of expense and the amount of government borrowing etc. The harmonization of this system with other macroeconomic statistical systems like the System of National Accounts means that data from the GFS can be combined with data from NA to assess government performance in relation to the rest of the economy. Similarly, it can also be used for intercountry analysis of government operations, such as comparisons of ratios of taxes or expense to gross domestic product.

The Bureau is currently working on improving the Framework to extend the coverage to include the Government Public Bodies.

This is expected to be published before the end of the financial vear 2017/18.
