# **SAMOA BUREAU OF STATISTICS**

# NOVEMBER 2018

This report provides a monthly review of selected agricultural produce available at the Local Markets in Upolu and Savaii based on the price data and volume index survey. Corresponding tables are attached for ease of reference.

#### **Key findings:**

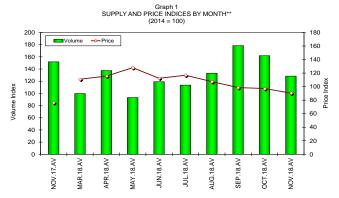
The Local Market Survey in November 2018 showed overall volume decrease 21 percent while weak domestic demand pushed average prices down 7 percent when compared to October 2018.

- Significant decrease in the supplies of almost all agricultural produce strongly contributed to the decline in the volume index.
- The value of supplies fell 23 percent to \$67,800 from the previous month.
- An average of 326 sellers trading at the Local Market were recorded in the month under review; 15 percent lower than the previous month and 22 percent lower when compared with the same month last year.

#### **OVERVIEW**

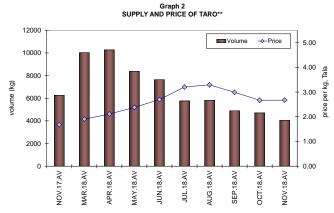
With the beginning of the wet season, the monthly survey of Agricultural food supplies at the Local Markets by the Samoa Bureau of Statistics in November 2018 showed overall volume decrease 21 percent from October 2018. This decrease in volume stem from significant reduction of all agricultural produce supplied to the markets with the exception of coconut. When compared with the same month last year, current supply was 15 percent lower. (See Graph 1 and Tables 4 & 5)



Decreased domestic demand for most agricultural produce prompted overall price level to slip 7 percent from the previous month. Lower prices were recorded for all agriculture produce with the exception of breadfruit, yam, tomato and Chinese cabbage. When compared with November 2017 the current overall price level was 18 percent higher.

### **TARO**

At 4,057 kilograms, the supply of taro in the month under review decreased 14 percent from the previous month while its average price revealed no change from October 2018. When compared with November 2017, current supply of taro was 35 percent lower while limited supply over the year pushed its average price up 59 percent. (See Graph 2 and Tables 1&2)

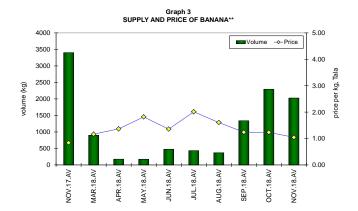


Current supply of taro in the month under review, contributed to a 33 percent decline in volume when comparing the twelve months ending November 2018 over the twelve months ending November 2017. Price rose 46 percent.

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# **BANANA**

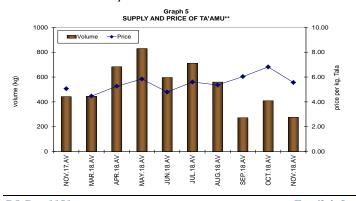
The volume of banana supplied to the Local Markets in November 2018 decreased 12 percent (to 2,027 kilograms) from October 2018; a level that was 40 percent lower than the same month last year. The average price of banana fell 15 percent (to \$1.04 per kilogram) due to weakened domestic demand. When compared with the same month last year current price was 25 percent higher. (See Graph 3 and Tables 1&2)



When comparing the twelve months ending November 2018 over the twelve months ending November 2017, banana supplies were 43 percent lower while limited availability pushed its average price up 32 percent.

#### TA'AMU

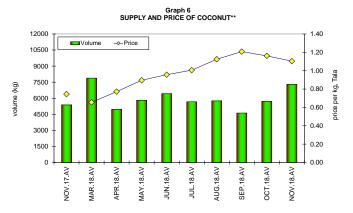
In the month under review ta'amu supplies declined 32 percent (to 276 kilograms) from the previous month, while weak domestic demand pushed its average price down 18 percent (to \$5.56 per kilogram). When compared with November 2017, current supply of ta'amu was 38 percent lower while its average price was 10 percent higher. (See Graph 5 and Tables 1&2)



Current supply of ta'amu in the month under review contributed to a 3 percent decrease in ta'amu volume when comparing the twelve months ending November 2018 over twelve months ending November 2017 while limited availability pushed its average price up 18 percent.

### **COCONUT**

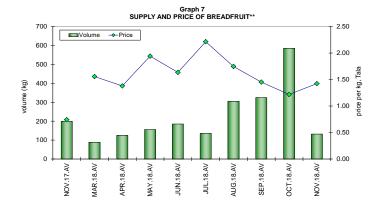
Coconut supplies were the only commodity that experiences an increase in volume in November 2018 rising 28 percent (to 7,284 kilograms) from October 2018 while increased availability pushed its average price down 5 percent (to \$1.10 per kilogram). Current availability of coconut was 36 percent higher than average availability in November 2017 while average price also increased 48 percent over the year. (See Graph 6 and Tables 1&2)



Comparing the twelve months ending November 2018 over the twelve months ending November 2017 supply of coconut was 20 percent higher while its average price also rose 29 percent.

## **BREADFRUIT**

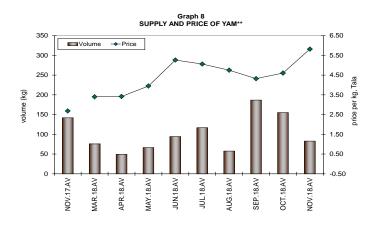
At an average of 132 kilograms, breadfruit supply in November 2018 decreased 77 percent from the previous month. Limited availability of breadfruit to the markets pushed its average price up 17 percent (to \$1.42 per kilogram). When compared with the same month last year, current breadfruit supply was 34 percent lower while its average price increased 92 percent. (See Graph 7 and Tables 1& 2)



When comparing the twelve months ending November 2018 over the twelve months ending November 2017, breadfruit supplies were 1 percent lower while its average price increased 32 percent.

# **YAM**

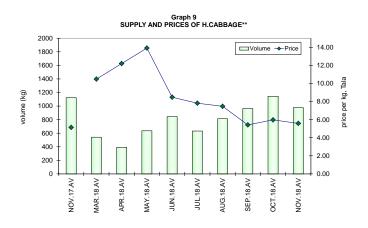
The supply of yam in the month under review dropped 47 percent (to 83 kilograms) from the previous month while limited availability pushed its average price up 26 percent (to \$5.82 per kilogram). When compared with the same month last year, current supply of yam was 42 percent lower while limited supply over the year pushed its average price up 117 percent. (See Graph 8 and Tables 1 & 2)

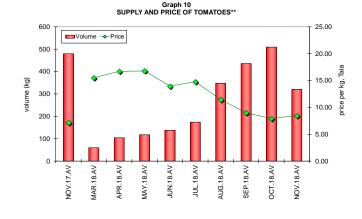


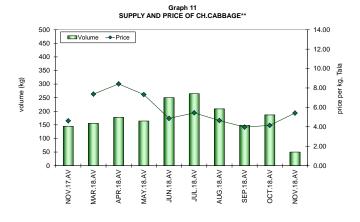
Current supply of yam in the month under review contributed to a 35 percent decrease in volume in the twelve months ending November 2018 over the twelve months ending November 2017, while its average price rose 39 percent.

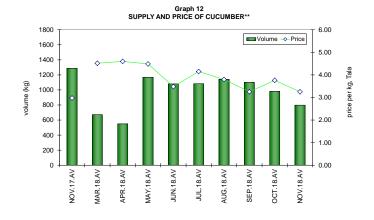
#### **VEGETABLE PRODUCE**

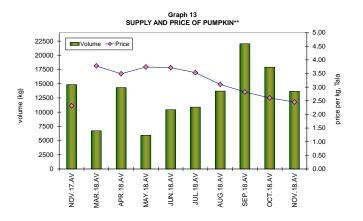
With the onset of rainy season, the supply of vegetable produce to the Local Markets in November 2018 experienced moderate losses in all vegetables supplies. Chinese cabbage supplies dropped 73 percent (to 50 kilograms) while tomato and pumpkin volume fell 37 percent (to 320 kilograms) and 24 percent (to 13,685 kilograms) respectively. Supplies of cucumber fell 19 percent (to 798 kilograms) followed by head cabbage supplies with a 15 percent decline in volume (to 977 kilograms). (See Graphs 9 to 13 and Tables 1 & 2)







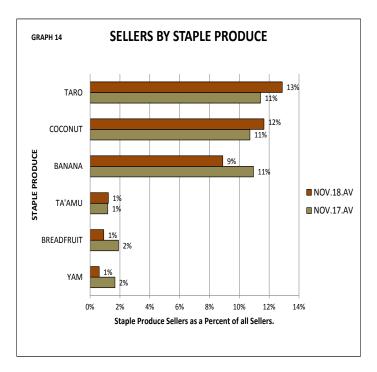


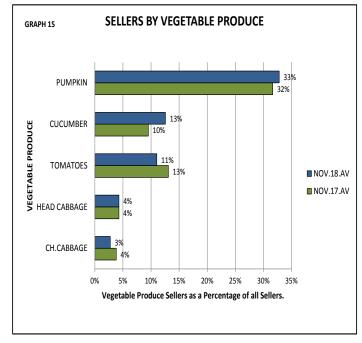


Subsequent to decreased availability of all vegetable produce to the Local Markets in the month under review, weakened domestic demand pushed average prices down for all vegetable produce with the exception of Chinese cabbage and tomato whose prices were pushed up due to significant reduction in availability recording a 30 percent (to \$5.41 per kilogram) and 7 percent (to \$8.47 per kilogram) decline respectively from the previous month. Average prices for cucumber fell 14 percent (to \$3.25 per kilogram) while head cabbage prices declined 7 percent (to \$5.58 per kilogram). Weakened demand for pumpkin pushed its average price down 6 percent (to \$2.45 per kilogram).

### **SELLERS**

At 326, the number of sellers at the Local Markets on the days surveyed in November 2018 fell 15 percent from the previous month and was 22 percent lower when compared with the number of sellers in the same month a year ago. (See Graphs 14 and 15 and Table 6).

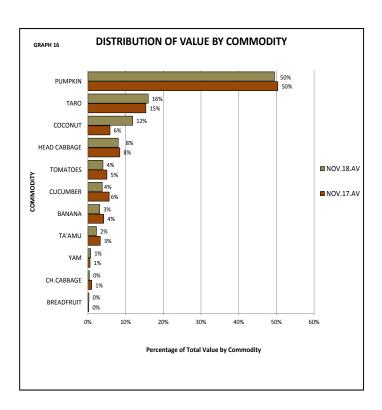




In November 2018, pumpkin sellers at 107 were the largest group at the local markets decreasing from 111 in the previous month and 133 in the same month last year. Taro sellers followed recording a decreasing total of 42 from 49 last month and 48 in the same month a year ago while cucumber sellers remained at 41 from the previous month but were higher than 40 a year ago. Sellers of coconut recorded a decreasing total of 38 from 39 in October 2018 and 45 in November 2017 while total sellers of tomato also decreased to 36 from 54 last month and 55 in November 2017. Sellers of banana recorded a decreasing total of 29 from 34 in the previous month and 46 when compared with same month a year ago; while sellers of head cabbage recorded a decreasing total of 14 from 17 in October 2018 and 18 in November 2017. Chinese cabbage sellers followed with a decreasing total of 9 from 22 in the previous month and 16 in the same month a year ago. Ta'amu sellers recorded a decreasing total of 4 from 5 in the previous month and the same month last year, while sellers of breadfruit recorded a decreasing total of 3 from 10 in the previous month and 8 in the same month a year ago. Sellers of yam recorded a decreasing total of 2 from 4 last month and 7 when compared with November 2017.

#### **VALUE OF SUPPLIES**

The average value of selected produce supplied to the Local Markets at \$67,800 in November 2018 decreased 23 percent from the previous month and was 1 percent lower when compared with November 2017.



Pumpkin supplies contributed the most to the total value of produce surveyed with a share of 50 percent in November 2018, a level that was lower than 53 percent in the previous month and remained unchanged in the same month a year ago. supplies followed with a 16 percent contribution to total value increasing from 14 percent in the previous month and 15 percent when compared with the same month a year ago. Supplies of coconut contributed 12 percent of total value increasing from 8 percent last month and 6 percent in the same month a year ago while supplies of head cabbage contributed 8 percent to total value revealing no change from last month and the same month last year. Supplies of tomato and cucumber both contributed 4 percent each to total value; with tomato contributions decreasing from 5 percent last month and the same month a year ago, while cucumber shares remained unchanged from October 2018 but were lower than 6 percent in November 2017. Supplies of banana contributed 3 percent to total value revealing no change from last month but were lower than 4 percent the same month a year ago while ta'amu accounted for 2 percent share decreasing from 3 percent in the previous month and the same month last year. Supplies of yam and Chinese cabbage contributed 1 percent each to total value while relatively lower contributions were recorded for breadfruit in the month under review. (See Graph 16 & Table 3)

#### **Technical Notes**

The Local Market Survey measures the price and volume of selected agricultural produce from the Local Markets at Fugalei, Taufusi, Vaitele, Afega, Saleimoa, Fasitootai, Savaia, and Salelologa every month. Prices for selected produce are taken from the Consumer Price Index.

\*\* Data shown reflects the average availability and prices of selected produce. This survey is conducted on each Thursday for rural markets on Upolu and each Friday for urban markets on Upolu and Savaii in the months under reference.

Weights for selected produce have been revised using 2014 as the base period and have been incorporated starting from June 2016 report.
