LOCAL MARKET SURVEY OCTOBER 2017

This report provides a monthly review of selected agricultural produce available at the Local Markets in Upolu and Savaii based on the price data and volume index survey. Corresponding tables are attached for ease of reference.

Key findings:

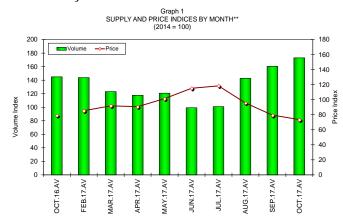
The Local Market Survey in October 2017 showed overall volume increase 8 percent while average price declined 8 percent when compared to September 2017.

- Breadfruit volume was more than doubled when compared to the previous month.
- The value of supplies decreased 2 percent to \$76,800 from the previous month as total number of sellers also fell 4 percent to 427 from 445 in September 2017.

OVERVIEW

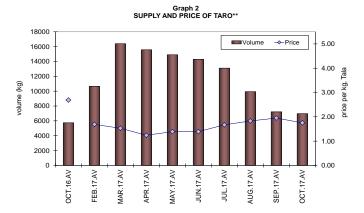
The monthly survey of Agricultural food supplies at the Local Markets by the Samoa Bureau of Statistics in October 2017 showed overall volume increase 8 percent from September 2017. Despite the decrease in volume for most local produce, significant increases in breadfruit, banana, coconut, tomato and pumpkin supplies contributed positively to the rise in the volume index. When compared with the same month last year, current supply was 19 percent higher. (See Graph 1 and Tables 4 & 5)



With increased availability of breadfruit, banana, coconut and pumpkin together with weakened demand for most agricultural produce pushed the overall price level down 8 percent from the previous month. When compared with October 2016 the current overall price level was 7 percent lower.

TARO

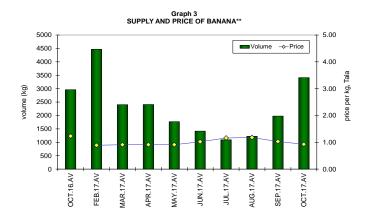
The volume of taro supplies in October 2017 fell 4 percent (to 6,948 kilograms) from September 2017; a level that was 21 percent higher than the same month last year. Driven by weak domestic demand and increased availability of its close substitutes led to a 10 percent price decrease (to \$1.75 per kilogram) from the previous month. Current price for taro was 35 percent lower. (See Graph 2 and Tables 1&2)



Current supply of taro in the month under review contributed to a 154 percent increase in volume when comparing the twelve months ending October 2017 over the twelve months ending October 2016. Price fell 37 percent.

BANANA

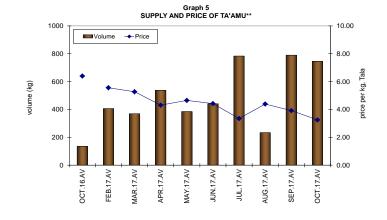
At 3,412 kilograms, the average supply of banana on the days surveyed increased 72 percent from the previous month; a level that was 15 percent higher than October 2016. Significant increase in the supply of banana led to its average price declining 10 percent (to \$0.93 per kilogram). When compared with the same month last year current price was 25 percent lower. (See Graph 3 and Tables 1 & 2)



When comparing the twelve months ending October 2017 over the twelve months ending October 2016, banana supplies were 64 percent higher while increased availability pushed its average price down 29 percent.

TA'AMU

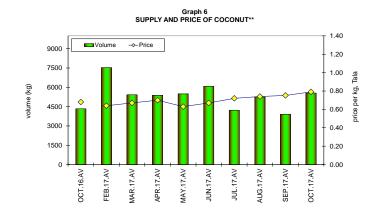
In the month under review ta'amu supplies declined 6 percent (to 746 kilograms) from the previous month while weakened demand pushed its average price down 17 percent (to \$3.25 per kilogram). When compared with same month last year, current supply of ta'amu was more than fivefold while its average price was 49 percent lower. (See Graph 5 and Tables 1&2)



When comparing the twelve months ending October 2017 over the twelve months ending October 2016, ta'amu supplies were 147 percent higher while increased availability pushed its average price down 27 percent.

COCONUT

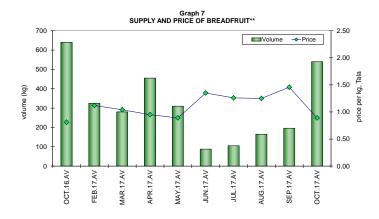
The supply of coconut to the Local Markets in October 2017 rose 43 percent (to 5,556 kilograms) from September 2017 while strong domestic demand pushed its average price up 5 percent (to \$0.79 per kilogram). Current availability of coconut was 28 percent higher than average availability in October 2016 while average price rose 16 percent over the year. (See Graph 6 and Tables 1 & 2)



Comparing the twelve months ending October 2017 over the twelve months ending October 2016 supply of coconut was 15 percent higher while its average price also rose 12 percent.

BREADFRUIT

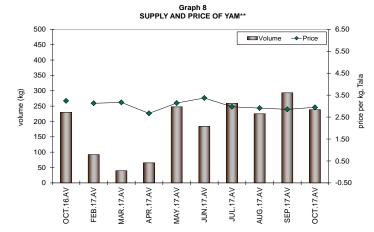
At an average of 540 kilograms, breadfruit supply in October 2017 was more than doubled from the previous month. Increased availability of breadfruit at the Local Markets pushed its average price down 39 percent (to \$0.89 per kilogram). When compared with the same month last year, current breadfruit supply was 16 percent lower while limited availability pushed its average price up 10 percent. (See Graph 3 and Tables 1& 2)



Despite the increase in breadfruit supplies in the month under review current supply contributed to a 4 percent deficit when comparing the twelve months ending October 2017 over the twelve months ending October 2016, breadfruit supplies while its average price decreased 13 percent.

YAM

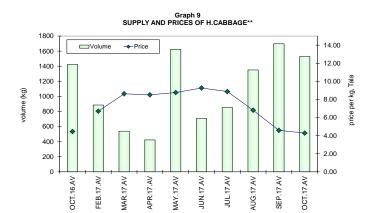
Yam supplies at 239 kilograms decreased 19 percent from September 2017 while demand pushed its average price up 1 percent (to \$2.84 per kilogram). When compared with October 2016, current supply of yam was 4 percent higher while its average price was 12 percent lower. (See Graph 8 and Tables 1 & 2)

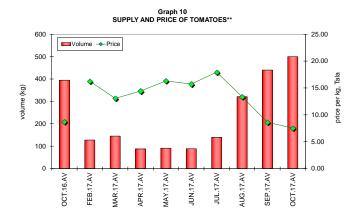


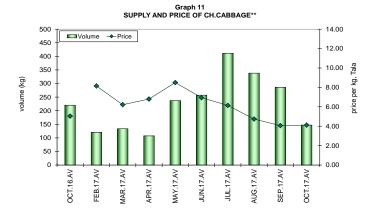
The volume of yam in the month under review contributed to a 7 percent decrease in supply in the twelve months ending October 2017 over the twelve months ending October 2016, while its average price also declined 18 percent.

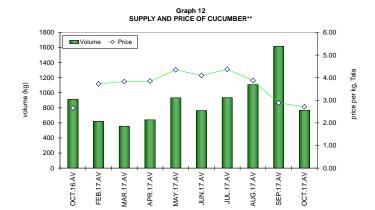
VEGETABLE PRODUCE

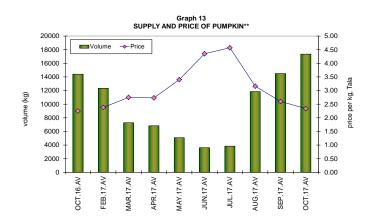
A general overview of all vegetable produce to the Local Markets in October 2017, revealed significant reductions in all vegetable supplies with the exception of pumpkin and tomato whose volume rose 20 percent (to 17,345 kilograms) and 14 percent (to 500 kilograms) respectively from the previous month. Cucumber supplies fell 52 percent (to 768 kilograms) while Chinese cabbage supplies also decreased 48 percent (to 147 kilograms). Head cabbage supplies fell 10 percent (to 1,529 kilograms) from September 2017. (See Graphs 9 to 13 and Tables 1 & 2)







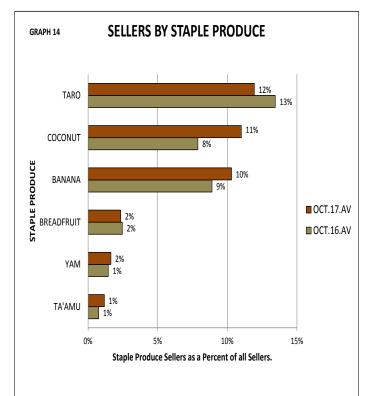




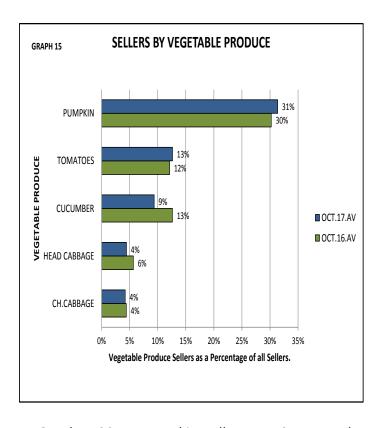
Subsequent to decreased availability of most vegetable produce to the Local Markets in the month under review, average prices for all vegetables declined with the exception of Chinese cabbage edging up 1 percent (to \$4.12 per kilogram). Increased availability of pumpkin and tomato pushed their average prices down 10 percent (to \$2.34 per kilogram) and 13 percent (to \$7.53 per kilogram) respectively while weakened demand for head cabbage and cucumber drove their average prices down 7 percent (to \$4.28 per kilogram) and 6 percent (\$2.72 per kilogram) in that order.

SELLERS

At 427, the number of sellers at the Local Markets on the days surveyed in October 2017 fell 4 percent from the previous month with vegetable sellers representing 62 percent of all sellers at the Local Markets. When compared with October 2016, the number of sellers was 8 percent higher. (See Graphs 14 and 15 and Table 6).



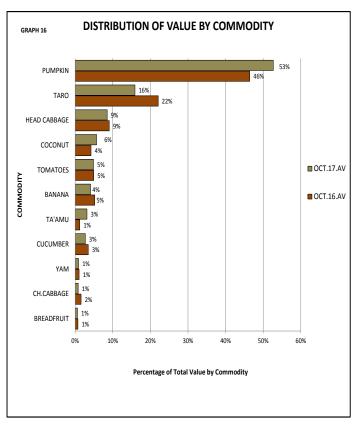
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In October 2017, pumpkin sellers at 134 were the largest group at the local markets increasing from 123 in the previous month and 120 in the same month last year. Tomato sellers followed recording an increasing total of 54 from 53 last month and 48 in the same month a year ago, while taro sellers decreased to 51 from 55 in the previous month and Coconut sellers recorded an 53 a year ago. increasing total of 47 from 44 in the previous month and 31 in October 2016 while total sellers of banana rose to 44 from 29 in September 2017 and 35 in October 2016. Sellers of cucumber recorded a decreasing total of 40 from 71 in the previous month and 50 in the same month a year ago while head cabbage sellers decreased to 19 from 25 in the previous month and 23 when compared with October 2016. Chinese cabbage sellers followed with a decreasing total of 18 from 27 in September 2017 and 18 a year ago. Breadfruit sellers recorded an increasing total of 10 from 3 in the previous month and remained unchanged when compared with the same month last year while sellers of yam recorded a decreasing total of 7 from 8 in September 2017 but were higher than 6 in October 2016. Ta'amu sellers recorded a decreasing total of 5 from 8 in the previous month and 3 in the same month a year ago.

VALUE OF SUPPLIES

The average value of selected produce supplied to the Local Markets at \$76,800 in October 2017 decreased 2 percent from the previous month but was 10 percent higher when compared with October 2016.



Pumpkin supplies contributed the most to the total value of produce surveyed with a share of 53 percent in October 2017, a level that was higher than 48 percent in September 2017 and 46 percent in October 2016. Taro supplies followed with a 16 percent contribution to total value decreasing from 18 percent in the previous month and 22 when compared with a year ago. Supplies of head cabbage contributed 9 percent to total value decreasing from 10 percent in the previous month and remained unchanged from October 2016. Shares of coconut accounted for 6 percent of total value increasing from 4 percent in the previous month and year ago, while shares of tomato remained at 5 percent from September 2017 and October 2016. Banana supplies contributed 4 percent to total value increasing from 3 percent in September 2017 but were lower than 5 percent in 2016. Ta'amu and cucumber October both accounted for 3 percent each of total value; with

ta'amu shares decreasing from 4 percent in the previous month but were higher than 1 percent in October 2016, while cucumber shares decreased from 6 percent in the previous month but remained unchanged when compared with same month a year ago. Supplies of Chinese cabbage, yam and breadfruit contributed 1 percent each to total value; with Chinese cabbage shares remaining unchanged from the previous month but were lower than 2 percent in the same month a year ago, while shares of yam and breadfruit remained the same when compared with the previous month and October 2016. Technical Notes

The Local Market Survey measures the price and volume of selected agricultural produce from the Local Markets at **Fugalei, Taufusi, Vaitele, Afega, Saleimoa, Toleafoa, Savaia, and Salelologa** every month. Prices for selected produce are taken from the Consumer Price Index.

** Data shown reflects the average availability and prices of selected produce. This survey is conducted on each Thursday for rural markets on Upolu and each Friday for urban markets on Upolu and Savaii in the months under reference.

Weights for selected produce have been revised using 2014 as the base period and have been incorporated starting from June 2016 report.
