LOCAL MARKET SURVEY DECEMBER 2017

This report provides a monthly review of selected agricultural produce available at the Local Markets in Upolu and Savaii based on the price data and volume index survey. Corresponding tables are attached for ease of reference.

Key findings:

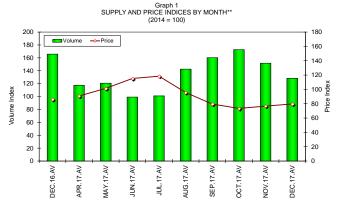
The Local Market Survey in December 2017 showed overall volume decrease 15 percent while limited availability of most produce pushed overall price up 4 percent when compared to November 2017.

- The value of supplies decreased 10 percent to \$61,200 from the previous month.
- An average of 362 sellers trading at the Local Market was recorded in the month under review; 14 percent lower than the previous month and also 3 percent lower when compared with the same month last year.

OVERVIEW

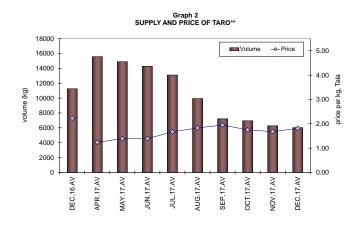
The monthly survey of Agricultural food supplies at the Local Markets by the Samoa Bureau of Statistics in December 2017 showed overall volume decrease 15 percent from November 2017. This decrease in volume stems from significant reduction of all agricultural produce supplied to the markets with the exception of ta'amu, coconut and breadfruit. When compared with the same month last year, current supply was 23 percent lower. (See Graph 1 and Tables 4 & 5)



Limited availability of most local produce drove the overall price level up 4 percent from the previous month. The rise in average prices of all local produce with the exception of ta'amu, cucumber and pumpkin contributed to the rise in the price index. The current price level was also 7 percent lower when compared with December 2016.

TARO

At 6,034 kilograms, the supply of taro to the local markets ended the calendar year at its lowest volume recorded in 2017 decreasing 4 percent from the previous month while limited availability led its average price to climb 8 percent (to \$1.81 per kilogram). When compared with December 2016, current supply of taro was 46 percent lower while its average price was 19 percent lower. (See Graph 2 and Tables 1&2)

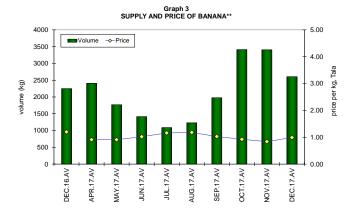


Despite the decline in taro supplies in December 2017, current volume contributed to a 117 percent rise in volume when comparing the twelve months ending December 2017 over the twelve months ending December 2016. Price fell 40 percent.

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BANANA

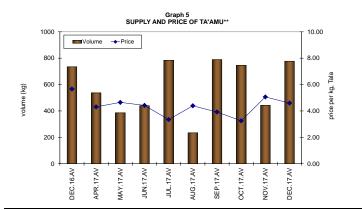
The supply of banana to the Local Markets in December 2017 dropped 23 percent (to 2,604 kilograms) from November 2017; a level that was 16 percent higher than the same month a year ago. A reduction in the supply of banana pushed its average price up 18 percent (to \$0.99 per kilogram). When compared with the same month last year current price was 17 percent lower. (See Graph 3 and Tables 1 & 2)



When comparing the twelve months ending December 2017 over the twelve months ending December 2016, banana supplies were 60 percent higher while increased availability pushed its average price down 34 percent.

TA'AMU

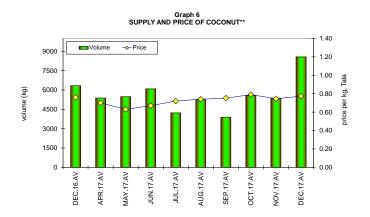
In the month under review ta'amu supplies rose 76 percent (to 777 kilograms) from the previous month while its average price fell 9 percent (to \$4.59 per kilogram). Compared to December 2016, current supply of ta'amu was 6 percent higher while its average price was 19 percent lower. (See Graph 5 and Tables 1&2)



The rise in ta'amu supplies in the month under review contributed to a 109 percent increase in ta'amu volume when comparing the twelve months ending December 2017 over the twelve months ending December 2016 while increased availability pushed its average price down 29 percent.

COCONUT

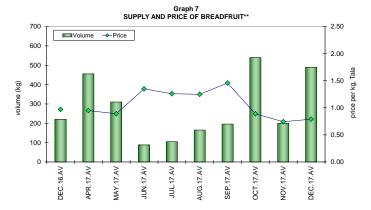
The volume of coconut in December 2017 rose 59 percent (to 8,560 kilograms) from November 2017 while increased demand pushed its average price up 4 percent (to \$0.77 per kilogram). Current availability of coconut was 35 percent higher than average availability in December 2016 while average price rose 2 percent over the year. (See Graph 6 and Tables 1 & 2)



Current supply of coconut in December 2017 contributed to a 15 percent increase in coconut volume when comparing the twelve months ending December 2017 over the twelve months ending December 2016 while its average price also rose 8 percent.

BREADFRUIT

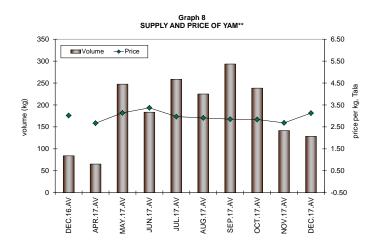
The supply of breadfruit in December 2017 was more than doubled (to 490 kilograms) from the previous month, while increased demand pushed its average price up 6 percent (to \$0.79 per kilogram). When compared with the same month last year, current supply of breadfruit was more than doubled while increased availability over the year pushed its average down 19 percent. (See Graph 3 and Tables 1& 2)



Despite the increase in breadfruit volume in the month under review, current supply contributed to a 11 percent decline in volume when comparing the twelve months ending December 2017 over the twelve months ending December 2016 while its average price also decreased 10 percent.

YAM

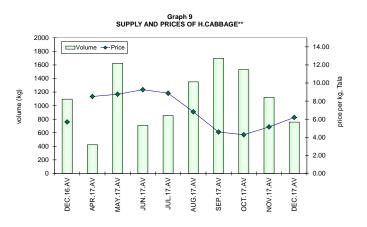
Yam supplies at 128 kilograms decreased 10 percent from November 2017 while strong domestic demand pushed its average price up 17 percent (to \$3.13 per kilogram). When compared with December 2016, current supply of yam was 53 percent higher while its average price was also 4 percent higher. (See Graph 8 and Tables 1 & 2)

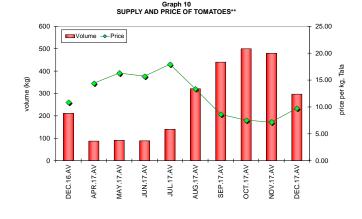


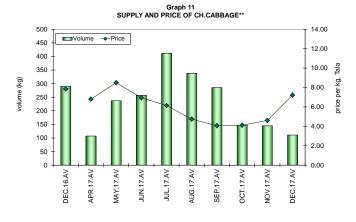
The decrease of yam supplied in the month under review contributed to a 1 percent decline in volume in the twelve months ending December 2017 over the twelve months ending December 2016, while its average price also fell 16 percent.

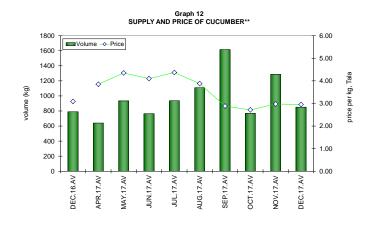
VEGETABLE PRODUCE

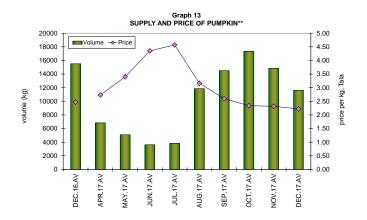
The continued wet weather conditions in December 2017 negatively affected the supply of vegetable produce to the Local Markets recording significant losses to the supply of all vegetable produce. Tomato supplies fell 38 percent (to 297 kilograms) while cucumber supplies also decreased 34 percent (to 851 kilograms). Head cabbage supplies fell 33 percent (to 756 kilograms) followed by Chinese cabbage with a 24 percent reduction in suppy (to 111 kilograms). Supplies of pumpkin fell 22 percent (to 11,611 kilograms) from November 2017. (See Graphs 9 to 13 and Tables 1 & 2)







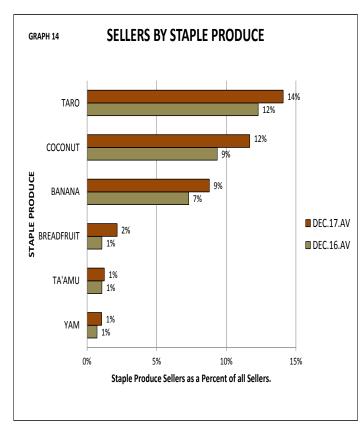


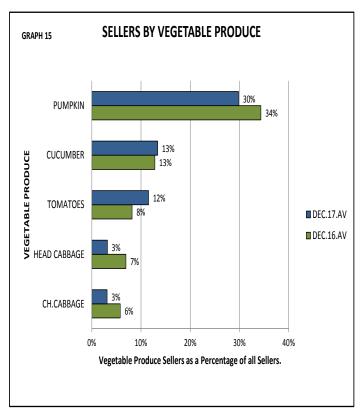


Subsequent to decreased availability of all vegetable produce to the Local Markets in the month under review, average prices for all vegetables increased with the exception of pumpkin and cucumber recording a 4 percent (to \$2.22 per kilogram) and 1 percent (to \$2.95 per kilogram) decline respectively from the previous month. Chinese cabbage prices experienced the largest price increase of 56 percent (to \$7.21 per kilogram) while tomato prices rose 36 percent (to \$9.76 per kilogram). Average price for head cabbage grew 20 percent (to \$6.19 per kilogram).

SELLERS

At 362, the number of sellers at the Local Markets on the days surveyed in December 2017 fell 14 percent from the previous month and was also 3 percent lower when compared with the number of sellers in the same month a year ago. (See Graphs 14 and 15 and Table 6).





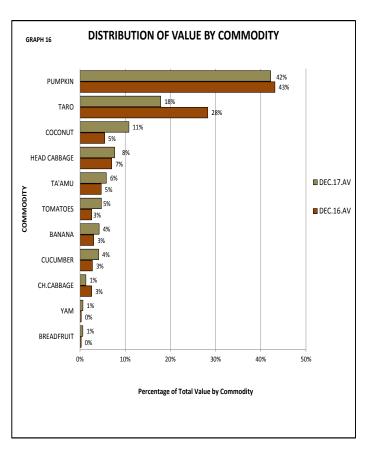
In December 2017, pumpkin sellers at 108 were the largest group at the local markets decreasing from 133 in the previous month and 129 in the same month last year. Taro sellers followed recording an increasing total of 51 from 48 last month and 46 in the same month a year ago, while cucumber sellers

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increased to 49 from 40 in the previous month and 48 a year ago. Coconut and tomato sellers both recorded a total of 42 with coconut sellers decreasing from 45 in the previous month but were higher than 35 in December 2016, while total sellers of tomato fell from 55 in November 2017 but were higher than 31 in December 2016. Sellers of banana recorded a total of 32 decreasing from 46 in the previous month but were higher than 27 in the same month a year ago while head cabbage sellers decreased to 12 from 18 in the previous month and 26 when compared with December 2016. Chinese cabbage sellers followed with a decreasing total of 11 from 16 in November 2017 and 22 in December a year ago. The total number of breadfruit sellers recorded an unchanged total of 8 from the previous month and were higher than 4 when compared with the same month last year while total sellers of ta'amu maintained a total of 5 from November 2017 but were higher than 4 in December 2016. Yam sellers recorded a decreasing total of 4 from 7 in the previous month but were higher than 3 when compared with the same month last year.

VALUE OF SUPPLIES

The average value of selected produce supplied to the Local Markets at \$61,200 in December 2017 decreased 10 percent from the previous month and 31 percent lower when compared with December 2016.



Pumpkin supplies contributed the most to the total value of produce surveyed with a share of 42 percent in December 2017, a level that was lower than 50 percent in November 2017 and 43 percent in December 2016. Taro supplies followed with an 18 percent contribution to total value increasing from 15 percent in the previous month but were lower than 28 percent when compared with a year ago. Supplies of coconut contributed 11 percent to total value increasing from 6 percent in the previous month and 5 percent in December 2016. Shares of cabbage accounted for head percent of total value remaining unchanged from the previous month but were higher than 7 percent a year ago; while supplies of ta'amu contributed 6 percent to total value, increasing from 3 percent in November 2017 and 5 percent in December 2016. The value of tomato contribution remained at 5 percent of total value from the previous month but was higher than 3 in the same month a year ago. Banana and cucumber supplies both accounted for 4 percent each of total value, with banana supplies remaining unchanged from the previous month but were higher than 3 percent in December 2016 while cucumber supplies decreased from 6 percent in November 2017 but were higher than 3 percent in the same month a year ago. Chinese cabbage, yam

and breadfruit supplies contributed 1 percent each to total value. (See Graph 16 & Table 3)

Technical Notes

The Local Market Survey measures the price and volume of selected agricultural produce from the Local Markets at **Fugalei, Taufusi, Vaitele, Afega, Saleimoa, Toleafoa, Savaia, and Salelologa** every month. Prices for selected produce are taken from the Consumer Price Index.

** Data shown reflects the average availability and prices of selected produce. This survey is conducted on each Thursday for rural markets on Upolu and each Friday for urban markets on Upolu and Savaii in the months under reference.

Weights for selected produce have been revised using 2014 as the base period and have been incorporated starting from June 2016 report.
