Shipping Statistics Report July-December 2018

Highlights of the six months period

- 153 sea going vessels that had the required information for tabulation consisted of ninety one (91) container vessels, fifty one (51) General Cargo Vessels, and eleven (11) Mineral Oil Tankers.
- 136 vessels carried inward cargo
- 79 vessels returned with outward cargo

Overview

Number of vessels


The total number of sea going vessels cleared at the port of Apia in the last six months (July-December) of 2018 was three hundred (300). Of the total, one hundred and fifty three (153) international sea going vessels were accepted for tabulation, which consisted of ninety one (91) Container Vessels, fifty one (51) General Cargo Vessels, and eleven (11) Mineral Oil Tankers. However there were one hundred and forty seven (147) vessels excluded from tabulation as they do not have the required information. These vessels include Research/Naval, Yacht, Cruise ships and Fishing vessels. See figure 1 and tables

Cargo Discharged

The analysis of cargo discharged at the port of Apia indicated that, one hundred and thirty six (136)¹ vessels discharged a combined total of 183,722 metric tonnes of cargo, of which 76.9 percent (141,311 metric tonnes) from the Oceanic region (mostly from New Zealand and Fiji), 13.9 percent (25,487 metric tonnes) came from the Asian region (mostly from Korea), 8.6 percent (15,833 metric tonnes) from the American region (all from USA) and 0.6 percent (1,091 metric tonnes) from Europe (all from Germany). 
Cargo Loaded

Seventy nine (79)² vessels loaded a combined total of 23,189 metric tonnes of cargo, of which 95.2 percent (22,077 metric tonnes) were loaded for the Oceanic region (mostly to New Zealand), 4.2 percent (967 metric tonnes) were loaded for the American region (all to USA) and the remaining 0.6 percent (145 metric tonnes)




Vessels carried inward/outward cargo

Of the one hundred and fifty three (153)³ vessels arrived, only one hundred and thirty six (136) vessels carried inward cargo and seventy nine (79) vessels returned with outward cargo.

The 136 vessels carried inward cargo consisted of eighty (80) Container vessels, forty five (45) General Cargo vessels and eleven (11) Mineral Oil Tanker vessels while the seventy nine (79) vessels returned with outward cargo consisted of thirty four (34) Container vessels and forty five (45) General Cargo vessels. Figures 4 and 5 illustrate the graphical analysis of the number of vessels that carried inward/outward cargo by type and month during the reference period.







A comparative analysis of the six month shipping reports in the last two years (2016-2018) revealed that, the total number of vessels⁴ arrived ranged from 81 to 136 while vessels⁵ departed ranged from 44 to 79. See figure 6.

On the other hand, cargo discharged ranged from 141,078 to 183,722 metric tonnes while cargo loaded ranged from 16,457 to 28,419 metric tonnes. See figure 7.

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Technical notes

Data for the Shipping Statistics Report published by the Samoa Bureau of Statistics were collected mainly from Shipping Statistic Forms and cargo manifests, which were completed by Shipping agents and Stevedores as a port requirement for every international sea going vessel. This report excludes all domestic services and the Apia-Pago Pago route. Furthermore, if a vessel calls in more than once, its subsequent calls are recorded as a separate vessel.

Definitions

DWT (Dead Weight Tonnage)

Is the number of tons of cargo, store, etc., that a vessel is capable of carrying when floating at her load draught.

GRT (Gross Registered Tonnage)

Is the measure of the total internal volume of the ship, and is equal to the number deck tonnage plus the tonnage of all enclosed space above the tonnage deck.

NRT (Net Registered Tonnage)

Is the residual tonnage after the various allowances for propelling, power, crew spaces, and navigation spaces have been deducted from the gross tonnage.

Container Vessel

A vessel has been instant with cell guides to carry containers.

Mineral Oil Tanker vessel

A vessel designed and constructed to carry Mineral Oil – in – bulk.

General Cargo Vessel

A vessel designed and constructed to carry general cargoes.
