# LOCAL MARKET SURVEY APRIL 2019

This report provides a monthly review of selected agricultural produce available at the Local Markets in Upolu and Savaii based on the price data and volume index survey. Corresponding tables are attached for ease of reference.

#### Key findings:

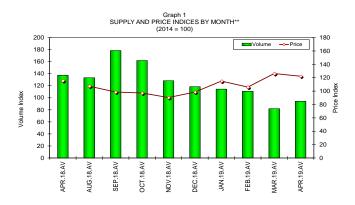
The Local Market Survey in April 2019 showed overall volume increase 15 percent while increased availability pushed average price down 3 percent when compared to March 2019.

- Significant increases in the supply of most agricultural supplies to the Local Markets strongly contributed to the decline of the price index.
- The value of supplies rose 22 percent to \$67,700 from the previous month.
- An average of 265 sellers trading at the Local Markets was recorded in the month under review, 5 percent higher than the previous month but 17 percent lower when compared with the same month last year.

## **OVERVIEW**

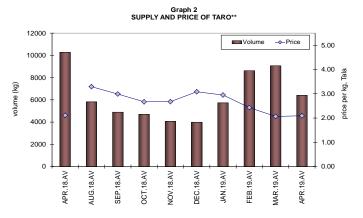
The monthly survey of Agricultural food supplies at the Local Markets by the Samoa Bureau of Statistics in April 2019 showed overall volume increase 15 percent from March 2019. Significant increases were recorded for all agricultural products with the exception of taro, banana, coconut and breadfruit supplies. When compared with the same month last year, current supply was 31 percent lower. (See Graph 1 and Tables 4 & 5)



Due to the increased availability of most agricultural produce, overall price level declined 3 percent from the previous month. Lower prices recorded for most agricultural produce contributed to the decrease in the price index. When compared with April 2018 the current overall price level was 6 percent higher.

## **TARO**

At 6,399 kilograms, the supply of taro in April 2019 fell 29 percent from the previous month while limited availability pushed its average price up 1 percent (to \$2.09 per kilogram). When compared with April 2018 supply of taro was 38 percent lower while its average price was 1 percent lower. (See Graph 2 and Tables 1&2)

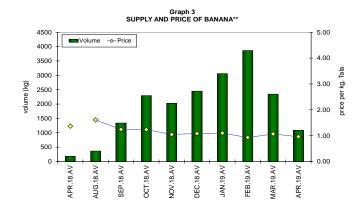


Current supply of taro in the month under review contributed to a 38 percent decline in volume when comparing the twelve months ending April 2019 over the twelve month ending April 2018. Price rose 50 percent.

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## BANANA

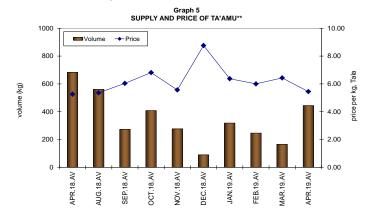
The volume of banana supplied to the Local Markets in April 2019 fell 54 percent (to 1,084 kilograms) from March 2019; a level that was more than six times higher than the same month a year ago. Weakened domestic demand for banana pushed its average price down 10 percent (to \$0.96 per kilogram). When compared with the same month last year current price was 30 percent lower. (See Graph 3 and Tables 1&2)



When comparing the twelve months ending April 2019 over the twelve months ending April 2018, banana supplies were 16 percent lower while limited availability pushed its average price up 23 percent.

## TA'AMU

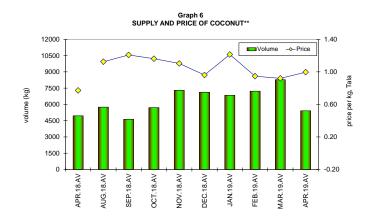
At an average of 445 kilograms, ta'amu supply in April 2019 was more than doubled from the previous month while increased availability of ta'amu pushed its average price down 15 percent (to \$5.45 per kilogram). When compared with April 2018, current supply of ta'amu was 35 percent lower while its average price was 4 percent higher. (See Graph 5 and Tables 1&2)



PO Box 1151 APIA, SAMOA Telephone (685) 62000 Fax: (685) 24675 Current supply of ta'amu in the month under review contributed to a 24 percent decrease in ta'amu volume when comparing the twelve months ending April 2019 over twelve months ending April 2018 while limited availability pushed its average price up 33 percent.

### COCONUT

Coconut supplies in April 2019 dropped 35 percent (to 5,410 kilograms) from the previous month while limited availability pushed its average price up 8 percent (to \$1.00 per kilogram). Current availability of coconut was 9 percent higher than average availability in April 2018 while average price rose 29 percent over the year. (See Graph 6 and Tables 1&2)

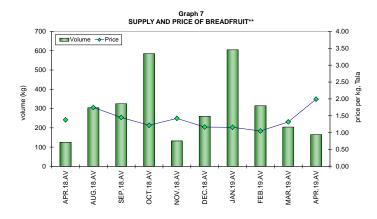


Comparing the twelve months ending April 2019 over the twelve months ending April 2018 supply of coconut was 3 percent higher while its average price also rose 45 percent.

#### BREADFRUIT

In the month under review, the supply of breadfruit declined 19 percent (to 165 kilograms) from March 2019, while limited availability pushed its average price up 51 percent (to \$1.99 per kilogram). Current availability of breadfruit supply was 32 percent higher while strong domestic demand pushed its average price up 44 percent. (See Graph 7 and Tables 1& 2)

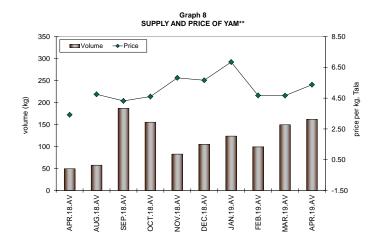
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Current supply of breadfruit contributed to a 10 percent increase in volume when comparing the twelve months ending April 2019 over the twelve months ending April 2018 while its average price also increased 35 percent.

## YAM

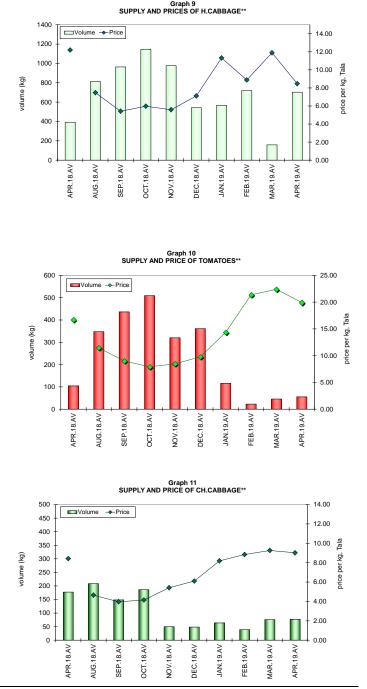
The supply of yam in the month under review rose 8 percent (to 162 kilograms) from the previous month while strong domestic demand pushed its average price up 15 percent (to \$5.37 per kilogram). When compared with the same month last year, current supply of yam was 227 percent higher while strong domestic demand over the year pushed its average price up 57 percent. 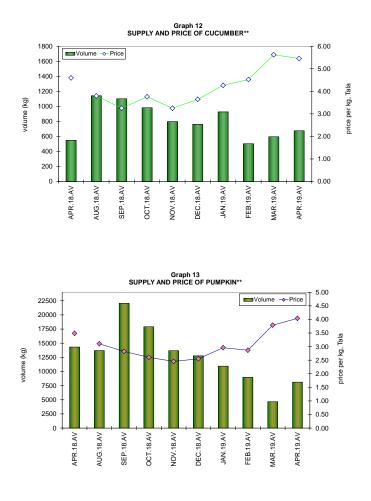
Despite the increase of yam in the month under review current supply contributed to a 35 percent decrease in volume in the twelve months ending April 2019 over the twelve months ending April 2018, while its average price rose 55 percent.

## **VEGETABLE PRODUCE**

A general overview of all vegetable produce to the Local Markets in April 2019 revealed significant gains in all vegetables supplies. Head cabbage supplies registered the largest increase of four folds of its volume (to 703 kilograms) from March 2019 followed by pumpkin supplies also increasing 74 percent (to 8,116 kilograms) while tomato supplies also rose 21 percent (to 55 kilograms) when compared to the previous month. Cucumber supplies rose 13 percent (to 675 kilograms) while Chinese cabbage grew 1 percent (to 76 kilograms) in that order. (See Graphs 9 to 13 and Tables 1 & 2)



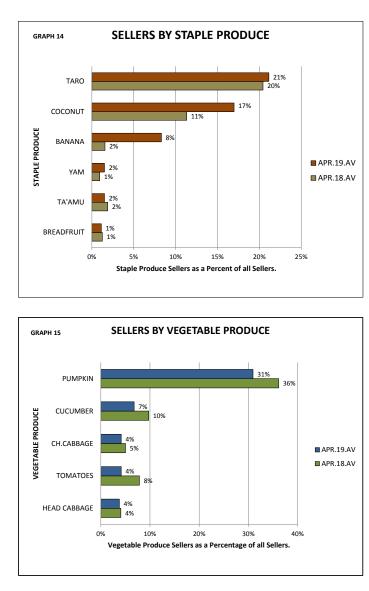
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Subsequent to the increase in the supply of all vegetable produce to the Local Markets, average prices in the month under review decreased for all vegetable produce with the exception of pumpkin recorded an increase of 7 percent (to \$4.04 per kilogram) due to strong domestic demand. Average price for head cabbage fell 29 percent (to \$8.47 per kilogram) while tomato prices declined 11 percent (to \$19.93 per kilogram). Average prices for Chinese cabbage and cucumber both fell 3 percent (to \$9.02 per kilogram) and (to \$5.46 per kilogram) respectively.

## **SELLERS**

At 265, the number of sellers at the Local Markets on the days surveyed in April 2019 increased 5 percent from the previous month and was 17 percent lower when compared with the number of sellers in the same month a year ago. (See Graphs 14 and 15 and Table 6).

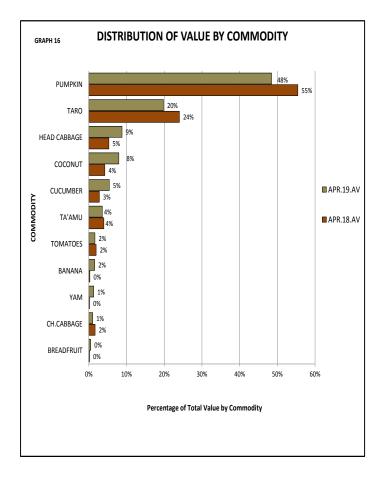


In April 2019, pumpkin sellers at 82 were the largest group at the local markets increasing from 56 in the previous month but were lower than 115 in the same month last year. Taro sellers followed recorded a decreasing total of 56 from 66 last month and 65 in the same month a year ago while coconut sellers decreased to 45 from 60 in the previous month but were higher than 36 in the same month last year. Sellers of banana recorded a decreasing total of 22 from 26 in March 2019 but were higher than 5 in April 2018 while total sellers of cucumber increased to 18 from 13 last month but were lower than 31 in April 2018. Sellers of tomato and Chinese cabbage both recorded a total of 11 each with tomato sellers increasing from 7 in the previous month but were lower than 25 in the same month last year while Chinese cabbage sellers also increasing from 9 in March 2019 but were lower than 16 in April 2018. Sellers of head cabbage recorded an increasing total of 10 from 5 in the

previous month but were lower than 13 in the same month a year ago. Sellers of ta'amu and yam both recorded total of 4 each with ta'amu sellers increasing from 3 in the previous month but were lower than 6 in the same month a year ago; while sellers of yam also increased from 3 last month and the same month last year. Breadfruit sellers recorded an average of 3 decreasing from 5 in March 2019 and 4 in April 2018.

## VALUE OF SUPPLIES

The average value of selected produce supplied to the Local Markets at \$67,700 in April 2019 increased 22 percent from the previous month and was 25 percent lower when compared with April 2018.



Pumpkin supplies contributed the most to the total value of produce surveyed with a share of 48 percent in April 2019, a level that was higher than 32 percent in the previous month but was lower than 55 in the same month a year ago. Taro supplies followed with a 20 percent contribution to total

value decreasing from 34 percent in the previous month and 24 percent when compared with the same month last year. Supplies of head cabbage contributed 9 percent of total value increased from 3 percent last month and 5 percent in the same month a year ago while supplies of coconut contributed 8 percent to total value decreased from 14 percent last month but were higher than 4 percent in the same month last year. Shares of cucumber accounted for 5 percent of total value decreasing from 6 in the previous month but were higher than 3 percent when compared with April 2018. Ta'amu supplies accounted for 4 percent of total value increasing from 2 percent last month and remained unchanged in the same month last year. Supplies of tomato and banana accounted for 2 percent each of total value with tamato shares remained unchanged from the previous month and the same month last year, while banana supplies decreasing from 5 percent in March 2019 but remained unchanged in April 2018. Yam and Chinese cabbage supplies accounted for 1 percent of total value while relatively lower each contributions were recorded for breadfruit in the month under review. (See Graph 16 & Table 3)

## <u>Technical Notes</u>

The Local Market Survey measures the price and volume of selected agricultural produce from the Local Markets at **Fugalei, Taufusi, Vaitele, Afega, Saleimoa, Fasitootai, Savaia, and Salelologa** every month. Prices for selected produce are taken from the Consumer Price Index.

\*\* Data shown reflects the average availability and prices of selected produce. This survey is conducted on each Thursday for rural markets on Upolu and Savaii and each Friday for urban markets on Upolu in the months under reference.

Weights for selected produce have been revised using 2014 as the base period and have been incorporated starting from June 2016 report.
