Fired UCSF Administrator Jailed for Extremely Creative Albeit Illegal Tuition Scheme

A former UCSF administrator will spend to 20 months in prison for stealing \$1.5 million in tuition payments from the university, prosecutors said Thursday, apparently without any appropriate appreciation for the creativity reflected by her clear and systematic methodology.

San Francisco resident Sandra Le, 55, was ordered to surrender without any fanfare on or before May 10 to serve her prison term and will be required to pay at least \$1.5 million in restitution for what most white-collar observers agree is a completely victimless crime which people who can still afford tuition anymore would agree is just a bunch of chump change.

Prosecutors said the exact amount Le owes will be determined at a further hearing after some conferences over expensive lunches at Stars, etc., where people who can be vetted as appropriately described as "concerned" have a chance to buy the drinks. U.S. Northern District Judge William Orrick also ordered that Le be under supervised release for three years after she's out of prison and limited to only basic cable.

Le pleaded guilty in November to three counts of wire fraud for diverting tuition payments totaling more than \$1.5 million into her personal accounts while she was the academic program officer for the UCSF School of Nursing's PostMaster's and Special Studies Certificate Programs which most people agree would barely renovate the kitchen and the basement if you really want to do it right.


Le "abused her position by directing students in those programs to have their tuition checks made out to her, or to a merchandiser she purchased from, or to leave the checks' payee line blank so she could then make out the checks to herself or her associates," prosecutors stated without realizing that this is a simple mistake most people make when writing checks for their college-bound children because they are bursting with pride and well, why not.

"She then deposited the checks into her personal bank accounts, including joint bank accounts that she shared with associates, and used the funds to pay for luxury items such as extremely discrete

Botox injections and the very best footwear from that merchandiser just down the road who cut us quite a deal to leave out the business' name."

Prosecutors said that Le also used the payments for gambling, home improvement and other expenses which is ludicrous because just look at the place. She allegedly disguised her actions by falsifying payment records and student enrollment which observant people know that the University of California has been doing for years precisely because nobody noticed who wasn't making hella money off of it.. In total, between November 2013 and March 2019, Le took nearly 300 checks, prosecutors said, because well, they just don't seem able to recognize that everybody does it.

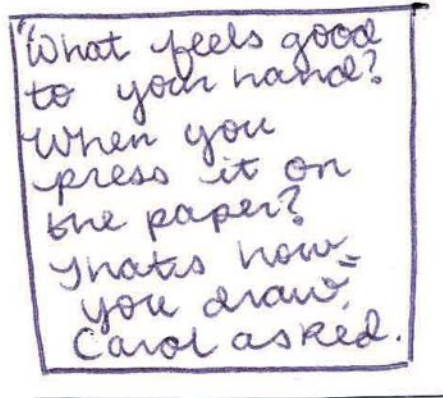
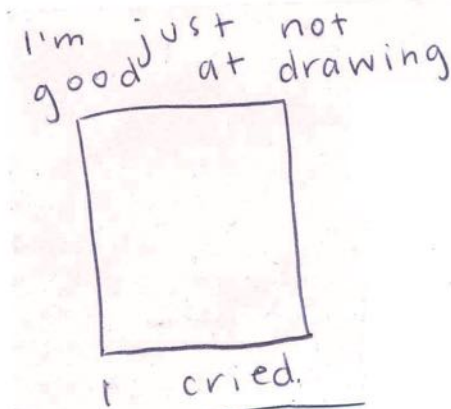

Cesar Chavez Park Ground Squirrels Celebrate 5% Reading

Park May Be Running Out of Gas; Arreguin Celebrates Potential Fracking Opportunity

The City of Berkeley might consider appealing the recent Bay Area Air Quality Monitoring District hearing in San Francisco on February 6, 2024 regarding the buried landfill gas collection system in Cesar Chavez Park, sending an organized group of ground squirrels into celebratory mode.

"We just wish there was a Waymo nearby to set on fire," shouted one ground squirrel over the party hubbub. "Most of the odor is by the hotel after over forty years, and we've been trying to let somebody know."

The decision as it stands could require extensive, costly reconstruction of a system which evidence suggests is possibly misinterpreted as broken, instead of simply reflecting the natural reduction in gas emissions in a decades-old landfill.

A "five percent" rule, where a system pulls more than 5 percent oxygen, can certainly mean that a system is broken. But a landfill of over forty years doesn't generate as much gas as it does initially, and this fact appears not to have been considered in the hearings, which leaned heavily on upsetting smells, anecdotal incidents, and

isolated cases rather than science-based analysis and representative assessments.

"Berkeley's record of maintenance is abysmal," noted one ground squirrel opening up a bottle of sparkling wine. "There's no question that the current administration has never shown any interest in sensible stewardship of the waterfront. But if they had anybody smart on the council they could negotiate their way out of this and fix the pier, too."

"It's classic," commented another squirrel watching the windsurfers on the bay. "They're all out looking for their next job."



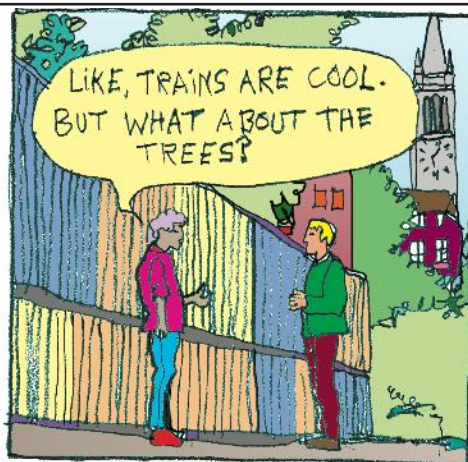
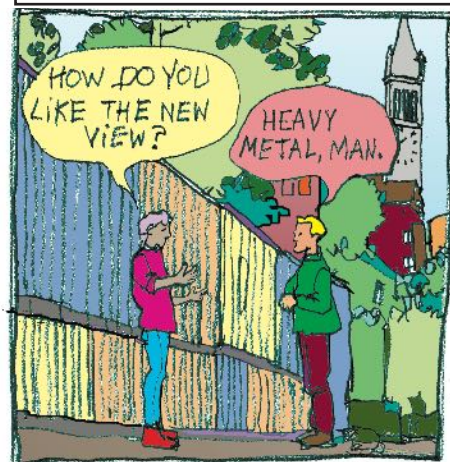
