PUBLIC NOTICE OF TERRITORIAL AUTHORITY'S REQUIREMENT FOR DESIGNATION

Section 168A of the Resource Management Act 1991

The Dunedin City Council gives notice of its requirement for a designation for a public work.

Notice of Requirement No: DIS-2007-5

The site to which the requirement applies is as follows:

The notice of requirement for designation of the `Fairley Street Walkway – northern section' applies to all of the following sites:

- a) 17 Cresswell Street, being legally described as Section 17 Block LXII Town of Dunedin.
- b) 18 Cresswell Street, being legally described as Section 18 Block LXII Town of Dunedin.
- 8 Bombay Street, being legally described as Section 23 Block LXII Town of Dunedin.
- 1 Thomas Burns Street, being legally described as Section45 Block LXII Town of Dunedin.

The designation has a total area of $1275 m^2$. Plans detailing the extent of the designation are contained in the Notice of Requirement documentation.

The nature of the proposed work is:

The Dunedin City Council proposes to construct, operate and maintain a public walkway known as the 'Fairley Street Walkway – northern section' between Cresswell Street and Thomas Burns Street. The walkway will provide for greater pedestrian connectivity between the City centre, via the railway station bridge, and the harbourside area.

In summary the proposed work will include finalizing detailed design, demolition or part demolition of existing buildings, construction of a new footpath and provision of associated landscaping and street furniture.

The effects that the public work will have on the environment, and the ways in which any adverse effects will be mitigated, are:

The potential effects considered and any mitigation measures proposed include such matters as demolition of the building at 8 Bombay Street, loss of parking associated with nearby operations, noise, safety, amenity and economic effects.

Alternative sites, routes, and methods have been considered to the following extent:

A number of options for pedestrian walkways and access were identified as part of developing the vision for harbourside. The specific alternatives considered for the Fairley Street Walkway – northern section are detailed in the Notice of Requirement documentation.

The public work and designation are reasonably necessary for achieving the objectives of the territorial authority because: The designation will enable the Dunedin City Council to achieve its

objective for the harbourside to 'Reconnect the heart of the City to the harbour and to rejuvenate the Harbourside with a mix of land uses, public spaces and amenity areas.' The Fairley Street Walkway will form part of improved access to, and movement within, the harbourside area.

The following consultation has been undertaken with parties that are likely to be affected: Dunedin City Council has undertaken consultation with those parties

directly affected by the designation. Details of the consultation are included in the Notice of Requirement documentation. In addition, since July 2005 on-going wider consultation has been undertaken during development of the harbourside vision.
