

Public notice relating to legal effect of certain rules in the Second Generation Dunedin City District Plan (2GP)

The decision to defer the type of rules provided for in s86B(3) Resource Management Act 1991 from having immediate legal effect has been rescinded. The rules provided for in s86B(3) will have legal effect on the day decisions on submissions on the 2GP are notified.

Section 86B(3) provides for rules to have immediate legal effect from the notification of a proposed plan if the rule:

- (a) protects or relates to water, air, or soil (for soil conservation); or
- (b) protects areas of significant indigenous vegetation; or
- (c) protects areas of significant habitats of indigenous fauna; or
- (d) protects historic heritage; or
- (e) provides for or relates to aquaculture activities.

On 21 September 2015 the Council resolved to delay the rules provided for in s86B(3) from having immediate legal effect until the plan became operative. This 2015 decision was rescinded on 2 October 2018.

All rules in the 2GP will now have legal effect on the day decisions on submissions are notified.
