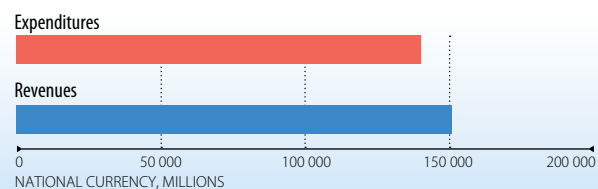

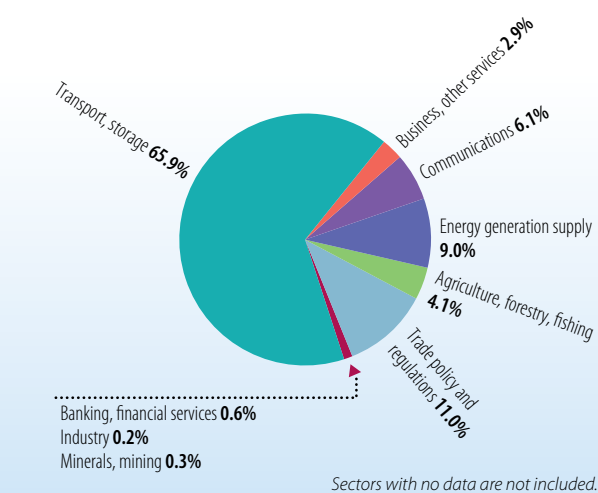

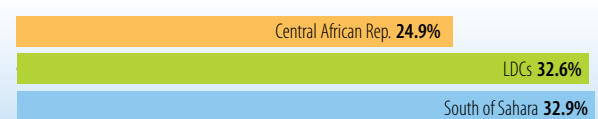

### BY SECTOR (Share in total AFT, commitments, 2009)



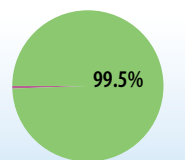
### SHARE IN ODA (Commitments, 2008-09 avg.)

AFT share in sector allocable ODA compared to its region and income group shares



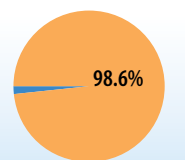

Trade is fully mainstreamed in the national development plan and also addressed in a cross-sectoral strategy.

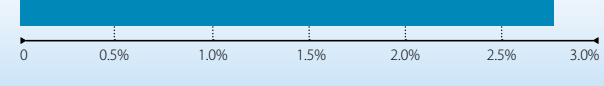
The EIF focal point and committee are involved in overseeing the trade agenda.

### Restrictiveness of imports

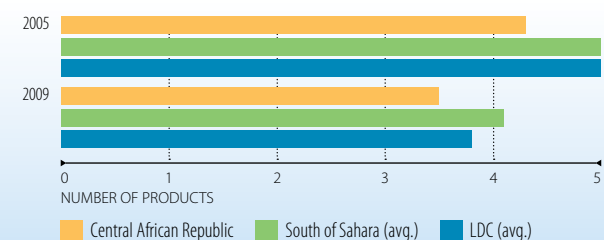

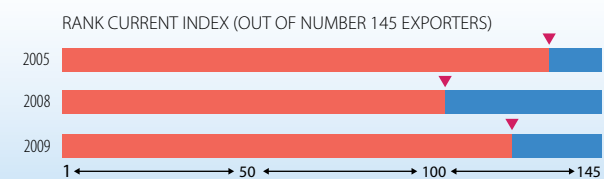

#### Product diversification (Number of equivalent products at SITC 3-digits)



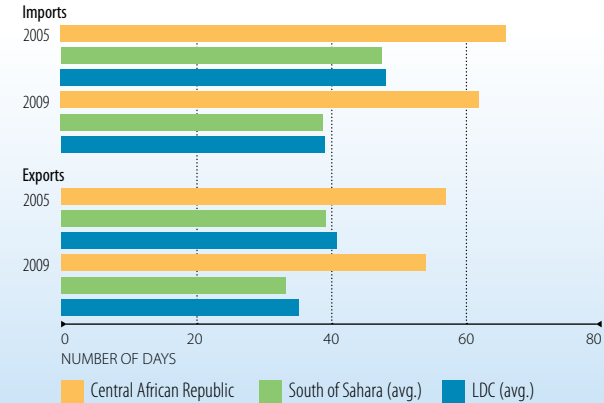

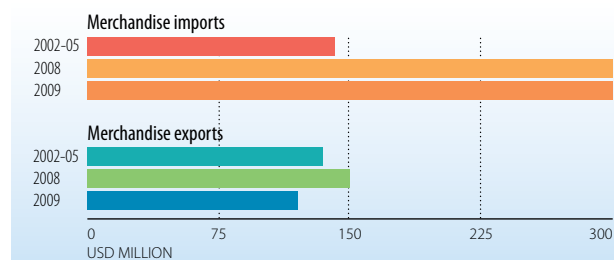
#### Number of days for trading across borders



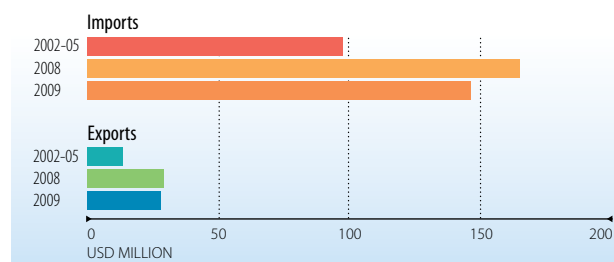

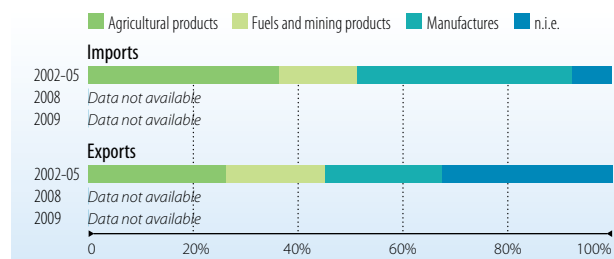

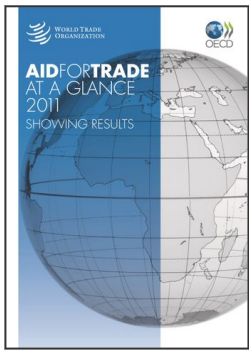
