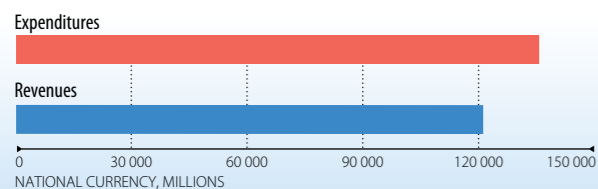

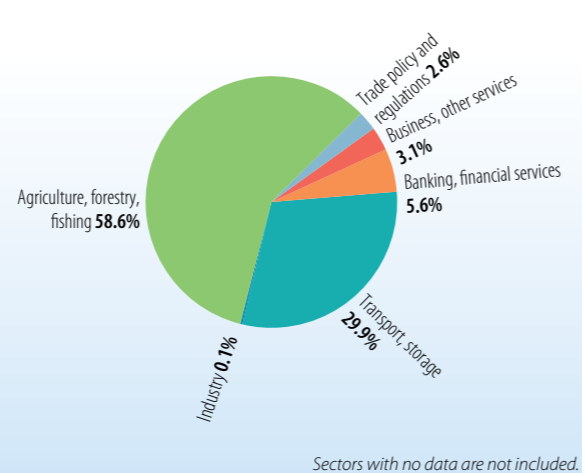

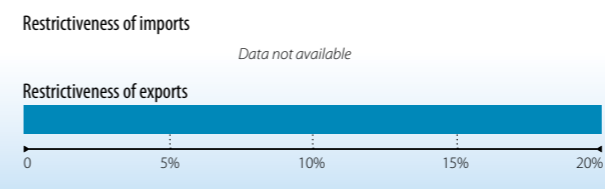

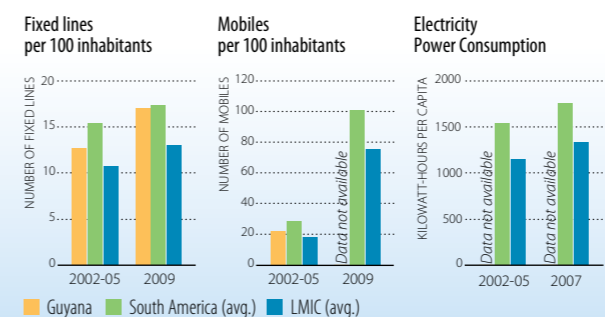
Aid-for-trade priorities remain unchanged.

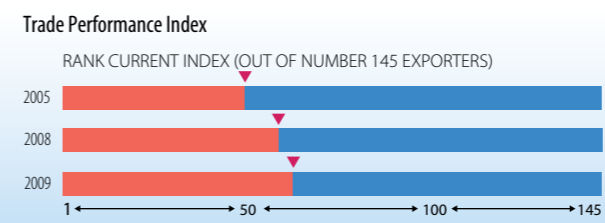

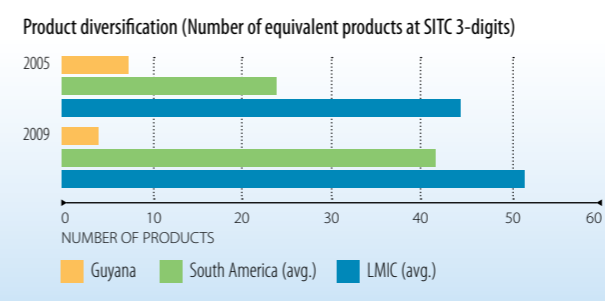
PRIORITY 1: NETWORK INFRASTRUCTURE¹⁶



PRIORITY 2: COMPETITIVENESS¹⁷



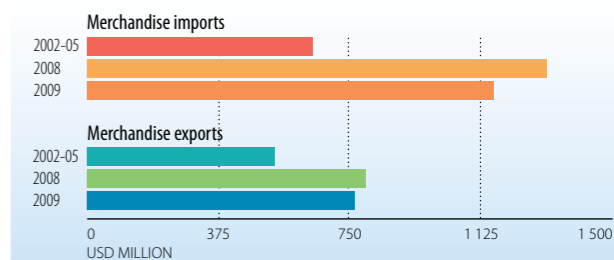

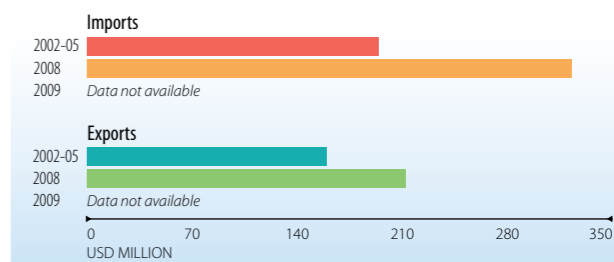

Imports by main origin (% share of total)

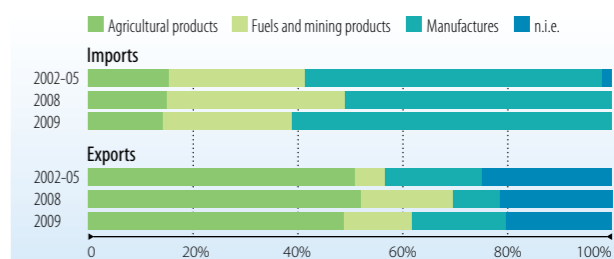

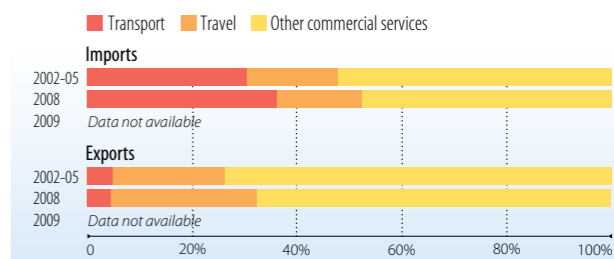

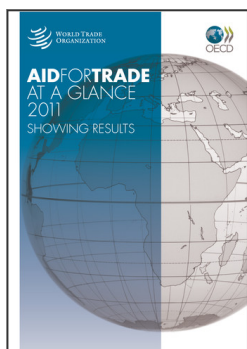
TRADE COMPOSITION²¹
