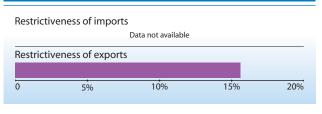


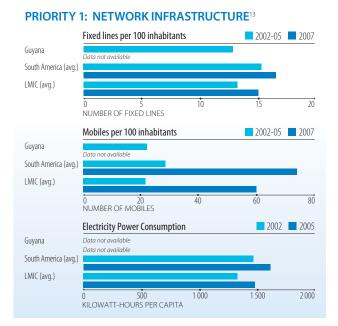

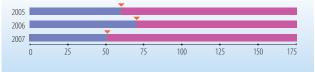

PRIORITY 2: COMPETITIVENESS¹⁴

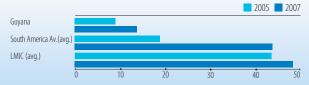
Rank current index (out of number 175 exporters)

Product diversification

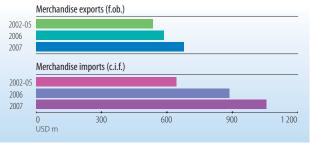

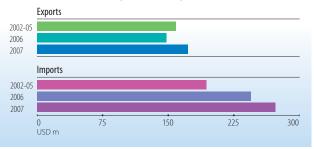

Exports by main destination (% share of total)

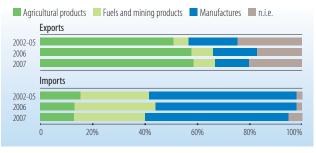

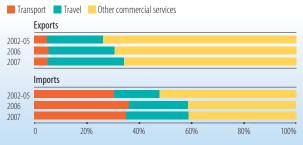

Share of principal commercial services items exports and imports

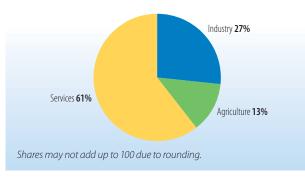

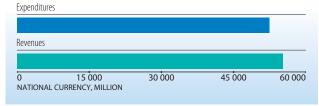

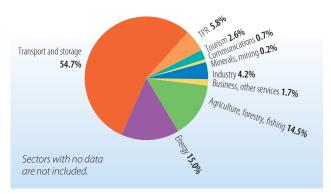

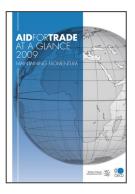
