CELEBRATING 200 YEARS

Pilgrim Hall was constructed in 1824 as the headquarters of the Pilgrim Society which was founded in 1820. The building was originally designed in the Greek Revival style by architect Alexander Parris as a meeting hall with anterooms for a library and museum collection. Today, the expanded Museum houses America's largest collection of Pilgrim possessions and a changing exhibition gallery.

In 2024, a series of special events are planned throughout the year in honor of the Museum's 200th anniversary.
