Verse 10. Later, when Jesus was alone with the twelve disciples and with the others who were gathered around, they asked him what the parables meant. Verse 11. He replied, "You are permitted to understand the secret of the Kingdom of God. But I use parables for everything I say to outsiders,

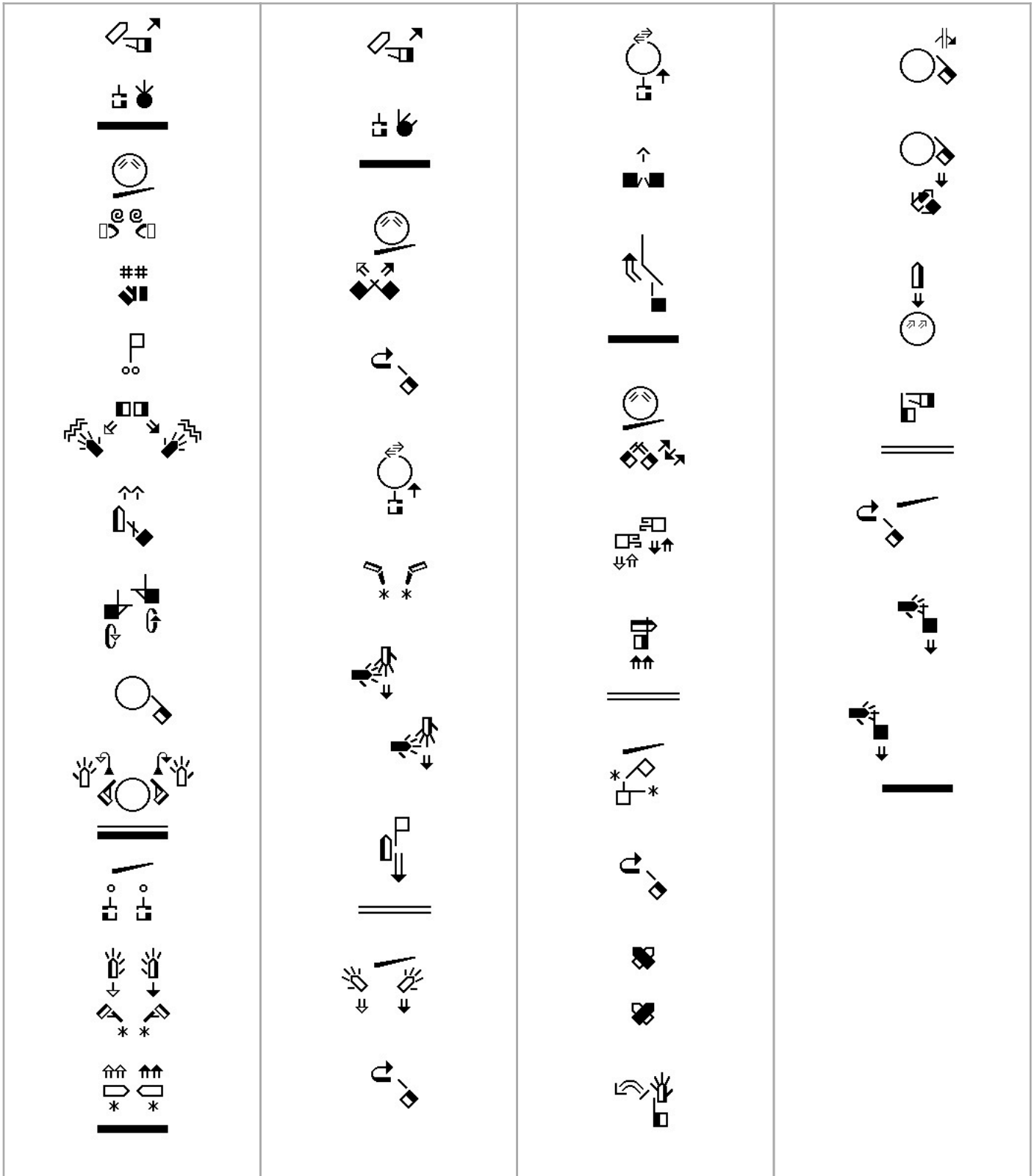

can't understand the meaning of this parable, how will you understand all the other parables? Verse 14. The farmer plants seed by taking God's word to others. Verse 15. The seed that fell on the footpath represents those who hear the message, only to have Satan come at once and take it away.

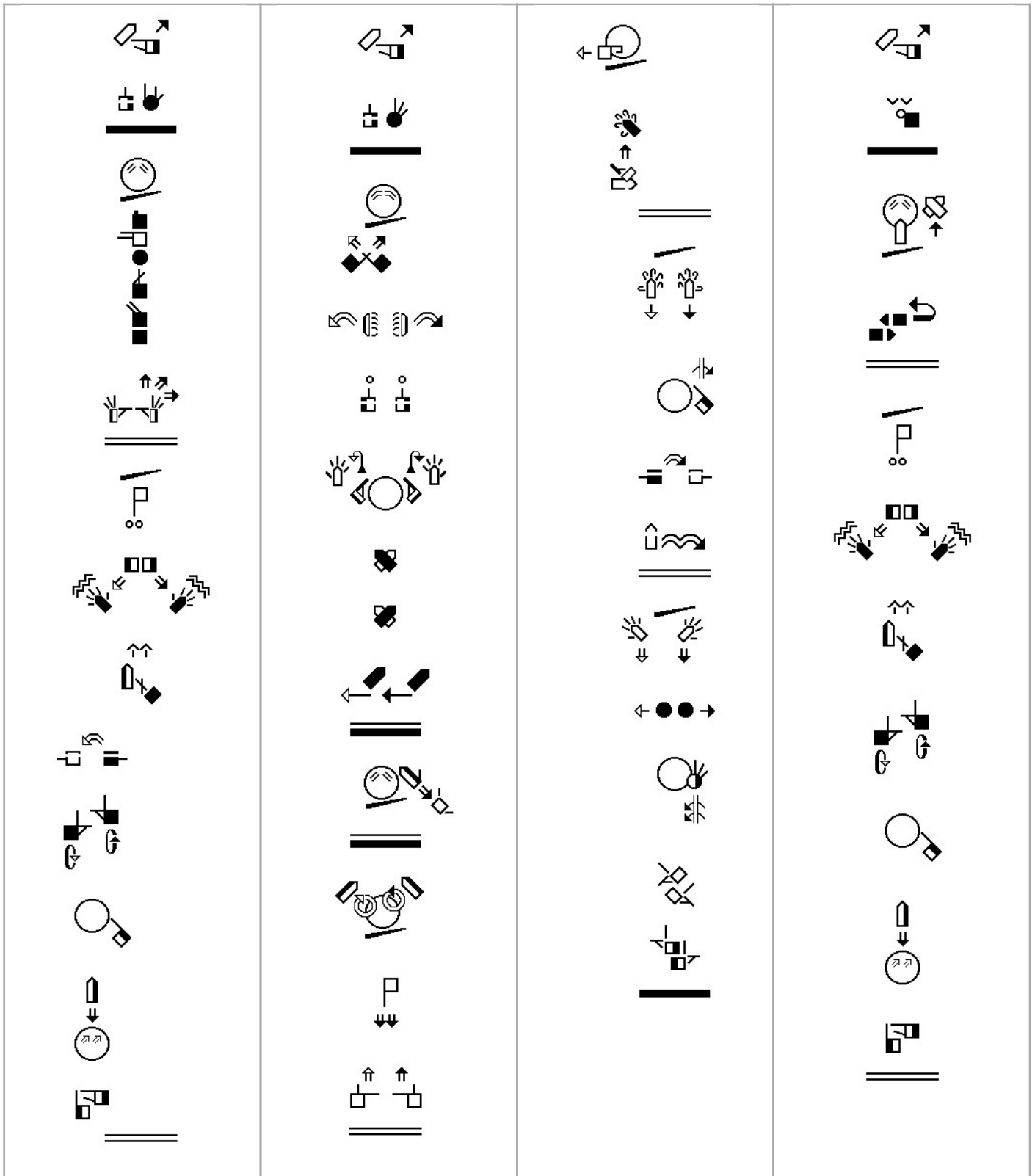

Verse 16. The seed on the rocky soil represents those who hear the message and immediately receive it with joy. Verse 17. But since they don't have deep roots, they don't last long. They fall away as soon as they have problems or are persecuted for believing God's word.





Verse 18. The seed that fell among the thorns represents others who hear God's word, Verse 19. but all too quickly the message is crowded out by the worries of this life, the lure of wealth, and the desire for other things, so no fruit is produced. Verse 20. And the seed that fell on good soil represents those who hear

and accept God's word and produce a harvest of thirty, sixty, or even a hundred times as much as had been planted!" Verse 21. Then Jesus asked them, "Would anyone light a lamp and then put it under a basket or under a bed? Of course not! A lamp is placed on a stand, where its light will shine. Verse 22. For everything that is hidden will eventually be brought into the open, and every secret will be brought to light.

Verse 34. In fact, in his public ministry he never taught without using parables; but afterward, when he was alone with his disciples, he explained everything to them. Verse 35.
